## PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

With profound gratitude and heartfelt joy, I write to you today to celebrate a monumental milestone in the life of our parish. After eight years of dedication, sacrifice, and unwavering faith, we have officially paid off the debt on the Gonzaga Center. What a remarkable testament to the power of community, perseverance, and stewardship! We embarked on the ambitious project of building a space where faith formation, pastoral ministry, parish gatherings, and countless acts of service could take root and flourish. The Gonzaga Center was designed to be a home—a hub—for our mission of forming disciples and building community. Along the way, our journey was anything but smooth. The devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey required unexpected and costly reconstruction. Yet, by God's grace, and through your faith and generosity, we did it! On June 30th, 2025, we made the final payment on the balloon note. That is a remarkable accomplishment, especially in a time of financial uncertainty for many families and institutions. This success would not have been possible without the generous contributions of so many parishioners, the diligent and prudent leadership of our Finance Council through these eight years, and the careful stewardship of our staff, who scrutinized every expenditure with the utmost responsibility. We proved the naysayers wrong—not by pride or power, but by unity and shared sacrifice. This is not just the closing of a financial chapter—it is the opening of a new one. A chapter where we can dream bigger, reach farther, and serve more deeply.

As we celebrate this milestone, it is also a time to reflect on the foundation that made it possible: biblical stewardship. So often, we think of stewardship in terms of finances alone. But true stewardship, grounded in Scripture, is a way of life. It is a response to the truth that everything we have—our time, our talents, our treasure—is a gift from God, entrusted to us for a greater purpose. In the life of a Roman Catholic, stewardship begins with the offering of our time—especially in prayer. Giving time to God each day in silence, Scripture, and sacraments forms the heart of the disciple. Jesus frequently withdrew from the crowds to pray, teaching us by His example that prayer is not optional—it is essential. Stewardship of time means prioritizing our relationship with the Lord in the midst of busy schedules. Talent refers to the unique gifts and abilities each of us possesses. No gift is too small to be of service in the Kingdom. Whether you are good at organizing events, teaching, listening, cooking, fixing things, singing, or simply being present—there is a place for you in the life of the Church. Stewardship of talent calls us to place our gifts at the service of others. Treasure, of course, refers to the financial blessings we have received. Biblical stewardship invites us to return a portion of our income back to God—not out of guilt or obligation, but as a joyful act of thanksgiving. The widow's mite in the Gospel reminds us that generosity is not measured by amount but by sacrifice and love.

The purpose of biblical stewardship is transformation—of our hearts, our homes, and our parish. Stewardship aligns us with God's will. It frees us from the illusion of ownership and invites us into a relationship of trust and generosity. It makes us better disciples—people who are more prayerful, more generous, more connected to the needs of others. If you find yourself unsure of how to begin living as a steward, I encourage you to start small. Begin by setting aside ten minutes each day for prayer. Reflect on the gifts God has given you and ask how they might be used for the good of the parish or the wider community. Consider making a regular financial contribution to the parish—even a modest one—as a sign of your commitment and trust. For those who may come from a background where stewardship was not emphasized culturally or spiritually, I understand that this way of thinking may feel unfamiliar. But I urge you to consider this: what we give, we never lose. In giving, we become freer. In sharing, we become more fully ourselves. In sacrificing, we become more Christlike. Imagine what our parish could look like if each member embraced stewardship as a way of life. Our ministries would overflow. Our worship would be enriched. Our outreach would deepen. Our youth would be empowered. And above all, we would become an even greater witness to the Gospel in our local community.

Our parish motto is "*A People for Others.*" Stewardship brings that vision to life. When we give of ourselves—our time, talent, and treasure—we are not just supporting programs or paying off buildings. We are building the Kingdom of God. As St. Ignatius of Loyola teaches us in his *Suscipe* prayer: "*Take, Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and my entire will—all that I have and possess. You have given all to me. To you, O Lord, I return it.*" That is the heart of stewardship. That is the soul of discipleship. And that is the future we are called to embrace—together.

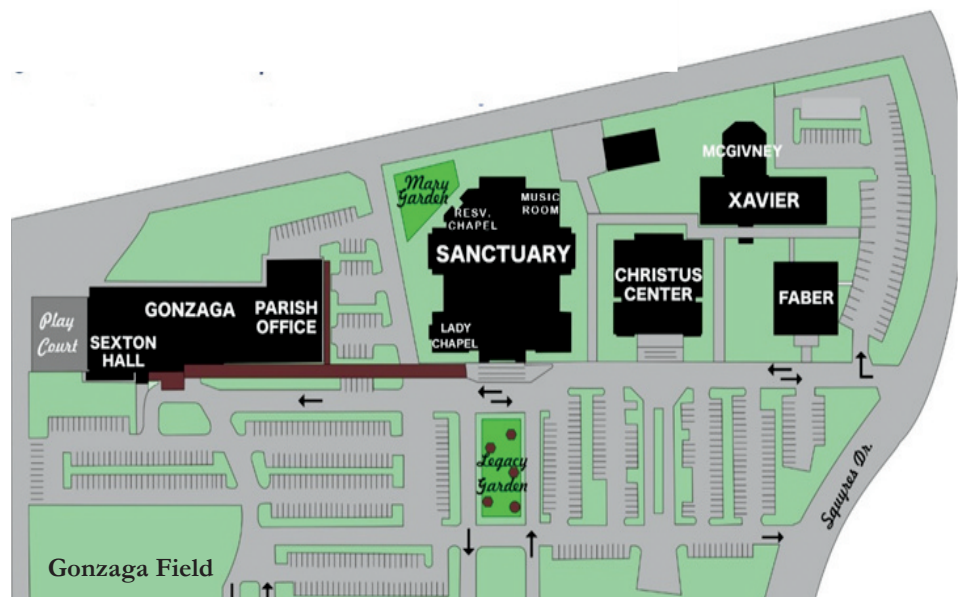

**Sunday, Jul 13, 2025****For the love of God**

What would happen if you and a whole bunch of other people really took to heart these words of scripture: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself"? What, in other words, would be the result if you and I and lots of others put God first in our lives? There would be mutual respect between people. The love of God would be lived out. Violence would disappear. No one would lack what they need. It sounds too good to be true, but with God all things are possible. Do your part and give it your all.

*Deuteronomy 30:10-14; Colossians 1:15-20; Luke 10:25-37 (105). "Return to the LORD, your God, with all your heart and all your soul."*

**Monday, Jul 14, 2025****Fight violence with a secret weapon**

One look at the daily news reminds us: It's a cold, cruel world out there. Innocence is slaughtered every day. The harshness of the world can make us tough, self-protecting, and cold at the center: "Not my job. Not my problem." But the violence of our generation really is our problem, and the job of responding to it can only be ours. We have one great weapon in the war against cruelty. Today, unwrap the gift of kindness. Use it liberally, especially with those who "trespass against you."

*Exodus 1:8-14, 22; Matthew 10:34-11:1 (389). "Pharaoh then commanded all his subjects, 'Throw into the river every boy that is born to the Hebrews.'"*

**Tuesday, Jul 15, 2025****Small mercies**

You know the story: Pharaoh ordered all the male Hebrew children to be cast into the Nile to check the burgeoning Israelite population. One mother followed his command but with a twist: Trying to save her little boy, she floated him out onto the river in a basket. Pharaoh's daughter, at the river to bathe, saw the little boat, gave the baby back to the mother, whom she paid to nurse and raise the child, until she was able to adopt the child as her own. She called him Moses, which means "drawn out." A tragic tale for the rest of the unlucky babies, but also one that shows how God's care shows itself in small ways. Where are the little signs of God's love floating through your life?

*Exodus 2:1-15a; Matthew 11:20-24 (390). "She called him Moses; for she said, 'I drew him out of the water.'"*

**Wednesday, Jul 16, 2025****Your attention, please**

You're not looking for God in the supermarket. You don't expect to see God in traffic. You don't usually have a religious experience while doing homework, standing in line at the bank, eating cereal, or watching TV. In the

same way Moses was most certainly not expecting to have a divine encounter at work the day of his first encounter with God, during another monotonous shift keeping an eye on the sheep. Yet when he climbed up to see that now-famous burning bush, God was waiting for him. Look more closely: Could that be God trying to get your attention?

*Exodus 3:1-6, 9-12; Matthew 11:25-27 (391). "Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground."*

**Thursday, Jul 17, 2025****We've been introduced**

It makes a difference whether you know someone's name. To be introduced to a person involves learning their name. It puts you on personal terms. That's true even when it comes to God. When Moses asked God who he should say sent him, God says to tell them, "I AM sent me to you." Jesus, too, refers to himself as "I am" in the Gospel of John. We believe in a God who we can know on an intimate, personal level. Don't be afraid to call God by name. You've already been introduced and on a first-name basis long before the day you were born.

*Exodus 3:13-20; Matthew 11:28-30 (392). "This is what you shall tell the children of Israel: I AM sent me to you."*

**Friday, Jul 18, 2025****Image adjustment**

The Bible is replete with various images of God, from God as a judge and executor (Exodus 12:12) to God as a woman baking bread (Matthew 13:33). Often these images seem contradictory—a violent God killing firstborn children versus a God who nourishes with patience and care. Frequently these likenesses are used to describe a perceived attribute of God. What images describe your experience of God? If loving, just, and merciful don't come to mind, perhaps it's time to get to know God better. Scripture is a good place to start.

*Exodus 11:10-12:14; Matthew 12:1-8 (393). "I desire mercy, not sacrifice."*

**Saturday, Jul 19, 2025****No time to wait**

There are few things more Jewish than matzo, and nothing more Catholic than the Eucharist. In both cases it's odd to remember that the unleavened bread was purely unintentional. The bread was flat on the day of the great Passover because there was simply no time for it to rise. God doesn't mind making use of what's available, no matter how untimely it seems to us. God chose a young girl, Mary, not yet married, to be the mother of the world's great passover from sin, Jesus.

When it comes to salvation, why wait?

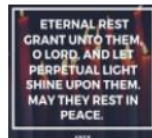

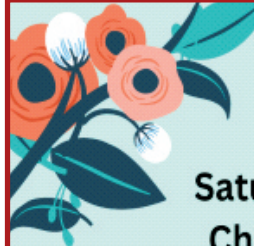

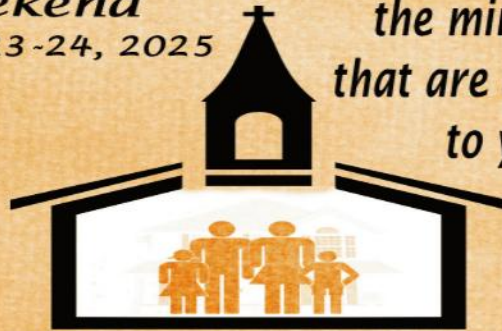

## El Poder transformador de la liturgia

### Racismo y prejuicio

En el Libro del Apocalipsis, san Juan describe una visión del culto de la Jerusalén celestial: “una muchedumbre tan grande, que nadie podía contarla. Eran individuos de todas las naciones y razas, de todos los pueblos y lenguas. Todos estaban de pie delante del trono y del Cordero” (7, 9, cursiva añadida). Esa visión es el patrón para el culto de la Iglesia en la tierra, el objeto de nuestra esperanza y un modelo para nuestra vida en común: una comunión divinamente establecida de pueblos diversos. La liturgia tiene el poder de transformarnos en hombres y mujeres que defienden la dignidad de todas las razas y etnias.

#### Teología

El origen de todo ser humano es el amor de Dios, y todos los seres humanos por igual y plenamente son portadores de la imagen de Dios.

En la plenitud de los tiempos, Dios envió a su Hijo para la salvación de todos, “pues no quiere que nadie perezca, sino que todos se arrepientan” (2 Pe 3, 9). Esta salvación se recibe de manera particular a través de los sacramentos de la Iglesia, y el Papa Francisco nos recuerda que la invitación a los sacramentos es universal, y la misión de la Iglesia es extender esa invitación a cada hombre y mujer (cfr. Desiderio desideravi, n. 5).

Además, la participación en la muerte y resurrección de Cristo a través de los sacramentos profundiza y transforma la comunión establecida en la creación: “todos nosotros, aun siendo muchos, formamos un solo cuerpo unidos a Cristo, y todos y cada uno somos miembros los unos de los otros” (Rm 12, 5). El pecado del racismo rechaza estas verdades fundamentales: nuestro origen y dignidad comunes, nuestro llamado común a la salvación y nuestro destino común en el Reino de los Cielos. El pecado del racismo rechaza las demandas de nuestra nueva vida en Cristo.

#### Liturgia

La liturgia, el signo e instrumento de la comunión, se alza como un faro de esperanza para la Iglesia y el mundo. La Eucaristía, el sacramento de la unidad, nos hace uno y nos da la fuerza para seguir adelante con el don de la unidad que hemos recibido. Nuestra experiencia litúrgica de comunión en la diversidad nos da un anticipo de la comunión que estamos llamados a vivir y fomentar fuera de los muros de la Iglesia. Las numerosas y diversas comunidades parroquiales de los Estados Unidos son modelos no sólo de la vida eclesial sino también de nuestra vida cívica. Queda mucho trabajo por hacer, y hay grandes esperanzas.

En 2016, se invitó a las diócesis de todo el país a celebrar un Día de oración por la paz en nuestras comunidades el 9 de septiembre, el memorial de san Pedro Claver. Algunas comunidades siguen celebrando este día, y se pueden encontrar recursos en [USCCB.org/racism](https://USCCB.org/racism). En esta página web también hay numerosos recursos para la oración, por ejemplo, un Servicio de oración para la sanación racial en nuestro país, una Hora Santa contra el racismo, un Vía Crucis para la superación del racismo, y textos de muestra para la Oración universal.

Entre sus Misas y oraciones por varias necesidades y para diversas circunstancias, el Misal Romano contiene varias Misas que están especialmente relacionadas con este tema:

- “Para fomentar la concordia” (n. 15)
- “Por la reconciliación” (n. 16)
- “Por el progreso de los pueblos” (n. 29)
- “Por la paz y la justicia” (n. 30)

Se utilizan vestimentas del color del día o del tiempo litúrgico, pero si estas celebraciones tuvieran un carácter más penitencial, se podrá llevar el color violeta. Una de las Plegarias eucarísticas “de la Reconciliación” se utiliza apropiadamente con cada uno de estos formularios.

El Prefacio de la Plegaria eucarística “de la Reconciliación” I destaca la reconciliación del género humano con Dios Padre (“La reconciliación con el Padre en Cristo”) y el Prefacio de la Plegaria eucarística “de la Reconciliación” II destaca la reconciliación de los seres humanos entre sí (“El don de la reconciliación entre los hombres”).

#### Acción

Cuidar la dignidad de todas las razas y etnias es una tarea de individuos y comunidades. Un buen lugar para comenzar es la carta pastoral de 2018 de los obispos de los Estados Unidos contra el racismo, “Abramos nuestros corazones: El incesante llamado al amor”. En ella, los obispos reflexionan sobre la experiencia de los nativos americanos, afroamericanos e hispanos y destacan formas de que “abramos nuestros corazones de par en par”, por ejemplo, reconocer el pecado, estar abiertos al encuentro y a nuevas relaciones, y cambiar estructuras. Queridos hermanos,

Con profunda gratitud y sincera alegría, les escribo hoy para celebrar un hito monumental en la vida de nuestra parroquia. Tras ocho años de dedicación, sacrificio y fe inquebrantable, hemos saldado oficialmente la deuda del Centro Gonzaga. ¡Qué testimonio tan notable del poder de la comunidad, la perseverancia y la administración! Nos embarcamos en el ambicioso proyecto de construir un espacio donde la formación en la fe, el ministerio pastoral, las reuniones parroquiales y un sinnúmero de actos de servicio pudieran arraigarse y florecer. El Centro Gonzaga fue diseñado para ser un hogar, un centro, para nuestra misión de formar discípulos y construir comunidad. Esta meta fue todo menos que fácil. La devastación causada por el huracán Harvey requirió una reconstrucción inesperada y costosa. Sin embargo, por la gracia de Dios, y gracias a su fe y generosidad, ¡lo logramos! El 30 de junio de 2025, realizamos el pago final del pagaré global. Es un logro extraordinario, especialmente en tiempos de incertidumbre financiera para muchas familias e instituciones. Este éxito no habría sido posible sin las generosas contribuciones de tantos feligreses, el liderazgo diligente y prudente de nuestro Consejo de Finanzas durante estos ocho años, y la cuidadosa administración de nuestro personal, que examinó cada gasto con la máxima responsabilidad. Demostramos que quienes nos criticaban estaban equivocados, no por orgullo ni poder, sino por unidad y sacrificio compartido. Esto no es solo el cierre de un capítulo financiero, sino el comienzo de uno nuevo. Un capítulo en el que podemos soñar en grande, llegar más lejos y servir con mayor intensidad.

Al celebrar este hito, también es momento de reflexionar sobre el fundamento que lo hizo posible: la corresponsabilidad bíblica. Con frecuencia, pensamos en la corresponsabilidad solo en términos financieros. Pero la verdadera corresponsabilidad, basada en las Escrituras, es un estilo de vida. Es una respuesta a la verdad de que todo lo que tenemos —nuestro tiempo, nuestros talentos, nuestro tesoro— es un regalo de Dios, confiado a nosotros para un propósito mayor. En la vida de un católico romano, la corresponsabilidad comienza con la ofrenda de nuestro tiempo, especialmente en la oración. Dedicar tiempo a Dios cada día en silencio, la Escritura y los sacramentos forman el corazón del discípulo. Jesús se apartaba con frecuencia de las multitudes para orar, enseñándonos con su ejemplo que la oración no es opcional, sino esencial. La corresponsabilidad del tiempo significa priorizar nuestra relación con el Señor en medio de agendas apretadas. El talento se refiere a los dones y habilidades únicos que cada uno de nosotros posee. Ningún don es demasiado pequeño para servir en el Reino. Ya seas bueno organizando eventos, enseñando, escuchando, cocinando, arreglando cosas, cantando o simplemente estando presente, hay un lugar para ti en la vida de la Iglesia. La administración del talento nos llama a poner nuestros dones al servicio de los demás. El tesoro, por supuesto, se refiere a las bendiciones financieras que hemos recibido. La administración bíblica nos invita a devolver una parte de nuestros ingresos a Dios, no por culpa ni obligación, sino como un alegre acto de agradecimiento. La ofrenda de la viuda en el Evangelio nos recuerda que la generosidad no se mide por la cantidad, sino por el sacrificio y el amor.

El propósito de la corresponsabilidad bíblica es la transformación de nuestros corazones, nuestros hogares y nuestra parroquia. La corresponsabilidad nos alinea con la voluntad de Dios. Nos libera de la ilusión de propiedad y nos invita a una relación de confianza y generosidad. Nos hace mejores discípulos: personas más devotas, más generosas y más conectadas con las necesidades de los demás. Si no estás seguro de cómo empezar a vivir como corresponsable, te animo a empezar poco a poco. Empieza por dedicar diez minutos cada día a la oración. Reflexiona sobre los dones que Dios te ha dado y pregúntate cómo podrían usarse para el bien de la parroquia o de la comunidad en general. Considera hacer una contribución financiera regular a la parroquia, incluso una modesta, como muestra de tu compromiso y confianza. Para quienes provienen de un contexto donde la corresponsabilidad no se enfatizó cultural o espiritualmente, entiendo que esta forma de pensar puede resultarles desconocida. Pero les insto a considerar esto: lo que damos, nunca lo perdemos. Al dar, nos volvemos más libres. Al compartir, nos convertimos en nosotros mismos más plenamente. Al sacrificarnos, nos asemejamos más a Cristo. Imaginen cómo sería nuestra parroquia si cada miembro adoptara la corresponsabilidad como estilo de vida. Nuestros ministerios se desbordarían. Nuestro culto se enriquecería. Nuestro alcance se profundizaría. Nuestros jóvenes se empoderarían. Y, sobre todo, nos convertiríamos en un testimonio aún mayor del Evangelio en nuestra comunidad local.

Nuestro lema parroquial es *"Personas para los Demás"*. La corresponsabilidad da vida a esa visión. Cuando damos de nosotros mismos —nuestro tiempo, talento y tesoro— no solo apoyamos programas o financiamos edificios. Estamos construyendo el Reino de Dios. Como nos enseña San Ignacio de Loyola en su oración del *Suscipe*: *"Toma, Señor, y recibe toda mi libertad, mi memoria, mi entendimiento y toda mi voluntad; todo lo que tengo y poseo. Tú me lo has dado todo. A ti, Señor, te lo devuelvo"*. Esa es la esencia de la corresponsabilidad. Esa es el alma del discipulado. Y ese es el futuro que estamos llamados a abrazar, juntos.

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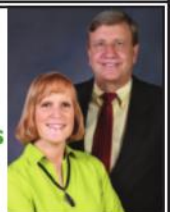
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
