

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

“*Ad Maiorem Dei Gloriam*” — For the Greater Glory of God. These words, the motto of St. Ignatius of Loyola and of the Society of Jesus which he founded, guide us as we celebrate the Solemnity of our patron, St. Ignatius. This is a joyous occasion for our parish community, and I extend heartfelt congratulations to each of you as we gather to honor the life, witness, and enduring spiritual legacy of the man whose name we proudly bear. Although July 31 is the universal feast day of St. Ignatius, the Church allows parishes dedicated to a saint to celebrate that saint’s feast as a solemnity, the highest rank of liturgical celebration, and even to transfer it to the nearest Sunday. Why? Because a patronal solemnity is more than a remembrance — it is a spiritual homecoming. The Church encourages communities to enter deeply into the life and vision of their patron saint, to celebrate what God has done through them, and to recommit ourselves to the mission they have entrusted to us. For us at St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish, this feast is not just about celebrating a historical figure. It is a renewal of our identity as a people grounded in the spirituality of St. Ignatius—an identity shaped by discernment, prayerful reflection, action, and service. His life story speaks to all of us, especially in our journey of conversion and discipleship.

Born in 1491 in the Basque region of Spain, Iñigo López de Loyola was, by all worldly standards, destined for a life of ambition and honor on the battlefield. But God had other plans. In 1521, while defending the fortress of Pamplona, a cannonball shattered his leg and changed the trajectory of his life. During his long recovery, he read the only books available: one on the life of Christ and another on the lives of the saints. Slowly, a conversion took root in his soul. The vanity and glory of the world faded in comparison to the joy and peace he discovered in surrendering his will to God. Ignatius became a pilgrim, seeking God in all things. He spent time in solitude, penance, and prayer in a cave in Manresa, where he composed the beginnings of his Spiritual Exercises, a profound guide to deepening one’s relationship with God through contemplation, discernment, and service. Eventually, he gathered companions who shared his vision of serving Christ in the world, and in 1540, Pope Paul III approved the formation of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits). Their mission was clear: to go wherever the need was greatest and to do everything for the greater glory of God.

That same mission lives in us today. Here at St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish, we continue his legacy by striving to become a people for others—formed by the Word, nourished by the Eucharist, and sent out as missionary disciples. We accompany one another on the journey of faith, listening for God’s voice in the quiet of our hearts, and responding with generous love to the needs of the world around us. Our parish is alive with the spirit of Ignatian spirituality. From adult faith formation and retreats to service projects and youth ministry, we are learning to ask the central Ignatian question: “What more can I do for Christ?” This question animates our outreach, our prayer, our care for one another, and our response to the call of the Gospel.

One shining example of this Ignatian spirit at work can be seen in our youth. I am excited to announce that five of our high school youth have been selected to serve on the Archdiocesan Youth Council for the 2025–2026 term: Darek Aguirre, Maria Fernanda Bolivar Prince, Christina Dao, Eva Cuellar, Abby Cunningham. This is no small honor! The Archdiocesan Youth Council is composed of over 100 youth from across the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston. These young leaders will assist with the planning and implementation of evangelization programs, retreats, and gatherings—forming a vital bridge between the needs of young Catholics and the broader Church. Let us pray for them and support them as they respond to this exciting call to servant leadership.

As we look ahead, I want to remind all families that registration is now open for our catechetical programs at every level—from early childhood through adult formation. Whether it’s preparing for the sacraments, learning the faith anew, or walking more deeply with Christ, these programs are an essential way we fulfill our mission to form missionary disciples of all ages. In the words of St. Ignatius, “He who goes about to reform the world must begin with himself.” Let us form ourselves well so that we may serve others more faithfully.

My friends, let this solemnity of St. Ignatius be more than just a liturgical observance. Let it be a moment of conversion—as it was for Ignatius. May it move us to “find God in all things,” to be attentive to the stirrings of the Spirit, and to discern our daily decisions with open hearts. Let us renew our commitment to live for the greater glory of God, trusting always in His grace and mercy to guide us. St. Ignatius once said, “Love ought to show itself in deeds more than in words.” May our celebration today inspire us to love more deeply, serve more generously, and walk more courageously as a people for others, rooted in Christ and sent to the world.

The freedom to be good

What does it mean to be free? For some it's a matter of not being trapped in oppressive circumstances, like an unsatisfying job, a difficult relationship, or an illness. For others it's the ability to find ways to live creatively within those situations. Some say freedom is about having choices. And there are those who think it's simply being able to do whatever they want. Christians believe Christ has freed them to discern what is truly important: to be generous rather than selfish; kind instead of cruel; truthful rather than deceptive. Use your freedom to choose the ways of Christ.

Keep it on the down low

The Bible says Moses was the meekest man in the world. Today's saint, John Vianney, a.k.a. the Curé of Ars, was pretty lowly in his own right. It was said that he had a poor memory and no ability whatsoever to grasp abstract thought. In seminary he failed essential subjects like theology and Latin. But they ordained him anyway because his lowness allowed God's love to shine through. Unlike others who let their ambitions get the best of them, Saint John Vianney stuck to his strengths. He cared for the people he was sent to serve. He advised other priests: "Do not try to please everybody. Try to please God, the angels, and the saints—they are your public." Good advice for all of us to follow.

God is waiting for you

You have to admire Moses. Two people close to him—Aaron and Miriam—had started asking why they couldn't be prophets, too. To settle the matter God called the three of them out for a talking-to: God trusted Moses, God said—end of argument. What's more, God punished Miriam with an instant case of leprosy. But Moses just as quickly asked the Lord to forgive Miriam. We see something similar when Jesus called Saint Peter to walk out on the water to him. Peter's initial faith sank pretty quickly, but Jesus caught him before he could go under. It's a virtue to keep faith—and to reach out a forgiving hand to others when they have not kept faith with you. God does it all the time. Remember the words of Saint Maria Goretti, the patron saint of forgiveness: "He loves, He hopes, He waits. Our Lord prefers to wait Himself for the sinner for years rather than keep us waiting an instant."

Numbers 12:1-13; Matthew 14:22-36 or 15:1-2, 10-14 (408). "He cried out, 'Lord, save me!'"

Use your power for good

The two events we remember today offer a startling juxtaposition of images. First is the brilliant light radiating from Jesus as he is transformed on the mountaintop and the cloud from which is heard: "This is my beloved Son; listen to him." Next to that is Hiroshima, Japan on August 6, 1945: a blinding flash of light, a dense, dark, demonic mushroom cloud, and the greatest devastation humankind has ever seen. These images prompt us to consider the ways we use our knowledge and power, both individually and as a nation. Does our "light," like Jesus', provide illumination, or cause blindness? To realize what we've done after the fact is too late. As Albert Einstein himself reportedly

lamented about the atomic bomb, "If only I had known, I would have become a locksmith."

Words to live by

Sixtus II became pope in 257 and was martyred almost a year later along with several deacons. Not only was he willing to die for Christ, it is inscribed on his tomb that he also offered himself first to the persecutors with the hope of saving his companions. Sixtus championed the belief that only one Baptism was necessary in life—it needn't be repeated, as some others claimed at the time. Once baptized in Christ, you always will be. That permanence makes extraordinary sacrifice possible. Indeed, through your Baptism, "you have become a new creation and clothed yourself in Christ," says the celebrant during the baptismal ritual. "See in this white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity. With your family and friends to help you by word and example, bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of heaven." Those are the words Christians choose to live by.

Bother to love

The Jesuit theologian James Keenan once said that sin was simply not bothering to love. Note: Sin isn't the absence of love; love is already there. Rather it's the failure to choose to take advantage of opportunities to love. Saint Dominic, the founder of the Order of Preachers, and Dominican brothers and sisters ever since have sought to put knowledge and love together guided by their motto: "To praise, to bless, to preach." You can do the same. Review your day and see where you did not bother to love or, in Dominican terms, to offer praise, a blessing, or a good word. Then take the trouble to do it tomorrow.

What would you risk?

Three Spanish saints—Ignatius of Loyola, Teresa of Ávila, and John of the Cross—wrote extensively on suffering and the role of the cross. Their writings helped draw Edith Stein (later Carmelite Sister Teresa Benedicta) into the life of the church. Even before the rise of Nazism, Teresa Benedicta, a Jewish convert to Catholicism who was gassed at Auschwitz in 1942, saw the cross as central in her own life: "I understood the cross as the destiny of God's people. . . I felt that those who understood the cross of Christ should take it upon themselves on everybody's behalf." How willing are you to take up the cross on behalf of others? What would you risk for the sake of what is right and just?





Please note that Mass dates and times are first-come, first-served and, the intention(s) of only one donor is allowed per Mass.



Queridos hermanos,

"Ad Maiorem Dei Gloriam" — Para la mayor gloria de Dios. Estas palabras, lema de San Ignacio de Loyola y de la Compañía de Jesús la cual él fundó, nos guían al celebrar la solemnidad de nuestro santo patrón, San Ignacio. Esta es una ocasión de alegría para nuestra comunidad parroquial, y les extiendo mis más sinceras felicitaciones a cada uno de ustedes al reunirnos para honrar la vida, el testimonio y el perdurable legado espiritual del hombre cuyo nombre llevamos con orgullo. Aunque el 31 de julio es la festividad universal de San Ignacio, la Iglesia permite a las parroquias dedicadas a un santo celebrar su festividad como solemnidad, el máximo rango de celebración litúrgica, e incluso trasladarla al domingo más cercano. ¿Por qué? Porque una solemnidad patronal es más que un recuerdo: es un regreso espiritual. La Iglesia anima a las comunidades a profundizar en la vida y la visión de su santo patrón, a celebrar lo que Dios ha hecho a través de ellos y a renovar nuestro compromiso con la misión que nos han confiado. Para nosotros en la Parroquia de San Ignacio de Loyola, esta fiesta no se trata solo de celebrar a una figura histórica. Es una renovación de nuestra identidad como pueblo, arraigada en la espiritualidad de San Ignacio: una identidad forjada por el discernimiento, la reflexión orante, la acción y el servicio. Su historia nos habla a todos, especialmente en nuestro camino de conversión y discipulado.

Nacido en 1491 en el País Vasco español, Íñigo López de Loyola estaba, según todos los estándares mundanos, destinado a una vida de ambición y honor en el campo de batalla. Pero Dios tenía otros planes. En 1521, mientras defendía la fortaleza de Pamplona, una bala de cañón le destrozó una pierna y cambió el rumbo de su vida. Durante su larga recuperación, leyó los únicos libros disponibles: uno sobre la vida de Cristo y otro sobre la vida de los santos. Poco a poco, una conversión arraigó en su alma. La vanidad y la gloria del mundo se desvanecieron en comparación con la alegría y la paz que descubrió al entregar su voluntad a Dios. Ignacio se convirtió en peregrino, buscando a Dios en todas las cosas. Pasó tiempo en soledad, penitencia y oración en una cueva de Manresa, donde compuso los inicios de sus Ejercicios Espirituales, una guía profunda para profundizar la relación con Dios a través de la contemplación, el discernimiento y el servicio. Con el tiempo, reunió a compañeros que compartían su visión de servir a Cristo en el mundo, y en 1540, el Papa Pablo III aprobó la formación de la Compañía de Jesús (Jesuitas). Su misión era clara: ir donde más se necesitará y hacer todo para la mayor gloria de Dios.

Esa misma misión vive en nosotros hoy. Aquí, en la Parroquia de San Ignacio de Loyola, continuamos su legado esforzándonos por ser personas para los demás, formados por la Palabra, alimentados por la Eucaristía y enviados como discípulos misioneros. Nos acompañamos en el camino de la fe, escuchando la voz de Dios en la quietud de nuestros corazones y respondiendo con amor generoso a las necesidades del mundo que nos rodea. Nuestra parroquia está viva con el espíritu de la espiritualidad ignaciana. Desde la formación en la fe para adultos y los retiros hasta los proyectos de servicio y el ministerio juvenil, estamos aprendiendo a plantearnos la pregunta central ignaciana: "¿Qué más puedo hacer por Cristo?". Esta pregunta anima nuestro compromiso con los demás, nuestra oración, nuestro cuidado mutuo y nuestra respuesta al llamado del Evangelio.

Un ejemplo brillante de este espíritu ignaciano en acción se puede ver en nuestros jóvenes. Me complace anunciar que cinco de nuestros jóvenes de preparatoria han sido seleccionados para servir en el Consejo Arquidiocesano de la Juventud para el período 2025-2026: Darek Aguirre, María Fernanda Bolívar Prince, Christina Dao, Eva Cuellar y Abby Cunningham. ¡Este es un gran honor! El Consejo Arquidiocesano de la Juventud está compuesto por más de 100 jóvenes de toda la Arquidiócesis de Galveston-Houston. Estos jóvenes líderes ayudarán en la planificación e implementación de programas de evangelización, retiros y reuniones, creando un puente vital entre las necesidades de los jóvenes católicos y la Iglesia en general. Oremos por ellos y apoyémoslos mientras responden a este emocionante llamado al liderazgo de servicio.

Con cara al futuro, quiero recordar a todas las familias que ya está abierta la inscripción para nuestros programas de catequesis en todos los niveles, desde la primera infancia hasta la formación de adultos. San Ignacio dijo: «El amor debe manifestarse con hechos más que con palabras». Que nuestra celebración de hoy nos inspire a amar más profundamente, servir con más generosidad y caminar con más valentía como personas para los demás, arraigados en Cristo y enviados al mundo.
