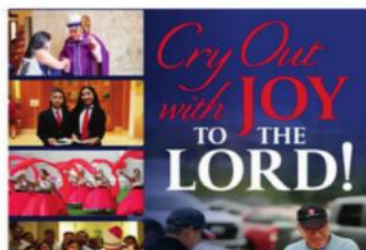

PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Grace and peace to you in our Lord Jesus Christ! As we continue to grow together as *people for others*, I present today the first in a series of three pastoral letters introducing and reflecting upon the Catholic principles of stewardship—a way of life deeply rooted in our identity as missionary disciples. Guided by the lens of Ignatian Spirituality, we will explore what it means to live as stewards of all that God has entrusted to us, beginning in this letter with the stewardship of talent, and in future letters turning to time and treasure.

The U.S. Bishops teach us that “*stewardship is part of discipleship and is a way of responding to the call to follow Jesus.*” (USCCB, *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*). As Catholic Christians, our lives are not our own—they are a sacred trust. God, in His infinite generosity, has blessed each of us uniquely. These blessings are not given merely for our own benefit, but for the building up of His Kingdom on earth. St. Ignatius of Loyola expressed a similar sentiment in his First Principle and Foundation, where he reminds us that we are created “*to praise, reverence, and serve God our Lord, and by this means to save [our] soul.*” The gifts God has poured into our lives—our energy, skills, knowledge, personality, passions, and creativity—are given so that we may serve God and one another more fully.

To be a steward of talent means we recognize that our abilities and aptitudes are not earned independently but are freely given by God. The bishops write, “*Each of us has received a unique set of talents and gifts from God. Stewardship calls us to nurture and develop these gifts and to use them generously in service to others.*” (USCCB, *Stewardship and Development: A Vision for the Future*). In Ignatian terms, we are called to be “contemplatives in action”—men and women who discern how best to use our gifts in the real, concrete situations of our daily lives. Whether we are teachers, mechanics, artists, engineers, musicians, nurses, retirees, or students, each of us has something to offer the Body of Christ. Living as stewards of our talents means being intentional in the use of these gifts—not letting them sit idle, but putting them at the service of God and community. We are reminded of the parable of the talents (Mt 25:14–30), where the master entrusts his servants with varying amounts of money—each according to their ability—and expects a return on his investment. The one who hides the gift out of fear is reprimanded. So too, when we fail to recognize and use our gifts for good, we bury the treasure God has placed within us. True stewardship calls us to courageous, generous action.

Discernment, a key principle of Ignatian Spirituality, invites us to pause, pray, and reflect deeply on how God is calling us to serve. Begin by asking yourself: What brings me life and joy when I serve others? What have others affirmed in me as gifts or strengths? Where do I see a need that tugs at my heart? In Ignatius' own journey, his initial dreams of worldly glory were transformed by grace. While recovering from injury, he noticed that reading the lives of the saints left him consoled and energized, while fantasies of knighthood eventually left him empty. This was the beginning of his discernment—a discovery of the talents God had placed within him and how they were meant to be used. So too with us. Our deepest desires and God's will are not at odds. In fact, Ignatius would say they are often one and the same—when rightly ordered and generously offered for the service of others.

Our parish, like the universal Church, depends on the active participation of each member. We are not an audience. We are not consumers. We are the Body of Christ, and each one of us is a vital part of that Body. Already, we see so many of you sharing your talents through liturgical ministries, music, teaching faith formation, repairing facilities, accompanying youth, helping the poor, leading Bible studies, supporting the grieving, and more. Every act—seen or unseen—is a contribution to our common mission of proclaiming the Gospel and forming missionary disciples. The invitation today is to renew your sense of calling. If your talents are not currently being shared, ask the Lord in prayer where He might be nudging you. And if you're already serving, take time to reflect on how your gifts might be deepened, expanded, or redirected in this season of life. As the bishops remind us, “*Good stewards never stop growing in their understanding of how to live as stewards of the Gospel.*” Let us be a parish that nurtures each person's gifts and provides space for every voice and vocation.

In the coming weeks, I invite you to pray the *Suscipe* of St. Ignatius each morning: “*Take, Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and my entire will, all I have and call my own. You have given all to me. To you, Lord, I return it. Everything is yours; do with it what you will. Give me only your love and your grace. That is enough for me.*” May this prayer become the foundation of our stewardship—of talent, time, and treasure.

As always, know of my prayers for each of you. I will be away this week for my usual mid-August respite to celebrate the ending of another year around the sun and the beginning of the next trip 😊. In my absence, please welcome the visiting priests and continue to build one another up in faith and service.

Jesus offers a different vision when he assures us that God is pleased to give us the Kingdom. There is nothing to earn here, nothing to be gained, nothing to be lost. Monday, Aug 11, 2025**Keep it simple**

Isn't it amazing how much stuff we collect in our lives? You move into a house or an apartment with a few things and you think you've got plenty of room. But within a short period of time, you've got no place left to put all of it. Saint Clare didn't have that problem. Although from a wealthy family, she embraced a life of strict and total poverty, possessing absolutely nothing for the sake of the joy that comes with possessing only Christ. And joyful she was for nearly 40 years, so much so that she was declared a saint only two years after she died. “We become what we love and who we love shapes what we become,” advises Clare. Striving toward holiness and sainthood? Start with a little simple living.

Saint Jane Frances de Chantal, who founded the Visitation Sisters in France 400 years ago, suffered years of interior anguish and spiritual dryness. Her contemporary, Saint Francis de Sales, said of her struggles: “For all that suffering her face never lost its serenity, nor did she once relax in the fidelity God asked of her. And so I regard her as one of the holiest souls I have ever met on this earth.” Her way of enduring through difficult times reflects the order's motto: “Live Jesus.” Whatever your inner struggle, hold fast to your faith and your holiness will shine through.

Wednesday, Aug 13, 2025**Forgiveness ever available**

What may be one of the strangest reconciliations in church history occurred between Pontian and Hippolytus. Pontian became pope in 235 A.D.—just in time for the Roman persecution of Christians. He spent most of his reign as a slave in the mines of Sardinia. Hippolytus, who was at odds with the papacy, got the idea to have his followers name him pope. But he was swept up in the same persecution that netted Pontian. Now both in prison, Hippolytus repented to the true pope, Pontian, and Pontian reconciled him to the church. As today's two saints came to know, forgiveness is always possible, no matter the circumstances. For as Hippolytus notes: “Christ is easily found by those who live by faith and to those of pure eye

and holy heart, who desire to knock at the door, he opens immediately.”

Thursday, Aug 14, 2025**When compromise is not an option**

Maximilian Kolbe was a Franciscan friar who offered his life to save that of a stranger sentenced to die in the Auschwitz concentration camp. Canonized in 1982, he also was honored in 1998 as one of ten 20th-century Christian martyrs commemorated with statues over Westminster Abbey in London. The martyrs represent victims of religious persecution and oppression worldwide. “There has never been a time in Christian history when someone, somewhere, has not died rather than compromise with the powers of oppression, tyranny, and unbelief,” said the Rev. Dr. Anthony Harvey, sub-dean of Westminster, when the statues were unveiled in 1998. They responded when their faith was tested. Can we do the same?

Friday, Aug 15, 2025**Every body deserves respect**

Assumption is a teaching about the Mother of God, but this dogma has much to say about all of us. It affirms the dignity of our bodies and how God is mindful of every hair on our heads. In an era when the idea of the human person is continually under assault—from the arena of public policy to the refugee camps and killing fields of war—Mary's Assumption is a divine response to our deepest fears as well as our greatest hopes about the fate of our bodies. “Mary is assumed into heaven: small and humble,” said Pope Saint John Paul II. “She, a human creature, one of us, attains eternity in soul and body. And there she awaits us as a mother waits for her children to come home.” Honor your body and the bodies of others in ways that would make your Mother Mary proud.

Saturday, Aug 16, 2025**Practice patience on everyone**

In the year 2000 Hungarians celebrated the 1,000th anniversary of the founding of their country by Saint Stephen, who not only created one nation out of numerous tribes but also made it Christian. Though Stephen had already been canonized by the Roman Church centuries before, to mark the millennium, the Eastern Orthodox Church also canonized him—an unprecedented gesture endorsed by Pope Saint John Paul II, who emphasized the need for Christians more than ever to work together. Stephen's admonitions to his son Emeric include the words: “Be merciful to all who are suffering violence . . . Be patient with everyone, not only with the powerful, but also with the weak.” Spare a little more patience for the weakest and strongest in your own life.

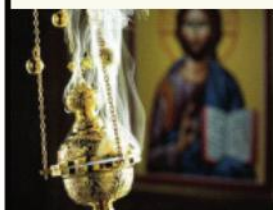

FIN DE SEMANA DE LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD AGOSTO 23-24





Queridos hermanos,

¡Gracia y paz a ustedes en nuestro Señor Jesucristo! Mientras seguimos creciendo juntos como *personas para los demás*, les presento hoy la primera de una serie de tres cartas pastorales que presentan y reflexionan sobre los principios católicos de la corresponsabilidad responsable, un estilo de vida profundamente arraigado en nuestra identidad como discípulos misioneros. Guiados por la espiritualidad ignaciana, exploraremos lo que significa vivir como corresponsales de todo lo que Dios nos ha confiado, comenzando en esta carta con la corresponsabilidad del talento y, en futuras cartas, abordando el tiempo y los tesoros.

Los obispos estadounidenses nos enseñan que *“la corresponsabilidad forma parte del discipulado y es una forma de responder al llamado a seguir a Jesús”* (USCCB, *Corresponsabilidad: La respuesta de un discípulo*). Como cristianos católicos, nuestras vidas no nos pertenecen; son un encargo sagrado. Dios, en su infinita generosidad, nos ha bendecido a cada uno de manera única. Estas bendiciones no se dan solo para nuestro propio beneficio, sino para la edificación de su Reino aquí en la tierra. San Ignacio de Loyola expresó un sentimiento similar en su Primer Principio y Fundamento, donde nos recuerda que fuimos creados *“para alabar, venerar y servir a Dios nuestro Señor, y por este medio para salvar [nuestra] alma”*. Los dones que Dios ha derramado en nuestras vidas —nuestra energía, habilidades, conocimiento, personalidad, pasiones y creatividad— nos son dados para que podamos servir a Dios y a los demás más plenamente.

Ser corresponsales de talentos significa reconocer que nuestras habilidades y aptitudes no se ganan de forma independiente, sino que son otorgadas libremente por Dios. Los obispos escriben: *«Cada uno de nosotros ha recibido un conjunto único de talentos y dones de Dios. La corresponsabilidad nos llama a nutrir y desarrollar estos dones y a usarlos generosamente al servicio de los demás»* (USCCB, *Administración y Desarrollo: Una Visión para el Futuro*). En términos ignacianos, estamos llamados a ser «contemplativos en acción»: hombres y mujeres que discernen la mejor manera de usar nuestros dones en las situaciones reales y concretas de nuestra vida diaria. Ya seamos maestros, mecánicos, artistas, ingenieros, músicos, enfermeros, jubilados o estudiantes, cada uno de nosotros tiene algo que ofrecer al Cuerpo de Cristo. Vivir como corresponsales de nuestros talentos significa ser intencionales en el uso de estos dones, no dejándolos inactivos, sino poniéndolos al servicio de Dios y de la comunidad. Recordamos la parábola de los talentos (Mt 25:14-30), donde el amo confía a sus siervos diversas cantidades de dinero, cada uno según su capacidad, y espera una recompensa por su inversión. Quien esconde el don por miedo recibe una reprimenda. De la misma manera, cuando no reconocemos ni usamos nuestros dones para el bien, enterramos el tesoro que Dios ha puesto en nosotros. La verdadera corresponsabilidad nos llama a actuar con valentía y generosidad.

El discernimiento, principio clave de la espiritualidad ignaciana, nos invita a detenernos, orar y reflexionar profundamente sobre cómo Dios nos llama a servir. Comienza por preguntarte: ¿Qué me llena de vida y alegría cuando sirvo a los demás? ¿Qué dones o fortalezas han afirmado otros en mí? ¿Dónde veo una necesidad que me conmueve? En el camino de Ignacio, sus sueños iniciales de gloria terrenal fueron transformados por la gracia. Mientras se recuperaba de una lesión, notó que leer las vidas de los santos lo consolaba y le llenaba de energía, mientras que las fantasías de caballero finalmente lo dejaban vacío. Este fue el comienzo de su discernimiento: un descubrimiento de los talentos que Dios había depositado en él y cómo debían usarse. Lo mismo ocurre con nosotros. Nuestros deseos más profundos y la voluntad de Dios no están en desacuerdo. De hecho, Ignacio diría que a menudo son uno y lo mismo, cuando se ordenan correctamente y se ofrecen generosamente al servicio de los demás.

Nuestra parroquia, al igual que la Iglesia universal, depende de la participación activa de cada miembro. No somos una audiencia. No somos consumidores. Somos el Cuerpo de Cristo, y cada uno de nosotros es parte vital de ese Cuerpo. Ya vemos a muchos de ustedes compartiendo sus talentos a través de los ministerios litúrgicos, la música, la enseñanza de la formación en la fe, la reparación de instalaciones, el acompañamiento a los jóvenes, la ayuda a los pobres, la dirección de estudios bíblicos, el apoyo a los dolientes y más. Cada acto, visible o invisible, contribuye a nuestra misión común de proclamar el Evangelio y formar discípulos misioneros. La invitación de hoy es a renovar su sentido de vocación. Si sus talentos no se comparten actualmente, pídanle al Señor en oración que les dirija a dónde podría estar inspirándolos. Y si ya están sirviendo, dediquen tiempo a reflexionar sobre cómo sus dones podrían profundizarse, expandirse o redirigirse en esta etapa de la vida. Como nos recuerdan los obispos: *«Los buenos Corresponsales nunca dejan de crecer en su comprensión de cómo vivir como corresponsales del Evangelio»*. Seamos una parroquia que nutra los dones de cada persona y ofrezca espacio para cada voz y vocación.

En las próximas semanas, los invito a rezar el Suscipe (Acto de entrega de sí) de San Ignacio cada mañana: *“Toma, Señor, y recibe toda mi libertad, mi memoria, mi entendimiento y toda mi voluntad, todo mi haber y mi poseer. Tú me lo diste. A ti, Señor, te lo devuelvo. Todo es tuyo; haz con ello conforme tu voluntad. Dame tu amor y gracia que eso me basta”*. Que esta oración se convierta en el fundamento de nuestra corresponsabilidad de talento, tiempo y tesoro.

Como siempre, sepan que rezo por cada uno de ustedes. Estaré ausente esta semana para mi habitual descanso de mediados de agosto y celebrar el fin de otro año alrededor del sol y el comienzo del próximo viaje. 😊 En mi ausencia, les pido que den la bienvenida a los sacerdotes visitantes y continúen edificándose mutuamente en la fe y el servicio.

Con gratitud por cada uno de ustedes y una esperanza que no defrauda,

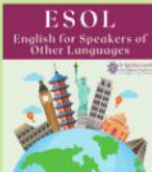

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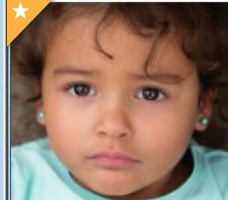
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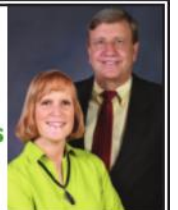
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
