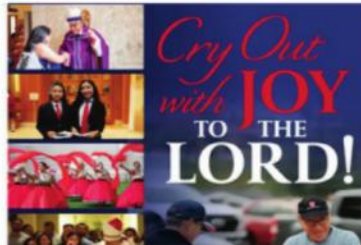

PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we continue our reflection on the biblical call to stewardship, I invite you to enter more deeply into the second pillar of this spiritual way of life: the stewardship of *time*. In my last pastoral letter, we explored the stewardship of *talent*, and in a future letter we will reflect on the stewardship of *treasure*. But today, I want to speak to you about something that often slips through our fingers unnoticed: time — especially time offered to God in prayer.

To be a steward is to be entrusted with something that belongs to another. In the biblical sense, stewardship is our grateful response to God's love. Everything we have — our lives, our gifts, our material possessions, our time — are entrusted to us by God, not for selfish use, but for His greater glory and the building up of the Kingdom. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) reminds us in their pastoral letter *Stewardship: A Disciple's Response* that "*a Christian steward is one who receives God's gifts gratefully, cherishes and tends them in a responsible and accountable manner, shares them in justice and love with others, and returns them with increase to the Lord.*" This call to stewardship is not optional for Catholics. It is an essential expression of our discipleship. We are called to live this out in all dimensions of our lives — including our time.

You may be familiar with the concept of "tithing" in relation to financial giving. Traditionally, to tithe means to give one-tenth (10%) of one's income to God through charitable works, most especially the Church. But did you know we are also called to "tithe" our *time*? And the most important part of that time is time spent in prayer. Let's break that down: 10% of 24 hours is 2 hours and 24 minutes. Imagine what our spiritual lives would look like if we set aside even a fraction of that each day for conversation with God — not just *talking* to or at God, but *listening* for God. Time for the Eucharist, yes — but also time for quiet reflection, Scripture reading, the rosary, intercessory prayer, and simply *being* with the Lord. This is what it means to "tithe to prayer." It is not only about quantity, but quality — intentionally giving God the *first fruits* of our time, not the leftovers.

Many Catholics associate "prayer" with Sunday Mass. While participation in the Eucharist is the *source and summit* of our faith and fulfills our weekly obligation, stewardship of time calls us beyond mere obligation. It calls us to a *relationship*. If we were to only speak with our closest friends or family members once a week for an hour, what kind of relationship would that be? Our relationship with God deserves more than that. It requires daily attention, space in our schedules, and priority in our hearts. And so, yes — we are called to give God more than just one hour on Sunday. We are called to live our lives in rhythm with prayer. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, "*Prayer is the life of the new heart. It ought to animate us at every moment*" (CCC 2697).

The call to offer our time in prayer is woven throughout Scripture and Tradition. Jesus Himself modeled this in His earthly ministry — rising early to pray, retreating from the crowds, spending entire nights in communion with His Father. The early Church was "devoted to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers" (Acts 2:42). The bishops of the United States are clear that stewardship includes "time spent with God in prayer and worship" (*Stewardship: A Disciple's Response*). So, yes — Roman Catholics are called to tithe our time. Not because it is an obligation, but because it is a *privilege* to spend time with the One who gave us life.

As individuals, when we make time for prayer, we grow in intimacy with Christ. We are strengthened in our identity as beloved sons and daughters of God. We become more attuned to the voice of the Holy Spirit and better able to discern how to use our gifts. Our inner peace deepens. Our purpose becomes clearer. As a parish, when more of us are rooted in prayer, our community is transformed. Ministries become more Spirit-led. Conflicts are approached with compassion. We become, more and more, *a people for others*. We no longer serve from obligation, but from love. We no longer ask "what do I get?" but "how can I give?" Prayer empowers us for mission. Stewardship of time prepares us to be missionary disciples — people who carry the Good News into our homes, neighborhoods, and workplaces because we are so deeply rooted in Christ that we cannot help but share Him. So, I challenge you: examine your schedule. Is there time for prayer? Not squeezed in when convenient, but intentionally carved out as the foundation of your day? If not, start small: ten minutes of silent prayer in the morning. A daily Rosary. Reading the Gospel of the day. Coming to daily Mass once a week. Joining a prayer group or Bible study this fall. We don't have to begin perfectly — we just have to begin. Let us become a parish who tithes our time to the Lord — joyfully, gratefully, and generously. For in giving time to God, we gain everything in return.

Sunday, Aug 17, 2025**Make no small plans**

"Be who God meant you to be and you will set the world on fire," says Saint Catherine of Siena. But who is it that God wants you to be? The search for that answer is what the church calls the "process of discernment." At various points in our lives, each of us must pause to ask: Where am I being called? What will ignite a fire within me—and set the world ablaze? As you determine your fiery course, consider this exhortation from Pope Francis: "We Christians were not chosen by the Lord for little things; push onwards toward the highest principles. Stake your lives on noble ideals."

Monday, Aug 18, 2025**Check your security system**

Why does having many possessions stand in the way of our spiritual freedom? If that is the case, why do we go to such great lengths to acquire things, and why is it so difficult to part with them, even when their usefulness to us is long gone? Perhaps it's because we all need something we can hold onto, and holding onto things we can see and touch is certainly an understandable response to insecurity. But ultimately perishable things will fail to deliver the hoped-for security, as each of us learns sooner or later in life. Our relationships with God and our fellow human beings are the only sources of security that can endure. As spiritual giant Thomas Merton put it, "In the end, relationships save everything."

Tuesday, Aug 19, 2025**Believe in the big picture**

"With God all things are possible" is surely one of the most well-known of Jesus' statements. It's short, optimistic, and, most important, we want it to be true. But when we look at the world around us, the words of the ancient Israelite Gideon more likely capture what's on our minds. "If the Lord is with us, why has all this happened?" What Gideon didn't know and we forget is that God holds the entire picture of creation, while we see only a very small piece. It's like viewing a corner of a painting and wondering why we can't make sense of the whole canvas. What's a believer to do? Believe. Believe in a loving, merciful God who makes all things possible. That's what Gideon did.

Judges 6:11-24a; Matthew 19:23-30 (420). "Alas, Lord GOD, that I have seen the angel of the LORD face to face!"

Wednesday, Aug 20, 2025**Cultivate your calm**

Bernard of Clairvaux, a French abbot of the 12th century, had a profound influence on the course of Catholicism at a time of great strife and intrigue in the church. He reformed monastic life, brought Marian devotion to the forefront of popular piety, and mediated between princes and popes. He was also instrumental in the founding of the Knights Templar, who came to embody the medieval ideal of a Christian knight. Amid the tumult of his age, he held fast to the conviction that the "three most important virtues are humility, humility, and humility." Our own time is no less turbulent.

Perhaps a touch of Saint Bernard's contemplative spirit—and his humility—could help us find calm today

Thursday, Aug 21, 2025**Turn the table on tyrants**

The concept of freedom is intrinsically linked with the struggle against tyranny. In the Lincoln-Douglas Debates, Abraham Lincoln explores two principles that, he says, have stood face to face from the beginning of time: the common right of humanity and the divine right of kings. It is an eternal push and pull of right and wrong, of a spirit that says, "You toil and work and earn bread, and I'll eat it." Whether in the context of a ruler or enslaver, "it is the same tyrannical principle," says Lincoln. Jesus describes a different type of reign where the king invites everyone to the table and defies norms by making the last first and the first last. This upside-down world is the one our Baptism in Christ calls us to espouse.

Friday, Aug 22, 2025**The royal we**

Though Mary was never crowned Queen of Heaven in scripture, she has long reigned as queen in the hearts of the faithful. Still, the question remains: In what way is her queenship real? Mary's royal stature holds meaning for us, apart from whatever it signifies in the divine realm. "She is a most tender and kind Queen," writes Saint Alphonsus Liguori, "eager to help us in our miseries. So much so that the church wants us to call her a Queen of Mercy." We, too, are invited to be a holy and royal people, shaped by divine mercy and loving-kindness. What Mary already possesses is a vision of what we can be. Give yourself and others the royal treatment. Start with a touch of love.

Saturday, Aug 23, 2025**Mary, most honored**

You may be familiar with the 16th-century Litany of Loreto, which gathers wonderful images of Mary such as Mother Admirable, Mystical Rose, Tower of Ivory, Gate of Heaven, and Morning Star. Saint Francis of Assisi in the 13th century had a similar litany, his "Salutation of the Virgin," which hails Mary as Christ's Palace, Tabernacle, Home, and, perhaps the most striking, Mary as "Virgin made church." Mary is the model for Christian discipleship. "Let it be done unto me according to God's word," she prays. Listen to Mary. She is always directing us toward her son, saying again and again, "Do what he tells you."

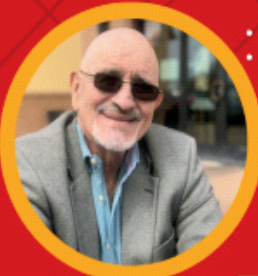

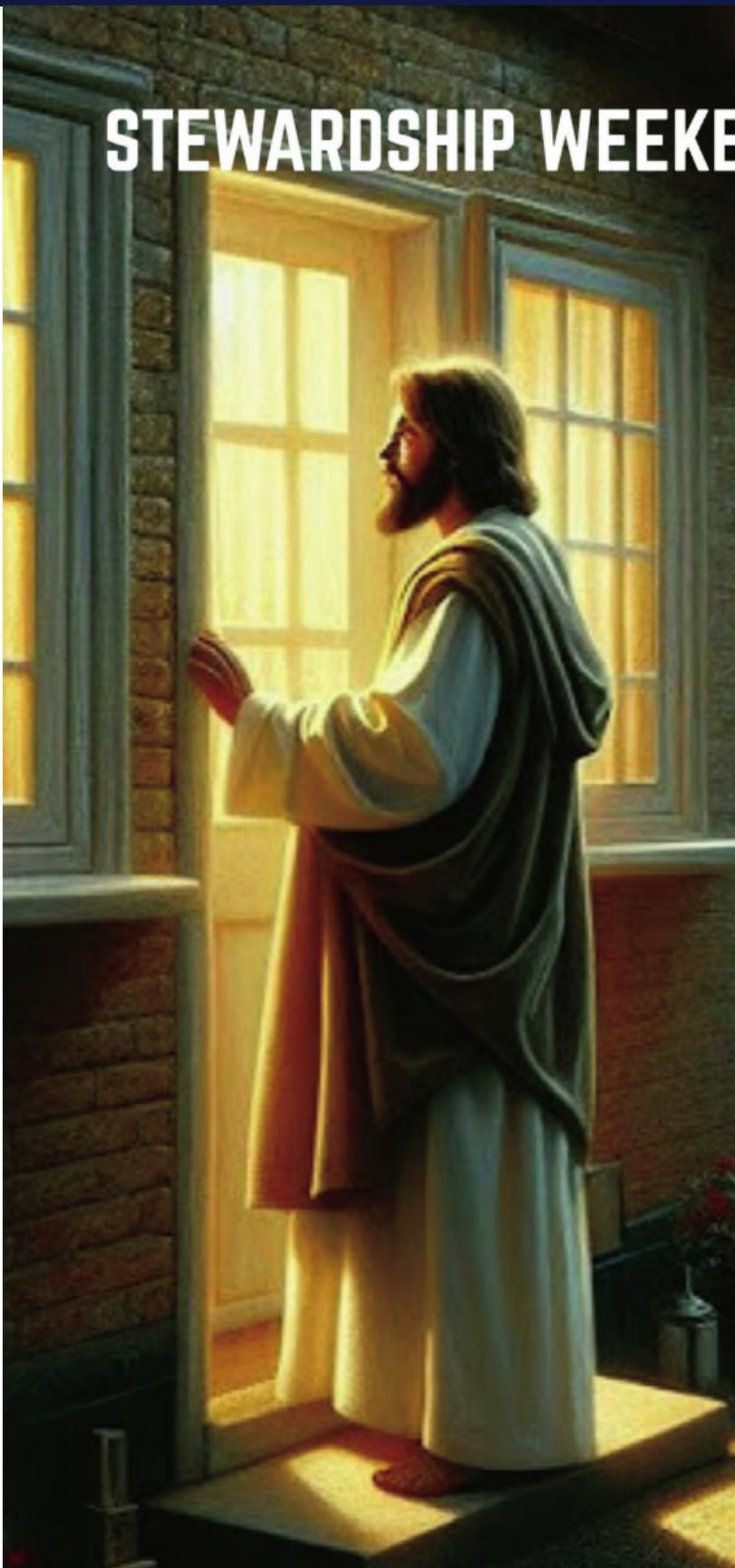

FIN DE SEMANA DE LA CORRESPONSABILIDAD AGOSTO 23-24





Queridos hermanos:

Al continuar nuestra reflexión sobre el llamado bíblico a la Corresponsabilidad, los invito a profundizar en el segundo pilar de este estilo de vida espiritual: la corresponsabilidad del tiempo. En mi última carta pastoral, exploramos la corresponsabilidad del talento, y en una próxima carta reflexionaremos sobre la corresponsabilidad del tesoro. Pero hoy quiero hablarles de algo que a menudo se nos escapa: el tiempo, especialmente el tiempo ofrecido a Dios en la oración.

Ser corresponsable es que se nos confíe algo que pertenece a otro. En el sentido bíblico, la corresponsabilidad es nuestra respuesta agradecida al amor de Dios. Todo lo que tenemos —nuestras vidas, nuestros dones, nuestras posesiones materiales, nuestro tiempo— nos lo ha confiado Dios, no para nuestro uso egoísta, sino para su mayor gloria y la edificación del Reino. *La Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos (USCCB) nos recuerda en su carta pastoral «Corresponsabilidad: La respuesta de un discípulo» que «un corresponsal cristiano es aquel que recibe los dones de Dios con gratitud, los aprecia y cuida de manera responsable, los comparte con justicia y amor con los demás y los devuelve con creces al Señor».* Este llamado a la corresponsabilidad no es opcional para los católicos. Es una expresión esencial de nuestro discipulado. Estamos llamados a vivir esto en todas las dimensiones de nuestra vida, incluyendo nuestro tiempo.

Quizás estés familiarizado con el concepto de "diezmar/ofrecer el diezmo" en relación con las donaciones financieras. Tradicionalmente, diezmar significa dar una décima parte (10%) de tus ingresos a Dios a través de obras de caridad, especialmente a la Iglesia. Pero ¿sabías que también estamos llamados a "diezmar" nuestro tiempo? Y la parte más importante de ese tiempo es el que dedicamos a la oración. Analicémoslo: el 10% de 24 horas son 2 horas y 24 minutos. Imagina cómo sería nuestra vida espiritual si dedicáramos, aunque sea una fracción de ese tiempo cada día a *conversar* con Dios; no solo a hablar con Dios, sino a *escucharlo*. Tiempo para la Eucaristía, sí, pero también tiempo para la *reflexión* en silencio, la lectura de las Escrituras, el rosario, la oración de intercesión y simplemente estar con el Señor. Esto es lo que significa "diezmar para la oración". No se trata solo de cantidad, sino de calidad: dar intencionalmente a Dios *las primicias de nuestro tiempo*, no las sobras.

Muchos católicos asocian la oración con la misa dominical. Si bien la participación en la Eucaristía es la fuente y cumbre de nuestra fe y cumple con nuestra obligación semanal, la administración del tiempo nos llama a ir más allá de la mera obligación. Nos llama a una relación. Si solo habláramos con nuestros amigos o familiares más cercanos una vez a la semana durante una hora, ¿qué clase de relación sería? Nuestra relación con Dios merece más que eso. Requiere atención diaria, espacio en nuestras agendas y prioridad en nuestros corazones. Y así, sí, estamos llamados a dedicarle a Dios más que solo una hora el domingo. Estamos llamados a vivir nuestras vidas al ritmo de la oración. Como enseña el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica: *«La oración es la vida del corazón nuevo. Debe animarnos en todo momento» (CIC 2697).*

El llamado a ofrecer nuestro tiempo en oración está presente en las Escrituras y la Tradición. Jesús mismo lo ejemplificó en su ministerio terrenal: madrugar para orar, alejarse de las multitudes y pasar noches enteras en comunión con su Padre. La Iglesia primitiva era «dedicada a la enseñanza de los apóstoles, a la comunión fraterna, a la fracción del pan y a las oraciones» (Hechos 2:42). Los obispos de Estados Unidos tienen claro que la corresponsabilidad incluye «tiempo dedicado a Dios en oración y adoración» (*Corresponsabilidad: La Respuesta de un Discípulo*). Así que, sí, los católicos romanos estamos llamados a diezmar nuestro tiempo. No porque sea una obligación, sino porque es *un privilegio* pasar tiempo con Aquel que nos dio la vida.

Como individuos, cuando dedicamos tiempo a la oración, crecemos en intimidad con Cristo. Nos fortalecemos en nuestra identidad como hijos e hijas amados de Dios. Nos sintonizamos más con la voz del Espíritu Santo y somos más capaces de discernir cómo usar nuestros dones. Nuestra paz interior se profundiza. Nuestro propósito se aclara. Como parroquia, cuando más personas se arraigan en la oración, nuestra comunidad se transforma. Los ministerios se vuelven más guiados por el Espíritu. Los conflictos se abordan con compasión. Nos convertimos, cada vez más, en *personas para los demás*. Ya no servimos por obligación, sino por amor. Ya no preguntamos "¿qué recibo?", sino "¿cómo puedo dar?". La oración nos da fuerza para la misión. La corresponsabilidad del tiempo nos prepara para ser discípulos misioneros: personas que llevan la Buena Nueva a nuestros hogares, vecindarios y lugares de trabajo porque estamos tan profundamente arraigados en Cristo que no podemos evitar compartirlo. Así que, los reto a que examinen su horario. ¿Hay tiempo para la oración? ¿No solo para cuando conviene, sino para que sea la base de tu día? Si no, empieza poco a poco: diez minutos de oración en silencio por la mañana. Un rosario diario. Leer el Evangelio del día. Asistir a misa durante días de semana. Unirse a un grupo de oración o estudio bíblico este otoño. No tenemos que empezar de forma perfecta, solo tenemos que empezar. Convirtámonos en una parroquia que diezma nuestro tiempo al Señor con alegría, gratitud y generosidad. Porque al dedicar tiempo a Dios, lo recibimos todo a cambio.

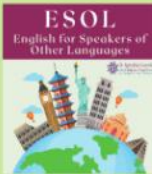

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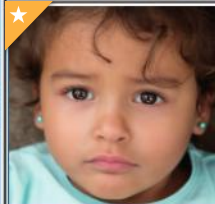
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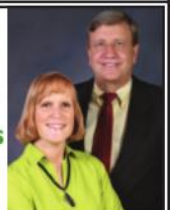
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
