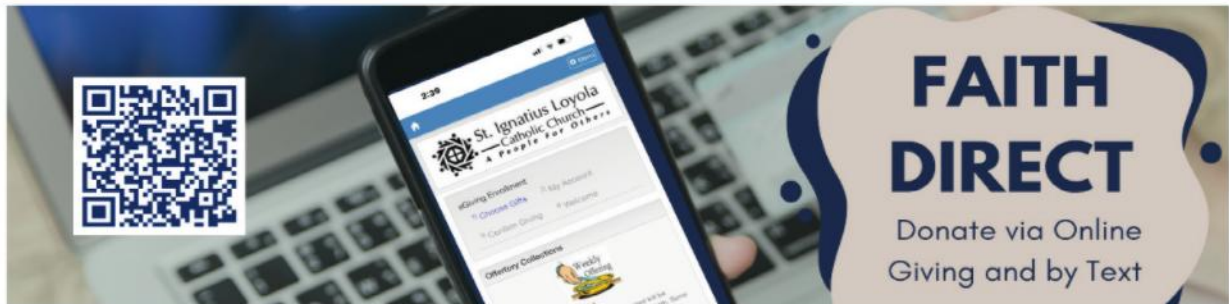

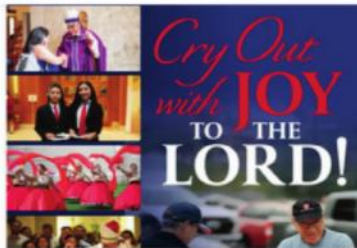

PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In our ongoing reflection on *Biblical Stewardship* as a way of life rooted in gratitude, trust, and mission, we now come to the third and final letter in this series: the stewardship of treasure. In our first letter, we explored the biblical call to stewardship as an invitation to offer our talents, our God-given gifts and abilities, in loving service to God and one another. In our second, we reflected on the stewardship of time, especially through prayer, worship, and presence. Now, we turn to perhaps the most sensitive—but no less essential—dimension of discipleship: stewardship of treasure.

“Tithing” comes from the biblical tradition of offering a tenth of one’s income to the Lord. In the Old Testament, tithing was a covenantal act of worship: a recognition that everything belongs to God (cf. Leviticus 27:30; Malachi 3:10). Though the New Testament does not prescribe a strict percentage, the spirit of tithing remains: we are called to give back to God generously, sacrificially, and joyfully from what we have received. In his Second Letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul writes, “*Each must do as already determined, without sadness or compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver*” (2 Cor 9:7). The call to give is not about legalism, but love—returning to God what is already His in a spirit of gratitude and trust. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that “*the fifth precept of the Church (‘You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church’) means that the faithful are obliged to assist with the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability*” (CCC 2043). The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops echoes this teaching: “Disciples who practice stewardship recognize God as the origin of life, the giver of freedom, the source of all they have and are and will be... They are grateful for what they have received and eager to cultivate their gifts out of love for God and one another.” (*Stewardship: A Disciple’s Response*, USCCB) Tithing and financial giving are not separate from our spiritual lives; they are part of the way we express our faith in action, how we participate in the Church’s mission, and how we show that our trust lies not in wealth, but in God.

You may be asking, “Where do I start?” The truth is that living a life of biblical stewardship is a journey, not an instant transformation. Here are some practical steps: 1. Pray First: Ask the Holy Spirit to guide your heart. Stewardship begins with interior conversion. 2. Reflect on Your Budget: Look honestly at your finances. Can you begin by offering 1%, then grow towards 5%, and eventually to 10% or more as you are able? 3. Be Intentional: Make your giving a regular and prioritized part of your financial plan. Choose a specific percentage or amount and give it consistently. 4. Be Transparent and Accountable: Discuss this with your family or spiritual advisor. Giving is not a private act—it is a communal, faith-filled witness. 5. Give to God First: Resist the temptation to give only what is left over. Stewardship is a first-fruits offering—not a leftover one.

We practice stewardship not to “earn” God’s love or favor, but because we have already received it in abundance. Stewardship shapes our souls. It detaches us from materialism and reminds us that our ultimate security is in God. It forms us in humility and generosity. It transforms us from being passive consumers of religion to active communities of missionary disciples. Stewardship strengthens the Church’s capacity to evangelize, educate, serve the poor, and celebrate the sacraments. As Pope Francis teaches in *Evangelii Gaudium*: “The joy of the Gospel fills the hearts and lives of all who encounter Jesus... a Church which ‘goes forth’ is a community of missionary disciples who take the first step, who are involved and supportive, who bear fruit and rejoice” (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 1, 24). Giving is a way of “*going forth*”—participating in that mission of joy and love. The Lord never asks us to give what we do not have. The widow’s mite (Luke 21:1–4) reminds us that God sees the heart, not just the amount. It is not about equal *gifts*—but equal *sacrifice*. If your current circumstances make financial giving difficult, then begin with prayer and service. Offer what you can, with a generous spirit. But to intentionally choose not to be a steward—of time, talent, or treasure—is to misunderstand the very nature of Christian discipleship. Stewardship is not an optional “extra” for the spiritually elite. It is the everyday path of the baptized, the concrete expression of our love for God and neighbor.

As we conclude this series on biblical stewardship, I challenge each of us to embrace the stewardship way of life with courage and joy. Let us not be satisfied with giving God only the minimum. Instead, let us give Him our all—our time in prayer, our talents in service, and our treasure in generous sharing. To be a “*people for others*,” as St. Ignatius would remind us, is to pour out our lives for the sake of the Gospel. Stewardship is not just about what we give, but about who we are becoming: grateful, generous, trusting disciples of Jesus Christ.

May we become a parish not just with stewards—but of stewards. Not just with disciples—but of missionary disciples. May our treasure never become a possession we cling to, but a gift we release—for the building up of His Kingdom.

Sunday, Aug 24, 2025**The only way to make an impression on God**

A teacher asked his class for examples of words that describe the current crop of college students. He expected to hear “highly educated” or “sophisticated” but was surprised at the honesty of a young woman who responded “entitlement. We think everything is owed to us.” An overstatement, yet such an attitude can often be attached to a particular social class, race, gender, ethnicity, or nationality. But scripture makes it clear that simply being a member of a chosen race or having rank upon rank of wealthy, noble, or accomplished ancestors makes no impression on God. Only one thing does: goodness.

Monday, Aug 25, 2025**Of icons and idols**

The First Council of Nicaea, convened on this day in 325, condemned the Arian heresy and affirmed both the divinity of Christ and the Trinitarian nature of God through the Nicene Creed. Four centuries later, the Second Council of Nicaea addressed the Iconoclastic Controversy, condemning the destruction of religious images. The council affirmed the legitimacy of displaying and venerating icons as a way to connect with Christ and the saints, while carefully distinguishing between veneration, which honors the person represented, and worship, which belongs to God alone. These ancient debates—about who God is and how we approach the divine—echo throughout salvation history. Idolatry, the act of placing anything above God, remains a constant temptation. Consider using religious art as you take time to examine your own life. What false idols might stand between you and God?

Tuesday, Aug 26, 2025**Duty to imitate**

To share the gospel is to share a part of yourself. Your life experience brings the word of God to life. We are the living word—witnesses to the gospel in our everyday actions. When you share yourself with others through acts of love, the gospel becomes more real—not only for those you encounter, but for you as well. As Saint Augustine reminds us: “It is the highest duty of religion to imitate Him whom you adore.”

1 Thessalonians 2:1-8; Matthew 23:23-26 (426). “We were determined to share with you not only the Gospel of God, but our very selves as well.”

Wednesday, Aug 27, 2025**In her own words**

In the early centuries of the church, women's importance was often tied to the social standing of the men in their lives, and their stories were told through a male voice. Saint Monica's story comes to us through the writings of her son, Saint Augustine of Hippo. He described Monica as a model of womanly virtue: hard working, persevering, submissive, and holy. Yet we know nothing about Monica in her own words. We do not even know if she could write. Monica, like many women, past and present, lacked the social power to speak for themselves. Perhaps today we can entrust to her saintly patronage all the people who struggle to find—or to be heard

in—their own voice.

Thursday, Aug 28, 2025**Be inspired by a good book**

Looking for a good book? Try Augustine's Confessions, a classic of literature by one of the greatest thinkers of all time. Augustine's account of his search for God contains all the elements of a great adventure story: exotic locations, decadence and dissolution, complicated maternal relationship, philosophical and theological struggles, despair and confusion, and finally a profound religious experience: “No further would I read; nor needed I: for instantly at the end of this sentence, by a light as it were of serenity infused into my heart, all the darkness of doubt vanished away.” Augustine's search for the only source of true peace is our search, too. “You have made us for yourself, O Lord,” he wrote, “and our hearts are restless until they rest in you.”

Friday, Aug 29, 2025**Sin doesn't get the last word**

We tend to divide up people into good guys and bad guys. Yet the truth about any given person defies those categories. Just think if you were to be permanently judged and labeled based on a particularly bad day when all your weak points showed up like yellow dandelions on a green lawn. Take Herod for instance, one of the villains of the gospel stories. Despite his bad behavior, Mark presents him as having a heart with at least a reasonable potential for goodness. As Just Mercy author Bryan Stevenson says, “Each of us is more than the worst thing we've ever done.” And our Christian faith teaches that everyone is worthy of our compassion. Indeed, as Jesus said in one of Saint Faustina's visions: “The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to my mercy.”

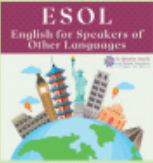

Queridos hermanos:

En nuestra continua reflexión sobre la *corresponsabilidad bíblica* como un estilo de vida basado en la gratitud, la confianza y la misión, llegamos a la tercera y última carta de esta serie: la corresponsabilidad del tesoro. En nuestra primera carta, exploramos el llamado bíblico a la corresponsabilidad como una invitación al ofrecer nuestros talentos, dones y habilidades que Dios nos dio, en un servicio amoroso a Dios y a los demás. En la segunda, reflexionamos sobre la corresponsabilidad de nuestro tiempo, especialmente a través de la oración, la adoración y la presencia. Ahora, nos centramos en la dimensión quizás más sensible, pero no menos esencial del discipulado: la corresponsabilidad del tesoro.

El "diezmo" proviene de la tradición bíblica de ofrecer al Señor la décima parte de los ingresos. En el Antiguo Testamento, el diezmo era un acto de adoración basado en un pacto: un reconocimiento de que todo pertenece a Dios (cf. Levítico 27:30; Malaquías 3:10). Aunque el Nuevo Testamento no prescribe un porcentaje estricto, el espíritu del diezmo permanece: estamos llamados a devolver a Dios con generosidad, sacrificio y alegría lo que hemos recibido. En su Segunda Carta a los Corintios, San Pablo escribe: «Cada uno dé según lo que decidió personalmente, y no de mala gana o a la fuerza, pues Dios ama al que da con corazón alegre» (2 Cor 9:7). El llamado a dar no se trata de legalismo, sino de amor: devolver a Dios lo que ya es suyo con un espíritu de gratitud y confianza. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica nos recuerda que «el quinto precepto de la Iglesia (*Ayudar a la Iglesia en sus necesidades*)» significa que los fieles están obligados a ayudar a las necesidades materiales de la Iglesia, cada uno según su propia capacidad» (CIC 2043). La Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos hace eco de esta enseñanza: Los discípulos que practican la corresponsabilidad reconocen a Dios como el origen de la vida, el dador de la libertad, la fuente de todo lo que tienen, son y serán... Están agradecidos por lo que han recibido y deseosos de cultivar sus dones por amor a Dios y a los demás. (*Corresponsabilidad: Respuesta de los Discípulo*, USCCB) El diezmo y las donaciones financieras no están separadas de nuestra vida espiritual; son parte de la manera en que expresamos nuestra fe en acción, cómo participamos en la misión de la Iglesia y cómo demostramos que nuestra confianza no reside en la riqueza, sino en Dios.

Quizás te preguntes: "¿Por dónde empiezo?". La verdad es que vivir una vida de Corresponsabilidad bíblica es un viaje, no una transformación instantánea. Aquí tienes algunos pasos prácticos: 1. Ora primero: Pide al Espíritu Santo que guíe tu corazón. La Corresponsabilidad comienza con la conversión interior. 2. Reflexiona sobre tu presupuesto: Mira honestamente tus finanzas. ¿Puedes comenzar ofreciendo el 1%, luego crecer hasta el 5% y eventualmente al 10% o más según te sea posible? 3. Sé intencional: Haz que tus donaciones sean una parte regular y priorizada de tu plan financiero. Elige un porcentaje o cantidad específica y dónala de manera constante. 4. Sé transparente y responsable: Habla de esto con tu familia o consejero espiritual. Dar no es un acto privado, es un testimonio comunitario lleno de fe. 5. Da a Dios primero: Resiste la tentación de dar solo lo que sobra. La Corresponsabilidad es una ofrenda de primicias, no de sobras.

Practicamos la corresponsabilidad no para "ganar" el amor o el favor de Dios, sino porque ya lo hemos recibido en abundancia. La corresponsabilidad moldea nuestras almas. Nos libera del materialismo y nos recuerda que nuestra seguridad última está en Dios. Nos forma en humildad y generosidad. Nos transforma de ser consumidores pasivos de la religión a comunidades activas de discípulos misioneros. La corresponsabilidad fortalece la capacidad de la Iglesia para evangelizar, educar, servir a los pobres y celebrar los sacramentos. Como enseña el Papa Francisco en el mensaje central de *Evangelii Gaudium*: «La alegría del Evangelio llena el corazón y la vida de todos los que se encuentran con Jesús... una Iglesia en salida es una comunidad de discípulos misioneros que dan el primer paso, que se involucran y apoyan, que dan fruto y se alegran». (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 1, 24). Dar es una forma de "salir", de participar en esa misión de alegría y amor. El Señor nunca nos pide que demos lo que no tenemos. La ofrenda de la viuda (Lucas 21:1-4) nos recuerda que Dios ve el corazón, no solo la cantidad. No se trata de *dones* iguales, sino de *sacrificios* iguales. Si sus circunstancias actuales le dificultan dar económicamente, comience con la oración y el servicio. Ofrezca lo que pueda, con un espíritu generoso. Pero elegir intencionalmente el no ser corresponsable —de nuestro tiempo, talento o tesoro— es malinterpretar la naturaleza misma del discipulado cristiano. La corresponsabilidad no es un "extra" opcional para la élite espiritual. Es el camino cotidiano de los bautizados, la expresión concreta de nuestro amor a Dios y al prójimo.

Al concluir esta serie sobre la corresponsabilidad bíblica, los invito a todos a apoyar la corresponsabilidad con valentía y alegría. No nos conformemos con darle a Dios solo lo mínimo. En cambio, entreguémosle todo: nuestro tiempo en la oración, nuestros talentos en el servicio y nuestro tesoro en la generosidad. Ser personas para los demás, como nos recordaba San Ignacio, es entregar nuestra vida por el Evangelio. La corresponsabilidad no se trata solo de lo que damos, sino de en quiénes nos convertimos: discípulos de Jesucristo agradecidos, generosos y confiados.

Que nos convirtamos en una parroquia no solo con corresponsales, sino de corresponsales con el llamado de Dios. No solo con discípulos, sino con discípulos misioneros. Que nuestro tesoro nunca se convierta en una posesión a la que nos aferremos, sino en un don que despleguemos para la edificación de Su Reino.

La única manera de causar una buena impresión en Dios

Un maestro pidió a su clase ejemplos de palabras que describieran el corte actual de estudiantes de universidad. Él esperaba escuchar “altamente educados” o “sofisticados” pero se sorprendió con la honestidad de una mujer joven quien respondió “derecho. Creemos que se nos debe dar todo.” Una exageración, aún así una actitud que a menudo puede ser relacionada a una particular clase social, raza, género, etnicidad, o nacionalidad. Pero la escritura pone en claro que el simplemente ser miembro de una raza elegida o tener grado sobre grado de ancestros ricos, nobles o consumados no causa una impresión en Dios. Solo una cosa lo hace: la bondad.

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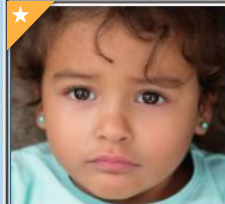
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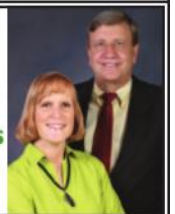
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
