





PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend is unlike most weekends in our parish life. Rather than celebrating one of the Sundays of Ordinary Time, we are privileged to celebrate the great Feast of the **Exaltation of the Holy Cross**. The liturgy lifts our gaze to the wood of the Cross on which hung the salvation of the world. The Cross is not simply a historical reminder of the crucifixion of Jesus. For us as Christians, it is the sign of victory, the throne of glory, the place where love was poured out without measure. When we exalt the Cross, we proclaim that what once was an instrument of shame and suffering has become the means of eternal life. St. Paul reminds us: "*May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ*" (Gal 6:14). This weekend, we are especially blessed to have with us a **relic of the True Cross**, made available to us for veneration. What a profound grace! To stand before the very wood that bore our Savior's sacrifice draws us closer to the mystery of redemption.

We are also honored to welcome members of the **Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem** at the 10:00 am Mass, who will accompany the relic in solemn procession. Some may wonder who the Knights and Dames in their distinctive capes and insignia are. The Order traces its roots back nearly a thousand years, to the days of the Crusaders. Established to safeguard the Holy Sepulchre—the very tomb of Christ in Jerusalem—the Order's mission has always been linked to the places most sacred to our faith. Today, the Order continues this holy mission, not with weapons but with charity and solidarity. Its members support the Church in the Holy Land, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, and the Christians who still live and witness there amid great difficulty. Their presence among us is a reminder that our faith is not confined to Spring, Texas, but is universal—rooted in real places and real people who still walk where Jesus walked.

Over the past several weeks, I have written and preached about **Biblical Stewardship**—that call to recognize everything we have as gift, and to return to the Lord a portion of what He has entrusted to us. Stewardship is not simply a fundraising strategy; it is a way of life, a way of discipleship. This weekend, our **Finance Council** presents its annual report to the parish, which you will also find in the bulletin and on our website. This is not just an exercise in transparency; it is a matter of accountability and good stewardship. I am deeply grateful to the faithful parishioners who serve on the council, offering me their wisdom and guidance in financial decisions.

As you know, this past year we took the important step of paying off the Gonzaga Center loan. To do so, we drew from parish savings, which means that now we must begin the work of **rebuilding our reserves**. We do have a maintenance fund for emergencies, but with rising costs, we need a greater cushion to prepare for large expenses—air conditioning, heating, roofing, and the like. It has been many years since we asked our community to prayerfully consider increasing offertory giving. The last time was before Hurricane Harvey. After that devastation came the pandemic, which brought layoffs and uncertainty for so many. During those years, we did not raise the call for increased giving, but relied on grants for our Early Childhood Program and careful management. Now, however, the time has come. I ask each household to prayerfully examine your giving. For those who are not yet contributing, start small but begin. For those who have been blessed with increased income, consider what portion should be returned to the Lord. For those on fixed incomes, give according to your means, with trust that no gift is too small in the eyes of God. Remember the widow in the Gospel who gave two small coins and was praised by Jesus for her faithfulness.

Last weekend, at our LifeTeen Mass, we dedicated our new statue of **St. Carlo Acutis**, the first millennial saint. Many of our young people are already inspired by his story: a teenager, ordinary in many ways, yet extraordinary in his love for the Eucharist and his desire to use technology to spread the Gospel. St. Carlo reminds us that holiness is possible at every age and in every circumstance. He once said, "*The Eucharist is my highway to heaven.*" What a gift to place his image in our church, especially for our youth and young adults who face the challenges of growing up in a digital and secular world. May his example help them discover that the true adventure in life is to live as friends of Jesus. I extend heartfelt thanks to the donor who made this statue possible. Sacred art is not decoration; it is catechesis in stone and bronze. Carlo's presence in our parish will silently preach for generations to come, urging us to center our lives on the Eucharist and to live joyfully as missionary disciples.

My friends, this unusual weekend holds together so many dimensions of our faith: the Cross that redeems us, the universal Church that unites us, the stewardship that sustains us, and the witness of saints who inspire us. Each of these calls us not to complacency but to action. Let us venerate the Cross with gratitude. Let us support our parish with generosity. Let us look to St. Carlo as a companion on our pilgrimage. And let us give thanks for the communion of the Church that stretches from Jerusalem to Spring, Texas.

May the Lord bless you and your families, and may our parish continue to grow as a community of faith, hope, and love.

Understanding cross culture

It's not always easy to face the things that hurt us or our loved ones. So why would we lift up the cross, honoring that which symbolizes pain and the death of Jesus? As Christians we choose to face the cross. In doing so we confront not only the reality of suffering and death but also the hope and belief in new life, in that "something more" of salvation. And somehow in facing our pain, instead of pretending it isn't there or whitewashing the reality, there is acknowledgement of our vulnerability. We become open to healing. The exaltation of the cross is not only a reminder of Jesus' death but of his Resurrection. It is an invitation to lift up our own pain and find in it a path to healing and wholeness.

Seven ways to know Mary

Pop quiz on Catholic tradition: Name the "seven sorrows" in the life of the Virgin Mary. OK, time's up! While all seven may not have come to mind quickly, here's a tip: They're all found in gospel passages. Today is a good day to read and ponder them: the Prophecy of Simeon (Luke 2:34); the Flight into Egypt (Matthew 2:13); the Boy Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:43); the Way of the Cross (Luke 23:27); the Crucifixion of Jesus (John 19:26); the Descent from the Cross (John 19:39); the Burial of Jesus (Luke 23:55).

United in welcome

Cornelius and Cyprian are remembered and celebrated together because of their united efforts to welcome people back into the church. At the time (ca. 250) there was rancorous and strident debate over how and even whether to allow "sinners" to rejoin the Christian community. One group advocated severe punishment and often permanent excommunication. Cornelius and Cyprian, on the other hand, pushed for leniency grounded in the forgiveness modeled by Jesus. Ostracism can never lead to oneness and wholeness. In honor of Cornelius and Cyprian we might ask ourselves, "In what ways have I excluded others, even briefly, and how can I make amends?"

Allow wisdom in

When the wisdom of God comes calling at your door, it's always a good idea to receive her—and, oh yes, Hebrew scripture compares holy wisdom to a woman. The smart person allows wisdom to enter their life because she comes from God, has always been with God, and embodies God's creative power and teaching (Torah), three pretty important things. Saint Paul called Christ the wisdom of God, as have Christian saints and

scholars ever since. "When we speak about wisdom, we are speaking of Christ," said Saint Ambrose, the fourth-century bishop of Milan. How can you entertain wisdom today?

1 Timothy 3:14-16; Luke 7:31-35 (445). "Wisdom is vindicated by all her children."

Thursday, Sep 18, 2025

Take bold steps to break barriers

As much as society creates and perpetuates divisions and privileges based on gender, color, orientation, ability, income, religion, Christians must be equally persistent in breaking those barriers, just as Jesus did. Jesus' actions were often condemned as audacious and rebellious. But he was actually modeling reciprocity and inclusivity. In a 2022 speech on welcoming people with disabilities, Pope Francis explained that Christ's gaze on the people he met was "a gaze of tenderness and mercy above all for those who were excluded. For this reason, every time the Christian community transforms indifference into proximity, and exclusion into belonging, it fulfills its prophetic mission." What part will you play in advancing this audacious mission of universal welcome?

1 Timothy 4:12-16; Luke 7:36-50 (446). "If this man were a prophet, he would know who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him."

Friday, Sep 19, 2025

What will you leave behind?

We've all heard the adage, "You can't take it with you." Although it's a true statement, it's not a very inspiring one. Another way to say the same thing is to ask, "What will you leave behind?" Consider the wisdom of the ancient Greek statesman Pericles: "What you leave behind is not what is engraved on stone monuments, but what is woven into the lives of others." What stories and witness will you bequeath to your heirs? Saint Paul urges us to "compete well for the faith" and pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. That would be quite a legacy for the next generation.

1 Timothy 6:2c-12; Luke 8:1-3 (447). "For we brought nothing into the world, just as we shall not be able to take anything out of it."

Saturday, Sep 20, 2025

Cultivate a death-defying faith

While an underground and prohibited faith in Korea, Catholicism had taken root among laypeople 12 years before a priest arrived in 1836. Some 4,000 Catholics had learned the faith from pamphlets smuggled in from China. Catholics in Korea faced many hardships in those years, including the martyrdom of today's saints, but they kept their faith alive until finally gaining religious freedom in 1883. When the desire is there, faith is possible under all kinds of circumstances. Stay strong in your faith as you deal with hardship in your own life. For inspiration, remember the words of Saint Paul Chóng Ha-sang when he was asked to renounce his faith: "I have told you that I am a Christian, and will be one until my death."

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

Queridos hermanos,

Este fin de semana es diferente a la mayoría de los fines de semana en nuestra vida parroquial. En lugar de celebrar uno de los Domingos del Tiempo Ordinario, tenemos el privilegio de celebrar la gran Fiesta de la **Exaltación de la Santa Cruz**. La liturgia nos lleva a contemplar el madero de la Cruz donde pidió la salvación del mundo. La Cruz no es simplemente un recordatorio histórico de la crucifixión de Jesús. Para nosotros, como cristianos, es el signo de la victoria, el trono de la gloria, el lugar donde el amor se derramó sin medida. Al exaltar la Cruz, proclamamos que lo que una vez fue instrumento de vergüenza y sufrimiento se ha convertido en el medio de la vida eterna. San Pablo nos recuerda: «Yo sólo me gloriaré en la cruz de nuestro Señor Jesucristo» (Gal 6,14). Este fin de semana, tenemos la especial bendición de tener con nosotros una reliquia de la **Vera Cruz**, disponible para su veneración. ¡Qué profunda gracia! Estar ante el mismo madero que soportó el sacrificio de nuestro Salvador nos acerca al misterio de la redención.

También nos honra dar la bienvenida a los miembros de la **Orden Ecuestre del Santo Sepulcro de Jerusalén** en la misa de las 10:00 a. m., quienes acompañarán la reliquia en procesión solemne. Algunos se preguntarán quiénes son los Caballeros y Damas con sus distintivas capas e insignias. La Orden tiene sus raíces casi milenarias, en la época de las Cruzadas. Establecida para salvaguardar el Santo Sepulcro, la tumba de Cristo en Jerusalén, la misión de la Orden siempre ha estado vinculada a los lugares más sagrados para nuestra fe. Hoy, la Orden continúa esta misión santa, no con armas, sino con caridad y solidaridad. Sus miembros apoyan a la Iglesia en Tierra Santa, al Patriarca Latino de Jerusalén y a los cristianos que aún viven y dan testimonio allí en medio de grandes dificultades. Su presencia entre nosotros nos recuerda que nuestra fe no se limita a Spring, Texas, sino que es universal, arraigada en lugares y personas reales que aún caminan por donde Jesús caminó.

Durante las últimas semanas, he escrito y predicado sobre la **Corresponsabilidad Bíblica**: ese llamado a reconocer que todo lo que tenemos es un don y a devolver al Señor una parte de lo que Él nos ha confiado. La corresponsabilidad no es simplemente una estrategia para recaudar fondos; es un estilo de vida, una forma de discipulado. Este fin de semana, nuestro **Consejo de Finanzas** presenta su informe anual a la parroquia, que también encontrarán en el boletín y en nuestro sitio web. Esto no es solo un ejercicio de transparencia; es una cuestión de rendición de cuentas y buena corresponsabilidad. Estoy profundamente agradecido a los fieles feligreses que forman parte del consejo, quienes me ofrecen su sabiduría y guía en las decisiones financieras.

Como saben, el año recién pasado dimos el importante paso de liquidar el préstamo del Centro Gonzaga. Para ello, recurrimos a los ahorros de la parroquia, lo que significa que ahora debemos comenzar a **reconstruir nuestras reservas**. Contamos con un fondo de mantenimiento para las emergencias, pero con los altos costos, necesitamos tener un fondo de reserva para prepararnos para gastos mayores: aire acondicionado, calefacción, techo, etc. Han pasado muchos años desde que pedimos a nuestra comunidad que consideraran con oración aumentar las donaciones al ofertorio (colecta). La última vez fue antes del huracán Harvey. Tras esa devastación llegó la pandemia, que trajo despidos e incertidumbre para muchos. Durante esos años, no hicimos un llamado a aumentar las donaciones, sino que dependimos de los donativos para nuestro Programa de Primera Infancia y de una administración cuidadosa. Sin embargo, ahora ha llegado el momento. Pido a cada hogar que examine con oración sus donaciones. Para quienes aún no contribuyen, comiencen con poco, pero comiencen. Para quienes han sido bendecidos con mayores ingresos, consideren qué porción deben devolver al Señor. Para quienes tienen ingresos fijos, donen según sus posibilidades, confiando en que ninguna donación es demasiado pequeña a los ojos de Dios. Recordemos a la viuda del Evangelio que dio dos pequeñas monedas y fue elogiada por Jesús por su fidelidad.

El fin de semana pasado, en nuestra Misa Life Teen, dedicamos nuestra nueva estatua de **San Carlo Acutis**, el primer santo milenario. Muchos de nuestros jóvenes ya se sienten inspirados por su historia: un adolescente, común en muchos sentidos, pero extraordinario en su amor por la Eucaristía y su deseo de usar la tecnología para difundir el Evangelio. San Carlo nos recuerda que la santidad es posible a cualquier edad y en cualquier circunstancia. Una vez dijo: «*La Eucaristía es mi autopista al cielo*». Qué regalo colocar su imagen en nuestra iglesia, especialmente para nuestros jóvenes y adultos jóvenes que enfrentan los desafíos de crecer en un mundo digital y secular. Que su ejemplo les ayude a descubrir que la verdadera aventura de la vida es vivir como amigos de Jesús. Agradezco de corazón al donante que hizo posible esta estatua. El arte sacro no es decoración; es catequesis en piedra y bronce. La presencia de Carlo en nuestra parroquia predicará silenciosamente a las generaciones venideras, instándonos a centrar nuestras vidas en la Eucaristía y a vivir con alegría como discípulos misioneros.

Amigos míos, este fin de semana inusual reúne muchas dimensiones de nuestra fe: la Cruz que nos redime, la Iglesia universal que nos une, la corresponsabilidad que nos sostiene y el testimonio de los santos que nos inspiran. Cada una de ellas nos llama a no conformarnos, sino a actuar. Veneremos la Cruz con gratitud. Apoyemos a nuestra parroquia con generosidad. Miremos a San Carlo como compañero de peregrinación. Y demos gracias por la comunión de la Iglesia que se extiende desde Jerusalén hasta Spring, Texas.

Que el Señor los bendiga a ustedes y a sus familias, y que nuestra parroquia siga creciendo como una comunidad de fe, esperanza y amor.


