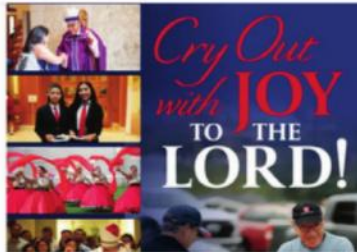

PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Over the past several weeks, we have walked together through the theme of Biblical Stewardship. Last weekend our Finance Council shared with you the “state of finances” of our parish family. I want to express my gratitude for your openness in listening, reflecting, and responding. It is not easy to talk about money—I can assure you it is not my favorite topic either! Yet, as St. Ignatius of Loyola reminds us in his *Spiritual Exercises*, “We ought to desire and choose only that which is more conducive to the end for which we are created.” The use of our financial resources is one of those choices. It is a concrete way by which we participate in building the Kingdom of God. Stewardship is not just about dollars and cents. It is about discipleship—how we give of our time, talent, and treasure in response to God’s immense love for us. Every baptized person, including our youth and children, has a role to play. I never ask you to do what I myself would not do. The measure of our gift is not found in the amount, but in the desire of the heart and the effort to share. St. Paul reminds us that “God loves a cheerful giver” (2 Cor 9:7). With that spirit, I again thank our Finance Council members for their wisdom, insight, and guidance. Their generous service helps us make decisions that are faithful to our mission and responsible for our future.

This same weekend, the Church in the United States celebrates **Catechetical Sunday**. The theme for this year, set forth by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, is: “*Empowered by the Spirit, Sent as Missionary Disciples*.” It is a reminder that formation is not merely about receiving information—it is about transformation in Christ, led by the Holy Spirit. The *National Directory for Catechesis* states: “*Catechesis is an essentially ecclesial act. The true subject of catechesis is the Church, which, continuing the mission of Jesus the Teacher and in the power of the Holy Spirit, proclaims, hands on, and celebrates the Gospel of salvation.*” But who is a catechist? Not only the men and women who serve in classrooms and parish programs—though their work is invaluable—but also every parent, godparent, and adult who guides children in the ways of faith. Parents, you are the first and best teachers of your children. The Church stands ready to accompany you in this noble mission.

Here at St. Ignatius, our Formation Department has a renewed energy and fresh insight. They are committed to serving you, walking with your children, youth, and families. But they cannot do this alone. We need mentors, guides, witnesses, and yes, trained catechists. If your heart is open and willing, we can give you the tools. As Pope Francis has said: “*Being a catechist is not a title; it is an attitude of abiding with Him, and it lasts a lifetime!*” This is why Catechetical Sunday is so important for us as a parish. It is not just about commissioning those who formally serve as catechists—it is about reminding us all that formation in faith is the responsibility of every disciple. Formation is a lifelong journey, not a stage to be completed. Our parish offers many opportunities, but it begins with your “yes.” Bring your willing heart, and together we can form missionary disciples who know, love, and follow Christ.

As we consider stewardship and catechesis, we also look ahead to an event that draws our whole community together: our Annual Fall Festival, to be held on Saturday and Sunday, October 4th and 5th. In just two weeks, our campus will be filled with laughter, music, fellowship, and the joy of being together. The Fall Festival is more than a fundraiser; it is a celebration of community and mission. The proceeds are important for our parish life, yes—but the fruit of this festival is measured also in fellowship, in hospitality, in the joy of our children, and in the spirit of faith that permeates it all. This year’s theme is Americana. We invite you to wear your best red, white, and blue as we come together to celebrate who we are as *one nation under God*. Let this year’s festival be a joyful witness of unity, gratitude, and faith—expressed not only in the fun of games and food, but also in our shared identity as God’s people. I encourage you to check the bulletin for what is needed. Please sign up to work in a booth, to help with set-up or clean-up, or to donate items. Every contribution makes a difference. Your willingness to step forward ensures that our festival is successful in every way: fellowship, finance, fun, and faithfulness in building the Kingdom of God.

As I close this letter, I return again to the heart of Ignatian spirituality: to seek and find God in all things. Stewardship, catechesis, and even a parish festival are not separate activities. They are moments where God is at work—calling us to gratitude, generosity, and joy. Let us respond with open hearts, remembering always the words of St. Ignatius: “*Love ought to manifest itself more by deeds than by words.*”

WEEK READINGS

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Sunday, Sep 21, 2025**Set an intention**

Most of us know intuitively what prayer is, but how do we pray at all times and “in every place,” as scripture says? One way is to set an intention for each task before us. For example, we might pray: “May this report I am writing be a sign of gratitude for my job.” Or: “May these dishes I am washing be a sign of my love for my family.” Or: “May this cover letter and résumé be a sign of my hope for the future.” By setting an intention for each part of our day, we become more fully aware of our relationship to God. Our actions become steeped with meaning and therefore more loving, peaceful, and compassionate. And isn’t that what prayer is for?

Amos 8:4-7; 1 Timothy 2:1-8; Luke 16:1-13 or Luke 16:10-13 (135). “I ask that supplications, prayers, petitions, and thanksgivings be offered for everyone.”

Monday, Sep 22, 2025**Shine your quantum light**

In her Revelations of Divine Love, 14th-century mystic Julian of Norwich describes how she came to understand that God is light, “our endless Day.” Seven centuries later, physicist Bernard Haisch came to the same understanding: “The solid, stable world of matter appears to be sustained at every instant by an underlying sea of quantum light,” which Haisch concludes gives “Let there be light” profound meaning and a clue to the nature of God and the mysteries of the universe. The light that shines within you is God. Let others see that light in everything you do.

Ezra 1:1-6; Luke 8:16-18 (449). “No one who lights a lamp conceals it with a vessel or sets it under a bed; rather, he places it on a lampstand.”

Tuesday, Sep 23, 2025**Suffering through the eyes of love**

Pope John Paul II canonized Padre Pio of Pietrelcina on June 16, 2002. More than 300,000 people braved excessive heat to fill St. Peter’s Square and nearby streets for the ceremony. They heard the Holy Father praise the new saint for his prayer and charity and for Padre Pio’s witness to the power of suffering. If accepted with love, the pope stressed, such suffering can lead to “a privileged path of sanctity.” There is meaning in the suffering in your own life. Search for it with a loving gaze.

Wednesday, Sep 24, 2025**Help freedom reign**

The church has not always been on the right side of history when it comes to slavery. In fact, for centuries the “right side” meant justifying slavery because it was an accepted social institution. The ancient Israelites were enslaved people, and the early Christians—and lots of Christians afterwards—took it for granted. Judaism, however, believed the law of God protected enslaved people from mistreatment, and early Christianity thought the differences between enslavers and the enslaved evaporated in the kingdom of God. While just about all people of faith today reject slavery outright, it is still very much alive in forms like human trafficking.

A number of Catholic women’s religious communities are involved in the fight against trafficking. Learn more about what you can do to bring freedom and justice to enslaved people.

Ezra 9:5-9; Luke 9:1-6 (451). “For slaves we are, but in our servitude our God has not abandoned us.”

Thursday, Sep 25, 2025**Gains and losses redefined**

The people of Israel, it seems, had more important things to do than rebuild the temple of the Lord—there was wealth to be made, food and drink and fine clothes to enjoy, and comfortable homes to build. Recent economic history echoes this pattern: Vast fortunes have been amassed, often at the expense of basic moral and ethical principles. In both prosperity and hardship, the divine call to justice, mercy, and love remains unchanged. If you seek lasting joy, disregard the shifting trends of society, and follow the eternal values God sets before us. As Saint Theresa of Ávila reminds us: “Our greatest gain is to lose the wealth that is of such brief duration and, by comparison with eternal things, of such little worth.”

Haggai 1:1-8; Luke 9:7-9 (452). “You have sown much, but have brought in little.”

Friday, Sep 26, 2025**Treasure the word**

Considering the enormous flow of words we can encounter with nothing more than the movement of a finger on a computer screen, it is difficult to imagine the ordeal required for a library in the Middle Ages to acquire even a single new book. Monks would often spend their entire careers traveling between monasteries and at each stop transcribing by hand whatever text their home library was in want of. The English monk Saint Ceolfrith (642-716) was renowned in his time for his tortuous travels and prolific transcribing efforts. His protégé, the famous Saint Bede, writes that Ceolfrith alone doubled the holdings of their monastery’s library, which was already considered sizeable. Draw on the wisdom of ancient monks as you contemplate how can you expand the treasury of God’s word today.

Haggai 2:1-9; Luke 9:18-22 (453). “Take courage, all you people of the land, says the LORD, and work! For I am with you.”

Saturday, Sep 27, 2025**Improve your attention span**

The early 20th-century French philosopher and mystic Simone Weil had much to say about the value of attention. “Attention is the highest and purest form of generosity,” she said. “Prayer is made of attention.” “There is never a case when an effort of attention is lost. It will always be spiritually effective.” Learning to pay attention—to focus and concentrate on what is at hand—is and has been a neglected practice. No doubt multitudes who lived at the time of Jesus rushed right by him as he preached in the synagogues and healed in the streets, too caught up in the day’s affairs to see the savior right in front of them. How about you? If Jesus were to come again today, would you be too “crazy-busy” to pay attention?

Zechariah 2:5-9, 14-15a; Luke 9:43b-45 (454). “Pay attention to what I am telling you.”

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

Queridos hermanos,

Durante las últimas semanas, hemos reflexionado juntos sobre el tema de la Corresponsabilidad bíblica. El fin de semana pasado, nuestro Consejo de Finanzas compartió con ustedes el estado de las finanzas de nuestra familia parroquial. Quiero expresar mi gratitud por su disposición a escuchar, reflexionar y responder. No es fácil hablar de dinero; ¡les aseguro que tampoco es mi tema favorito! Sin embargo, como nos recuerda San Ignacio de Loyola en sus *Ejercicios Espirituales*: «Debemos desear y elegir solo lo que sea más propicio para el fin para el que fuimos creados». El uso de nuestros recursos financieros es una de esas decisiones. Es una forma concreta de participar en la construcción del Reino de Dios. La Corresponsabilidad no se trata solo de dinero. Se trata de discipulado: cómo damos nuestro tiempo, talento y tesoro en respuesta al inmenso amor de Dios por nosotros. Cada persona bautizada, incluyendo a nuestros jóvenes y niños, tiene un papel que desempeñar. Nunca les pido que hagan lo que yo mismo no haría. La medida de nuestro donativo no se encuentra en la cantidad, sino en el deseo del corazón y el esfuerzo por compartir. San Pablo nos recuerda que «Dios ama al donante alegre» (2 Corintios 9:7). Con ese espíritu, agradezco nuevamente a los miembros de nuestro Consejo de Finanzas por su sabiduría, perspicacia y orientación. Su generoso servicio nos ayuda a tomar decisiones fieles a nuestra misión y responsables de nuestro futuro.

Este fin de semana, la Iglesia en Estados Unidos celebra el **Domingo Catequético**. El tema de este año, establecido por la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de Estados Unidos, es: *“Fortalecidos por el Espíritu, Enviados como Discípulos Misioneros”*. Es un recordatorio de que la formación no se trata solo de recibir información, sino de la transformación en Cristo, guiada por el Espíritu Santo. El *Directorio Nacional para la Catequesis* afirma: *“La catequesis es un acto esencialmente eclesial. El verdadero sujeto de la catequesis es la Iglesia, que, continuando la misión de Jesús Maestro y en el poder del Espíritu Santo, proclama, transmite y celebra el Evangelio de la salvación”*. Pero ¿quién es un catequista? No solo los hombres y mujeres que sirven en las aulas y en los programas parroquiales —aunque su labor es invaluable—, sino también todo padre, madre, padrino o madrina y adulto que guía a los niños en los caminos de la fe. 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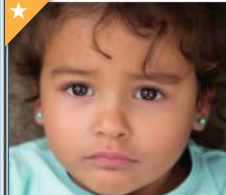
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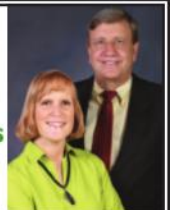


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
