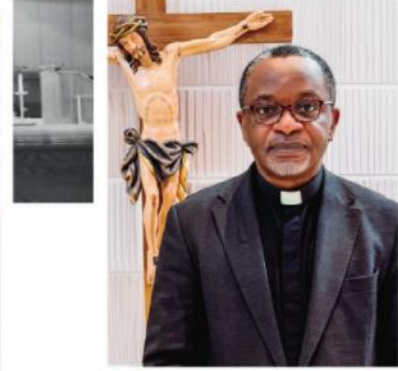

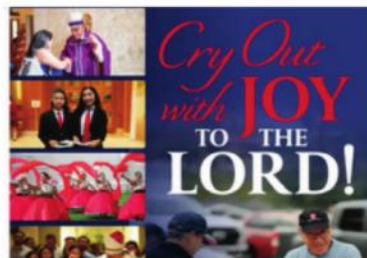

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend, I am filled with gratitude and excitement as I share several important moments in the life of our parish community. In a particular way, I am overjoyed to welcome our new Parochial Vicar, Monsignor Chibuike Onyeaghala, to St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish. After a three-month wait, it is truly a blessing to finally have him among us. Monsignor Chibuike comes to us with an extraordinary history of service to the Universal Church. Ordained in 1998 in the Diocese of Ahiara, Nigeria, his priestly life has unfolded in unique and inspiring ways. For over two decades, he has served in the diplomatic corps of the Holy See, holding assignments in Paraguay, Burundi, India, Gabon, the Philippines, Switzerland, and Liechtenstein. In these roles, he collaborated closely with the Apostolic Nuncios and the local hierarchies of the Church. He was entrusted with delicate responsibilities such as assisting in transitions of government, coordinating papal visits, and serving as *Chargé d'Affaires* in multiple nations. Many of you may recall that when Pope Francis visited the Philippines, Monsignor Chibuike was part of the papal entourage and assisted in welcoming over seven million people for the celebration of faith. He also played a part in preparations for Pope Francis' ecumenical pilgrimage to Geneva, Switzerland.

Alongside his diplomatic and administrative service, Monsignor has engaged deeply in pastoral and charitable work. He has founded and guided organizations dedicated to health care, education, and outreach to the poor in his native Nigeria and beyond. His work with hospitals, medical missions, and foundations demonstrates his deep commitment to bringing the love of Christ to those most in need. Fluent in six languages—Igbo, English, Italian, French, Spanish, and German—he embodies the universality of our Catholic faith and the missionary call of the Gospel.

Now, for the first time in his priesthood, Monsignor will be serving in a parish assignment. What a gift for us! Yet, as you can imagine, parish life differs greatly from the international settings in which he has ministered. I am calling on all of you, the people of St. Ignatius, to extend a warm welcome and to assist him in acclimating to the rhythm of parish community life. Show him our love of liturgy, our dedication to service, and our spirit of hospitality. In short, let him see the beauty of this family of faith that we are privileged to call our parish home. I am personally grateful for his willingness to join us, and I am humbled that God has chosen to bless our parish with his presence. Monsignor, we welcome you with open arms and open hearts.

I also want to express my heartfelt thanks to all who have stepped forward this year to serve as catechists for our children, youth, and adults. You embody the Church's call to missionary discipleship, walking alongside others in the spirit of accompaniment, and leading them into deeper encounters with Jesus Christ. Please know that your dedication does not go unnoticed. I am grateful for the hours you prepare lessons, for the patience you show, and for the joy you bring to your ministry. May the Holy Spirit strengthen you in wisdom and love as you carry out this vital work. There are still openings for more catechists and classroom assistants. If you have been feeling the Lord's tug in your heart, please step forward. Our children, youth, and adults await your accompaniment.

Next weekend marks one of the highlights of our parish calendar: the Fall Festival! I invite you to come early and stay late, enjoying two days of fellowship, food, and fun. This annual festival is not only our largest but also our most necessary fundraiser of the year. The proceeds enable us to continue our mission of evangelization, formation, and service. At the same time, it is a chance for all of us to grow together as a parish family. There will be delicious food from a variety of cultures, entertainment for all ages, and shopping from vendors who bring an assortment of unique items. Of course, no festival at St. Ignatius would be complete without BINGO, a parish favorite. Bring your friends and family, invite your neighbors, and remember to turn in your raffle tickets for a chance at some great prizes. The Fall Festival truly embodies the spirit of joy that marks our community, and I look forward to seeing you there. Volunteers are still needed. Sign up on our website and/or check in at the volunteer booth when you come to the festival.

Finally, I must share that Luis Espada, our Associate Director of Formation for Children and Families, has resigned his position. We are grateful for the gifts Luis brought to our parish during his short time with us and for his presence in our community. May God grant him many blessings as he begins his next endeavors.

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Sunday, Sep 28, 2025

Who's on your doorstep?

Long-standing images of the fires of hell owe much to the vivid description of the afterlife contained in a gospel story. A rich man (later sometimes named Dives) suffers tormenting flames after death because he ignored poor Lazarus on his doorstep throughout his life. Medieval artists loved to illustrate the story because of its drama and visual potential. But beneath all the fire and brimstone lies a clear and direct message: Living only for one's own wealth and comfort leads to a living hell. If we hope to rest in the bosom of Abraham, we need to pay attention to the Lazarus waiting at our doorstep.

Choose your side

The Bible sometimes reads like a chapter from Dungeons and Dragons. In the apocalyptic passages of Daniel and the Book of Revelation we meet serpents, angels, ancient ones, prophets, and warriors. These characters are set against a backdrop of fire, war, struggle, truth, and deceit. Such images paint a picture of a God who takes sides. In reality the world is deeply interconnected, one in which we can see the human suffering on all sides of violent conflict. What image of God can convey the truth that God is for everyone? Or more to the point, how can we refocus our vision to understand that there are no sides but God's?

Savor these words

Saint Jerome, brilliant biblical scholar, patron of librarians and translators, was fascinated by the meaning of words. Unlike many translators of his day, he favored use of what modern scripture-scholar Father Leslie Hoppe, O.F.M. calls "dynamic equivalence." That is, Jerome sought to translate texts from their original Hebrew and Greek "sense for sense" rather than "word for word." Jerome's contributions to Catholics' understanding of the Bible are unsurpassed. But perhaps his most significant contribution was simply his love of the word. Spend some time today savoring the words and struggling with the meaning of scripture.

Spiritual bouquet

Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, known as the "Little Flower," is one of the most popular saints, owing to her inspirational simplicity. She spent almost a decade of her short life cloistered as a Carmelite nun expressing her thoughts in writings that were eventually shared with the world. "Love proves itself by deeds," she wrote, "so how am I to show my love? Great deeds are forbidden me. The only way I can

prove my love is by scattering flowers and these flowers are every little sacrifice, every glance and word, and the doing of the least actions for love." Scatter some flowers of loving deeds in honor of this great saint.

You've got a friend

Joan Wester Anderson has been writing about angels since 1989 after her son was mysteriously rescued from a devastating snow storm on Christmas Eve. That experience resulted in her first book of true stories of remarkable encounters with angels, *Where Angels Walk*. Since then, she has written many more books on the subject, and all of them offer spine-tingling, inspiring tales of ordinary people who have been rescued, healed, comforted, and sheltered by heavenly visitors. These amazing stories make the case that every one of us has a guardian angel. That's a proposition the church itself has made from the earliest times. Biblical scholar and Doctor of the Church Saint Jerome posited: "So valuable to heaven is the dignity of the human soul that every member of the human race has a guardian angel from the moment the person begins to be." It's nice to know we're not alone.

Models of what's possible

The biblical towns of Tyre and Sidon might bring to mind some modern-day big cities: prosperous, bustling, cosmopolitan—and spiritually hungry. Early in Jesus' ministry people from these distant port cities heard about the things Jesus was doing, and, though they were in some sense outsiders, they responded with more enthusiasm than many of those who were closer to Jesus. Jesus held up these "pagan" cities as models of what is possible when people express a genuine desire for spiritual nourishment. Respond to the gospel with enthusiasm, and your spirit will be rewarded.

Baruch 1:15-22; Luke 10:13-16 (459). "It will be more tolerable for Tyre and Sidon at the judgment than for you."

Do what you need to do

If Saint Francis of Assisi knew that his band of brother-beggars would one day be called Franciscans, he'd probably laugh, or sigh. He never set himself up as a model. Indeed, he admonished his brothers: "We ought to be ashamed of ourselves; the saints endured but we who are servants of God try to win honor and glory by recounting and making known what they have done." Good deeds are ours to do, according to Francis. At the end of his life, he made that point abundantly clear: "I have done what was mine to do. May Christ teach you what is yours to do." Time to get doing.

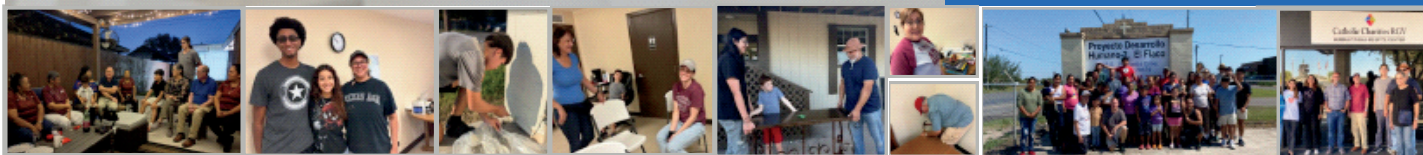

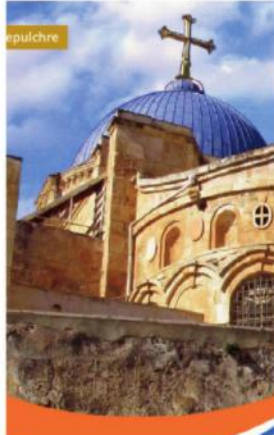

Queridos hermanos,

Este fin de semana, me siento lleno de gratitud y emoción al compartir varios momentos importantes en la vida de nuestra comunidad parroquial. De manera particular, me llena de alegría dar la bienvenida a nuestro nuevo Vicario Parroquial, Monseñor Chibuike Onyeaghala, a la Parroquia de San Ignacio de Loyola. Después de una espera de tres meses, es una verdadera bendición tenerlo finalmente entre nosotros. Monseñor Chibuike llega con una extraordinaria trayectoria de servicio a la Iglesia Universal. Las imágenes antiguas de los fuegos del infierno deben mucho a la vívida descripción de la vida después de la muerte contenida en una historia del evangelio. Un hombre rico (a veces llamado Dives después) sufre llamas tormentosas después de la muerte porque ignoró al pobre Lázaro a su puerta por toda su vida. A los artistas medievales les encantaba ilustrar la historia debido a su drama y potencial visual. Pero bajo todo el fuego y azufre yace un mensaje claro y directo: Vivir solo por la abundancia y comodidad propios lleva a un infierno viviente. Si esperamos descansar en el pecho de Abraham, necesitamos poner atención al Lázaro que espera en nuestra puerta.

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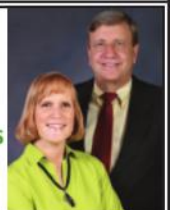
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
