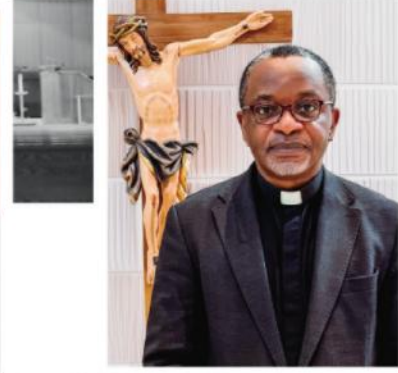

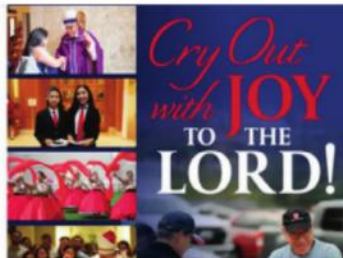

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend we gather as a parish family to celebrate our annual Fall Festival, the single largest fundraiser of the year for our community. On the surface it may look like rides, games, music, food, and fun, but in reality, it is much more. Our Fall Festival is an expression of who we are as the Body of Christ here in Spring: a people united in faith, strengthened by fellowship, and committed to the mission of being “a people for others.”

Ignatian spirituality reminds us that all we have and all we are is gift, freely given by God. In gratitude, we are called to place our gifts of time, talent, and treasure at the service of the Gospel. Our Fall Festival is a living icon of this principle: dozens of parishioners have spent months planning, hundreds more will volunteer this weekend, and all of us benefit from the fruits of their labor. I want to extend my deepest gratitude to our co-chairs and the dedicated members of the Festival Committee. Their planning began immediately after last year's event, and they have poured countless hours into making this weekend possible. Truly, the work of many hands bears much fruit, and we pray that the fruit of this labor will not only support the ministerial needs of our parish but also build lasting bonds of friendship and faith. St. Ignatius would remind us that when our labor is offered for the greater glory of God, it becomes more than work—it becomes prayer. The Fall Festival also gives us an opportunity to live out our identity as missionary disciples. We are invited to reach beyond our comfort zones, meet new people, welcome back those who have moved away, and extend hospitality to neighbors who may be visiting our parish for the first time. In these encounters, even over a plate of barbecue or a shared laugh at a game booth, we witness to Christ by our joy and generosity. As Pope Francis often reminded us, missionary discipleship is not reserved for great missions in faraway places; it begins right at our own gates, with those God places before us each day. The festival is not just about raising funds—it is about raising hearts toward God and raising one another up in community.

Next Sunday we will rejoice in another profound expression of God's grace in our midst: the Rite of Entrance into the Catechumenate. Several women and men who have never been baptized will take their next step on the journey toward becoming Roman Catholic Christians. Their journey began with a stirring of the Spirit, often inspired by the witness of family, friends, or parishioners like you. Now they have decided to go deeper, entering formally into the process of preparation for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. The catechumenate is a time of formation in faith, prayer, and community life. It is a period of apprenticeship in Christian living, supported by the entire parish. Our catechumens will now enjoy certain rights and privileges within the Church: They have the right to Christian burial if they should die before baptism. They may receive blessings and sacramentals to strengthen their faith. They are joined to the household of Christ through the prayers of the Church and are nurtured by the Word of God proclaimed at Mass. They are entitled to the love, support, and accompaniment of the Christian community as they continue their journey. For those of us already baptized, our responsibility is clear: to walk with our catechumens, encourage them by our example, and pray for them with genuine love. Ignatian spirituality teaches us to “find God in all things,” and that includes seeing God's Spirit at work in these men and women as they grow in faith. Our encouragement, a smile after Mass, a word of welcome, or an invitation to join us in parish activities can be the very way God communicates His presence to them.

As we celebrate the festival this weekend and prepare to welcome catechumens next week, let us remember that our parish mission is not about buildings or events alone, it is about forming disciples who live for others. The true measure of our parish is how we accompany one another on the path of faith and how we extend Christ's mercy to those who are poor, lonely, or in need. St. Ignatius taught us to ask, “What have I done for Christ? What am I doing for Christ? What ought I to do for Christ?” These questions are not meant to burden us, but to free us—to keep our focus on the One who gave everything for us. Whether serving a plate of food at the festival, teaching a catechism class, visiting the sick, or welcoming a new catechumen, each act of service becomes a response of love to Christ Himself. So let us have a wonderful weekend together, filled with laughter, fellowship, and joy. May the Fall Festival strengthen our bonds as a community, support our ministries with generosity, and remind us of our call to be missionary disciples in all we do. And next Sunday, let us welcome with open hearts those who will take their place among us as catechumens, trusting that God is doing something new in their lives and in ours. Together, may we continue to grow in being “a people for others,” rooted in Christ, guided by Ignatian spirituality, and sent forth as joyful witnesses of the Gospel.

WEEK READINGS

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Sunday, Oct 05, 2025**Time is on your side**

Time is one of the great mysteries of the human experience. It has many qualities and dimensions. There is the inexorable, relentless public time of clocks and calendars, schedules, and appointments. Then there is private time, the internal time of our thoughts and experiences. This kind of time is unique to each individual and, like a bird, alternates between flight and perching. When we are doing something we love or spending time with someone we care about, the minutes slow down and we experience something akin to God's time, the eternal now. In this dimension there is no pain or suffering, worry or anxiety; no fear of the future or regret for the past—all is well and on time. Spend a few moments in God's time today.

Monday, Oct 06, 2025**Get ready for your close-up**

Who is my neighbor? A man learned in Israelite law posed this question to Jesus. He asked neither what a neighbor was, nor how to treat a neighbor. The law had taught him that much. Rather he sought to know whom he needed to love. "Love thy neighbor" is a rule easy to understand and accept intellectually. Yet when we are face to face with other people, we are much more prone to excuse ourselves from this obligation. Thus, the Russian novelist Fyodor Dostoevsky wrote: "It's possible to love one's neighbor abstractly, and even occasionally from a distance, but hardly ever close up." Try to see your neighbors in those faces most difficult to love.

Tuesday, Oct 07, 2025**Choose the better part**

We all know the gospel story of Martha and her sister Mary of Bethany. During a visit from their friend Jesus, Martha got a little steamed because she was stuck with the cooking and serving while Mary got to sit at the Master's feet and listen to his words. Like many an aggrieved sibling before and since, she took her gripe to a higher authority, in this case Christ himself: "Tell her to help me." But note: Jesus responded with neither condemnation nor praise. He merely said that Mary had "chosen the better part"—in other words, Mary realized the importance of taking time out of the busyness of everyday life for hearing the words and teachings of the Lord. You can, too.

Jonah 3:1-10; Luke 10:38-42 (462). "There is need of only one thing."

Wednesday, Oct 08, 2025**More than words**

Think about the Lord's Prayer: It sounds as if it's mostly about what God does, but it's just as much—maybe more—about what we are to do. "Hallowed by your name, your kingdom come" is not only praise of God but also a prayer for God's name to be known and God's kingdom to be fulfilled on Earth—both of

which involve our cooperation. "Forgive us our sins as we forgive those indebted to us" reminds us of the uncomfortable truth that scripture proclaims loud and clear: God will forgive us to the extent we forgive one another. Next time you pray the Our Father, don't only say the words: Resolve to fulfill them.

Jonah 4:1-11; Luke 11:1-4 (463). "Lord, teach us to pray."

Thursday, Oct 09, 2025**A perfect example**

Most of us who have children and all of us who were once children carry some regrets about the whole parenting process. Even the most devoted parents fall short. The good news is that love covers a multitude of flaws. When children know they are truly loved, they can forgive much. As Saint John Chrysostom advises, "If from the beginning we teach children to love true wisdom, they will have greater wealth and glory than riches can provide." Parenting will never be perfect, but love, humility, and a desire to lead children toward wisdom can go a long way. And for all our shortcomings, we can always look to the greatest parent of all, God, for guidance and grace.

Malachi 3:13-20b; Luke 11:5-13 (464). "How much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

Friday, Oct 10, 2025**Cast your demons out**

Demons can make for great supernatural thrillers in the entertainment world, but they can also wreak havoc on our lives. We bump into them all the time—an unkind word, a sense of entitlement, a disparaging attitude toward ourselves or others. Our demons may not be the apocalyptic creatures of The Walking Dead or the latest "survival horror" video game, but they are very real and very deadly nonetheless. They can rob us of our conscience, of our God-given capacity to move toward the good, foster right relationships, and seek God always. What demons are you tangling with and how might you, in the words of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (no. 385), be vigilant in shifting your focus to God and trusting in the "superabundance" of God's grace?

Joel 1:13-15; 2:1-2; Luke 11:15-26 (465). "Every kingdom divided against itself will be laid waste and house will fall against house."

Saturday, Oct 11, 2025**Blessed are those who share the Good News**

One day a female follower of Jesus, apparently touched by his words, was moved to shout out a blessing on him: "Blessed is the womb that carried you and the breasts at which you nursed," perhaps wishing that she herself should have such a son. Yet Jesus demurs and turns the blessing back upon her and all like her. While Jesus' mother and her womb are indeed blessed as we pray in the "Hail Mary," Jesus takes even greater delight in those of either gender who allow his words to take root in their hearts, their inmost being—those who keep that word alive by nourishing it and sharing it with others. Jesus blesses us for laboring and bringing the Good News to birth today.

Dear Parish Family,

My name is Seth Dalton, and I am honored to serve as the Associate Director of Worship for Liturgical Music here at St. Ignatius. You've probably seen me zooming around here and there. 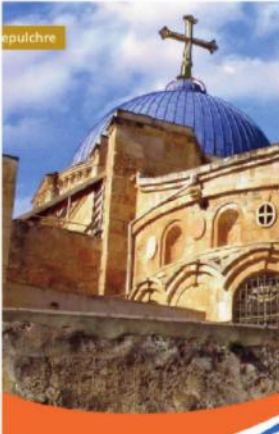

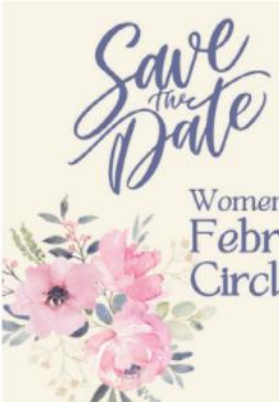

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

Queridos hermanos,

Este fin de semana nos reunimos como familia parroquial para celebrar nuestro Festival de Otoño anual, el evento de recaudación de fondos más grande del año para nuestra comunidad. A primera vista, puede parecer que incluye paseos, juegos, música, comida y diversión, pero en realidad es mucho más. Nuestro Festival de Otoño es una expresión de quiénes somos como Cuerpo de Cristo aquí en Spring: un pueblo unido en la fe, fortalecido por la comunión y comprometido con la misión de ser "Personas para los demás".

La espiritualidad ignaciana nos recuerda que todo lo que tenemos y todo lo que somos es un don, otorgado gratuitamente por Dios. En agradecimiento, estamos llamados a poner nuestros dones de tiempo, talento y tesoro al servicio del Evangelio. Nuestro Festival de Otoño es un ejemplo vivo de este principio: decenas de feligreses han dedicado meses a la planificación, cientos más se ofrecerán como voluntarios este fin de semana y todos nos beneficiamos del fruto de su labor. Quiero expresar mi más profundo agradecimiento a nuestros copresidentes y a los dedicados miembros del Comité del Festival. Su planificación comenzó inmediatamente después del evento del año pasado y han dedicado incontables horas para hacer posible este fin de semana. En verdad, el trabajo de muchas manos da mucho fruto, y oramos para que el fruto de esta labor no solo satisfaga las necesidades ministeriales de nuestra parroquia, sino que también construya lazos duraderos de amistad y fe. San Ignacio nos recordaba que cuando nuestro trabajo se ofrece para la mayor gloria de Dios, se convierte en más que trabajo: se convierte en oración. El Festival de Otoño también nos brinda la oportunidad de vivir nuestra identidad como discípulos misioneros. Estamos invitados a salir de nuestra zona de confort, conocer gente nueva, dar la bienvenida a quienes se han mudado y brindar hospitalidad a los vecinos que visitan nuestra parroquia por primera vez. En estos encuentros, incluso con un plato de barbacoa o unas risas compartidas en un puesto de juegos, damos testimonio de Cristo con nuestra alegría y generosidad. Como nos recordaba a menudo el Papa Francisco, el discipulado misionero no se reserva para grandes misiones en lugares lejanos; comienza justo en nuestras propias puertas, con aquellos que Dios pone ante nosotros cada día. El festival no se trata solo de recaudar fondos, sino de elevar los corazones hacia Dios y animarnos unos a otros en comunidad.

El próximo domingo nos regocijaremos en otra profunda expresión de la gracia de Dios entre nosotros: el Rito de Entrada al Catecumenado. Varios hombres y mujeres que nunca han sido bautizados darán el siguiente paso en su camino hacia la fe católica. Su camino comenzó con una inspiración del Espíritu, a menudo inspirada por el testimonio de familiares, amigos o feligreses como ustedes. Ahora han decidido profundizar, iniciando formalmente el proceso de preparación para los sacramentos del Bautismo, la Confirmación y la Eucaristía. El catecumenado es un tiempo de formación en la fe, la oración y la vida comunitaria. Es un período de aprendizaje en la vida cristiana, apoyado por toda la parroquia. Nuestros catecúmenos gozarán ahora de ciertos derechos y privilegios dentro de la Iglesia: Tienen derecho a una sepultura cristiana si fallecen antes del bautismo. Pueden recibir bendiciones y sacramentales para fortalecer su fe. Se unen a la familia de Cristo mediante las oraciones de la Iglesia y se nutren de la Palabra de Dios proclamada en la misa. Tienen derecho al amor, el apoyo y el acompañamiento de la comunidad cristiana en su camino. Para quienes ya estamos bautizados, nuestra responsabilidad es clara: acompañar a nuestros catecúmenos, animarlos con nuestro ejemplo y orar por ellos con amor genuino. La espiritualidad ignaciana nos enseña a "encontrar a Dios en todas las cosas", lo que incluye ver el Espíritu de Dios obrando en estos hombres y mujeres a medida que crecen en la fe. Nuestro aliento, una sonrisa después de la misa, una palabra de bienvenida o una invitación a unirse a nosotros en las actividades parroquiales pueden ser la forma en que Dios les comunica su presencia.

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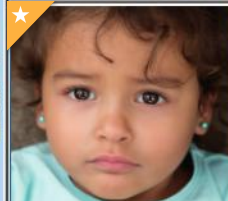
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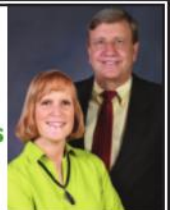
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
