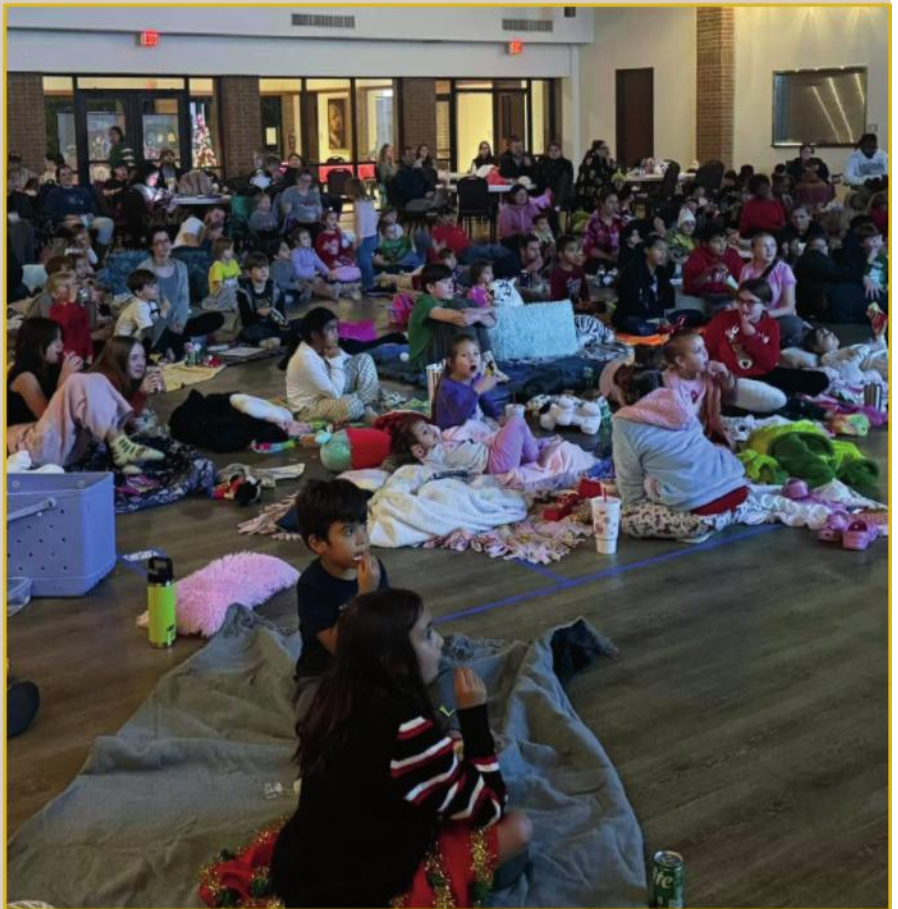

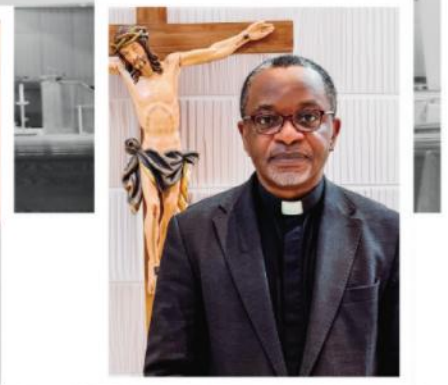

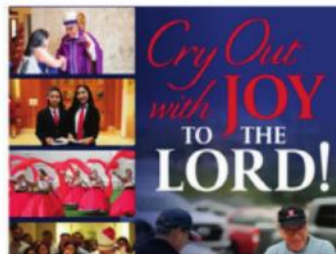

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we continue to walk together in faith at St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish, I write to you with a heart full of gratitude, encouragement, and challenge. First, a profound word of thanksgiving. Our annual Fall Festival was once again a tremendous display of our parish's vibrancy, generosity, and joy. I am deeply grateful to our co-chairs, committee members, sponsors, and all who attended. To those who purchased raffle tickets, contributed to the silent and live auctions, and those who donated, bid, or won—thank you! None of this could have happened without you. Truly, the life of our community shone brightly as we lived out what it means to be a people for others. We witnessed, in a very tangible way, how the Spirit unites us across generations, languages, and backgrounds. The fruit of this labor will be evident in the weeks ahead as the festival's proceeds help fund the ministries that touch lives daily. The final results will be posted and announced in about four to six weeks, but the spiritual fruit—the fellowship, laughter, and welcome shared—is already abundantly clear.

Our journey as missionary disciples continues in every corner of parish life. At present, we are still searching for a new Director of Formation for Children and Families. This role is vital to our mission of forming the next generation of Catholics and supporting their parents. We trust the Holy Spirit to guide us to the right person who will help us continue to grow as a community of missionary disciples, living the spirit of accompaniment so often spoken of by Pope Francis. Accompaniment means walking alongside another—listening to their story, sharing faith together, and pointing them to Christ in everyday life. It is not about quick answers or surface-level activity, but about patient presence, humble service, and a willingness to enter into another's journey. It means being companions on the road to Emmaus, opening the Scriptures together, and allowing hearts to burn with renewed faith. In the meantime, we are blessed beyond measure by the generosity of Mary Wright and Kathy Schaefer. Both of them, having faithfully served as directors of elementary and early childhood formation, stepped back in to keep our programs alive and thriving during this time of transition. They embody what it means to be missionary disciples: women who see the urgency of helping families encounter Christ and who offer themselves joyfully for the sake of the Gospel. I would be remiss if I did not offer a heartfelt word of gratitude to Deacon Joe Wright. Originally serving as a part-time formator for our teens preparing for Confirmation, Deacon Joe has now taken up the responsibility of leading our entire formation department through this transitional season. His leadership, generosity, and countless hours of dedication have ensured that our programs remain steady and strong. Deacon Joe, thank you for embodying servant leadership in the Ignatian spirit, for reminding us that true greatness is found in service.

This leads to an important reflection. Our parish does not simply need “volunteers.” Volunteers are valuable, of course, but volunteering often suggests “helping out” when convenient. A missionary disciple, however, sees service not as an optional activity but as the very expression of one's baptismal identity. To be a missionary disciple is to understand that we are *sent*. We do not merely fill roles; we live vocations. We are called to form and be formed, to accompany and to be accompanied, and to serve not only here within St. Ignatius but in the wider community and world. As Ignatius of Loyola teaches, our lives are meant to be lived in discernment, always asking: “Where is God calling me now, in this moment, with the gifts I have?” A missionary disciple answers that call with courage and generosity. At the recent commissioning of catechists, we heard these powerful words: *“For the pastoral activity of the Church, the cooperation of a great many people is needed, so that communities as well as individuals may advance to full maturity in faith and continually show forth their faith through the celebration of the liturgy, through study, and through their manner of life.”* What a gift it is that here at St. Ignatius, we truly have a “great many people” who step forward with faith and generosity! And yet, this is also a challenge: do you believe that *you yourself* are part of that “great many people”? Each of us is called by name at baptism to be a missionary disciple. Each of us is invited to grow deeper in faith, to accompany another, and to allow our lives to reflect Christ's mercy.

So, brothers and sisters, I leave you with this challenge in our Ignatian spirit of “finding God in all things”: ask yourself this week, “How am I living not as a volunteer, but as a missionary disciple? Where is Christ asking me to accompany another?” Perhaps it is through mentoring a young person, listening more deeply to a family member, or saying yes to a ministry here at the parish. Whatever it may be, do it with love, with joy, and with the awareness that you are part of God's great work of salvation. Thank you for being companions on this journey. Thank you for living your faith boldly. May we continue to grow together as a parish of missionary disciples, guided always by the vision of St. Ignatius: to see all things in Christ and to labor together for His greater glory.

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Sunday, Oct 12, 2025

Faith brings a wellspring of healing

Whether Jesus was speaking to a woman who had anointed him in a Pharisee's house, another woman whom he had cured of a hemorrhage, or a leper whom he'd cleansed, his closing words were much the same: "Your faith has saved you." Believing in Jesus' power to heal had opened the door to healing. Some versions of the Bible, though, translate this phrase a little differently: "Your faith has made you well." To be "saved," then, can mean to be made well, to be made whole, not only in one's own person but in relationships with others, too. In yourself and in your relationships with God and others, what needs healing?

Monday, Oct 13, 2025

Don't say no to this invitation

When in Luke's gospel Jesus uses the phrase the "sign of Jonah," most of us would think of the whale. But Jesus has something else in mind. Jonah had been a prophet sent by God to convert the pagan city of Nineveh—a job Jonah didn't want. But when he finally buckled down and did what God asked, the people—much to Jonah's astonishment—converted! So for Jesus the "sign of Jonah" recalls the Ninevites' acceptance of God's word through God's prophet. At the judgment, Jesus says, those Ninevites will shame his own generation because they were humble enough and smart enough to accept God's invitation. We, who have been given the gospel and are surrounded by so many signs of God's love, have even less justification for not hearing the word of God and keeping it.

Romans 1:1-7; Luke 11:29-32 (467). "This generation ... seeks a sign, but no sign will be given it, except the sign of Jonah."

Tuesday, Oct 14, 2025

Be slow to judge

The Pharisees may have gotten a bit of a bum rap in the New Testament because of events that occurred after Jesus' death. The passages of the New Testament that are most hostile to the Pharisees were compiled at a time when it had become clear that most Jews did not consider Jesus to be the Messiah. The Pharisees may have served as a convenient scapegoat for that rejection. The Pharisaic tradition was in fact more flexible on many questions than it was portrayed to be. It does us well to look and listen carefully and judge slowly when it comes to those who follow a different drummer.

Romans 1:16-25; Luke 11:37-41 (468). "You Pharisees ... inside you are filled with plunder and evil."

Wednesday, Oct 15, 2025

A one-step program

Ever wonder whether you are in good spiritual health? It's easy to assess: If love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control come easily to you, you're in good shape. If hatred, rivalry, jealousy, outbursts of fury, acts of selfishness, and envy are your frequent reactions to events, you're in need of a spiritual workout. Let Saint Teresa of Ávila (1515-82), reformer and church doctor, be your spiritual trainer. Step one: Recite this Teresian prayer daily: "Let nothing disturb you; Let nothing dismay you; All things pass: God never changes. Patience attains all that it strives for. He who has God lacks for nothing; God alone suffices." Step two:

There is no need for a step two if you master step one.

Thursday, Oct 16, 2025

We are already blessed

It helps to know things will work out before you get started on them. Paying bills is easy when you know the money is there. Getting something fixed is a less anxious experience when you have confidence in the repair person. So it is with the spiritual life. In all the apparent struggle to believe, live a holy life, and do the right thing, we can forget how much God has already done for us. And Saint Paul makes this point many times. We are already blessed. We already have redemption in Christ. God has revealed a plan for us. All we have to do is to stay close to God and follow the way. Saint Vincent de Paul understood this truth well when he asked, "Why should your soul not be filled with confidence since, by the mercy of Our Lord, you are his beloved child?" God has given us so much and promises to lead us to glory. Knowing that might make the journey a bit easier.

Romans 3:21-30; Luke 11:47-54 (470). "The righteousness of God has been manifested ... through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe."

Friday, Oct 17, 2025

A loving embrace

Ignatius of Antioch (c. 35-110) is one of the apostolic fathers of the church, a small group of Christian authors who lived close to the time of Jesus and had personal contact with some of the 12 apostles. It is said that Saint Peter himself appointed Ignatius to be bishop of Antioch. Tradition also has it that as a young child Ignatius had been one of the children Jesus took in his arms and blessed (Matthew 19:13-15). Whether or not historically true, this story signals something each of us can make our own—the image of being held in the loving arms of our Savior. That is a tradition that remains unbroken, from the time of Jesus down to the present.

Saturday, Oct 18, 2025

Care to share with the class?

Today we celebrate Saint Luke, author of the Acts of the Apostles as well as the gospel that bears his name. Thanks to Luke we have an original, compelling portrait of Jesus, our Messiah, the master who emphasized the importance of prayer and who cared deeply for women and the poor, the outcast, the ill, and the lowly. Luke is the only one of the four evangelists whose stated purpose in writing his gospel is so that others would be assured of the truth of what they've already learned. He writes in the prologue to his gospel: "I too have decided, after investigating everything accurately anew, to write it down in an orderly sequence for you, ... so that you may realize the certainty of the teachings you have received." Let us be grateful to parents, teachers, mentors, and others who, like Luke, freely share what they have learned for the benefit of others.

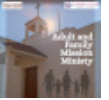

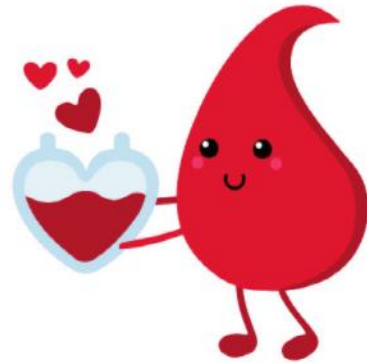

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

Queridos hermanos:

Mientras continuamos caminando juntos en la fe en la Parroquia de San Ignacio de Loyola, les escribo con un corazón lleno de gratitud, aliento y desafío. Primero, una profunda palabra de agradecimiento. Nuestro Festival Anual de Otoño fue, una vez más, una magnífica muestra de la vitalidad, la generosidad y la alegría de nuestra parroquia. Estoy profundamente agradecido a nuestros copresidentes, miembros del comité, patrocinadores y a todos los asistentes. A quienes compraron boletos para la rifa, contribuyeron a las subastas silenciosas y en vivo, y a quienes donaron, pujaron o ganaron, ¡gracias! Nada de esto habría sido posible sin ustedes. Verdaderamente, la vida de nuestra comunidad brilló con fuerza al vivir lo que significa ser personas para los demás. Fuimos testigos, de manera muy tangible, de cómo el Espíritu nos une a través de generaciones, idiomas y orígenes. El fruto de esta labor se hará evidente en las próximas semanas, ya que las ganancias del festival ayudarán a financiar los ministerios que impactan vidas a diario. Los resultados finales se publicarán y anunciarán en aproximadamente cuatro a seis semanas, pero el fruto espiritual (la comunión, la risa y la bienvenida compartida) ya es muy claro.

Nuestro camino como discípulos misioneros continúa en cada rincón de la vida parroquial. Actualmente, seguimos buscando un nuevo Director de Formación para Niños y Familias. Esta posición es vital para nuestra misión de formar a la próxima generación de católicos y apoyar a sus padres. Confiamos en que el Espíritu Santo nos guiará hacia la persona adecuada que nos ayudará a seguir creciendo como comunidad de discípulos misioneros, viviendo el espíritu de acompañamiento del que tanto habla el Papa Francisco. Acompañar significa caminar junto a otro: escuchar su historia, compartir juntos la fe y guiarlo hacia Cristo en la vida cotidiana. No se trata de respuestas rápidas ni de acciones superficiales, sino de presencia paciente, servicio humilde y la disposición a unirse al camino del otro. Significa ser compañeros en el camino de Emaús, abrir juntos las Escrituras y permitir que los corazones ardan con una fe renovada. Mientras tanto, nos sentimos inmensamente bendecidos por la generosidad de Mary Wright y Kathy Schaefer. Ambas, habiendo servido fielmente como directoras de formación de educación primaria y de primera infancia en el pasado, dieron de su tiempo y esfuerzo para mantener nuestros programas vivos y prósperos durante este tiempo de transición. Ellas encarnan lo que significa ser discípulas misioneras: mujeres que comprenden la urgencia de ayudar a las familias a encontrar a Cristo y que se ofrecen con alegría por el Evangelio. Sería un descuido de mi parte si no expresara mi más sincera gratitud al diácono Joe Wright. Inicialmente, sirviendo como formador a tiempo parcial para nuestros jóvenes que se preparaban para la Confirmación, el diácono Joe ahora ha asumido la responsabilidad de líder para todo nuestro departamento de formación durante esta etapa de transición. Su liderazgo, generosidad e innumerables horas de dedicación han asegurado la estabilidad y solidez de nuestros programas. Diácono Joe, gracias por encarnar el liderazgo de servicio con espíritu ignaciano, y por recordarnos que la verdadera grandeza reside en el servicio.

Esto nos lleva a una reflexión importante. Nuestra parroquia no solo necesita voluntarios. Los voluntarios son valiosos, por supuesto, pero el voluntariado a menudo implica "ayudar" cuando conviene. Sin embargo, un discípulo misionero ve el servicio no como una actividad opcional, sino como la expresión misma de su identidad bautismal. Ser un discípulo misionero es comprender que somos enviados. No nos limitamos a cumplir funciones; vivimos vocaciones. Estamos llamados a formar y ser formados, a acompañar y ser acompañados, y a servir no solo aquí en San Ignacio, sino en la comunidad y el mundo en general. Como enseña Ignacio de Loyola, nuestras vidas deben vivirse en discernimiento, preguntándonos siempre: "¿A dónde me llama Dios ahora, en este momento, con los dones que tengo?". Un discípulo misionero responde a ese llamado con valentía y generosidad. En la reciente comisión de catequistas, escuchamos estas conmovedoras palabras: *Para la actividad pastoral de la Iglesia, se necesita la cooperación de muchísimas personas, para que tanto las comunidades como las personas puedan alcanzar la plena madurez en la fe y manifestarla continuamente mediante la celebración de la liturgia, el estudio y su estilo de vida.* ¡Qué gran don (regalo espiritual) es que aquí en San Ignacio contemos con muchísimas personas que dan un paso al frente con fe y generosidad! Y, sin embargo, esto también es un desafío: ¿crees que *tu* formas parte de esas muchísimas personas? Cada uno de nosotros es llamado por su nombre en el bautismo a ser un discípulo misionero. Cada uno está invitado a profundizar en la fe, a acompañar a otro y a que nuestra vida refleje la misericordia de Cristo.

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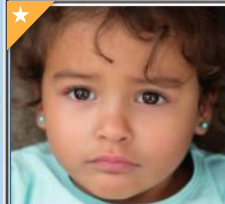
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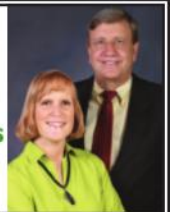


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
