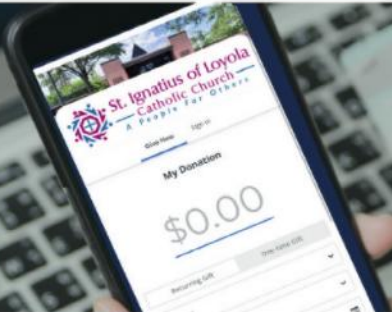

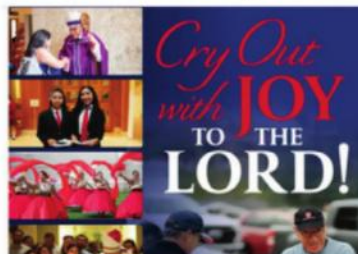

PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last weekend, our parish celebrated a beautiful and important liturgical moment: the Rite for Entrance into the Catechumenate. This step marks the beginning of a journey for those who desire to be fully initiated into the Catholic Church. Until recently, this rite was known as the Rite of Acceptance into the Catechumenate. The change in terminology may seem small, but it reflects a deeper renewal in the way the Church understands and celebrates the process of bringing new members into the Body of Christ. Along with this adjustment, the entire process formerly called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is now known as the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA). The word “order” helps us appreciate that initiation is not a single event but a series of sacred moments—rites—celebrated in a particular sequence. Each step is more than a formality; it is a movement of grace, a gradual unfolding of God’s work in the life of the catechumen. Together, these rites form a path that leads to full sacramental initiation at the Easter Vigil, when the elect are baptized, confirmed, and receive the Eucharist for the first time. This shift from “rite” to “order” reminds us that becoming Catholic is not simply about completing a program or passing through classes. It is about being drawn into the mystery of Christ, step by step, through a rhythm of prayer, liturgy, and formation. Each stage prepares the heart for deeper conversion, allowing the person to grow in faith, to be supported by the community, and to discern more clearly God’s call.

To guide the Church in this work, the bishops of the United States have issued the National Statutes for the Christian Initiation of Adults. These norms, especially numbers 3 through 6, remind us that the catechumenate is not meant to be rushed. Norm 3 emphasizes that the time of formation must be sufficient in length and intensity to allow true conversion to take root. Norm 4 stresses that this period should include a comprehensive catechesis, not only on the truths of the faith but also on how to live as disciples of Christ in the world. Norm 5 highlights the importance of liturgical rites and participation in the community’s prayer life, helping catechumens experience the rhythm of Catholic worship and grow comfortable within it. Finally, norm 6 points to the necessity of apostolic formation, meaning that catechumens should begin to experience what it means to serve others and to live the mission of the Church even before their baptism. In other words, the catechumenate is not simply about “making Catholics.” It is about forming missionary disciples—men and women who not only profess the Creed but live it with conviction, who can share the joy of the Gospel with others, and who understand that Christian faith is always outward-facing, rooted in love of God and neighbor. This is why the Church insists that the catechumenate be of real length and depth: conversion takes time, formation requires patience, and discipleship is not an overnight achievement. As a parish, we share responsibility for this process. Our prayers, our witness, and our welcome matter profoundly. Each catechumen is not just journeying alone with a sponsor or catechist; they are walking with the entire Body of Christ. Every time you greet them, pray for them, or accompany them in parish life, you are strengthening their path of faith.

As our catechumens begin this pilgrimage of initiation, I too embark on a pilgrimage this week. I will be in Rome to take part in the Jubilee Celebration with the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem. Knights and Dames from around the world will gather as pilgrims to walk through the Holy Doors of the major basilicas of Rome—St. Peter’s, St. Paul Outside the Walls, St. Mary Major, and St. John Lateran. In each of these sacred places we will celebrate Holy Mass, lifting up to the Lord the needs of the world and the intentions of the Church. The Jubilee theme is drawn from St. Paul’s words: *“Hope does not disappoint”* (Romans 5:5). In a world where disappointment often seems more common than joy, this Jubilee calls us to rediscover that Christian hope is rooted not in fleeting optimism but in the enduring love of God poured out in Christ. It is this same hope that animates our catechumens as they step into the life of the Church, trusting that God is leading them toward fullness of life. Be assured, dear friends, that I will carry you with me in prayer as I pass through the Holy Doors. Each step I take in those basilicas will be accompanied by gratitude for this parish family and by intercession for your needs. I ask you, in turn, to pray for me and for all the Knights and Dames making this pilgrimage—that our time in Rome may strengthen us to be more faithful witnesses of Christ’s peace and justice in the world.

Let us give thanks for those who are entering the catechumenate in our parish. Let us support them with our prayers and presence. Let us hold one another in hope, confident that God who has begun this good work will bring it to completion. And let us rejoice that, wherever we walk—whether in Spring, Texas or in the streets of Rome—we are companions on the road of faith, missionary disciples sent to announce the Gospel of life.

WEEK READINGS

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Sunday, Oct 19, 2025**No need to duke it out**

"Sometimes I get so mad at God," one woman told the priest, "that I'd like to punch him right in the nose!" Yikes! It sounds irreverent, but that's exactly what Jesus is saying in an amusing parable about a widow and a judge. The judge renders a decision for the widow because he fears the woman will strike him! If that's true for a worldly judge, Jesus says, how much more will the Judge of All be quick to answer a prayer. Faith, then, is waiting in joyful and expectant hope for our God, the truly just judge, who answers all our prayers. So you can put the gloves away.

Monday, Oct 20, 2025**Be generous with your time**

Jealously guarding our time can be considered a form of greed. We receive from God the gift of 24/7; we need to give some of it away. That's why this week we observe Pastoral Care Week, sponsored by the National Association of Catholic Chaplains. This week was established to recognize the many ways church professionals respond with attentive listening to those with physical, emotional, or spiritual concerns. Hospitals, prisons, nursing homes, and your local parish will accept volunteers who wish to donate their time for this important work. "What does love look like?" Saint Augustine asks. "It has the ears to hear the sighs and sorrows of others. That is what love looks like." Cut loose a couple of hours a week and give them to someone in need.

Tuesday, Oct 21, 2025**The virtue of patience**

Waiting is among the greatest spiritual challenges a believer faces. Twentieth-century French philosopher and Jesuit priest Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, whose visionary writings were not always well received in certain Catholic circles, knew what it meant to wait. It wasn't until several decades after his death that the church fully embraced his theological insights. His prayer "Patient Trust," borne out of his own trials, continues to offer hope for those who wait: "Above all, trust in the slow work of God. /We are quite naturally impatient in everything to reach the end without delay. . . /Give Our Lord the benefit of believing that his hand is leading you, and accept the anxiety of feeling yourself in suspense and incomplete."

Romans 5:12, 15b, 17-19, 20b-21; Luke 12:35-38 (474). "Be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks."

Wednesday, Oct 22, 2025**Hold yourself accountable**

On the back of countless trucks on our highways appears the curious inquiry: "How is my driving?" The accompanying

number to call invites our critique. What if we all came equipped with signs inviting the moral critique of those around us? We might be surprised and not at all pleased with the feedback. Thankfully, Christianity doesn't rely on external judgment; Jesus even warned against judging others. But we are encouraged to perform our own regular examination of conscience. Take a look at your life and loves, relationships and resources, talents and time. How are you doing?

Romans 6:12-18; Luke 12:39-48 (475). "Much will be required of the person entrusted with much."

Thursday, Oct 23, 2025**Light a fire under your spiritual growth**

Jesus shocks his disciples—and many of us as well, no doubt—when he declares that he came not to establish peace but rather division, to "set the earth on fire." What kind of fire did he have in mind? Fire in biblical times was associated with God's action in the world and the lives of people. Jesus is using strong language to impress upon us the importance of taking responsibility for our spiritual growth. Do our relationships, choices, lifestyles, and loyalties reflect the seriousness of the call to spiritual maturity? If not, what can we do today to begin to put things right?

Romans 6:19-23; Luke 12:49-53 (476). "Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth?"

Friday, Oct 24, 2025**Read the signs**

We're used to thinking about God as "hidden" or invisible, requiring an effort to perceive in the world around us, and one whom we will know fully only when we die. After all, doesn't Saint Paul say, "Now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face"? But it's also true that signs of God, as Jesus said, lie everywhere and are as obvious as a cloud bringing rain or a hot wind promising warm weather. So be a meteorologist for God. The signs of Christ's presence are all around. Where do you see them?

Romans 7:18-25a; Luke 12:54-59 (477). "You know how to interpret the appearance of the earth and the sky; why do you not know how to interpret the present time?"

Saturday, Oct 25, 2025**Make God decisions**

One of the choices life offers is whether to let God be part of your life. Of course, God is always present, within you and around you, but you can choose to ignore, shut out, or pretend God isn't there. Saint Paul called this "I don't need God attitude" living in "the flesh" and believed this illusion of self-sufficiency hid the road to death. Openness to the divine, though—to the power and Spirit of Christ—guides you to life in God. "If we wish to make any progress in the service of God we must begin every day of our life with new eagerness," advises Saint Charles Borromeo. Find some ways to choose God today.

Romans 8:1-11; Luke 13:1-9 (478). "If Christ is in you, the spirit is alive because of righteousness."

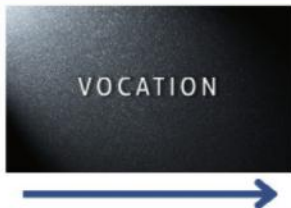

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

Queridos hermanos,

El fin de semana pasado, nuestra parroquia celebró un hermoso e importante momento litúrgico: el Rito de Entrada al Catecumenado. Este paso marca el inicio de un camino para quienes desean ser plenamente iniciados en la Iglesia Católica. Hasta hace poco, este rito se conocía como el Rito de Aceptación al Catecumenado. El cambio de terminología puede parecer insignificante, pero refleja una renovación más profunda en la forma en que la Iglesia entiende y celebra el proceso de incorporar nuevos miembros al Cuerpo de Cristo. Junto con este cambio, el proceso, anteriormente llamado Rito de Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos (RICA), ahora se conoce como Orden de Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos (OCIA). La palabra "orden" nos ayuda a comprender que la iniciación no es un evento único, sino una serie de momentos sagrados —ritos— celebrados en una secuencia particular. Cada paso es más que una formalidad; es un movimiento de gracia, un desarrollo gradual de la obra de Dios en la vida del catecúmeno. Juntos, estos ritos forman un camino que conduce a la iniciación sacramental completa en la Vigilia Pascual, cuando los elegidos son bautizados, confirmados y reciben la Eucaristía por primera vez. Este cambio de "rito" a "orden" nos recuerda que convertirse en católico no se trata simplemente de completar un programa o asistir a clases. Se trata de sumergirse en el misterio de Cristo, paso a paso, a través de un ritmo de oración, liturgia y formación. Cada etapa prepara el corazón para una conversión más profunda, permitiendo a la persona crecer en la fe, recibir el apoyo de la comunidad y discernir con mayor claridad la llamada de Dios.

Para guiar a la Iglesia en esta labor, los obispos de Estados Unidos han emitido los Estatutos Nacionales para la Iniciación Cristiana de Adultos. Estas normas, especialmente las 3 a 6, nos recuerdan que el catecumenado no debe ser apresurado. La Norma 3 enfatiza que el tiempo de formación debe ser suficiente en duración e intensidad para permitir que la verdadera conversión se arraigue. La Norma 4 enfatiza que este período debe incluir una catequesis integral, no solo sobre las verdades de la fe, sino también sobre cómo vivir como discípulos de Cristo en el mundo. La Norma 5 destaca la importancia de los ritos litúrgicos y la participación en la vida de oración de la comunidad, ayudando a los catecúmenos a experimentar el ritmo del culto católico y a sentirse cómodos en él. Finalmente, la Norma 6 señala la necesidad de la formación apostólica, lo que significa que los catecúmenos deben comenzar a experimentar lo que significa servir a los demás y vivir la misión de la Iglesia incluso antes de su bautismo. En otras palabras, el catecumenado no se trata simplemente de "hacer católicos". Se trata de formar discípulos misioneros: hombres y mujeres que no sólo profesen el Credo, sino que lo vivan con convicción, que puedan compartir la alegría del Evangelio con los demás y que comprendan que la fe cristiana está siempre orientada hacia el exterior, arraigada en el amor a Dios y al prójimo. Por eso la Iglesia insiste en que el catecumenado sea realmente largo y profundo: la conversión lleva tiempo, la formación requiere paciencia, y el discipulado no se logra de la noche a la mañana. Como parroquia, compartimos la responsabilidad de este proceso. Nuestras oraciones, nuestro testimonio y nuestra acogida son de suma importancia. Cada catecúmeno no camina solo con un padrino o catequista; camina con todo el Cuerpo de Cristo. Cada vez que los saludan, rezan por ellos o los acompañan en la vida parroquial, fortalecen su camino de fe.

Mientras nuestros catecúmenos comienzan esta peregrinación de iniciación, yo también me embarco en una peregrinación esta semana. Estaré en Roma para participar en la Celebración del Jubileo con La Orden Ecuéstre del Santo Sepulcro de Jerusalén. Caballeros y Damas de todo el mundo se reunirán como peregrinos para cruzar las Puertas Santas de las basílicas mayores de Roma: San Pedro, San Pablo Extramuros, Santa María la Mayor y San Juan de Letrán. En cada uno de estos lugares sagrados celebraremos la Santa Misa, elevando al Señor las necesidades del mundo y las intenciones de la Iglesia. El tema del Jubileo se inspira en las palabras de San Pablo: «*La esperanza no defrauda*» (Romanos 5,5). En un mundo donde la decepción a menudo parece más común que la alegría, este Jubileo nos llama a redescubrir que la esperanza cristiana no se basa en un optimismo fugaz, sino en el amor perdurable de Dios derramado en Cristo. Es esta misma esperanza la que anima a nuestros catecúmenos al integrarse en la vida de la Iglesia, confiando en que Dios los guía hacia la plenitud de vida. Tengan la seguridad, queridos amigos, de que los llevaré conmigo en oración al cruzar las Puertas Santas. Cada paso que dé en esas basílicas estará acompañado de gratitud por esta familia parroquial e intercesión por sus necesidades. Les pido, a su vez, que oren por mí y por todos los Caballeros y Damas que realizan esta peregrinación, para que nuestro tiempo en Roma nos fortalezca para ser testigos más fieles de la paz y la justicia de Cristo en el mundo.

Demos gracias por quienes inician el catecumenado en nuestra parroquia. Apoyémoslos con nuestras oraciones y nuestra presencia. Mantengámonos en la esperanza, confiados en que Dios, que inició esta buena obra, la completará. Y alegrémonos de que, dondequiera que caminemos —ya sea en Spring, Texas, o en las calles de Roma—, somos compañeros en el camino de la fe, discípulos misioneros enviados a anunciar el Evangelio de la vida.

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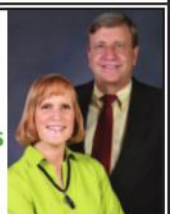


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
