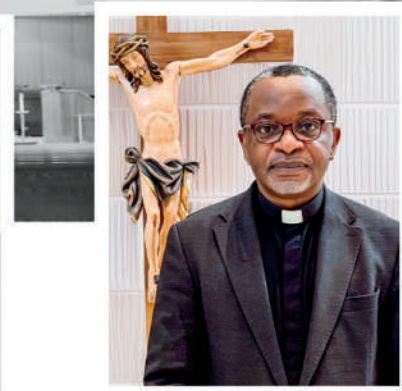

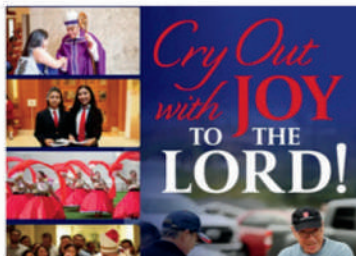

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend we have the great joy of welcoming to our parish The Most Reverend Juan Manuel Cuá Ajacum, Bishop of the Diocese of Quiché, Guatemala. Bishop Cuá joins us for our annual Mission Appeal for *La Escuelita*—the Little School in Chiché, Quiché, Guatemala. The official name of the school is *La Escuela Parroquial “Nojb’al Ri Q’inmit,”* but we also know it as Our Lady of Guadalupe School. This visit is both an honor and a blessing for our community, as it reminds us that the Church truly is universal and that our baptism calls us into communion and mission with brothers and sisters across the world. Our parish’s partnership with the Little School began in 2001, under the leadership of our former pastor, Fr. Fran Pistorius, S.J. What began as a “one-year project” has, by the grace of God and the steadfast generosity of our parish, blossomed into a long-term mission of hope and transformation. Now, in 2025, we continue to provide the salaries for the teachers and director of the school—a commitment that has endured through the faith, prayers, and stewardship of the people of St. Ignatius of Loyola. Over the years, we have witnessed extraordinary fruits from this humble beginning. Children who once sat in the Little School’s classrooms have now grown to become teachers, engineers, and community leaders, returning to serve the very parish and village that formed them. The school has not only provided education but has become a foundation for dignity, purpose, and Christian discipleship. The people of Chiché are no longer simply the recipients of mission—they are missionary disciples themselves, evangelizing by their faith and example.

Our Lord reminds us that to be baptized is to be sent—missionary support is not an option reserved for a few; it is an essential expression of our baptismal identity. When we support the Little School, we are responding to Christ’s Great Commission: *“Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations.”* (Matthew 28:19) Each July, 13 parishioners from St. Ignatius accompany me to Chiché to visit the school and the surrounding community. Over the years, we have seen classrooms expand, students flourish, parents grow in faith, and the parish of Santo Tomás de Chiché deepen its understanding of stewardship. It is a living example of collaboration in mission, where both communities—Spring, Texas, and Chiché, Guatemala—work hand in hand to bring about God’s reign of love and justice. The response of our parishioners has been overwhelming from the start. Enrollment quickly exceeded expectations. The school adopted a policy of never turning a child away, regardless of family circumstance. As a result, classrooms designed for smaller groups often hold more than 35 students, particularly in the lower grades. The community has embraced every challenge as an opportunity to grow in faith and service. Many families in Chiché depend on the help of their older children at home or in the fields, so attendance in upper grades is smaller. Yet even there, the dedication of the teachers—whose salaries we fund—ensures that every student receives not just an education, but an encounter with Christ.

In 2006, during our annual fundraiser, we were honored to welcome the then-Bishop of Quiché, Bishop Mario Alberto Molina, to St. Ignatius. His visit was deeply inspiring. He reminded us, “You are not only educating the children of the school, but you are affecting change for the entire country.” That year, our fundraiser was the most successful in the school’s history—an outpouring of generosity that continues to echo today. As our long-time parishioner Steve Dalhoff beautifully said when reflecting on this mission: *“With the seed planted by the Holy Spirit, and the continued support of Fr. Norbert, we share in this project in all of its parts—financially, physically, and spiritually. With the fruit of our combined labor, and with the blessing of the Holy Spirit, there can be no end for this wonderful journey.”* Their parents express profound gratitude for the gift of education and for the faith that now shapes their children’s lives. This is more than a mission project—it is a partnership of love, sacrifice, and blessings that unites our parish with another across borders and languages in the one Body of Christ.

Next Saturday, we will host our annual Refugee Thanksgiving Dinner in collaboration with Catholic Charities. Each year, families from around the world—newly arrived refugees who have endured hardship and displacement—are brought by bus to our campus, where they are welcomed with a traditional Thanksgiving meal. Our parishioners prepare, serve, and sit alongside our guests, sharing stories, laughter, and joy. It is one of the most heartwarming expressions of faith-in-action that we experience as a parish. In breaking bread together, we extend Christ’s hospitality and live the Gospel’s call to “welcome the stranger.”

Finally, I want to thank all of you for your prayers while I was away. Your kindness and support are deeply felt and profoundly appreciated. I am continually humbled by your faith and the generosity with which you live it out—both here at home and abroad.

WEEK READINGS

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Sunday, Nov 09, 2025**The Lord's living house**

How often, when we speak of church, we have to clarify whether we mean the faith community or the building where that community gathers. The fact that the memorial of the dedication of the Church of St. John Lateran today replaces even the Sunday liturgy reminds us that our faith reaches into the clay from which we are made. We celebrate this building—the pope's own cathedral, the mother of all churches—remembering that human beings need things that appeal to the senses to remind us of spiritual values. Saint Augustine says that when the community of faith gathers “they are hewn out, as it were, from mountains and forests, like stones and timber; but by catechizing, baptism, and instruction they are . . . shaped, squared, and planed by the hands of the workers and artisans” and finally are made into a house for the Lord, “fitted together through love.”

FEAST OF THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12; 1 Corinthians 3:9c-11, 16-17; John 2:13-22 (671). “Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?”

Monday, Nov 10, 2025**Called to account**

It's easy to fall into the habit of blaming others when things go wrong. But Jesus challenges us to take responsibility for our own actions. At the same time, Jesus calls us to hold each other accountable: “If your brother sins, rebuke him; and if he repents, forgive him” (Luke 17:3). There's a tension here—justice and mercy—but they go hand in hand. For Saint Augustine forgiveness is a great gift we can give to others and ourselves: “There are many kinds of alms, the giving of which helps us to obtain pardon for our sins; but none is greater than that by which we forgive from our heart a sin that someone has committed against us.” Avoid blame and focus on accountability and mercy, two sides of divine love.

Wisdom 1:1-7; Luke 17:1-6 (491). “Wisdom is a kindly spirit, yet she acquits not the blasphemer of his guilty lips.”

Tuesday, Nov 11, 2025**A soldier of Christ**

If conscientious objectors had a patron saint, it would be Saint Martin of Tours (316/317-397). Though Martin was born into a military family and named after Mars, the god of war, his conversion to Christianity led him to renounce military service and dedicate his life to the gospel. “I am a soldier of Christ,” he said. “I cannot fight.” Such a decision, then and now, is never easy for a soldier to make and, depending on the time or place, could lead to imprisonment (as it did for Martin), physical punishment, even death. As we rightly honor all those who have given military service to their country today, let us also remember those who have chosen to fulfill a different duty.

Wisdom 2:23-3:9; Luke 17:7-10 (492). “When you have done all you have been commanded, say, ‘... we have done what we were obliged to do.’”

Wednesday, Nov 12, 2025**Love rules**

Jesus asks a good question in the story about the 10 lepers he cleansed after only one returned to offer thanks: Where were the other nine? We can only imagine they were off doing exactly what Jesus told them to do: showing themselves to the priests, a Jewish ritual prescribed for the healing of leprosy. The tenth man, a

Samaritan, wasn't bound by Jewish law. So he was free to return and thank the Lord. When it comes to leading a virtuous life, it's always a safe bet to follow the law, but not at the expense of the good news of God's saving love. Christ's whole purpose for becoming human was to teach us that lesson. Remember that the next time you use church law as a crutch or a cudgel instead of a path that leads to the abundant love of Christ.

Wisdom 6:1-11; Luke 17:11-19 (493). “Desire therefore my words; long for them and you shall be instructed.”

Thursday, Nov 13, 2025**Good deeds build the Kingdom**

The word kingdom, found in the frequently used New Testament phrase “kingdom of God,” comes from the Greek *basileia*, meaning “kingdom,” “reign,” or most literally “foundation.” Jesus laid God's foundation among us, and Christians continue to build on that foundation through lives of love and service. Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850-1917) desired to build her life on Christ: “Convert me, Jesus,” she wrote in her diary, “for if you do not make me a saint, I will not know how to work in your vineyard.” God's kingdom comes each time we do the right thing—fight a just cause, serve the needs of our community, follow God's command to forgive and show mercy. Without a desire to do God's will, we will, in the words of Mother Cabrini, “end by betraying God's interests, instead of rendering them successful.”

Wisdom 7:22b-8:1; Luke 17:20-25 (494). “Behold, the Kingdom of God is among you.”

Friday, Nov 14, 2025**Prepare for final approach**

Old cathedrals preserve images of a sea of flames in which men and women are paying the penalty for their dissolute living. Replace the word “penalty” with “preparation,” and the idea of a “place” where souls are sent with the concept of a “process.” That comes closer to how the church speaks of purgatory today. Purgatory is a process whereby each soul is prepared for glory. If God is Love, then anything unloving or unyielding in our spirits must be surrendered before approaching final union with the Lord. Start the winnowing process now and let go of all that isn't heaven ready.

Wisdom 13:1-9; Luke 17:26-37 (495). “Whoever seeks to preserve his life will lose it, but whoever loses it will save it.”

Saturday, Nov 15, 2025**Science and religion: let's talk**

As scientists probe ever more deeply into the mysteries of life, some people of faith feel threatened by the new terrain being traversed. But rather than retreat from the field, believers do well to bring their faith and ethics to the dialogue. We can turn to Saint Albert the Great (1193/1206-80) for inspiration. Albert was a Dominican friar and priest famous for his advocacy of the peaceful coexistence of science and religion. Tutor to Saint Thomas Aquinas, Albert brought Aristotle out of the shadows of the Dark Ages and ushered in the modern era of scientific inquiry. If we believe that God is Lord of all creation, we have nothing to fear from the exploration of the mysteries of that creation.

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

Queridos hermanos,

Este fin de semana tenemos la gran alegría de recibir en nuestra parroquia a Monseñor Juan Manuel Cuá Ajacum, Obispo de la Diócesis de Quiché, Guatemala. El Obispo Cuá nos acompaña en nuestra colecta anual para la Misión de La Escuelita, en Chiché, Guatemala. El nombre oficial de la escuela es Escuela Parroquial “Nojb’al Ri Q’tinmit”, pero también la conocemos como Escuela Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe. Esta visita es un honor y una bendición para nuestra comunidad, pues nos recuerda que la Iglesia es verdaderamente universal y que nuestro bautismo nos llama a la comunión y la misión con hermanos y hermanas de todo el mundo. La colaboración de nuestra parroquia con la Escuelita comenzó en 2001, bajo el liderazgo de nuestro Párroco anterior, el Padre Fran Pistorius, S.J. Lo que empezó como un proyecto de un año, por la gracia de Dios y la generosidad constante de nuestra parroquia, se ha convertido en una misión de esperanza y transformación a largo plazo. Ahora, en 2025, continuamos proporcionando los salarios de los maestros y del director de la escuela, un compromiso que ha perdurado gracias a la fe, las oraciones y la administración de las personas de San Ignacio de Loyola. A lo largo de los años, hemos visto frutos extraordinarios de este humilde comienzo. Los niños que una vez asistieron a las aulas de la Escuelita se han convertido en maestros, ingenieros y líderes comunitarios, y regresan para servir a la misma parroquia y al pueblo que los formó. La escuela no solo ha brindado educación, sino que se ha convertido en un fundamento de dignidad, propósito y discipulado cristiano. Los habitantes de Chiché ya no son simplemente receptores de la misión; son discípulos misioneros, evangelizando con su fe y su ejemplo.

Nuestro Señor nos recuerda que bautizarse es ser enviado; el apoyo misionero no es una opción reservada para unos pocos, sino una expresión esencial de nuestra identidad bautismal. Al apoyar la Escuelita, respondemos a la Gran Comisión de Cristo: *«Por tanto, id y haced discípulos de todas las naciones»* (Mateo 28:19). Cada julio, trece feligreses de San Ignacio me acompañan a Chiché para visitar la escuela y la comunidad. A lo largo de los años, hemos visto cómo las aulas se expanden, los alumnos prosperan, los padres crecen en la fe y la parroquia de Santo Tomás de Chiché profundiza su comprensión de la corresponsabilidad. Es un ejemplo vivo de colaboración en la misión, donde ambas comunidades —Spring, Texas, y Chiché, Guatemala— trabajan juntas para instaurar el reino de amor y justicia de Dios. La respuesta de nuestros feligreses ha sido abrumadora desde el principio. La matrícula superó rápidamente las expectativas. La escuela adoptó la política de no rechazar jamás a ningún niño, independientemente de su situación familiar. Como resultado, las aulas diseñadas para grupos más pequeños suelen albergar a más de 35 estudiantes, sobre todo en los primeros grados. La comunidad ha asumido cada desafío como una oportunidad para crecer en la fe y el servicio. Muchas familias de Chiché dependen de la ayuda de sus hijos mayores en casa o en el campo, por lo que la asistencia en los grados superiores es menor. Sin embargo, incluso allí, la dedicación de los maestros —cuyos salarios financiamos— garantiza que cada estudiante reciba no solo una educación, sino un encuentro con Cristo.

En 2006, durante nuestra colecta anual, tuvimos el honor de recibir en San Ignacio al entonces obispo de Quiché, Mario Alberto Molina. Su visita fue profundamente inspiradora. Nos recordó: *«No solo están educando a los niños de la escuela, sino que están generando un cambio para todo el país»*. Ese año, nuestra colecta fue la más exitosa en la historia de la escuela: una muestra de generosidad que aún resuena. Como bien expresó nuestro feligrés Steve Dalhoff, de larga trayectoria, al reflexionar sobre esta misión: *«Con la semilla sembrada por el Espíritu Santo y el continuo apoyo del Padre Norbert, participamos de este proyecto en todos sus aspectos: financiero, físico y espiritual. Con el fruto de nuestro trabajo conjunto y la bendición del Espíritu Santo, este maravilloso camino no tendrá fin»*. Sus padres expresan su profunda gratitud por el don de la educación y por la fe que ahora guía la vida de sus hijos. Esto es más que un proyecto misionero: es una alianza de amor, sacrificio y bendiciones que une a nuestra parroquia con otra, superando fronteras e idiomas, en el único Cuerpo de Cristo.

El próximo sábado, celebraremos nuestra cena anual de Acción de Gracias para refugiados en colaboración con Caridades Católicas. Cada año, familias de todo el mundo —refugiados recién llegados que han sufrido penurias y desplazamientos— son trasladadas en autobús a nuestro campus, donde se les da la bienvenida con una cena tradicional de Acción de Gracias. Nuestros feligreses preparan, sirven y comparten la mesa con nuestros invitados, relatando historias, risas y alegría. Cuántas veces, cuando hablamos de la iglesia, tenemos que clarificar si queremos decir la comunidad de fe o el edificio donde esa comunidad se reúne. El hecho de que el monumento de la dedicación de la Iglesia de San Juan Lateran hoy reemplaza hasta la liturgia del Domingo nos recuerda que nuestra fe alcanza la arcilla de la que estamos hechos. Celebramos este edificio—la propia catedral del papa, la madre de todas las iglesias—recordando que los seres humanos necesitamos cosas que atraigan a los sentidos para recordarnos los valores espirituales. San Agustín dice que cuando la comunidad de fe se reúne “ellos son extraídos, como fuera, de montañas y bosques, como piedras y árboles; pero por el catequismo, el bautismo, la instrucción ellos son . . . formados, ajustados, y planeados por las manos de los obreros y artesanos” y finalmente son hechos en una casa para el Señor, “acomodados juntos a través del amor.”

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Ezequiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12; 1 Corintios 3:9c-11, 16-17; Juan 2:13-22 (671). “¿No saben acaso ustedes que son el templo de Dios y que el Espíritu de Dios habita en ustedes?”

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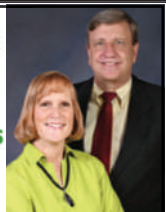


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
