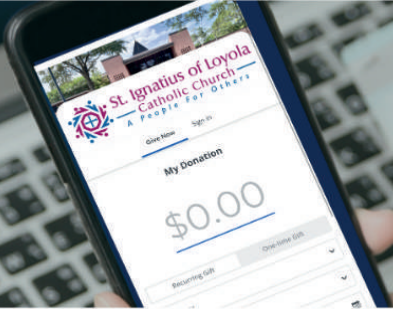

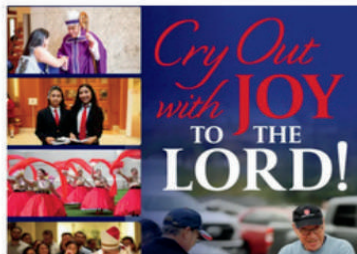

PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we come to the final Sunday of the liturgical year, Holy Mother Church places before our eyes the majestic and consoling Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. It is a celebration that stands as a bold proclamation of our faith and a clear reminder of who we are called to be. In the rhythm of the year, this solemnity crowns our journey by lifting our vision toward Christ, who reigns in glory and invites us to live as missionary disciples—disciples who make disciples—in order to bring His Gospel to the world. Some may wonder: Is this solemnity outdated? Does the idea of kingship still speak to the modern world? In truth, this celebration is more relevant today than perhaps at any other time. The Solemnity of Christ the King was established less than a century ago, in 1925, when Pope Pius XI saw rising secularism, nationalism, and confusion about moral authority. He called the Church to remember that no earthly power, no passing ideology, and no cultural trend could ever claim the human heart the way Jesus Christ can. Christ's kingship is not about domination or political rule; it is about truth, mercy, and the freedom that comes from belonging to God alone. In Ignatian spirituality, we often speak of "choosing the standard of Christ" and placing ourselves with the King who invites us to join Him in His mission. St. Ignatius, in **The Spiritual Exercises**, imagines Christ the King summoning ordinary people—people like us—to labor with Him for the salvation of the world. The Solemnity of Christ the King makes that invitation explicit. We are called not merely to admire Christ's kingship but to participate in it by allowing Him to reign in our hearts, our homes, and our parish. This is why the Church celebrates Christ the King on the final Sunday of Ordinary Time. It is the culmination of the year's pilgrimage—the moment when all the parables, miracles, teachings, and encounters with Jesus return us to the central truth: He is Lord of history and Lord of our lives. This solemnity provides a bridge from the present age into the eternal Kingdom. As missionary disciples, this perspective matters deeply. If Christ is truly our King, then our lives must reflect His priorities—mercy over judgment, truth over confusion, goodness over cynicism, and self-giving love over self-preservation. This feast re-centers us so that as a parish we may continue to form disciples who proclaim the Gospel not only with words, but with lives shaped by the reign of Christ.

As we rejoice in this great solemnity, our nation also prepares to celebrate Thanksgiving. With so many of our parish family traveling this week, please know of my prayers for your safety. May the holy angels of God watch over and protect you on every journey. For those remaining here at home, I warmly invite you to join us for Mass on Thanksgiving Day. While Thanksgiving is a national holiday, the very act of thanksgiving is at the heart of every Eucharistic celebration. *Eucharistia* means "thanksgiving," and each day—most especially each Sunday—we gather to give thanks to God for His blessings. I also invite you to bring the bread for your Thanksgiving table to Mass with you that morning. It will be blessed as a sign of the connection between the altar of the Holy Eucharist, where Christ gives Himself to us, and your own family table, where gratitude, love, and fellowship are shared. In this simple gesture, our domestic churches are united with the great banquet of Christ's love.

Next Sunday we will enter the season of Advent—a season often misunderstood as merely a countdown to Christmas. Advent is far richer. The Church gives us these four weeks not only to prepare for the birth of Christ in Bethlehem, but also to prepare our hearts for His coming again at the end of time. You will hear strong words in our readings: "*Stay awake... be vigilant... rejoice... the Lord is near.*" These are not simply poetic phrases; they are a spiritual summons. Advent invites us to examine our hearts, renew our prayer, deepen our commitment to missionary discipleship, and make room for the Lord who desires to dwell within us. In the spirit of Ignatian reflection, Advent is a time to ask: *Where is Christ inviting me? Where is He calling me to renewed generosity, forgiveness, or courage? How is He asking me to serve?* If we enter the season with openness, Advent will not simply prepare us for Christmas; it will shape us into more intentional disciples of Jesus.

Finally, as we look ahead and plan for the busy days of December, please note that the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception falls on a Monday this year and remains a holy day of obligation. Yes, this means we have the privilege of celebrating Holy Mass two days in a row—Sunday and Monday—as we honor Mary, conceived without sin, the patroness of our nation and a model of perfect discipleship. Please see the Mass schedule elsewhere in the bulletin so that you may plan accordingly.

My dear brothers and sisters, know of my gratitude for you. Your faith, your generosity, your spirit of service, and your commitment to missionary discipleship continue to make St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish a beacon of Christ's love. In this final week of the liturgical year, may we proclaim with renewed conviction: **Christ is our King—yesterday, today, and forever.**

LECTURAS DE LA SEMANA

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Sunday, Nov 23, 2025

A real power move

Power seems cool to possess—from a distance. You can do anything with enough of it: Order people around; get your way; make money, squander it, and get more. Those with worldly power are seemingly invincible—every comfort, security, and cure is theirs for the taking. That's why the crowds around the cross mock Jesus as a phony. If he really had juice, why is he hanging up there? What they failed to appreciate is the divine use of authority: not for self-preservation, but poured out for the sake of others. Think differently. Think love.

A model of endurance

Vietnam has had a thriving Catholic faith rooted there since the 17th century, a faith so strong that it produced 117 Vietnamese martyrs whom we remember today, all beatified and canonized between 1900 and 1951. In 1989 three American archbishops visited that country and said upon their return that in spite of the horrors of the war "the church in Vietnam is alive and vigorous . . . living out the gospel in a difficult and complex situation with remarkable persistence and strength." Holding to the faith in peaceful times is a challenge and is even more so during conflicts and persecutions. We may learn from Saint Andrew and his many companions what it means to live in patient endurance.

Think less; love more

We're nearing the end of the liturgical year, so a fair number of lectionary scripture passages this month urge us to see with the eyes of faith. We are to look beyond what is right in front of us and know this: What we see with our eyes and hear with our ears is only part of reality—and not necessarily the most interesting or important part at that. Storms may come, but they are not what we should give our attention to. "The important thing," says Saint Teresa of Ávila, "is not to think much but to love much; and so do that which best stirs you to love." Only then will we begin the work of creating heaven on Earth.

Wednesday, Nov 26, 2025

Share and share alike

Numbered, weighed, and divided: That's how God intends to deal with the assets of the unjust in the day of judgment, according to the Book of Daniel. But you can ward off a similar fate by numbering, weighing, and dividing your own resources in the direction of the common good. Almsgiving isn't only for Lent but can be a useful way to keep your heart open to the disadvantaged every week of the year. "The person who shows love and compassion to those in any kind of affliction," says Saint Leo the Great, "is blessed, not only

with the virtue of good will, but also with the gift of peace." And almsgiving isn't reserved for only those with means, as Saint Leo explains: "In the matter of almsgiving not only the rich and affluent but also those of average means and the poor are able to play their part. Those who are unequal in their capacity to give can be equal in the love within their hearts." Now is the time to survey your resources and share a measured amount with those in need.

Table your differences

Despite the rosy-colored rendition in childhood schoolbooks, not all was peaceful among the first settlers of Plymouth Colony. The passengers aboard the Mayflower were divided into camps based on differences over religion. Knowing they would face a test of survival upon landing, the rival groups were able to patch things up well enough by signing the Mayflower Compact in 1620 and adopting a common identity as Pilgrims. A year later they gave thanks to God and the Wampanoag people for helping them survive. This holiday season look for a way to patch up whatever differences might divide you from others around the Thanksgiving table.

What a wonderful world

Every age has its own particular mindset through which the people view their world. Our 21st-century perspective could be called "scientific." Whatever we can see with our eyes and measure with our instruments, we believe. Eight hundred years ago the prevailing attitude was "wonder." In the Middle Ages all of creation was viewed as a symbol. It was a book in which every living thing was a word charged with meaning. The faithful were called to look through the visible to the invisible and, by reading nature, read the thoughts of God. Our amazing and helpful advances in science sometimes come at the expense of wonder. Today, pray to the Holy Spirit for the gift of wonder and awe.

Don't get caught by surprise

There's that part of the Mass during the "Our Father" when the priest says, "... As we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ." Does it ever occur to us that the "coming of our Savior" could mean the moment when we die? When our mortal lives end and our world passes away, all that will be left is the eternal, the ever-presence of God. If we live as though there is only this present life, then the Lord's coming will catch us by surprise and frighten us. But if we're waiting in joyful hope, the day of the Lord's coming is not a dreaded event and will mean divine fullness. As Saint John Paul II advises: "Do not abandon yourselves to despair. We are the Easter people and hallelujah is our song." Keep hope alive.

PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

Queridos hermanos,

Al llegar al último domingo del año litúrgico, la Santa Madre Iglesia pone ante nuestros ojos la majestuosa y consoladora Solemnidad de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey del Universo. Es una celebración que se erige como una audaz proclamación de nuestra fe y un claro recordatorio de nuestra vocación. Al ritmo del año, esta solemnidad corona nuestro camino elevando nuestra mirada hacia Cristo, quien reina en gloria y nos invita a vivir como discípulos misioneros —discípulos que hacen discípulos— para llevar su Evangelio al mundo. Algunos se preguntarán: ¿Está anticuada esta solemnidad? ¿Sigue teniendo vigencia en el mundo moderno la idea de la realeza? En realidad, esta celebración es más relevante hoy que nunca. La Solemnidad de Cristo Rey fue instituida hace menos de un siglo, en 1925, cuando el Papa Pío XI observó el apogeo del secularismo, el nacionalismo y la confusión en torno a la autoridad moral. Exhortó a la Iglesia a recordar que ningún poder terrenal, ninguna ideología pasajera ni ninguna tendencia cultural podría jamás conquistar el corazón humano como lo hace Jesucristo. El reinado de Cristo no se trata de dominación ni de gobierno político; se trata de verdad, misericordia y la libertad que proviene de pertenecer solo a Dios. En la espiritualidad ignaciana, a menudo hablamos de «elegir el estandarte de Cristo» y de ponernos al lado del Rey que nos invita a unirnos a Él en su misión. San Ignacio, en **Los Ejercicios Espirituales**, imagina a Cristo Rey convocando a personas comunes y corrientes —personas como nosotros— a trabajar con Él por la salvación del mundo. La Solemnidad de Cristo Rey hace esta invitación explícita o definitiva. Estamos llamados no solo a admirar la realeza de Cristo, sino a participar en ella permitiéndole reinar en nuestros corazones, nuestros hogares y nuestra parroquia. Por eso la Iglesia celebra a Cristo Rey el último domingo del Tiempo Ordinario. Es la culminación de la peregrinación del año: el momento en que todas las parábolas, milagros, enseñanzas y encuentros con Jesús nos devuelven a la verdad fundamental: Él es Señor de la historia y Señor de nuestras vidas. Esta solemnidad nos tiende un puente desde la época presente hacia el Reino eterno. Como discípulos misioneros, esta perspectiva es de suma importancia. Si Cristo es verdaderamente nuestro Rey, entonces nuestras vidas deben reflejar sus prioridades: misericordia sobre juicio, verdad sobre confusión, bondad sobre cinismo y amor abnegado sobre la autopreservación. Esta fiesta nos reubica para que, como parroquia, podamos seguir formando discípulos que proclamen el Evangelio no solo con palabras, sino con vidas moldeadas por el reinado de Cristo.

Mientras nos regocijamos en esta gran solemnidad, nuestra nación también se prepara para celebrar el Día de Acción de Gracias. Con tantos miembros de nuestra parroquia viajando esta semana, sepan que rezo por su seguridad. Que los santos ángeles de Dios los cuiden y protejan en cada viaje. Para quienes permanecen en casa, los invito cordialmente a unirse a nosotros en la Misa del Día de Acción de Gracias. Si bien el Día de Acción de Gracias es una fiesta nacional, el acto mismo de dar gracias es la esencia de toda celebración eucarística. *Eucaristía* significa “*acción de gracias*”, y cada día —muy especialmente cada domingo— nos reunimos para dar gracias a Dios por sus bendiciones. También los invito a traer el pan para su mesa de Acción de Gracias a la Misa de esa mañana. Será bendecido como signo de la conexión entre el altar de la Sagrada Eucaristía, donde Cristo se nos entrega, y su propia mesa familiar, donde se comparten la gratitud, el amor y la comunión. En este sencillo gesto, nuestras iglesias domésticas se unen al gran banquete del amor de Cristo.

El próximo domingo entraremos en el Adviento, un tiempo que a menudo se malinterpreta como una simple cuenta atrás para la Navidad. El Adviento es mucho más enriquecedor. La Iglesia nos da estas cuatro semanas no solo para prepararnos para el nacimiento de Cristo en Belén, sino también para preparar nuestros corazones para su segunda venida al final de los tiempos. En las lecturas escucharán palabras poderosas: «*Manténganse despiertos... estén alerta... regocijense... el Señor está cerca*». No son meras frases poéticas; son una llamada espiritual. El Adviento nos invita a examinar nuestros corazones, renovar nuestra oración, profundizar nuestro compromiso con el discipulado misionero y abrirle espacio al Señor que desea morar en nosotros. En el espíritu de la reflexión ignaciana, el Adviento es un tiempo para preguntarnos: ¿A dónde me invita Cristo? ¿Dónde me llama a una generosidad, un perdón o una valentía renovados? ¿Cómo me pide que sirva? Si entramos en este tiempo con sinceridad, el Adviento no solo nos preparará para la Navidad; nos transformará en discípulos de Jesús más comprometidos.

Finalmente, al prepararnos para los ajetreados días de diciembre, les recordamos que la Solemnidad de la Inmaculada Concepción cae en lunes este año y sigue siendo día de precepto. Esto significa que tenemos el privilegio de celebrar la Santa Misa dos días seguidos —domingo y lunes— en honor a María, concebida sin pecado, patrona de nuestra nación y modelo de discipulado perfecto. Pueden consultar el horario de Misas en otra sección del boletín para planificar en consecuencia.

Mis queridos hermanos, sepan que les estoy muy agradecido. Su fe, su generosidad, su espíritu de servicio y su compromiso con el discipulado misionero siguen haciendo de la parroquia de San Ignacio de Loyola un faro del amor de Cristo. En esta última semana del año litúrgico, proclamemos con renovada convicción: **Cristo es nuestro Rey, ayer, hoy y siempre.**
