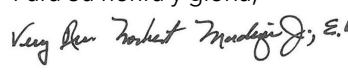

What is Stewardship?

It is about changing your heart to willingly share all that you are and all that you have with others.

It is a new ... Way of



Stewardship is based on the spiritual principles of the Old Testament and the teachings of Jesus. It is an expression of discipleship because disciples who are good stewards recognize God as the origin of life, the giver of freedom, and the source of all our gifts.

It is a complete lifestyle acknowledging God as Creator and Provider of all.

Who is a Christian Steward?

As a disciple of Jesus, a Christian Steward receives God's gifts gratefully, manages them responsibly, and shares them joyfully giving back to the Lord, generously expressed in prayer, worship, offering and action.

How do I get started with Stewardship?

In Baptism, we begin a lifelong process of learning to live as Jesus teaches, and of bringing Christ's presence to others.

Stewardship is this Journey of Faith.

Discernment... is a decision-making process that honors the place of God's will in our lives. Every choice we make, no matter how small, is an opportunity to align ourselves with God's will.

Pray to Do God's Will... As difficult as it may be, pray the words, "Thy will be done," asking God to give you the strength you need to continue to discern his will and to follow it.

Let God Speak to You... Most of us don't actually hear a voice when God speaks to us. However, pay close attention to the ways that God is speaking to you in thoughts and feelings.

Know That God Has a Plan for You... Remind yourself that you are not on your own and God's plan for you is driven purely by love. Reflect on all that the Lord has provided to you.

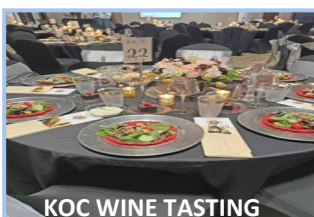

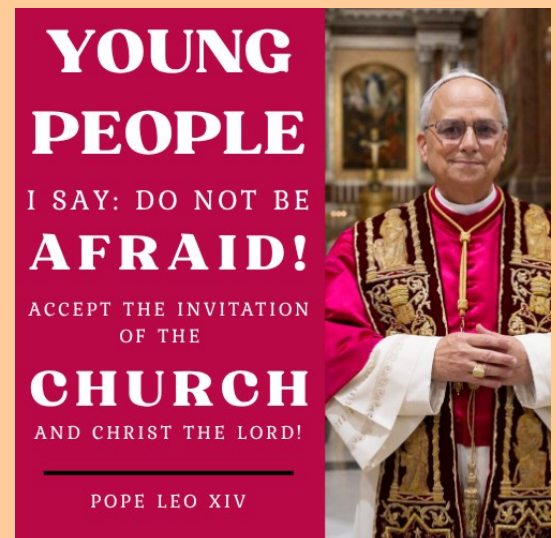

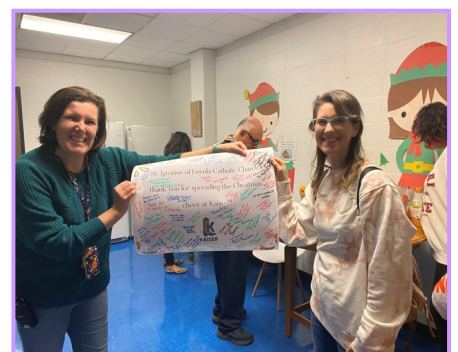

Outreach Projects / Events

- **Easter Help for the Homeless** — Parishioners provide donations of toiletries, socks, tee-shirts, and snacks to make 500 care packages at Loaves and Fishes soup kitchen downtown. A collection of large cans of vegetables and fruits is also taken for Hope Center.
- **Garage Sale** — Volunteers coordinate a community-wide Garage Sale to raise funds for the Outreach Ministry. Help is needed starting Sunday, January 24, 2027 until the sale ends on Saturday, January 30. Many positions are available.
- **Northwest Assistance Ministries (NAM)** — As one of the covenant congregations of NAM, we provide support to assist with helping the hungry, the abused, the poor, and the sick in the community. Daily Food Collection boxes are available in the Narthex and outside the Outreach Office door.
- **Refugee Resettlement Project** — The parish works with Catholic Charities to help those who have come from other countries under dire conditions to resettle here in Houston by hosting an annual Thanksgiving Meal celebration for refugee families held at the parish.

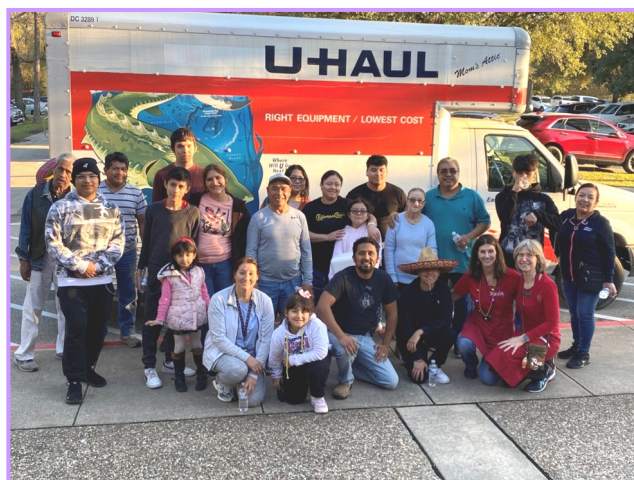

Outreach Direct Services

- **Citizenship Classes** — Classes and workshops are offered through Bonding Against Adversity.
- **Disaster Readiness** — Volunteers partner with select full-time organizations to provide our local areas with aid following a natural disaster. Assistance includes, among other things, providing food, resource collection, clean-up and home repairs for individuals and the general community.
- **ESOL (English classes)** — Volunteer teachers and assistants provide education for adult, nonnative speakers of English over a 15-week course. This program requires a commitment for two hours, two days/nights a week, and volunteers need not be bilingual or speak Spanish. Comprehensive training is provided if needed.
- **Information and Referrals** — The Church has a comprehensive list of social services in the area ranging from homeless shelters to family violence and recovery centers.
- **Financial Assistance** — Under the supervision of the Outreach Director, volunteers provide face-to-face interviews and financial needs assessment for emergency basic needs such as rent, utilities and food for parishioners and members of the community.
- **Financial Education** — Our team of volunteer experts offers one-on-one mentoring in areas such as budgeting, etc..
- **Rejoice Counseling Apostolate** — Offers professional and Catholic counseling to individuals, couples, parents, and families. Day or evening appointments available on Wednesdays in the Outreach Office on a sliding scale fee.

Worship guides all the liturgical celebrations in the parish and coordinates the efforts of all the liturgical ministries.

Altar server training, to include existing servers training for new positions, consists of 2 hours of training and is conducted at least once per year.

Eucharistic Visitors are Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion who strengthen those who cannot be present at the Eucharistic Celebration. They are sent to carry the Word of God and the Blessed Sacrament to the sick and homebound, thus making them one with us. These ministers visit hospitals, nursing homes, private homes, and extended care facilities. Pastoral Care also includes the celebration of the Anointing of the Sick which is a sacrament ministered by the priest. Each visitor attends an annual training session and is given a Rite of Communion to the Sick booklet to pray and accompany those who cannot receive the Eucharist weekly. Eucharistic Visitors visit parishioners in our area.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION (EMHC)

These ministers are commissioned to assist the ordinary ministers (priests and deacons) with the distribution of Holy Communion in the parish. An EMHC must be fully initiated (Confirmed) and in good standing with the Church. New minister training occurs in the fall with multiple EMHC training opportunities in English and Spanish. In addition, ministers are asked to participate in on-going training and adult faith formation.

FUNERAL MINISTRY

Christians celebrate the funeral rites to offer worship, praise and thanksgiving to God for the gift of a life which has now been returned to God. Together we commend the dead to God's merciful love. Members of the Funeral Ministry give witness to our Christian hope in the resurrection as they assist grieving family members in celebrating the funeral rites of their loved ones.

GIFT PRESENTERS

At each Mass, members of the community bring forth the gifts of bread and wine that will become the Lord's Body and Blood, as well as a representation of the monetary gift of the parishioners (the collection). The procession of gifts is a powerful expression of the participation of the entire assembly in the Eucharist and in the social mission of the Church. With these gifts we offer our very selves to be transformed by Christ through the Eucharist. Families or individuals are invited to sign-up via Sign-up Genius on our website.

HOSPITALITY MINISTRY

Hospitality ministers help all members of the assembly to experience the sense of belonging as they arrive. Our welcoming presence helps to prepare the congregation for the re-creative work of the Holy Spirit who makes us "one body, one spirit in Christ." Hospitality duties include handing out and collecting worship aids before and after Mass, taking up collections, bringing the community forward at Communion, counting all who are attending the Mass, and handing out bulletins after Mass. We assist in answering questions and assist those who need help during Mass. Hospitality ministers typically serve twice a month at their preferred Mass time and attend 1 training per year. Additionally, we volunteer to serve at special Masses and holy days of obligation.

INCENSE MINISTRY (IM)

The Incense Minister serves to enhance liturgical celebrations. The smoke of the incense is symbolic of sanctification and purification, and of the prayers of the faithful. Incense Ministers are experienced servers who prepare the charcoal and handle the thurible during Mass, and also serve at funeral liturgies and Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction. To join this ministry there is an initial orientation session followed by scheduled "supervised" sessions during Mass.

INSTITUTED ACOLYTE (IA)

The acolyte is conferred, not through sacred orders (ordination), but through institution by the bishop, to aid the deacon and to minister to the priest. Therefore, it is the duty of the acolyte to attend to the service of the altar and to assist the deacon and the priest in liturgical celebrations, especially in the celebration of Mass. The acolyte is also to distribute Holy Communion as an extraordinary minister when able. Since the Eucharist is at the heart of this ministry, Instituted Acolytes meet quarterly for prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament. Training is provided in a two-part workshop by the Archdiocesan Office of Worship along with parish level training by the IA ministry.

LECTORS

God speaks when we hear the Word proclaimed in the liturgy. Lectors are entrusted with the Word of God. They have personally encountered it, and through them the people of God encounter the divine Word. Lectors must be able to speak comfortably and with confidence before the assembly. They prepare through prayer and practice to proclaim the Word of God so that it comes alive for the community. Required preparation includes following the proclamation guidelines set forth in the Lector Workbook, annual in-person training and ongoing formation, e.g. retreats, bible study, etc.

MUSIC MINISTRY

God has bestowed upon his people the gift of song, and God is indeed present whenever his people sing his praises. The music ministry supports and strengthens the community's faith and worship. Choirs composed of children, teens, and adults are supported by accompanists, handbell ringers, and instrumentalists. The Cantor proclaims the Word of God and leads singing at liturgical celebrations. Audio/Video Ministry members operate the sound mixer board at Mass and at other celebrations. Choir members attend a weekly rehearsal to prepare for weekend Masses and holy days. Audio/Video Ministry members attend an annual training/formation session.

Our prayer teams gather weekly and place before God the needs of our community and those of all the world. Team members also minister through participation in parish activities and by responding to the spiritual and physical needs of our community.

WEDDING COORDINATORS

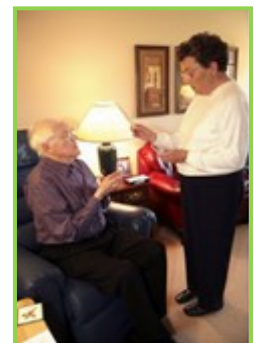

Coordinators attend an annual training and shadow-train other coordinators as needed.

Worship Coordinators assist the liturgy staff and clergy in preparing the items needed for Mass and other liturgical celebrations. We communicate with worship staff, clergy and other ministers about the particular needs for Mass. Through our ministerial role we encourage and exemplify full, active, and conscious participation of the faithful in ritual prayer and action. Worship Coordinators are trained on the job by assisting experienced worship coordinators during the Masses of their choice. Worship Coordinators typically serve twice a month and attend one yearly meeting.

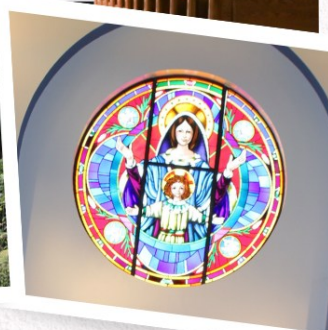

To what extent do we use time to foster our relationship with God or to volunteer in some ministry that blesses others?

Prayer is the beginning of Stewardship.

Only when we spend time with God in prayer are we spiritually prepared to offer ourselves in service of others.

How do we choose to use our time? Everyone is given the same amount of time, 24 hours each day, 168 hours each week.

Please reflect on these suggested commitments to spend more time with God.

- Attend Mass every Sunday and Holy Days
- Attend weekday Masses
- Spend 15 minutes a day in personal prayer; Morning/Evening, Novena/Devotions, Lectivo Divina
- Spend an hour in Eucharistic Adoration
- Take time to have meals with family
- Pray together with loved ones; Before/After Meals,
- Spend an hour per week reading the Bible
- Pray the rosary; Daily/Weekly
- Go to confession; Monthly/Seasonally
- Pray for vocations to the religious life and faithful marriage
- Build on your faith formation; join a Bible study or small group, attend a catholic conference, join a prayer group
- Plan a spiritual pilgrimage or retreat
- Perform daily acts of kindness

- Confesarse Mensual/Estacional
- Ora por las vocaciones a la vida religiosa y al matrimonio de fieles.
- Fortalece tu formación en la fe; únete a un estudio bíblico o a un grupo pequeño, asiste a una conferencia católica, únete a un grupo de oración.
- Planifica una peregrinación o retiro espiritual.
