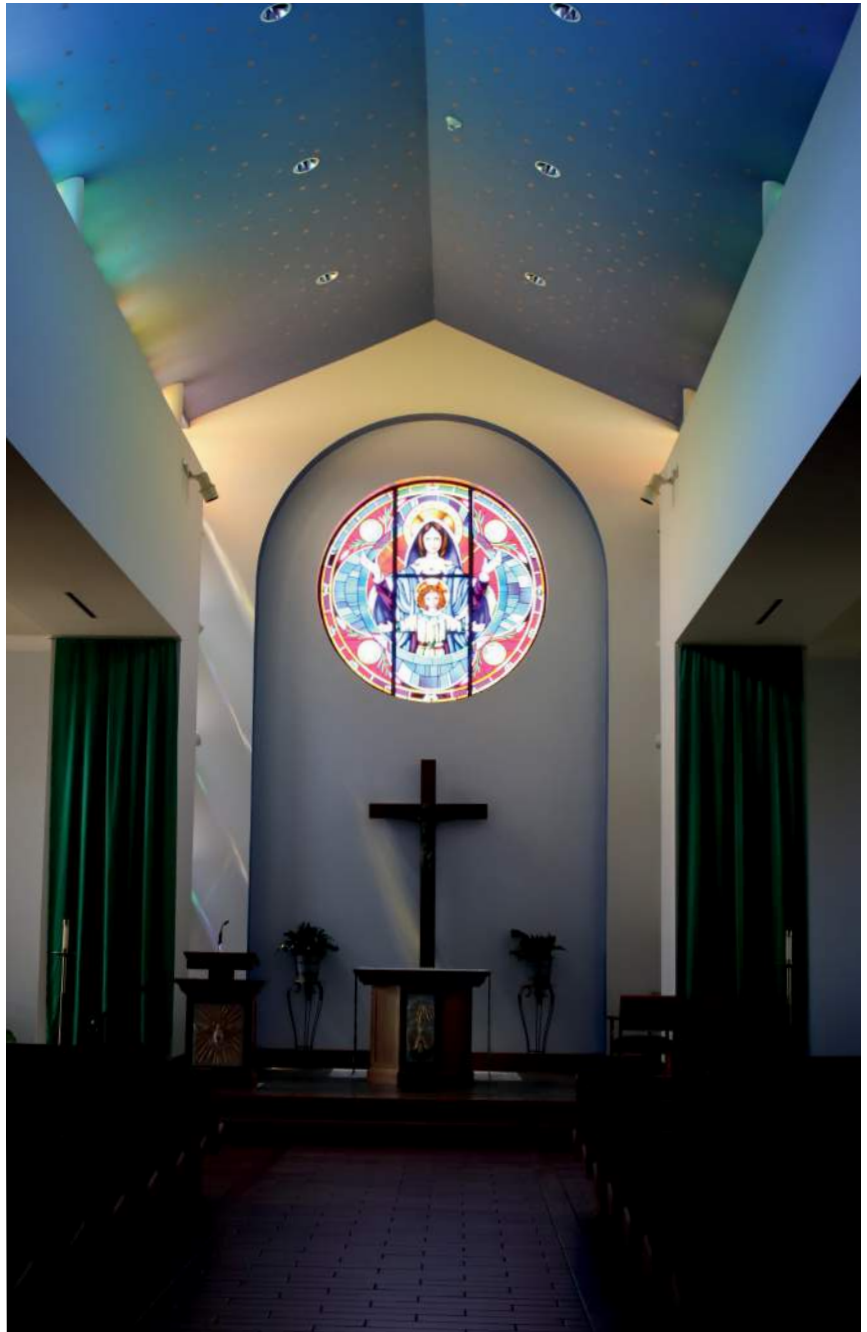

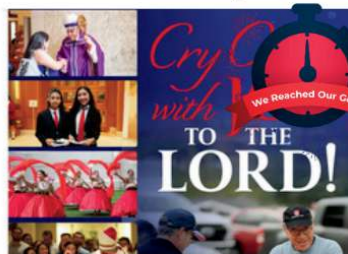

IRA Charitable Distributions

1. Gifts from an IRA, Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD), are popular forms of end-of-year giving for those 70 1/2 or older. A donor can make a gift directly from their IRA to the parish which can result in a reduction in annual taxes owed. Gifts to the parish alone can be mailed directly to the parish.
2. Gifts of appreciated stock allow donors to make an impact to the mission of the church and avoid capital gains on the appreciated shares that are donated to a qualified charity. A donor must complete a stock letter of intent.

The Development Department at the Downtown Chancery is available to assist your parish and community with these transactions. The Letter of Intent forms, which are necessary to initiate a donation of stock or gift from an IRA, and to allow proper donor identification and gift designation, are available for download from the Archdiocesan-website: www.archgh.org/ways-to-give. PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today the Church celebrates the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. At first glance, it can seem like an odd feast: Why does Jesus—sinless, holy, the Beloved Son—enter the waters of repentance? Yet that is precisely the point. Jesus steps into the Jordan not because He needs cleansing, but because He chooses solidarity—with sinners, with the searching, with the weary, with every human heart that longs for renewal. He descends into the waters to reveal that God does not save us from a distance. God saves us from within our reality. In that moment, we hear the Father's voice: *"You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."* The heavens open. The Spirit descends. This is not merely a private spiritual experience; it is a revelation of mission. From the waters, Jesus is not "returned" to comfort—He is sent. He goes from the Jordan into the wilderness, then into public ministry, then all the way to the Cross and the Resurrection. In other words, Baptism is not a "religious milestone." Baptism is the beginning of a life that belongs to God for the sake of the world. That is why this feast is so intimately connected to our own baptism. In baptism, you and I are not simply "made members" of a Church organization. We are made beloved sons and daughters. We are claimed and named. And then, like Jesus, we are sent. The Christian life is always a movement from belovedness to mission. Ignatian spirituality insists that we begin there: with the conviction that God is already at work in us, and that we are invited to respond generously.

Baptism makes us disciples but what else is required to become missionary disciples? A missionary disciple is not simply someone who "believes," or even someone who "belongs." A missionary disciple is someone who has learned to live with a particular interior freedom: free enough to follow Christ wherever He leads, and humble enough to be changed along the way. A missionary disciple prays, but also listens. A missionary disciple receives the sacraments, but also allows those sacraments to shape decisions, priorities, relationships, and habits. A missionary disciple is not content with minimums. A missionary disciple learns, over time, to ask an Ignatian question: "Lord, what do You want from me now for Your greater glory and the good of souls?" And this is where John the Baptist becomes both inspiration and challenge. John is bold, not because he enjoys confrontation, but because he is clear. He knows who he is, and he knows who he is not. He is not the Christ. He is the voice that prepares the way. In a culture that rewards self-promotion and personal preference, John teaches us the strength of humility: to point away from ourselves and toward the Lamb of God. Can we be that bold? Can we speak the truth with charity? Can we live with enough integrity that our faith is not merely an opinion but a witness?

With this feast, we also begin the season of Ordinary Time. "Ordinary" does not mean common or unimportant. It comes from the word that means ordered: time counted, arranged, and sustained. The Church's year has seasons of intense focus, Advent, Christmas, Lent, Easter. Ordinary Time is the long stretch where we learn to live the Gospel steadily, faithfully, and concretely. It is the "school of daily discipleship," where holiness is formed in the ordinary rhythms of life: work, family, prayer, service, recreation, suffering, and joy. And because Ordinary Time is "ordered," it is also a fitting moment to reflect on how we function together as a parish family. Every healthy family has rhythms and responsibilities: times to gather, to eat, to do chores, to care for one another. But every family also has guidelines that protect the common good: Who can use the car—and when? Who maintains it? Who puts gas in it? Without shared expectations, even loving families drift into confusion, resentment, and disorder. The Church—this family of God—also has guidelines that serve unity, reverence, justice, and mission. Canon Law provides the legal framework for life in the Church. The Catechism of the Catholic Church articulates what we believe and how we live. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal sets forth how we worship at Holy Mass—so that the liturgy remains the Church's prayer, not a personal project. And with the authority of Canon Law, our Archdiocese establishes pastoral and financial policies that must be followed, not as burdens, but as safeguards for the integrity of the Church's mission.

In the weeks ahead, I will begin addressing some of these policies more directly. But for now, I want to ask you to do something very Ignatian: pray with honesty about the moments when you feel tempted to do "your own thing," to prefer "my opinion" over what the Church asks, or to treat common responsibilities as optional. We live in a society that is increasingly independent—often suspicious of authority and/or impatient with structure. Yet the Church is not a collection of private individuals. We are a corporate body—the Body of Christ—called to act together for the welfare of the whole.

So here is the question for your prayer this week: Where do I experience tension between what I want and what the Church requires—and why? Is it pride? Convenience? Woundedness? Fear? Or perhaps a misunderstanding that needs clarification? Bring that to the Lord. Ask for the grace not merely to comply, but to understand; not merely to accept, but to grow. Finally, as we step into this ordered season, I invite you to become more deeply involved in the life of the parish. Ordinary Time is not "down time." It is prime time for discipleship. Join a ministry. Serve the poor. Help form our young people. Participate in adult formation. Step into stewardship with your time, talent, and treasure. If you have been on the sidelines, consider this your invitation from the Lord: Come closer. Engage more fully. Be part of the mission.

Make the connection

In his birth (Christmas), his adoration by the Magi (Epiphany), and the coming of the Spirit upon him (Baptism of the Lord) Jesus is revealed to be the Son of God. These significant events in Jesus' life are so closely tied that the Eastern Orthodox Church observes the coming of the Magi and the Lord's Baptism on the same day. In the same way, our own births and Baptism signal that we are children of God and followers of Christ. As a new year begins, find ways to reconnect with your family of faith and make daily choices that reveal your divine heritage.

Listen up

The tech industry would have us believe that the most important connections we make are virtual. While it's true that tech devices are useful in today's world, there remains the crucial connection with that still, small voice within our own hearts that no computer or phone can reach. That voice, which is God's, can only be heard in stillness: in the bare branches of trees against a winter sky, the quiet of new-fallen snow, the starry brilliance in a winter night sky, our breathing in and breathing out. What is God calling you to do now? Spend some time today just listening.

Tuesday, Jan 13, 2026

"I was a stranger"

Of all the lessons Jesus tried to teach us, the one that is perhaps hardest to believe—and therefore easiest to forget—is that we are all one. Jesus reminded us of this truth a number of times, most notably when he declared, "Just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me" (Matt. 25:40). Take a few minutes today to reflect on what life would be like if you knew, with as much certainty as you know your own name, that there are no strangers among us; we are all one, united through Christ. What would be different? How would you act toward yourself? Toward others?

Wednesday, Jan 14, 2026

Now appearing

You don't have to look very hard into Catholic tradition to find stories of supernatural appearances of Jesus, the saints, and especially Mary to believers through the centuries. These kinds of occurrences really go back to biblical times. In the New Testament the Holy Spirit "appeared" in the

form of a dove at Jesus' Baptism, Jesus himself appeared to his disciples after his Resurrection, and the risen Christ made a decisive personal intervention in the life of Saint Paul, to name a few examples. Most of us will never have such an experience, but we can indeed learn to make ourselves aware of the presence and guidance of God.

Wanted: Good leaders

The two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, were the trusted priests of the ancient temple in Shiloh. But they were stealing from the temple and committing immoral acts. As a result, the army of Israel was cursed and got hammered by the Philistines. Hophni and Phinehas were slain and the Philistines took the ark of God captive. It is a cautionary tale about the faithful's need for good leaders. Pray for vocations, and very specifically for men and women to serve the Lord in truth and integrity.

Friday, Jan 16, 2026

Move on

There's a lot in life that can get us down. Sometimes they are things of our own making, and sometimes, well, it's life. It's not always easy to know what to do. We can stand still and try to figure it out, or we can backtrack to see what happened. At some point, however, it is time to move forward—to step out of what happened and to imagine something new. "Begin now," says Saint Jerome, "to be what you will be hereafter."

Saturday, Jan 17, 2026

Alone with the truth

Few of us would take aloneness to the extent of Saint Anthony of the Desert, who spent much of his 105 years in solitude. Stories of Anthony say he was besieged by all kinds of temptations in the desert night. At some level we know that silence forces us to confront the reality of who we are before God. But, as Saint Anthony explains, it is a worthy pursuit: "One who knows oneself, knows God . . . Therefore, my beloveds in the Lord, know yourselves." Opening up at such depth is indeed terrifying, but Jesus "gets" the weakness of being human. He calls each of us not for condemnation but friendship.

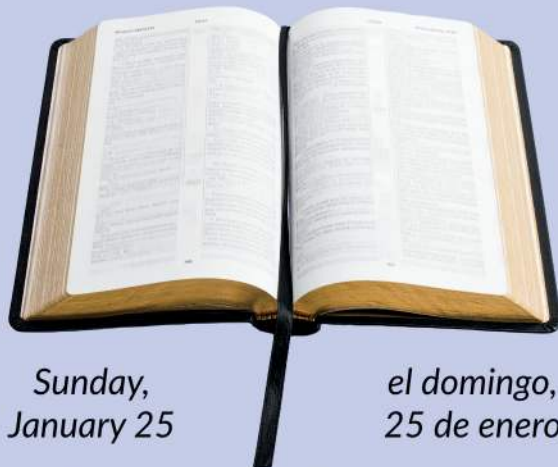

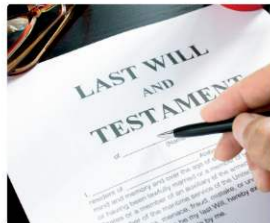

Queridos hermanos,

Hoy la Iglesia celebra la Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor. A primera vista, puede parecer una fiesta extraña: ¿Por qué Jesús —sin pecado, santo, el Hijo amado— entra en las aguas del arrepentimiento? Sin embargo, ese es precisamente el punto. Jesús entra en el Jordán no porque necesite purificación, sino porque elige la solidaridad: con los pecadores, con los que buscan, con los cansados, con cada corazón humano que anhela la renovación. Desciende a las aguas para revelar que Dios no nos salva desde la distancia. Dios nos salva desde dentro de nuestra propia realidad. En ese momento, escuchamos la voz del Padre: «*Tú eres mi Hijo amado; en ti me complazco*». Los cielos se abren. El Espíritu descende. Esto no es simplemente una experiencia espiritual privada; es una revelación de misión. Desde las aguas, Jesús no regresa a la comodidad, sino que es enviado. Va del Jordán al desierto, luego al ministerio público, y finalmente hasta la Cruz y la Resurrección. En otras palabras, el bautismo no es un simple "hito religioso". El bautismo es el comienzo de una vida que pertenece a Dios para el bien del mundo. Por eso esta celebración está tan íntimamente ligada a nuestro propio bautismo. En el bautismo, tú y yo no somos simplemente "incorporados" a una organización eclesial. Nos convertimos en hijos e hijas amados y amadas. Somos reconocidos y llamados por nuestro nombre. Y luego, como Jesús, somos enviados. La vida cristiana es siempre un camino que va del ser amados a la misión. La espiritualidad ignaciana insiste en que comencemos por ahí: con la convicción de que Dios ya está obrando en nosotros y que estamos invitados a responder con generosidad.

El bautismo nos convierte en discípulos, pero ¿qué más se necesita para ser discípulos misioneros? Un discípulo misionero no es simplemente alguien que "cree", ni siquiera alguien que "pertenece" a la Iglesia. Un discípulo misionero es alguien que ha aprendido a vivir con una libertad interior particular: lo suficientemente libre como para seguir a Cristo dondequiera que Él lo guíe, y lo suficientemente humilde como para dejarse transformar en el camino. Un discípulo misionero ora, pero también escucha. Un discípulo misionero recibe los sacramentos, pero también permite que estos moldeen sus decisiones, prioridades, relaciones y hábitos. Un discípulo misionero no se conforma con lo mínimo. Con el tiempo, aprende a hacerse la pregunta ignaciana: «Señor, ¿qué quieres de mí ahora para tu mayor gloria y el bien de las almas?». Y aquí es donde Juan el Bautista se convierte tanto en inspiración como en desafío. Juan es valiente, no porque disfrute de la confrontación, sino porque tiene las ideas claras. Sabe quién es y quién no es. No es el Cristo. Es la voz que prepara el camino. En una cultura que recompensa la autopromoción y las preferencias personales, Juan nos enseña la fuerza de la humildad: apartar la mirada hacia nosotros mismos y dirigirla hacia el Cordero de Dios. ¿Podemos ser así de valientes? ¿Podemos hablar la verdad con caridad? ¿Podemos vivir con la suficiente integridad para que nuestra fe no sea solo una opinión, sino un testimonio?

Con esta fiesta, también comenzamos el Tiempo Ordinario. "Ordinario" no significa común ni sin importancia. Proviene de la palabra que significa ordenado: tiempo medido, organizado y constante. El año litúrgico de la Iglesia tiene tiempos de intensa concentración: Adviento, Navidad, Cuaresma y Pascua. El Tiempo Ordinario es el período largo en el cual aprendemos a vivir el Evangelio de manera constante, fiel y concreta. Es la "escuela del discipulado cotidiano", donde la santidad se forja en los ritmos ordinarios de la vida: el trabajo, la familia, la oración, el servicio, el descanso, el sufrimiento y la alegría. Y precisamente porque el Tiempo Ordinario está "ordenado", es también un momento oportuno para reflexionar sobre cómo funcionamos juntos como familia parroquial. Toda familia sana tiene ritmos y responsabilidades: momentos para reunirse, para comer, para realizar las tareas del hogar, para cuidarse mutuamente. Pero toda familia también tiene normas que protegen el bien común: ¿Quién puede usar el coche y cuándo? ¿Quién se encarga de su mantenimiento? ¿Quién le pone gasolina? Sin expectativas compartidas, incluso las familias más unidas caen en la confusión, el resentimiento y el desorden. La Iglesia, esta familia de Dios, también tiene normas que promueven la unidad, la reverencia, la justicia y la misión. El Derecho Canónico proporciona el marco legal para la vida en la Iglesia. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica articula lo que creemos y cómo vivimos. La Instrucción General del Misal Romano establece cómo celebramos la Santa Misa, para que la liturgia siga siendo la oración de la Iglesia y no un proyecto personal. Y con la autoridad del Derecho Canónico, nuestra Arquidiócesis establece políticas pastorales y financieras que deben seguirse, no como cargas, sino como garantías para la integridad de la misión de la Iglesia.

En las próximas semanas, abordaré algunas de estas políticas de forma más directa. Pero por ahora, quiero pedirles que hagan algo muy propio de la espiritualidad ignaciana: oren con sinceridad sobre los momentos en que se sienten tentados a actuar por su cuenta, a anteponer su propia opinión a lo que la Iglesia pide, o a considerar las responsabilidades comunes como algo opcional. Vivimos en una sociedad cada vez más individualista, a menudo desconfiada de la autoridad e impaciente con las estructuras. Sin embargo, la Iglesia no es una simple suma de individuos. Somos un cuerpo, el Cuerpo de Cristo, llamados a actuar juntos por el bien de todos.

Así que aquí está la pregunta para su oración de esta semana: ¿Dónde experimento tensión entre lo que deseo y lo que la Iglesia me pide, y por qué? ¿Es orgullo? ¿Comodidad? ¿Alguna herida del pasado? ¿Miedo? ¿O quizás un malentendido que necesita aclaración? Presenten esto al Señor. Pidan la gracia no solo para obedecer, sino para comprender; no solo para aceptar, sino para crecer. Finalmente, al comenzar este tiempo litúrgico ordinario, los invito a involucrarse más profundamente en la vida de la parroquia. El Tiempo Ordinario no es un tiempo de inactividad, sino un tiempo privilegiado para el discipulado. Únanse a un ministerio. Sirvan a los pobres. Ayuden a formar a nuestros jóvenes. Participen en la formación de adultos. Comprométanse con su tiempo, talentos y recursos. Si han estado al margen, consideren esta una invitación del Señor: Acérquense. Participen más plenamente. Sean parte de la misión.

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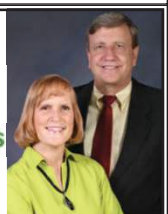
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
