IRA Charitable Distributions

1. Gifts from an IRA, Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD), are popular forms of end-of-year giving for those 70 1/2 or older. A donor can make a gift directly from their IRA to the parish which can result in a reduction in annual taxes owed. Gifts to the parish alone can be mailed directly to the parish.
2. Gifts of appreciated stock allow donors to make an impact to the mission of the church and avoid capital gains on the appreciated shares that are donated to a qualified charity. A donor must complete a stock letter of intent.

PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we move forward from the celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the Church now leads us into the season of Ordinary Time. As I shared with you previously, “ordinary” does not mean common or insignificant. Rather, it comes from the word *ordo*—that which is ordered, structured, and purposeful. Ordinary Time is the long, steady season in which discipleship is lived day by day. It is where faith matures, habits are formed, and the Gospel is embodied in the ordinary rhythms of life. As we journey through the liturgical calendar—from Advent and Christmas, through Lent and Easter, and back again into Ordinary Time—the Church provides us with a clear structure that guides our worship, our prayer, and our communal life. Canon Law, the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), and directives from the Vatican and our Archdiocese are not arbitrary rules; they exist to safeguard unity, reverence, accountability, and the common good of the People of God.

The Church often speaks of herself as a family of faith. And like every healthy family, we function best when there are shared expectations—general rules and “house rules”—that help us live together respectfully and responsibly. The general rules come from the universal Church and the Archdiocese. The house rules are parish-based guidelines designed to help *our* community function smoothly, transparently, and with integrity. Over the next several weeks, I want to begin a thoughtful review of some of our parish policies, practices, and procedures. This is not about criticism or correction; it is about clarity, accountability, and shared responsibility. I would like to begin with an area that touches every parish and every ministry: finances.

The financial life of St. Ignatius of Loyola is governed by Archdiocesan policy and adapted for our local needs. There is a fiduciary responsibility entrusted to us—to properly care for every dollar that comes into the parish. These funds do not belong to an individual, a ministry, or even the parish leadership; they belong to the Church and are given in trust for the mission of Christ. We are blessed to have a dedicated parish accountant who serves as our financial operator. She is assisted by another staff member who handles accounts receivable, while she oversees accounts payable and payroll. In addition, we have a Finance Council composed of parishioners who oversee our financial practices and ensure compliance with Archdiocesan policies, including periodic in-house audits. The way money is processed matters greatly. Daily bank deposits, receipts in triplicate, detailed logs, proper account assignments—these are not bureaucratic hurdles; they are safeguards. Parish income comes from many sources: weekly collections, mail-in contributions, electronic giving, retreat fees, tuition payments, and fundraising efforts by our ministries. Every dollar must be tracked, recorded, and processed correctly. When a parish ministry holds a fundraiser, the funds raised are legally considered funds of St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish. These monies are placed into a reserve account and earmarked for that ministry’s use. However, the parish is required to pay a *cathedraticum*—a tax to the archdiocese—on *all* fundraising income, including ministry fundraisers. This tax is paid by the parish, even though the parish does not retain the funds raised by the ministry. This reality alone necessitates strict accountability.

Handling money—especially money given by others—is inherently risky. For that reason, the Church requires tight financial controls. At times, these procedures can feel burdensome, particularly to those who generously volunteer their time. But every role carries responsibility. If one accepts responsibility for handling ministry funds, one must also accept the responsibility of following established procedures. Sadly, our accounting staff is sometimes accused of being unkind or unhelpful. In truth, she is doing precisely what she has been entrusted to do: protecting the parish, the ministry, and the individuals involved. For example, reimbursements cannot and will not be issued without proper receipts. Period. Proof of purchase and documentation showing that the expense was incurred on behalf of the ministry—under the name of St. Ignatius of Loyola—is required. This is not complicated, but it is non-negotiable. When procedures are bypassed, the entire parish is put at risk during audits. Regarding accounts payable, checks are processed one day each week. Requests must be submitted by Monday for processing. Preparing payments requires careful review: matching invoices, verifying approvals, and ensuring accuracy. When someone arrives without notice, demanding immediate payment, it disrupts an already demanding process and undermines the systems in place.

What can we do as a community? First, remember that procedures exist for a reason. Second, recognize that our accounting department is staffed by one primary individual, assisted by one other person. Patience, understanding, and gratitude are not merely good manners—they are expressions of Christian charity. If you have questions about financial policies or procedures, much of this information is available on our parish website. You may also contact a member of the Finance Council, who will be happy to assist you.

As a family of faith, we walk together—ordered, accountable, and united in mission. When we respect the structures that support us, we free ourselves to focus on what truly matters: proclaiming the Gospel and being a people for others. Thank you for your cooperation, your generosity, and your commitment to the life of our parish.

LECTURAS DE LA SEMANA

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Sunday, Jan 18, 2026

Faith is a daily commitment

The Gospel of John tells us that the Spirit came down and remained on Jesus. The wording is no accident. At one point or another, each of us likely has had a powerful spiritual experience, a genuine “moment of connection” with the divine. Without diminishing the beauty and significance of such experiences, a single “peak experience” does not a spiritual life make. It is the day-in, day-out commitment to practice one’s faith that will create a deeply rooted spirituality. The Holy Spirit not only descended on Jesus, it remained with him. The results were evident in Jesus’ life, and can be in ours as well.

Isaiah 49:3, 5-6; 1 Corinthians 1:1-3; John 1:29-34 (64). “On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.”

That all may be one

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity began in 1908. The dates of the week were proposed by Father Paul Wattson, S.A., cofounder of the Graymoor Franciscan Friars. Popes Pius X blessed the concept and Benedict XV encouraged its observance. Protestant leaders in the mid-1920s also proposed an annual octave of prayer for unity. In 1948, with the founding of the World Council of Churches, the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity became increasingly recognized by different churches throughout the world. Take a moment today to pray that while acknowledging our differences, Christians of various backgrounds and traditions may indeed all be one in Christ.

Blissful thinking

“We all want to live happily,” Saint Augustine wrote. “How is it, then, that I seek you, Lord?” For the answer, the Catechism of the Catholic Church advises: Look to the Beatitudes—a word that means “ultimate happiness” or “bliss”—in the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus explains how to be comforted, shown mercy, filled, even to inherit the Earth and see God. Happiness doesn’t come from money or power or fame, as tempting as they might be, but from humility, purity of heart, faithfulness—all the virtues Jesus extols. When happiness eludes you, it can be recovered by recalling the words of Saint Thomas Aquinas: “God alone satisfies.”

Wednesday, Jan 21, 2026

Nothing is as simple as black and white

Determining good and evil is rarely a simple affair. Saint Agnes refused to obey a Roman official and marry his son, so she was considered a defiant citizen, tortured and beheaded. Jesus healed on the Sabbath and so was considered a lawbreaker,

tortured and hanged. Every age has its citizens and leaders who see things in black and white and stand ready to accuse any who would dare to admit to shades of gray when it comes to right and wrong. Be careful not to join their ranks. The world is filled with mystery, subtlety, and divine truths that can’t be prepackaged in one-size-fits-all boxes.

Cling to Christ

While Christian unity comes to our attention each January, in the daily “culture wars” what divides people (including Christian from Christian) seems always more prominent. In the healthcare debate, for example, securing the noble goal of healthcare for all, including the poor and undocumented, sparks controversy and even belligerence. What of the borderless kingship of Christ? Christ’s unconditional compassion is real only insofar as it is acted in our flesh. Unity among Christians will elude us as long as any of us clings to anyone or anything other than Christ.

Friday, Jan 23, 2026

On call every day

To what will you be called this day? Will it be to reconciliation and right relationship with a friend or coworker? To lead the way on a project using your gifts and a bit of inspiration from the Spirit? To lay aside your pride to help another person? To make someone smile? You may not see it coming, and you might not even realize it when it is happening, but throughout this day, indeed every day, you are called by God to bring about the gospel of Christ Jesus—to “do small things with great love,” in the words of Mother Teresa. Listen, and be ready!

Saturday, Jan 24, 2026

Here’s a crazy idea: Be kind and gentle

Many of Jesus’ relatives thought Jesus was out of his mind because of all the things he was saying and doing. Sixteen centuries later people thought Saints Francis de Sales and Jane Frances de Chantal were nuts for starting a religious order of sick and broken-down women who could not follow the more austere rules of religious life at the time. Yet together, like Mary at the Visitation, these women practiced “gentleness with a valiant spirit.” The Order of the Visitation has as its motto “Live Jesus,” which serves as a reminder to all of us to do the same.

PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

Queridos hermanos,

Al concluir la celebración de la Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor, la Iglesia nos introduce en el Tiempo Ordinario. Como les comenté anteriormente, "ordinario" no significa común o insignificante. Más bien, proviene de la palabra latina *ordo*, que significa ordenado, estructurado y con un propósito. El Tiempo Ordinario es el largo período en el que se vive el discipulado día a día. Es el tiempo en el que la fe madura, se forman hábitos y el Evangelio se encarna en el ritmo cotidiano de la vida. A medida que recorremos el calendario litúrgico —desde Adviento y Navidad, pasando por Cuaresma y Pascua, y de regreso al Tiempo Ordinario— la Iglesia nos proporciona una estructura clara que guía nuestra adoración, nuestra oración y nuestra vida comunitaria. El Derecho Canónico, la Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR) y las directrices del Vaticano y de nuestra Arquidiócesis no son reglas arbitrarias; existen para salvaguardar la unidad, la reverencia, la responsabilidad y el bien común del Pueblo de Dios.

La Iglesia a menudo se describe a sí misma como una familia de fe. Y como toda familia sana, funcionamos mejor cuando compartimos expectativas —normas generales y normas internas— que nos ayudan a convivir con respeto y responsabilidad. Las normas generales provienen de la Iglesia universal y de la Arquidiócesis. Las normas internas son directrices parroquiales diseñadas para que *nuestra* comunidad funcione de manera fluida, transparente y con integridad. Durante las próximas semanas, quiero iniciar un estudio minucioso de algunas de nuestras políticas, prácticas y procedimientos parroquiales. No se trata de criticar ni de corregir; se trata de claridad, rendición de cuentas y responsabilidad compartida. Me gustaría comenzar con un área que concierne a todas las parroquias y a todos los ministerios: las finanzas.

La gestión financiera de la parroquia de San Ignacio de Loyola se rige por las políticas de la Arquidiócesis y se adapta a nuestras necesidades locales. Tenemos la responsabilidad fiduciaria de administrar correctamente cada dólar que ingresa a la parroquia. Estos fondos no pertenecen a un individuo, a un ministerio ni a la directiva parroquial; pertenecen a la Iglesia y se confían para la misión de Cristo. Contamos con la bendición de tener una contadora parroquial dedicada que se encarga de nuestras finanzas. Cuenta con la ayuda de otra persona del personal que gestiona las cuentas por cobrar, mientras que ella supervisa las cuentas por pagar y la planilla de salarios. Además, tenemos un Consejo de Finanzas compuesto por feligreses que supervisan nuestras prácticas financieras y garantizan el cumplimiento de las políticas arquidiocesanas, incluyendo auditorías internas periódicas. La forma en que se gestiona el dinero es de suma importancia. Los depósitos bancarios diarios, los recibos por triplicado, los registros detallados y la correcta asignación de cuentas no son trámites burocráticos, sino medidas de seguridad. Los ingresos de la parroquia provienen de diversas fuentes: Las entradas de fondos provienen de las colectas semanales, las donaciones por correo, las donaciones electrónicas, las cuotas de retiros espirituales, el pago de matrículas y las actividades de recaudación de fondos de nuestros ministerios. Cada dólar debe ser rastreado, registrado y procesado correctamente. Cuando un ministerio parroquial organiza una actividad para recaudar fondos, los fondos recaudados se consideran legalmente propiedad de la Parroquia San Ignacio de Loyola. Este dinero se deposita en una cuenta de reserva y se destina al uso de dicho ministerio. Sin embargo, la parroquia está obligada a pagar un *cathedraicum* —un impuesto a la arquidiócesis— sobre *todos* los ingresos por recaudación de fondos, incluidas las actividades de los ministerios. Este impuesto lo paga la parroquia, aunque no retenga los fondos recaudados por el ministerio. Esta situación, por sí sola, exige una estricta rendición de cuentas.

Gestionar dinero, especialmente el dinero donado por otros conlleva riesgos inherentes. Por esta razón, la Iglesia exige estrictos controles financieros. En ocasiones, estos procedimientos pueden resultar engorrosos, sobre todo para quienes generosamente ofrecen su tiempo como voluntarios. Sin embargo, cada función conlleva una responsabilidad. Si se acepta la responsabilidad de gestionar los fondos del ministerio, también se debe aceptar la responsabilidad de seguir los procedimientos establecidos. Lamentablemente, nuestro personal de contabilidad a veces es acusado de ser poco amable o poco servicial. En realidad, está haciendo precisamente lo que se le ha encomendado: proteger a la parroquia, al ministerio y a las personas involucradas. Por ejemplo, no se realizarán reembolsos sin los recibos correspondientes. Punto. Se requiere comprobante de compra y documentación que demuestre que el gasto se realizó en nombre del ministerio, bajo el nombre de San Ignacio de Loyola. Esto no es complicado, pero es innegociable. Cuando se quebrantan los procedimientos, toda la parroquia se pone en riesgo durante las auditorías. En cuanto a las cuentas por pagar, los cheques se procesan un día a la semana. Las solicitudes deben presentarse a más tardar el lunes para su procesamiento. La preparación de los pagos requiere una revisión minuciosa: examinar las facturas, verificar las autorizaciones y garantizar la exactitud de los datos. Cuando alguien llega sin previo aviso exigiendo un pago inmediato, interrumpe un proceso ya de por sí complejo y debilita los sistemas establecidos.

¿Qué podemos hacer como comunidad? En primer lugar, recordemos que los procedimientos existen por una razón. En segundo lugar, tengamos en cuenta que nuestro departamento de contabilidad cuenta con una persona principal y una asistente. La paciencia, la comprensión y la gratitud no son solo buenos modales, sino expresiones de caridad cristiana. Si tienen preguntas sobre las políticas o los procedimientos financieros, gran parte de esta información está disponible en el sitio web de nuestra parroquia. También pueden comunicarse con un miembro del Consejo de Finanzas, quien con gusto les brindará su ayuda.

Como familia de fe, caminamos juntos, de forma organizada, con responsabilidad y unidos en nuestra misión. Al respetar las estructuras que nos sostienen, nos liberamos para centrarnos en lo que realmente importa: proclamar el Evangelio y ser un pueblo al servicio de los demás. Gracias por su colaboración, su generosidad y su compromiso con la vida de nuestra parroquia.

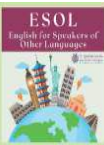

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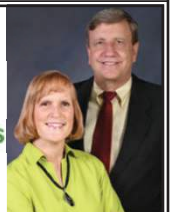
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
