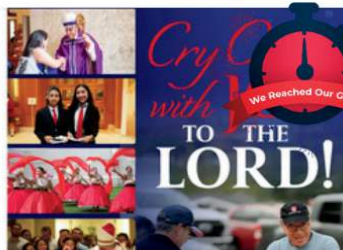

IRA Charitable Distributions

1. Gifts from an IRA, Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD), are popular forms of end-of-year giving for those 70 1/2 or older. A donor can make a gift directly from their IRA to the parish which can result in a reduction in annual taxes owed. Gifts to the parish alone can be mailed directly to the parish.
2. Gifts of appreciated stock allow donors to make an impact to the mission of the church and avoid capital gains on the appreciated shares that are donated to a qualified charity. A donor must complete a stock letter of intent.

PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we continue our journey through Ordinary Time, I again remind you of the purpose of this series of pastoral letters. Ordinary Time is our season of taking stock—of examining who we are as a parish community, how we function, and how we faithfully steward all that God has entrusted to us. Last week, we reflected on the governance of parish finances and the fiduciary responsibility we share in safeguarding every contribution given for the mission of the Church. This week, I would like to turn our attention to another critical dimension of parish life: providing and maintaining a safe and secure environment for every parishioner, ministry, and visitor who steps onto our campus.

As with any large family, the life of a parish requires structure, guidelines, and consistent procedures. Within our community, one of the key areas where these procedures are most evident is the reservation and use of parish facilities. We are blessed with numerous active ministries and organizations, each seeking to fulfill the mission of forming disciples and building up the Body of Christ. Because of this vibrant activity, we operate a structured room reservation system that allows ministries to request and book space on campus. Most of the time, we can accommodate preferences, especially when a group requests a consistent room for its meetings. However, depending on the nature of the space and the competing needs of other groups, we cannot always guarantee the same room every time. What is essential is that the space is properly reserved in advance. Occasionally, individuals or groups come to the office seeking a room “on demand.” As understandable as that desire may be, it is extremely difficult to manage. Our reservation system does more than assign space; it programs the opening and locking of exterior doors and controls the AC and heating for the scheduled meeting. While we could simply hand out a key, doing so would not activate the HVAC system nor the timed door access, meaning doors remain locked and the room may be uncomfortable or inaccessible for participants.

More importantly, such circumvention of the established process compromises the safety we are responsible for providing. Our doors are programmed to unlock thirty minutes before a scheduled meeting and to re-lock fifteen minutes after the start time—providing a forty-five-minute window for arrival. Unfortunately, we frequently find that individuals prop open an exterior door with rocks or small objects to allow latecomers to enter. While the intention may be innocent, the result is not. A propped-open door disables all security protocols and exposes the entire building—and the people inside—to risk. Anyone, whether well-intentioned or not, can walk inside. And depending on how far the door is wedged open, the risk is not limited to people. Being situated near a bayou, we regularly see raccoons, opossums, feral cats, and even snakes crossing our property. These “creatures of God,” while harmless in their natural habitat, do not belong wandering our halls or startling a ministry meeting. To illustrate the seriousness of these issues, I offer an incident I encountered a while ago. One evening, I came across a group of people in McGivney Hall who were practicing dance routines. When I asked who they were and how they gained access, they admitted that one person had entered earlier when the building was legitimately open for a scheduled ministry. That individual then blocked an exterior door with a rock and returned later with others to practice. This might seem harmless fun, but in reality, it was a breach of our safety protocols, a misuse of parish facilities, and a situation that could have resulted in property damage or personal harm. Another dimension of maintaining a safe campus is knowing who is in our buildings at all times. Some ministries have requested their own key so they can come and go freely. Again, such an arrangement is not possible. If the building is not reserved, the alarm system is engaged. Any unscheduled entry triggers police response and a fine for false alarms. Beyond that, unmonitored access poses risks to our children, youth, and vulnerable parishioners who deserve the highest level of protection we can provide.

As I wrote last week, rules and guidelines exist for the good of all. Our neighborhood is not what it was twenty years ago. Equipment can be stolen. Buildings can be accessed by individuals who do not belong here. The consequences can be serious and costly. Our procedures are not inconveniences; they are safeguards. I ask all parishioners and ministry leaders to join me in maintaining a culture of safety. Please reserve rooms properly. Please respect the door schedule. Please refrain from propping open doors. Please understand that these measures protect not only property but people—our families, our children, our seniors, our volunteers, and our staff. Together, with patience, charity, and shared responsibility, we can ensure that St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish remains a safe, welcoming, and well-ordered community of faith. Let us safeguard one another, as Christ commands, and remain “a people for others” in every aspect of our parish life.

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Sunday, Jan 25, 2026

Lace up your walking shoes

Do you feel different this year? What insights have you gained over the past 12 months? In what ways have you changed? What areas in your life need your attention? You may feel like resting for a while. But remember, you can't stand in one place indefinitely and be a disciple of Jesus. Christianity requires transformation and conversion, and these changes can take a lifetime. Invest in the resources (people, periodicals, books, and worship) that will serve as your walking shoes on your never-ending spiritual journey.

Isaiah 8:23—9:3; 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17; Matthew 4:12-23 (67). "Immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him."

Monday, Jan 26, 2026

Truth be told

"What is truth?" Pontius Pilate asked at Jesus' trial. His question showed how little he understood of Jesus' claim that "Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice" (John 18:37). Today, people sometimes go to the opposite extreme and are a little too quick to call something, particularly their own ideas, the Truth. However, most of us recognize that truth has to do with something or someone we can trust and rely on. For Christians, God is the one who is utterly trustworthy. How do we know this? One place to look is scripture and the truth revealed there. Listen to God's word and learn it well, and you will "belong to the truth."

2 Timothy 1:1-8 or Titus 1:1-5; Mark 3:22-30 (520/317). "Bear your share of hardship for the Gospel with the strength that comes from God."

Tuesday, Jan 27, 2026

Think differently

Jesus continually challenged his followers (and us) to think beyond rigid definitions and long-established rules. Angela Merici (1470-1540), founder of the Order of St. Ursula, was one who accepted this challenge. At a time when women were either supposed to marry or enter a convent, Angela understood that single women could live with their families, immerse themselves in their community, and evangelize through their good works. She considered the women who joined her mission her "daughters," and thus expanded, as Jesus calls us to do, our perception of family. In what ways do your perceptions restrict you? Be open to new ways of thinking, as Jesus and Saint Angela were.

Put your mind to it

The formidable thinking and writings of Saint Thomas Aquinas, Dominican theologian and doctor of the church, are still studied today, not only by Christian scholars but by secular philosophers as well. While Aquinas did refer to his massive and unfinished Summa Theologiae as "so much straw" when

compared with what he came to discover in his relationship with Christ, he is nonetheless an important model for us today on the seemingly lost art of clear and logical thinking. We can also show Thomas respect by exploring the richness found in other philosophies and beliefs and seek to include rather than exclude, to understand more than proselytize.

Save space for learning

Read just about any string of online "comments"—chances are if you're a thoughtful person you won't be able to get far—and you'll quickly realize that many people don't think much about what they say. In most virtual spaces, expressing opinions and feelings, no matter how shallow, uninformed, and irrelevant to the topic, is everything. So please note: Carelessness doesn't fly when it comes to the gospel. Jesus wants his disciples to take time to learn and ponder and explore his message before they start sharing it. As Saint Jerome bluntly put it: "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ!" So do your spiritual homework, and after that remember to be kind.

2 Samuel 7:18-19, 24-29; Mark 4:21-25 (320). "The measure with which you measure will be measured out to you."

Friday, Jan 30, 2026

Put some mustard on it

The tiny mustard seed adds flavor not only to many foods but also to a number of religious traditions. Jesus used the gospel parable of the mustard seed as a model for the reign of God. To teach humility, Jewish texts compared the knowable universe to the size of a mustard seed. And the Quran states that no soul will suffer the least injustice on the Day of Judgment because even the equivalent of a mustard seed will be accounted for on God's scales of justice. Whenever you doubt that your small efforts will make a difference, remember the quiet power of that tiny seed.

2 Samuel 11:1-4a, 5-10a, 13-17; Mark 4:26-34 (321). "To what shall we compare the Kingdom of God ...? It is like a mustard seed."

Saturday, Jan 31, 2026

Discover your calling

When we hear the word vocation, many of us think of ordained ministry or vowed religious life. Yet each of us has a unique calling that, if discerned and embraced, would make the best use of our gifts and talents. When we haven't taken time to discover that call, our lives can feel less significant or effective than they were meant to be. In honor of Saint John Bosco (1815-88), a pioneer in vocational training, take some time to ask yourself, "Who am I called to be?" A thoughtful book, such as *A Sacred Voice Is Calling* by John Neafsey, or a heartfelt conversation with a wise friend can help your process of discernment.

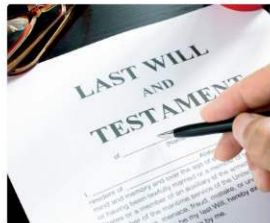

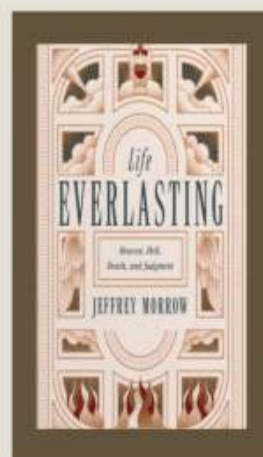

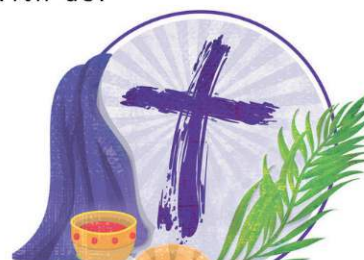

PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

Queridos hermanos,

Al continuar nuestra jornada durante el Tiempo Ordinario, les recuerdo nuevamente el propósito de esta serie de cartas pastorales. El Tiempo Ordinario es un tiempo para reflexionar, para examinar quiénes somos como comunidad parroquial, cómo funcionamos y cómo administramos fielmente todo lo que Dios nos ha confiado. La semana pasada, reflexionamos sobre la administración de las finanzas parroquiales y la responsabilidad fiduciaria que compartimos al salvaguardar cada contribución destinada a la misión de la Iglesia. Esta semana, me gustaría centrar nuestra atención en otra dimensión fundamental de la vida parroquial: proporcionar y mantener un entorno seguro para cada feligrés, ministerio y visitante que llega a nuestras instalaciones.

Como en cualquier familia numerosa, la vida parroquial requiere estructura, normas y procedimientos consistentes. Dentro de nuestra comunidad, una de las áreas clave donde estos procedimientos son más evidentes es la reserva y el uso de las instalaciones parroquiales. Contamos con numerosos ministerios y organizaciones activas, cada una dedicada a cumplir la misión de formar discípulos y edificar el Cuerpo de Cristo. Gracias a esta intensa actividad, contamos con un sistema estructurado de reserva de salas que permite a los ministerios solicitar y reservar espacios en el recinto parroquial. La mayoría de las veces, podemos satisfacer las preferencias, especialmente cuando un grupo solicita una sala fija para sus reuniones. Sin embargo, dependiendo de las características del espacio y de las necesidades de otros grupos, no siempre podemos garantizar la misma sala. Lo fundamental es que el espacio se reserve con la debida anticipación. En ocasiones, algunas personas o grupos acuden a la oficina solicitando una sala de forma improvisada. Si bien este deseo es comprensible, resulta extremadamente difícil de gestionar. Nuestro sistema de reservas no solo asigna espacios; también programa la apertura y el cierre de las puertas exteriores y controla el aire acondicionado y la calefacción para la reunión programada. Si bien podríamos simplemente entregar una llave, esto no activaría el sistema de climatización ni el acceso programado a las puertas, lo que significa que las puertas permanecerían cerradas y la sala podría resultar incómoda o inaccesible para los participantes.

Más importante aún, este incumplimiento del procedimiento establecido compromete la seguridad que tenemos la responsabilidad de garantizar. Nuestras puertas están programadas para desbloquearse treinta minutos antes de una reunión programada y para volver a cerrarse quince minutos después de la hora de inicio, lo que proporciona un margen de cuarenta y cinco minutos para la llegada. Desafortunadamente, con frecuencia encontramos que algunas personas mantienen abiertas las puertas exteriores con piedras u objetos pequeños para permitir la entrada de quienes llegan tarde. Si bien la intención puede ser inocente, el resultado no lo es. Una puerta abierta de esta manera desactiva todos los protocolos de seguridad y expone a todo el edificio, y a las personas que se encuentran dentro, a un riesgo. Cualquiera, con buenas o malas intenciones, puede entrar. Y dependiendo de qué tan abierta esté la puerta, el riesgo no se limita solo a las personas. Al estar ubicados cerca de un pantano, vemos regularmente mapaches, zarigüeyas/comadreja o faras, gatos salvajes e incluso serpientes cruzando nuestra propiedad. Estas criaturas, si bien son inofensivas en su ambiente natural, no deben deambular por nuestros pasillos ni interrumpir una reunión. Para ilustrar la gravedad de estos problemas, les cuento un incidente que presencié hace un tiempo. Una noche, me encontré con un grupo de personas en el Salón McGivney que estaban ensayando rutinas de baile. Cuando pregunté quiénes eran y cómo habían accedido al edificio, admitieron que una persona había entrado antes, cuando el edificio estaba abierto legítimamente para una actividad parroquial programada. Esa persona bloqueó una puerta exterior con una piedra y regresó más tarde con otros para ensayar. Esto podría parecer una travesura inofensiva, pero en realidad, fue una violación de nuestros protocolos de seguridad, un uso indebido de las instalaciones parroquiales y una situación que podría haber provocado daños a la propiedad o lesiones personales. Otro aspecto fundamental para mantener un entorno seguro es saber quién se encuentra en nuestros edificios en todo momento. Algunos grupos parroquiales han solicitado tener su propia llave para poder entrar y salir libremente. Sin embargo, esto no es posible. Si el edificio no está reservado, el sistema de alarma está activado. Cualquier entrada no autorizada activa la alarma y conlleva una multa por falsa alarma. Además, el acceso sin supervisión representa un riesgo para nuestros niños, jóvenes y feligreses vulnerables, quienes merecen la máxima protección que podamos brindarles.

Como escribí la semana pasada, las normas y directrices existen para el bien de todos. Nuestro vecindario no es el mismo que hace veinte años. Los equipos pueden ser robados. Personas ajenas a la parroquia pueden acceder a los edificios. Las consecuencias pueden ser graves y costosas. Nuestros procedimientos no son inconvenientes; son medidas de seguridad. Les pido a todos los feligreses y líderes de ministerios que se unan a mí para mantener una cultura de seguridad. Por favor, reserven las salas correctamente. Respeten el horario de apertura y cierre de las puertas. Absténganse de dejar las puertas abiertas. Comprendan que estas medidas protegen no solo la propiedad, sino también a las personas: nuestras familias, nuestros hijos, nuestros ancianos, nuestros voluntarios y nuestro personal. Juntos, con paciencia, caridad y responsabilidad compartida, podemos asegurar que la Parroquia San Ignacio de Loyola siga siendo una comunidad de fe segura, acogedora y bien organizada. Protejámonos unos a otros, como Cristo nos manda, y seamos "un pueblo para los demás" en cada aspecto de nuestra vida parroquial.

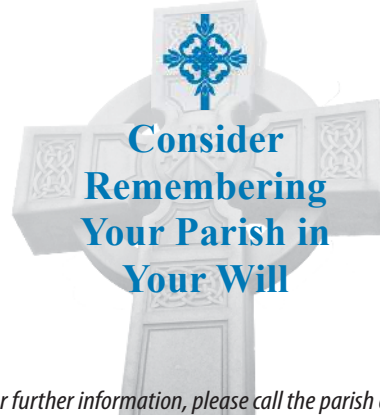

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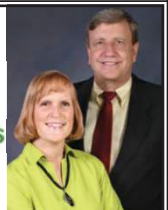
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
