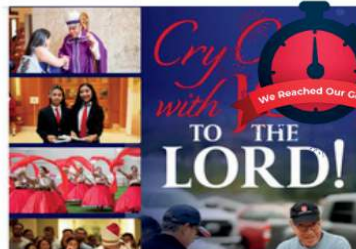

# PASTOR'S COLUMN

## COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

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Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we continue our journey through Ordinary Time, I am grateful for the thoughtful engagement many of you have shown with this pastoral letter series. The purpose of these letters is not merely to convey information, but to invite reflection, renewal, and deeper intentionality in how we live our faith together as a parish family. In the first letter, we reflected on *Ordinary Time* itself as *ordered time*: time given to us by the Church to grow, mature, and be formed as disciples. We then addressed our financial obligations and guidelines to maintain the proper function of the accountability systems dealing with money. In the second letter, we turned our attention to *stewardship*, particularly as it relates to campus safety. We spoke about fiduciary responsibility, transparency, and accountability, as well as the importance of maintaining a safe and secure campus for all who gather here. Stewardship, we noted, is not limited to money; it encompasses our care for people, property, and the mission entrusted to us.

Today, I would like to address the heart of our communal life as Catholics: the Eucharistic Liturgy. The Church gives us clear, precise, and prayerfully developed guidance for the celebration of Mass through the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (often referred to as the GIRM). This document tells us what to do, how to do it, when to do it, and what to say in the celebration of the Eucharist. This is not accidental, nor is it restrictive. Rather, it is an expression of the Church's wisdom, developed over centuries, to safeguard unity, reverence, and theological integrity in our most sacred act of worship. Increasingly, however, we see a tendency—sometimes well-intentioned—for individuals to introduce personal preferences, private devotions, or individual expressions into the public, communal celebration of the Mass. When this occurs, the liturgy can become disjointed and confusing. What is meant to be a unified act of worship by the Body of Christ risks becoming fragmented. Private devotion and personal piety are beautiful and necessary parts of our spiritual lives—but they do not replace, nor should they intrude upon, the public worship of the Church. The liturgy is not “my Mass” or “your Mass.” It is *the Mass of the Church*.

The unity to which the liturgy calls us begins well before the opening hymn. Our gathering for Mass begins in our homes. It begins by reviewing the readings that the Church has prescribed for that particular day. These readings are not chosen at random; they are part of a carefully ordered lectionary meant to form us over time in the whole of salvation history. The gathering also includes something very practical: choosing what to wear. How we dress matters. Studies consistently show that dress affects disposition, attitude, and behavior. The Mass is not a casual social event; it is the “Wedding Feast of the Lamb.” Ask yourself honestly: *How would I dress for a wedding?* Most of us would not choose shorts, t-shirts, flip-flops, pajama-style pants, or overly casual attire. There was once a common phrase, “*Sunday best*.” It did not mean expensive clothing; it meant offering the best we have. Our dress should reflect what we are celebrating: the sacrificial offering of the Son of God, through whom we are saved from sin and offered eternal life. What we wear should assist—not hinder—our interior disposition toward reverence and awe. We should strive to arrive early enough to recollect ourselves and pray for the grace to celebrate the liturgy well. This is not simply about being on time; it is about being *present*. Conversation and social interaction are important—but they belong in the narthex, the gathering space at the entrance of the church. The nave, where the assembly gathers, is a place of prayer. (The word *nave* comes from the Latin *navis*, meaning “ship,” reminding us that the Church carries us together through the waters of this world.)

As we enter the nave, we pause at the baptismal font. This gesture is intentional and deeply symbolic. We place our right hand into the holy water and slowly, deliberately make the Sign of the Cross: *In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit*—from forehead, to chest, from left shoulder to right. In doing so, we recall our baptism, through which we became beloved sons and daughters of God and were promised eternal life. At St. Ignatius of Loyola, we do not ordinarily genuflect upon entering the pew. Why? Because genuflection is reserved for the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Since the Blessed Sacrament is reserved in the Reservation Chapel and not in the main sanctuary, the Church asks us instead to make a profound (deep) bow to the altar. The altar has been consecrated with Sacred Chrism. It represents Christ himself in our midst. A deep bow is not a casual nod; it is a deliberate act of reverence—an outward expression of an inward recognition of the Lord's presence. Once in the pew, we pray. Ask for grace: Why am I here? What do I bring to this altar today? What do I ask God to give me in return? Take in the environment. Notice what the space communicates about the celebration that is about to unfold. Review the readings again in the worship aid. Pay attention to words or phrases that stir your heart or draw you closer to God. This is active, intentional participation—not passive observation.

This series exists because how we worship shapes who we are. The Eucharistic Liturgy is not something we improvise or personalize according to preference. It is the Church's prayer, entrusted to us, forming us week after week into one Body, one Spirit in Christ. I invite you to reflect honestly on your own actions and disposition as you respond to the Lord's invitation to celebrate in His presence.

# WEEK READINGS

## LECTURAS DE LA SEMANA

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### Sunday, Feb 01, 2026

#### Who wants to inherit the Earth?

The simplest way to think of humility may be “knowing one’s limitations.” Don’t be more—or less—than you are. For Christians, though, humility means something deeper than practicing a virtue; it’s a matter of putting others first, and “others” include God, people, and all of creation. The monk Thomas Merton wrote, “. . . The right of another . . . is the expression of God’s love and God’s will.” Why follow this crazy-sounding advice? “Because Christ emptied himself . . . he humbled himself” (Philippians 2:7). As he did, and does, so we are to do: give of ourselves for the good of others. The stories of the saints reveal such humility. Their first thought was of God and the needs of those around them, not themselves. It’s a tall order, but humble attitudes and actions can connect you to God in your everyday life.

### Monday, Feb 02, 2026

#### Open the gifts children bring

Like most parents, Mary and Joseph wanted the best for their child. They were faithful Jews and desired their son to be raised in the faith that had sustained them. They took Jesus to the Temple to be consecrated and presented to God, where they met Simeon and Anna, elders of the community. The elders immediately recognized Jesus as the Messiah, the fulfillment of God’s promise to Israel, a light to the whole world. What can you do this day to call forth the gifts of a child and encourage them to use those gifts to give light to the world?

### Tuesday, Feb 03, 2026

#### God has a hand in healing

Many stories of healing in scripture are of the miraculous variety; they’re “supernatural”—“above” nature—and on God’s power over everything, including natural things like illness. While such miracles seem rarer today, one of the keys to healing remains trust: in God, whether the outcome is an actual cure or the acceptance of one’s situation. Either way, suffering eases. “Grace does not destroy nature but perfects it,” says Saint Thomas Aquinas. Let the grace of faith bring some healing to your life.

*2 Samuel 18:9-10, 14b, 24-25a, 30-19:3; Mark 5:21-43 (324). “Your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction.”*

### Wednesday, Feb 04, 2026

#### When familiarity breeds contempt

“Well, who do they think they are?” neighbors wonder as they gossip about the behavior of other neighbors and make decisions like “they’ve grown too big for their britches.” In traditional societies—today and in the time of Jesus—such criticism tells people that the priorities of the community to fit

in and get along are valued over priorities of the individual. But judging the personal lives of others can create conflict and cause jealousy. Indeed, “Envy is the mother of murder,” says Saint John Chrysostom. Do you indulge in character assassination? If so, why? Take time to think about your motivations.

*2 Samuel 24:2, 9-17; Mark 6:1-6 (325). “A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin.”*

### Thursday, Feb 05, 2026

#### In solidarity with saints

When facing challenges, we can turn to the saints for help. The church raises up women and men who are in solidarity with us, including saints who have experienced some of the same horrors that people today have. As we fight for human dignity and the protection of life, we can look to saints like Saint Agatha, who knew personally the terror of sexual assault and torture, or to Saint Josephine Bakhita, who was sold into slavery at the age of 7 and eventually won her freedom and became a Canossian sister, or to the saints among us, including many contemporary Catholic sisters, who are at the forefront of the struggle against human trafficking. Play your part in protecting the dignity and freedom of all people.

### Friday, Feb 06, 2026

#### A fruitful rain continues to nourish

Brother Paul Miki, a Jesuit and a native of Japan, is the best known among the 26 martyrs who died in Japan in 1597. As he died on a hill in Nagasaki he said, “After Christ’s example I forgive my persecutors. I do not hate them. I ask God to have pity on all, and I hope my blood will fall on my fellow men as a fruitful rain.” Indeed, it did. Centuries later, missionaries returned to Japan to find thousands of Christians who had quietly preserved the faith underground until it was legalized. Mientras continuamos nuestro camino durante el Tiempo Ordinario, agradezco la atenta participación que muchos de ustedes han demostrado con esta serie de cartas pastorales. El propósito de estas cartas no es simplemente transmitir información, sino invitarles a la reflexión, la renovación y una mayor intencionalidad en la forma en que vivimos nuestra fe juntos como familia parroquial. En la primera carta, reflexionamos sobre el *Tiempo Ordinario* como un *tiempo ordenado*: un tiempo que la Iglesia nos concede para crecer, madurar y formarnos como discípulos. Luego nos ocupamos de nuestras obligaciones financieras y las directrices para el correcto funcionamiento de los sistemas de rendición de cuentas en materia económica. En la segunda carta, centramos nuestra atención en la *corresponsabilidad* de los bienes, particularmente en lo que respecta a la seguridad del campus. Hablamos de la responsabilidad fiduciaria, la transparencia y la rendición de cuentas, así como de la importancia de mantener un campus seguro para todos los que se reúnen aquí. La administración de los bienes, señalamos, no se limita al dinero; abarca nuestro cuidado de las personas, las propiedades y la misión que se nos ha encomendado.

Hoy quisiera abordar el núcleo de nuestra vida comunitaria como católicos: la Liturgia Eucarística. La Iglesia nos ofrece una guía clara, precisa y cuidadosamente elaborada para la celebración de la Misa a través de la *Instrucción General del Misal Romano* (conocida comúnmente como IGMR). Este documento nos indica qué hacer, cómo hacerlo, cuándo hacerlo y qué decir en la celebración de la Eucaristía. Esto no es casual ni restrictivo, sino que es una expresión de la sabiduría de la Iglesia, desarrollada a lo largo de los siglos, para salvaguardar la unidad, la reverencia y la integridad teológica en nuestro acto de culto más sagrado. Sin embargo, cada vez con mayor frecuencia, observamos una tendencia —a veces bien intencionada— a que algunas personas introduzcan preferencias personales, devociones privadas o expresiones individuales en la celebración pública y comunitaria de la Misa. Cuando esto ocurre, la liturgia puede volverse incoherente y confusa. Lo que debería ser un acto de adoración unificado por parte del Cuerpo de Cristo corre el riesgo de fragmentarse. La devoción privada y la piedad personal son aspectos hermosos y necesarios de nuestra vida espiritual, pero no reemplazan ni deben interferir en el culto público de la Iglesia. La liturgia no es «mi Misa» ni «tu Misa», sino *la Misa de la Iglesia*.

La unidad a la que nos llama la liturgia comienza mucho antes del canto de entrada. Nuestra preparación para la Misa comienza en nuestros hogares. Comienza revisando las lecturas que la Iglesia ha prescrito para ese día en particular. Estas lecturas no se eligen al azar; forman parte de un leccionario cuidadosamente ordenado, diseñado para formarnos a lo largo del tiempo en la historia completa de la salvación. La preparación también incluye algo muy práctico: elegir qué ponernos. La forma en que nos vestimos es importante. Diversos estudios demuestran que la vestimenta influye en el estado de ánimo, la actitud y el comportamiento. La Misa no es un evento social informal; es el «Banquete de bodas del Cordero». Pregúntate con sinceridad: ¿Cómo me vestiría para una boda? La mayoría de nosotros no elegiríamos pantalones cortos, camisetas, sandalias, pantalones de pijama ni ropa demasiado informal. Antes existía la expresión común: «vestirse de domingo». No se trata de usar ropa cara; se trata de ofrecer lo mejor que tenemos. Nuestra vestimenta debe reflejar lo que celebramos: el sacrificio del Hijo de Dios, por quien somos salvados del pecado y recibimos la vida eterna. Lo que vestimos debe favorecer —no obstaculizar— nuestra disposición interior de reverencia y asombro. Debemos esforzarnos por llegar con suficiente anticipación para que recobremos la serenidad y oremos para que se nos conceda la gracia de celebrar la liturgia dignamente. No se trata simplemente de llegar a tiempo; se trata de estar *presentes*. La conversación y la interacción social son importantes, pero corresponden al nártex, el espacio de reunión a la entrada de la iglesia. La nave, donde se congrega la asamblea, es un lugar de oración. (La palabra *nave* proviene del latín *navis*, que significa «barco», recordándonos que la Iglesia nos transporta juntos a través de las aguas de este mundo).

Al entrar en la nave, nos detenemos ante la pila bautismal. Este gesto es intencional y profundamente simbólico. Sumergimos la mano derecha en el agua bendita y, lenta y deliberadamente, hacemos la señal de la cruz: *En el nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo*, desde la frente hasta el pecho, del hombro izquierdo al derecho. Al hacerlo, recordamos nuestro bautismo, por el cual nos convertimos en hijas e hijos amados de Dios y se nos prometió la vida eterna. En la iglesia de San Ignacio de Loyola, normalmente no hacemos genuflexión al entrar y sentarnos en la banca. ¿Por qué? Porque la genuflexión está reservada para la presencia del Santísimo Sacramento. Dado que el Santísimo Sacramento se reserva en la Capilla de la Reserva y no en el santuario principal, la Iglesia nos pide que, en su lugar, hagamos una profunda reverencia al altar. El altar ha sido consagrado con el Santo Crisma. Representa a Cristo mismo entre nosotros. Una reverencia profunda no es un simple asentimiento; es un acto deliberado de reverencia, una expresión externa del reconocimiento interno de la presencia del Señor. Una vez sentados en la banca, oramos. Pedimos gracia: ¿Por qué estoy aquí? ¿Qué traigo hoy a este altar? ¿Qué le pido a Dios a cambio? Observamos nuestro entorno. Observen lo que el espacio comunica sobre la celebración que está por comenzar. Repasen las lecturas en el guía de la celebración. Presten atención a las palabras o frases que les conmuevan o les acerquen a Dios. Esta es una participación activa e intencionada, no una simple observación pasiva.

Esta serie existe porque la forma en que adoramos forma nuestra identidad. La liturgia eucarística no es algo que improvisamos o personalizamos a nuestro gusto. Es la oración de la Iglesia, confiada a nosotros, que nos transforma semana tras semana en un solo Cuerpo, un solo Espíritu en Cristo. Los invito a reflexionar con sinceridad sobre sus propias acciones y actitudes al responder a la invitación del Señor a celebrar en Su presencia.

## ¿Quién quiere heredar la tierra?

La forma más sencilla de entender la humildad podría ser “conocer las propias limitaciones”. No seas más ni menos de lo que eres. Para los cristianos, sin embargo, la humildad significa algo más profundo que practicar una virtud; se trata de poner a los demás en primer lugar, y esos “otros” incluyen a Dios, a las personas y a toda la creación. El monje Thomas Merton escribió: “...El derecho del otro... es la expresión del amor y la voluntad de Dios”. ¿Por qué seguir este consejo que suena tan descabellado? “Porque Cristo se despojó de sí mismo... se humilló a sí mismo” (Filipenses 2:7). Como Él hizo y hace, así debemos hacer nosotros: entregarnos por el bien de los demás. Las historias de los santos revelan esta humildad. Su primer pensamiento era Dios y las necesidades de quienes los rodeaban, no las suyas propias. Es un gran desafío, pero las actitudes y acciones humildes pueden conectarte con Dios en tu vida cotidiana.

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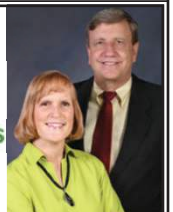
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
