

IRA Charitable Distributions

1. Gifts from an IRA, Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD), are popular forms of end-of-year giving for those 70 1/2 or older. A donor can make a gift directly from their IRA to the parish which can result in a reduction in annual taxes owed. Gifts to the parish alone can be mailed directly to the parish.
2. Gifts of appreciated stock allow donors to make an impact to the mission of the church and avoid capital gains on the appreciated shares that are donated to a qualified charity. A donor must complete a stock letter of intent.

PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I write to you once again as we continue this intentional series of pastoral reflections on our shared life of worship. The purpose of these letters remains clear and constant: a renewed call to unity—especially unity expressed and embodied in the celebration of the Eucharistic Liturgy. The Mass is not simply something we attend as individuals; it is the Church at prayer, the Body of Christ acting together. When unity in worship is weakened, the sign of who we are as Church is likewise weakened. Last week's reflection centered on proper preparation for the Eucharistic celebration. We were reminded that we do not arrive at Mass casually or by accident. We come intentionally, disposing our minds and hearts for worship, aware that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life" (Sacrosanctum Concilium, no. 10). From the Eucharist flows everything we do as Catholic Christians, and to it all our actions return. Preparation—spiritual, mental, and practical—is an act of reverence for what God is about to accomplish in our midst as a worshipping people.

Today, I would like to reflect on the opening moments of the Mass itself: the Introductory Rites and the Penitential Act. These rites are not preliminary formalities to be endured before "the real Mass" begins. Rather, the Church teaches that they are essential in forming us into a unified assembly capable of celebrating the sacred mysteries. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) states clearly that the purpose of the Introductory Rites is "to ensure that the faithful who come together as one establish communion and dispose themselves properly to listen to the Word of God and to celebrate the Eucharist worthily" (GIRM, no. 46). The emphasis here is deliberate: we establish communion. The Introductory Rites take a gathering of individuals and form them into one praying Body. This is why the entrance chant, the sign of the cross, the greeting, and the opening dialogue are not optional embellishments but constitutive acts of communal worship. When the priest greets the assembly, he does so not as a private individual but in his liturgical role, acknowledging the Lord's presence already active among His people. Our responses are likewise communal; they are not background noise but the voice of the Body of Christ responding together. Through these shared words and gestures, we are reminded that we stand before God not alone, but as a people.

Within the Introductory Rites, the Church places the Penitential Act. According to the GIRM, this act allows the whole community to acknowledge its sinfulness and to prepare itself to celebrate the sacred mysteries (cf. GIRM, no. 51). The Penitential Act is not a substitute for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, nor is it meant to be a moment of private introspection disconnected from the assembly. It is a communal act of humility, by which we recognize together our need for God's mercy. The Church provides several approved forms of the Penitential Act. These options are intentional, each with its own structure and theological emphasis, and all are equally valid when used as prescribed. What is essential is fidelity to the form chosen. The liturgy is not the place for personal improvisation, because its purpose is to express the prayer of the whole Church, not the preference of the individual. In this regard, a point of clarification is important. The concluding prayer of the Penitential Act—"May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life"—does not include the Sign of the Cross. The General Instruction does not prescribe this gesture at that moment, and therefore it is not part of the rite. While this may appear to be a minor detail, liturgical unity is built precisely through attentiveness to such details. When additional gestures are introduced that are not called for, the common language of worship becomes fragmented. Why does this matter? Because the liturgy does not belong to any one of us. It belongs to the Church. Through her liturgical norms, the Church teaches us how to pray as one Body. Words, gestures, postures, and moments of silence are carefully ordered so that we may be formed together in faith, reverence, and mission.

As we continue these reflections, I offer a gentle pastoral reminder. When we gather for the Eucharist, we do so not as individuals pursuing personal expressions of piety, but as one corporate Body of Christ. Our unity is not uniformity, but it does require a shared obedience to the Church's prayer. In acting together, we proclaim something far greater than ourselves: Christ alive and active in His Church. May our fidelity to the Church's liturgy deepen our unity at the altar, so that what we celebrate together may shape how we live together as missionary disciples in the world.

Next week we will review the structure, meaning and the "why" of the Liturgy of the Word.

Put it into practice

Twentieth-century writer Aldous Huxley said of love: “There isn’t any secret formula or method. You learn love by loving.” At every crossroad, at every bump in the road in your relationships with others, this is a simple truth to put into practice: Learn to love by loving; learn to forgive by forgiving. It isn’t any more complicated than that. The choice is yours.

Isaiah 58:7-10; 1 Corinthians 2:1-5; Matthew 5:13-16 (73). “Your light must shine before others.”

Monday, Feb 09, 2026

Reach out and touch

Who gets healed in the gospels? Mostly it’s those who make some small act of faith in Jesus. Today’s gospel tells of all the people healed in body and spirit just by touching Jesus’ cloak. The gospel points to two elements of spiritual healing: willingness and connection. Before God can do anything for us, we must break out of the paralysis of despair and be willing to reach out. If we make just the slightest move toward God, amazing changes are possible. As Pope Francis explained: “What type of faith is great? Great faith is that which brings its own story, marked even by wounds, and brings it to the Lord’s feet asking Him to heal them, to give them meaning.” We don’t have to do it all, simply reach out and touch Jesus in some way—through prayer, the Eucharist, or service to those in need.

1 Kings 8:1-7, 9-13; Mark 6:53-56 (329). “They laid the sick in the marketplaces and begged him that they might touch only the tassel on his cloak.”

Tuesday, Feb 10, 2026

Sibling solidarity

Saint Scholastica (c. 480-c. 543), together with her brother Benedict, founded the Western monastic tradition. Benedict’s rule of life emphasized gentleness and respect, qualities that were evident in the close relationship between Scholastica and Benedict. After adopting monastic life, the two allowed themselves one day a year to visit each other. They would meet at a small cottage halfway between Scholastica’s convent and Benedict’s abbey. Their great contribution to Catholicism is evidence of the good that can come from a loving relationship between siblings. Consider your own relationship with siblings or other close kin. What can you do today to strengthen those relationships? You never know what great contribution to humanity might result from your efforts!

Rules to live by

With the season of Lent and its practice of fasting arriving next week, it’s a little puzzling to remember that Jesus was a great breaker of fasts and violator of religious food rules—that was one thing that got him into trouble with the authorities. His followers gathered grain on the Sabbath because they were

starving. He ate with sinners and outcasts. He simply did not follow the rules, but for a purpose: to show how the rules should not control but rather serve to bring a person into a more loving relationship with God and neighbor. “In Jesus,” the Catechism of the Catholic Church says, “the law no longer appears engraved on tables of stone, but upon the heart of the Servant who becomes a covenant to the people, because he will faithfully bring forth justice” (CCC 580). What makes a person holy is not external observance but internal faith and love, which leads to right behavior.

1 Kings 10:1-10; Mark 7:14-23 (331). “[What] goes into a person from outside cannot defile. . . . (Thus he declared all foods clean.)”

Thursday, Feb 12, 2026

How can you say no to a sick child?

Did Jesus think of his own mother as the Gentile woman with the sick daughter argued with him for a healing? Mothers (and fathers) don’t want to talk politics and policy when their children are in need. They just want help and they want it now. Such confrontations take place every day in schools, emergency rooms, and social service offices, as parents argue for the well-being of their little ones. “Yes,” they say, “I know your mission statement [or charter, or law] doesn’t cover this, but my kid is hurting!” Jesus found this a compelling argument. Do you?

1 Kings 11:4-13; Mark 7:24-30 (332). “She replied and said to him, ‘Lord, even the dogs under the table eat the children’s scraps.’”

Friday, Feb 13, 2026

You’ve got to want it

Jesus performed many miracles but never did so by force. Neither would he coerce anyone to listen to him, much less to speak up on his behalf. If we choose to ignore the Good News in our own lives, we have the free will to do so. “He who created us without our help will not save us without our consent,” says Saint Augustine. It’s up to us to say yes to faith, to say yes to the truth of God’s love. God would never force you to do so. Faith is freely given and freely exercised. Exercise yours today.

1 Kings 11:29-32; 12:19; Mark 7:31-37 (333). “People brought to him a deaf man . . . and begged him to lay his hand on him.”

Saturday, Feb 14, 2026

Speak the language of love

This is real love: two brothers dedicate their lives to serving a people not their own. Born in ninth-century Greece, Methodius was older and eventually attained the office of archbishop. Cyril, more philosophical, was a linguist and theologian. Both took on the evangelizing of Moravia. There, Cyril devised the Slavic alphabet developed by later disciples and called Cyrillic in his honor. Both brothers fought for Bibles and liturgy in the language of the people. Pope John Paul II declared Cyril and Methodius patron saints of Europe. Follow the example of their love and bring good news to strangers.





Queridos hermanos,

Les escribo una vez más mientras continuamos con esta serie de reflexiones pastorales sobre nuestra vida de culto en común. El propósito de estas cartas sigue siendo claro y constante: un llamado renovado a la unidad, especialmente a la unidad expresada y manifestada en la celebración de la Liturgia Eucarística. La Misa no es simplemente algo a lo que asistimos individualmente; es la Iglesia en oración, el Cuerpo de Cristo actuando en conjunto. Cuando la unidad en el culto se debilita, el signo de lo que somos como Iglesia también se debilita. La reflexión de la semana pasada se centró en la preparación adecuada para la celebración eucarística. Se nos recordó que no llegamos a Misa de forma casual ni por accidente. Venimos intencionadamente, preparando nuestra mente y nuestro corazón para la adoración, conscientes de que la Eucaristía es «la fuente y la cumbre de la vida cristiana» (Sacrosanctum Concilium, n.º 10). De la Eucaristía emana todo lo que hacemos como católicos, y a ella regresan todas nuestras acciones. La preparación —espiritual, mental y práctica— es un acto de reverencia por lo que Dios está a punto de realizar entre nosotros como pueblo que adora.

Hoy me gustaría reflexionar sobre los momentos iniciales de la Misa: los Ritos Introdutorios y el Acto Penitencial. Estos ritos no son meras formalidades que hay que soportar antes de que comience la "verdadera Misa". Más bien, la Iglesia enseña que son esenciales para conformarnos como una asamblea unida, capaz de celebrar los sagrados misterios. La Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR) afirma claramente que el propósito de los Ritos Introdutorios es "que los fieles reunidos en la unidad construyan la comunión y se dispongan debidamente a escuchar la Palabra de Dios y a celebrar dignamente la Eucaristía. (IGMR, n.º 46). El énfasis aquí es intencional: establecemos la comunión. Los Ritos Iniciales transforman una reunión de personas en un solo cuerpo orante. Por eso, el canto de entrada, la señal de la cruz, el saludo y el diálogo inicial no son adornos opcionales, sino actos constitutivos del culto comunitario. Cuando el sacerdote saluda a la asamblea, lo hace no como un individuo particular, sino en su función litúrgica, reconociendo la presencia del Señor ya activa entre su pueblo. Nuestras respuestas son igualmente comunitarias; no son ruido de fondo, sino la voz del Cuerpo de Cristo que responde unánime. A través de estas palabras y gestos compartidos, recordamos que nos presentamos ante Dios no solos, sino como un pueblo.

Dentro de los Ritos Iniciales, la Iglesia incluye el Acto Penitencial. Según la Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR), este acto permite a toda la comunidad reconocer su condición pecaminosa y prepararse para celebrar los sagrados misterios (cf. IGMR, n.º 51). El Acto Penitencial no sustituye al Sacramento de la Reconciliación, ni pretende ser un momento de introspección privada desconectado de la asamblea. Es un acto comunitario de humildad, por el cual reconocemos juntos nuestra necesidad de la misericordia de Dios. La Iglesia ofrece varias formas aprobadas del Acto Penitencial. Estas opciones son intencionadas, cada una con su propia estructura y énfasis teológico, y todas son igualmente válidas cuando se utilizan según lo prescrito. Lo esencial es la fidelidad a la forma elegida. La liturgia no es el lugar para la improvisación personal, ya que su propósito es expresar la oración de toda la Iglesia, no la preferencia del individuo. En este sentido, es importante una aclaración. La oración final del Acto Penitencial —«Que Dios todopoderoso tenga misericordia de nosotros, nos perdone nuestros pecados y nos lleve a la vida eterna»— no incluye la señal de la cruz. La Instrucción General no prescribe este gesto en ese momento y, por lo tanto, no forma parte del rito. Si bien esto puede parecer un detalle menor, la unidad litúrgica se construye precisamente prestando atención a estos detalles. Cuando se introducen gestos adicionales que no están previstos, el lenguaje común de la liturgia se fragmenta. ¿Por qué es importante esto? Porque la liturgia no pertenece a ninguno de nosotros individualmente, sino a la Iglesia. A través de sus normas litúrgicas, la Iglesia nos enseña a orar como un solo Cuerpo. Las palabras, los gestos, las posturas y los momentos de silencio están cuidadosamente ordenados para que podamos formarnos juntos en la fe, la reverencia y la misión.

Mientras continuamos con estas reflexiones, les ofrezco un amable recordatorio pastoral. Cuando nos reunimos para la Eucaristía, no lo hacemos como individuos que buscan expresiones personales de piedad, sino como un solo Cuerpo de Cristo. Nuestra unidad no es uniformidad, pero sí requiere una obediencia compartida a la oración de la Iglesia. Al actuar juntos, proclamamos algo mucho más grande que nosotros mismos: Cristo vivo y activo en su Iglesia. Que nuestra fidelidad a la liturgia de la Iglesia profundice nuestra unidad en el altar, para que lo que celebramos juntos moldee nuestra forma de vivir como discípulos misioneros en el mundo.

La próxima semana repasaremos la estructura, el significado y el porqué de la Liturgia de la Palabra.




