PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In our previous pastoral reflection, we considered the Introductory Rites of the Mass and how they gather us from many places and dispositions into one Body, prepared to stand together before the Lord. Having been formed into a corporate body through our gathering, song, and penitential prayer, we now come to the first of the two great tables of the Mass: The **Liturgy of the Word**. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal clearly articulates the purpose of the Liturgy of the Word: “*In the readings, the homily, and the profession of faith, God speaks to his people, opening up to them the mystery of redemption and salvation*” (GIRM, no. 55). This is not simply a time of religious instruction or spiritual reflection. It is a sacred dialogue in which the living God addresses His people here and now, and the people respond with faith, prayer, and assent. The Liturgy of the Word is carefully structured and composed of several integral elements: the proclamation of Sacred Scripture, the responsorial psalm, the Gospel acclamation, the homily, the profession of faith, and the Prayer of the Faithful. Each element has its own proper minister and place, emphasizing that the Word of God is not self-generated but received, proclaimed, and responded to within the Church.

The readings themselves are drawn from the Lectionary, the Church’s official liturgical book containing the prescribed Scripture readings for each Mass throughout the liturgical year. These readings are not selected locally or according to personal preference. Rather, they are the fruit of careful discernment by the Church, structured in a multi-year cycle so that the faithful may hear a rich and representative portion of Sacred Scripture proclaimed over time. The Church, guided by the Holy Spirit, determines these readings so that the Word of God may be proclaimed systematically and in harmony with the liturgical seasons. The proclamation of the readings is itself a liturgical action and is entrusted to specific ministers. The first and second readings are ordinarily proclaimed by a lector, a lay minister who serves the assembly by giving voice to the Word of God. The Gospel, however, holds a unique place. It is proclaimed only by a deacon or, in his absence, by a priest. The *Praenotanda of the Lectionary* reminds us that in the Gospel proclamation, Christ Himself speaks to His people, making use of the voice of the ordained minister so that the Lord may be audibly present in the midst of the assembly. This distinction is further emphasized by the liturgical books themselves. The Lectionary contains all the readings—Old Testament, Psalms, Epistles, and Gospels—while the Book of the Gospels contains only the Gospel texts and is reserved exclusively for that proclamation. Its use highlights the dignity of the Gospel and underscores the unique role of Christ’s words and deeds in the life of the Church. Between the readings, the responsorial psalm is proclaimed from the ambo, the same place from which the other readings are proclaimed. In our parish, the cantor is vested to emphasize that the proclamation is indeed a liturgical action. This is intentional. The psalm is not a musical interlude or background meditation; it is the Word of God prayed by the assembly in response to what has been heard. Ideally sung, it allows the gathered Church to take God’s Word upon its lips and respond with praise, lament, or trust.

Following the proclamation of the Gospel, the homily occupies a privileged place. The GIRM teaches that the homily is “*necessary for the nurturing of the Christian life*” (GIRM, no. 65). It is not an optional commentary or personal reflection. Flowing directly from the Scriptures, the homily seeks to open the Word so that it may be understood and lived. It is a liturgical act through which the ordained minister helps the assembly recognize how God’s Word intersects with the mystery being celebrated and with daily life.

The assembly then stands to profess the faith. The Profession of Faith, or Creed, is our communal response to God’s Word. Together, we publicly affirm the truths God has revealed and that the Church faithfully hands on. This is not an individual statement of belief but a corporate act of faith by the Body of Christ.

The Liturgy of the Word concludes with the Prayer of the Faithful. Having listened to God speak, the baptized now exercise their priestly role by offering intercessions for the Church and the world. These prayers move outward—from the needs of the Church, to public authorities, to those burdened by suffering, and finally to the local community—reminding us that the Word we have heard always sends us outward in mission.

In the Liturgy of the Word, God truly speaks, and His people truly respond. Formed by what we have heard and professed, we are now prepared to approach the second great table of the Mass. In our next reflection, we will turn our attention to the Liturgy of the Eucharist, where the Word made flesh feeds His people at the Table of the Eucharist and sends us forth to live what we have celebrated.

Choose the right route

Breaking Bad, the highly acclaimed television series (2008-13) in which a desperate and dying chemistry teacher decides to become a producer of methamphetamine to make sure his family is cared for, is a modern morality tale that illustrates the destruction and death that are the consequences of making wrong choices, or “breaking bad,” as it were. With each ill-conceived decision it becomes easier to make the next until you become so turned around that you completely lose your moral compass. Take the time to map out your choices to see where they will lead—and then choose the path of righteousness.

A sure sign

Generations still seek a sign. But often we look for signs in the wrong place and remain oblivious to the divine inklings all around us. “If there is anyone who is not enlightened by this sublime magnificence of created things,” says Saint Bonaventure, “he is blind. If there is anyone who, seeing all these works of God, does not praise Him, he is dumb; if there is anyone who, from so many signs, cannot perceive God, that man is foolish.” Open your eyes and look around. When the brokenhearted take heart and the hard-hearted show some mercy—those are signs that God has gotten through. Want to find other divine signs? Fix your gaze on love.

It’s hard to keep it simple

Being “hard of heart” might be the biblical equivalent of having a thick skull. And most of the time the disciples, God bless them, are guilty as charged. At many points in the gospel accounts they misunderstand, misinterpret, or otherwise mismanage the Good News Jesus is trying to communicate to them. They are therefore the perfect role models for all who have followed Jesus since then. The simplicity and clarity of notions such as “love one another” and “do unto others” leaves us looking for an escape clause—it can’t be that simple, can it? Try to keep an open mind—and heart.

Spring cleaning for the soul

It’s the beginning of a new season of Lent for those who believe. Lent traditionally takes on a penitential tone with somber purple color and the practice of fasting, prayer, and charitable giving. But we shouldn’t forget that Lent comes from the Old English word for “spring,” and in this sense it’s a sort of spiritual new year, a season of rebirth and renewal. “Lent is a time of grace, a time for conversion, a time to come home to God,” says Saint Maximilian Kolbe. During Lent we cultivate better habits for a healthy heart. What will you refrain from (fasting), how will you seek God

(prayer), and where will you share your love (almsgiving) these 40 days?

The pain is worth the gain

When Jesus asks us to take up our cross daily and follow him, he’s not saying we need to seek out maximum pain. But he is saying that we can and should embrace suffering that is inescapable or for a higher good, rather than trying to avoid it at all costs.

“Nothing great is ever achieved without much enduring,” Saint Catherine of Siena reminds us. To take up our cross means to give our lives over to walking in the loving ways of God—a love which, as every Eucharist reminds us, is willing to sacrifice and suffer for others. May you find yourself at cross purposes today.

Friday, Feb 20, 2026

Not by bread alone

Fasting and mercy go together, like meat and potatoes—or, because it’s the first Friday of Lent, coleslaw and deep-fried cod. “Mercy is to fasting as rain is to the Earth,” says Early Church Father Saint Peter Chrysologus. “However much you may cultivate your heart, clear the soil of your nature, root out vices, sow virtues, if you do not release the springs of mercy, your fasting will bear no fruit.” Who might benefit from your mercy during your Lenten fast? Perhaps someone who has wronged you. Or someone who comes to you with hand out. Keep this additional advice in mind from Saint Peter Chrysologus as you contemplate moments of mercy: “You will not be allowed to keep what you have refused to give to others.”

LENTEN WEEKDAY; DAY OF ABSTINENCE

Isaiah 58:1-9a; Matthew 9:14-15 (221). “This, rather, is the fasting that I wish: releasing those bound unjustly.”

Saturday, Feb 21, 2026

Offer one another a sign of peace

Adults try to help young people discern how to choose their friends wisely and be a good friend to others. We encourage them to associate with upstanding and trustworthy people. We pray that they will lead exemplary Christian lives, which—if they take Jesus’ words to heart—will mean that they’ll end up eating and drinking with sinners! But there’s a catch: Jesus neither joins in the sin nor judges the sinner. He merely extends an offer of peace to people who are leading sad and desperate lives. “Let the weakest, sinful soul have no fear to approach me,” says Jesus in a vision recorded by Saint Faustina, “for even if it had more sins than there are grains of sand in the world, all would be drowned in the unmeasurable depths of my mercy.” This boundless compassion is the very heart of Christian discipleship.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of **fasting** and **abstinence**. Fridays of Lent are days of **abstinence**.

Fasting binds all persons ages 18-59 unless prevented by poor health. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's own needs. Eating between meals is not allowed although fluids may be taken.

Abstinence binds all persons age 14 and older, unless prevented by poor health. On days of abstinence, the consumption of meat is not allowed. The Church strongly encourages the observance of Friday abstinence, but failure to do so is not regarded as sinful. Pastors and parents are encouraged to see that children who are not bound by the obligation to fast and abstain are led to appreciate an authentic sense of penance.

Religious practices such as daily Mass, reception of the Sacrament of Penance, devotions, Stations of the Cross, daily prayer and reflection, works of charity and justice, and acts of self-denial are highly encouraged during this penitential season.

El Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo son días de ayuno y abstinencia. Los viernes de Cuaresma son días de abstinencia.

El **ayuno** obliga a todas las personas de entre 18 y 59 años, salvo que lo impida un mal estado de salud. En los días del ayuno, se permite una comida completa. Se pueden tener otras dos comidas, suficientes para mantener las fuerzas, según las necesidades de cada uno. No se permite comer entre comidas, aunque se pueden tomar líquidos.

La **abstinencia** obliga a todas las personas mayores de 14 años, salvo que lo impida un mal estado de salud. En los días de abstinencia, no se permite el consumo de carne. La Iglesia recomienda la observancia de la abstinencia los viernes, pero su incumplimiento no se considera pecaminoso. Se anima a los párrocos y a los padres a que se aseguren de que los niños que no están obligados a ayunar y abstenerse aprendan a apreciar el auténtico sentido de la penitencia.

Durante este tiempo penitencial, se recomienda practicar la misa diaria, recibir el sacramento de la penitencia, participar en devociones, el Vía Crucis, la oración y la reflexión diarias, obras de caridad y justicia, y actos de abnegación.





Queridos hermanos,

En nuestra anterior reflexión pastoral, consideramos los Ritos Iniciales de la Misa y cómo nos congregan, provenientes de diversos lugares y con diferentes disposiciones, en un solo Cuerpo, preparados para estar juntos ante el Señor. Habiendo sido formados en un cuerpo comunitario a través de nuestra reunión, el canto y la oración penitencial, llegamos ahora a la primera de las dos grandes partes de la Misa: La **Liturgia de la Palabra**. La Instrucción General del Misal Romano articula claramente el propósito de la Liturgia de la Palabra: «*En las lecturas, la homilía y la profesión de fe, Dios habla a su pueblo, le desvela los misterios de la redención y la salvación*» (IGMR, n.º 55). Este no es simplemente un momento de instrucción religiosa o reflexión espiritual. Es un diálogo sagrado en el que el Dios vivo se dirige a su pueblo aquí y ahora, y el pueblo responde con fe, oración y asentimiento. La Liturgia de la Palabra está cuidadosamente estructurada y compuesta por varios elementos esenciales: la proclamación de la Sagrada Escritura, el salmo responsorial, la aclamación del Evangelio, la homilía, la profesión de fe y la Oración de los Fieles. Cada elemento tiene su propio ministro y lugar, lo que hace énfasis que la Palabra de Dios no surge espontáneamente, sino que es recibida, proclamada y respondida dentro de la Iglesia.

Las lecturas se extraen del Leccionario, el libro litúrgico oficial de la Iglesia que contiene las lecturas bíblicas prescritas para cada Misa a lo largo del año litúrgico. Estas lecturas no se seleccionan localmente ni según preferencias personales, sino que son fruto de un cuidadoso discernimiento por parte de la Iglesia, estructuradas en un ciclo plurianual para que los fieles puedan escuchar, a lo largo del tiempo, una porción rica y representativa de la Sagrada Escritura. La Iglesia, guiada por el Espíritu Santo, determina estas lecturas para que la Palabra de Dios sea proclamada sistemáticamente y en armonía con los tiempos litúrgicos. La proclamación de las lecturas es en sí misma una acción litúrgica y está encomendada a ministros específicos. La primera y la segunda lectura son proclamadas ordinariamente por un lector, un ministro laico que sirve a la asamblea dando voz a la Palabra de Dios. El Evangelio, sin embargo, ocupa un lugar único. Es proclamado únicamente por un diácono o, en su ausencia, por un sacerdote. Las *Instrucciones Generales del Leccionario (Prenotandos)* nos recuerdan que, en la proclamación del Evangelio, Cristo mismo habla a su pueblo, utilizando la voz del ministro ordenado para que el Señor esté presente de forma audible en medio de la asamblea. Esta distinción se enfatiza aún más en los propios libros litúrgicos. El Leccionario contiene todas las lecturas —Antiguo Testamento, Salmos, Epístolas y Evangelios—, mientras que el Libro de los Evangelios contiene solo los textos evangélicos y está reservado exclusivamente para su proclamación. Su uso resalta la dignidad del Evangelio y recalca el papel único de las palabras y acciones de Cristo en la vida de la Iglesia. Entre las lecturas, el salmo responsorial se proclama desde el ambón, el mismo lugar desde donde se proclaman las demás lecturas. En nuestra parroquia, el cantor viste una vestimenta especial para enfatizar que la proclamación es, en efecto, una acción litúrgica. Esto es intencional. El salmo no es un interludio musical ni una meditación de fondo; es la Palabra de Dios rezada por la asamblea en respuesta a lo que se ha escuchado. Conviene que el salmo responsorial sea cantado, permite que la Iglesia reunida haga suyas las palabras de Dios y responda con alabanza, lamento o confianza.

Después de la proclamación del Evangelio, la homilía ocupa un lugar privilegiado. La Instrucción General del Misal Romano nos enseña que la homilía es «*necesaria para el crecimiento de la vida cristiana*» (IGMR, n.º 65). No se trata de un comentario opcional ni de una reflexión personal. Surgiendo directamente de las Escrituras, la homilía busca abrir la Palabra para que sea comprendida y vivida. Es un acto litúrgico mediante el cual el ministro ordenado ayuda a la asamblea a reconocer cómo la Palabra de Dios se relaciona con el misterio que se celebra y con la vida cotidiana.

La asamblea se pone de pie para profesar la fe. La Profesión de Fe, o Credo, es nuestra respuesta comunitaria a la Palabra de Dios. Juntos, afirmamos públicamente las verdades que Dios ha revelado y que la Iglesia transmite fielmente. No se trata de una declaración individual de creencias, sino de un acto de fe comunitario del Cuerpo de Cristo.

La Liturgia de la Palabra concluye con la Oración de los Fieles. Tras haber escuchado la palabra de Dios, los bautizados ejercen ahora su función sacerdotal ofreciendo intercesiones por la Iglesia y por el mundo. Estas oraciones se extienden desde las necesidades de la Iglesia, pasando por las autoridades públicas y los que sufren, hasta llegar a la comunidad local, recordándonos que la Palabra que hemos escuchado siempre nos impulsa a la misión.

En la Liturgia de la Palabra, Dios habla verdaderamente y su pueblo responde con fe. Formados por lo que hemos escuchado y profesado, estamos ahora preparados para acercarnos a la segunda gran mesa de la Misa. En nuestra próxima reflexión, centraremos nuestra atención en la Liturgia de la Eucaristía, donde la Palabra hecha carne alimenta a su pueblo en la Mesa de la Eucaristía y nos envía a vivir lo que hemos celebrado.


