# PASTOR'S COLUMN

## COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

---



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In our continuing reflection on the Holy Mass, we now stand at a pivotal threshold. Previously, we concluded our consideration of the Liturgy of the Word. Yet before moving forward, there remains one essential element worthy of careful attention: the *Prayers of the Faithful*, also called the *Universal Prayer* or the *General Intercessions*. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) reminds us that these intercessions are not private devotions inserted into the liturgy, nor are they narrowly focused petitions for highly specific or personal causes. Rather, they are intentionally **universal** and **ecclesial** in scope. The Church, gathered as the Body of Christ, exercises her baptismal priesthood by interceding for the needs of the world, the Church, civil authorities, those burdened by suffering, and the local community. Here the language of prayer is profoundly instructive. The customary response, “*Lord, hear our prayer*”, is not accidental. It is theologically precise. Though composed of many individuals, the assembly now prays as **one corporate body**. The prayer voiced is not a collection of separate intentions, but a single act of supplication offered by the Church united. The ancient axiom *Lex orandi, lex credenda*, “we believe what we pray, and we pray what we believe”, illuminates this reality. If we truly understand ourselves as incorporated into Christ’s Body, then the response “*Lord, hear our prayer*” expresses that unity. The singular form reflects the singular voice of the Church. Were we merely a gathering of individuals offering parallel petitions, the plural might suffice. But the liturgy forms something deeper: communion.

Having spoken and listened in the Liturgy of the Word, and having exercised our common priesthood through intercession, the Mass now moves with deliberate continuity into the **Liturgy of the Eucharist**, a movement often described as passing from the *Table of the Word* to the *Table of the Eucharist*, that is, the altar. At this moment, the altar is prepared. Each element placed upon it bears both practical and symbolic significance. The **corporal**, first unfolded upon the altar, is a square white linen cloth. Its name derives from the Latin *corpus*, meaning “body.” Upon this cloth the sacred vessels rest, and upon it the Body and Blood of the Lord will soon be present. Its use recalls the reverence due to the Eucharist and echoes the burial cloth of Christ, subtly linking sacrifice and resurrection. The chalices and patens are arranged, the **purificators** set in place, small linen cloths reserved for the careful cleansing of the sacred vessels, and the **Roman Missal** is positioned. Nothing here is arbitrary; the Church’s ritual precision safeguards both meaning and belief.

During this preparation, the collection is taken. This, too, is frequently misunderstood. The collection is not an interruption, nor merely a pragmatic necessity. It is a genuine **liturgical act**. From the earliest centuries of Christianity, the faithful brought forward offerings for the support of the Church, the sustenance of the clergy, and the care of the poor. The practice remains an expression of stewardship, sacrifice, and participation in the Church’s mission. In this action, material gifts symbolize something greater: the offering of ourselves. The faithful do not simply finance the Church’s work; they enact the spiritual truth that worship necessarily involves self-gift.

Then the gifts of **bread and wine** are brought forward. These are not chosen at random. Bread, the fruit of the earth and work of human hands, sustains life. Wine, drawn from crushed grapes, evokes joy, covenant, and transformation. Together they represent creation offered back to the Creator, human labor united to divine grace, and ultimately the very lives of those who present them. They symbolize us. Soon the priest turns to the assembly with words both familiar and profound: “*Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the Almighty Father.*” Here the Church’s theology of the Eucharist is unmistakable. The sacrifice is not exclusively the priest’s, nor is the priest a solitary actor performing a sacred rite on behalf of passive observers. The sacrifice is **one**, yet shared: “*my sacrifice and yours.*” By baptism, the faithful participate in Christ’s priesthood. Their lives, labors, sufferings, and prayers are spiritually placed upon the altar, united to Christ’s perfect offering. The ministerial priest acts *in persona Christi capitis*, in the person of Christ the Head, but the entire Body is engaged in the sacrificial act. The bread and wine thus carry layered meaning. They are gifts of creation, signs of human offering, and soon, by divine action, they will become the sacramental presence of Christ Himself. What is placed upon the altar visibly represents what must occur interiorly: the surrender of our lives to God. This is why the Eucharistic sacrifice is never merely the priest’s action. It is the act of Christ and His Church, Head and members inseparably united.

Here, then, we pause, at the edge of the Eucharistic Prayer, where thanksgiving, consecration, and mystery converge. In our next reflection, we will enter more deeply into that sacred center. Until then, let us approach the altar with renewed awareness, recognizing that the liturgy does not simply invite attendance, but transformation.

### Sunday, Mar 08, 2026

#### Show us with the water of life

Today, catechumens experience the First Scrutiny, a ritual in which the whole church prays for them as they face squarely the power of evil and open themselves to Christ's saving power. "Grant that these catechumens, who like the woman of Samaria, thirst for living water, may turn to the Lord as they hear his word and acknowledge the sins and weaknesses that weigh them down." We who are already baptized should feel ourselves in the catechumens' shoes and allow ourselves to be prayed for: "Protect them from vain reliance on self, and defend them from the power of Satan. Free them from the spirit of deceit, so that, admitting the wrong they have done, they may attain purity of heart and advance on the way to salvation."

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT; FIRST SCRUTINY OF THE ELECT

*Exodus 17:3-7; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8; John 4:5-42 (28). "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."*

### Monday, Mar 09, 2026

#### Tune out the noise

Often the people around us try to undermine our resolve to get physically and spiritually healthy. As we try to avoid addictive substances, find time for quiet contemplation, volunteer one night a week, or whatever we've committed to, others try to thwart us. Some loved ones may be worried that the measures we're taking are too extreme; others may be suffering from the misery-loves-company syndrome—they choose not to get healthy and don't want to be on that path alone. Whatever the reason, we feel unappreciated and betrayed. But don't let that distract you. Jesus knew that no prophet is accepted in his hometown, but that didn't stop him from preaching in Nazareth.

#### Reach deep for compassion

In a women's concentration camp in Nazi Germany, a prayer was found scrawled on a piece of wrapping paper. The anonymous writer commends to God "not only the men and women of good will, but also those of ill will. But do not remember all the suffering they have inflicted on us. Remember the fruits borne of this suffering: the loyalty, the humility, the courage, the generosity, the greatness of heart which has grown out of this. And when they come to judgment, let all the fruits which we have borne be their forgiveness." May we cultivate such deep pockets of compassion for those who injure us.

### Wednesday, Mar 11, 2026

#### Put your relationships in order

Think of all the relationships in your life: family, friends, neighbors, coworkers, and others. They don't always go smoothly, but without them life would be pretty empty. Then think about God. God is a relationship, too: the Trinity—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The whole story of scripture, the whole story of the church, tells of

God calling creation, especially people, into community and communion with one another and with God. "Love God, serve God; everything is in that," says Saint Clare of Assisi. Put your relationship with God first, and all the others will fall into place.

### Thursday, Mar 12, 2026

#### Check your freedom

Sometimes we don't know what hit us. Power comes into our lives and takes our breath away. Was this mighty attraction we just felt a good thing or a bad thing? Was that charismatic speaker who cast a spell over us an evil genius or a saint? It all depends on which direction the demons are headed, according to Jesus. The spirit of holiness is a liberating power, and the spirit of darkness one that constricts us. The freer you are to open your arms in love, the closer you are to God's Holy Spirit. Take time to do a freedom check.

### Friday, Mar 13, 2026

#### Be a good neighbor

When Jesus is asked by a scribe to name the single most important Commandment, he answers by citing not one, but two Commandments: to love God and to love neighbor. The scribe agrees with the answer. All this might seem a bit odd to us—wasn't Jesus supposed to pick just one Commandment? Perhaps the message here is that we can't really separate these two Commandments from one another—they come as a unit. It is impossible to "love God with all your heart" if you do not "love your neighbor as yourself," and vice versa. God is in our neighbor—yes, even in the noisy one who plays loud music late at night. Do your best to live up to the greatest Commandment. Love God with all your heart—it's the neighborly thing to do.

#### A worthy practice

Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque is best known for introducing the observance of nine First Fridays in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. But she also had some wise words about how to put humility into practice: "Be humble towards God and gentle with your neighbor. Judge and accuse no one but yourself, and ever excuse others. Speak of God always to praise and glorify him, speak of your neighbor only with respect—do not speak of yourself at all, either well or ill." Her advice makes for a worthy Lenten practice: praise for God, respect for the neighbor, and keep blessedly silent about yourself!







Queridos hermanos,

En nuestra continua reflexión sobre la Santa Misa, nos encontramos ahora en un momento crucial. Anteriormente, concluimos nuestra consideración de la Liturgia de la Palabra. Sin embargo, antes de avanzar, queda un elemento esencial que merece una cuidadosa atención: *las Oraciones de los Fieles*, también llamadas *Oración Universal* o *Intercesiones Generales*. La Instrucción General del Misal Romano (IGMR) nos recuerda que estas intercesiones no son devociones privadas insertadas en la liturgia, ni peticiones limitadas por causas muy específicas o personales. Más bien, son intencionalmente **universales** y de alcance **eclesial**. La Iglesia, reunida como Cuerpo de Cristo, ejerce su sacerdocio bautismal intercediendo por las necesidades del mundo, la Iglesia, las autoridades civiles, los que sufren y la comunidad local. En este contexto, el lenguaje de la oración es profundamente instructivo. La respuesta habitual, «*Señor, escucha nuestra oración*», no es casual. Es teológicamente precisa. Aunque compuesta por muchas personas, la asamblea ahora ora como **un solo cuerpo**. La oración expresada no es un conjunto de intenciones separadas, sino un único acto de súplica ofrecido por la Iglesia unida. El antiguo axioma «*Lex orandi, lex credenda*», «creemos lo que oramos y oramos lo que creemos», ilumina esta realidad. Si realmente nos entendemos como parte integrante del Cuerpo de Cristo, la respuesta «*Señor, escucha nuestra oración*» expresa esa unidad. La forma singular refleja la voz singular de la Iglesia. Si fuéramos simplemente una reunión de individuos que ofrecen peticiones paralelas, el plural podría bastar. Pero la liturgia forma algo más profundo: la comunión espiritual.

Habiendo hablado y escuchado en la Liturgia de la Palabra, y haber ejercido nuestro sacerdocio común mediante la intercesión, la Misa se adentra ahora, con una continuidad deliberada, en la **Liturgia de la Eucaristía**, un movimiento que a menudo se describe como el paso de la *Mesa de la Palabra* a la *Mesa de la Eucaristía*, es decir, el altar. En este momento, se prepara el altar. Cada elemento colocado sobre él tiene un significado práctico y simbólico. El **corporal**, que se despliega primero sobre el altar, es un mantel cuadrado de lino blanco. Su nombre deriva del latín *corpus*, que significa «cuerpo». Sobre este mantel reposan los vasos sagrados, y sobre él pronto estarán presentes el Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor. Su uso evoca la reverencia debida a la Eucaristía y evoca el sudario de Cristo, vinculando sutilmente el sacrificio y la resurrección. Se disponen los cálices y las patenas, se colocan los **purificadores**, se reservan pequeños lienzos para la cuidadosa limpieza de los vasos sagrados y se coloca el **Misal Romano**. Nada es arbitrario; la precisión ritual de la Iglesia salvaguarda tanto el significado como la fe.

Durante esta preparación, se realiza la colecta. Esto también se malinterpreta con frecuencia. La colecta no es una interrupción, ni una mera necesidad pragmática. Es un auténtico **acto litúrgico**. Desde los primeros siglos del cristianismo, los fieles aportaban ofrendas para el sostenimiento de la Iglesia, el sustento del clero y el cuidado de los pobres. Esta práctica sigue siendo una expresión de administración, sacrificio y participación en la misión de la Iglesia. En esta acción, las donaciones materiales simbolizan algo mayor: la ofrenda de nosotros mismos. Los fieles no se limitan a financiar la obra de la Iglesia; representan la verdad espiritual de que el culto implica necesariamente la entrega de uno mismo.

Luego se presentan los dones **del pan y el vino**. Estos no son escogidos al azar. El pan, fruto de la tierra y del trabajo humano, sustenta la vida. El vino, extraído de la uva prensada, evoca alegría, alianza y transformación. Juntos representan la creación ofrecida al Creador, el trabajo humano unido a la gracia divina y, en última instancia, la vida misma de quienes los presentan. Nos simbolizan. Luego, el sacerdote se dirige a la asamblea con palabras familiares y profundas: «*Oren, hermanos para que este sacrificio mío y de ustedes sea agradable a Dios, Padre Todopoderoso*». Aquí la teología eucarística de la Iglesia es inconfundible. El sacrificio no es exclusivo del sacerdote, ni este es un actor solitario que realiza un rito sagrado en nombre de observadores pasivos. El sacrificio es uno, pero compartido: «*mi sacrificio y el de ustedes*». Por el bautismo, los fieles participan en el sacerdocio de Cristo. Sus vidas, trabajos, sufrimientos y oraciones se colocan espiritualmente sobre el altar, unidos a la ofrenda perfecta de Cristo. El sacerdote ministerial actúa *in persona Christi capitis*, en la persona de Cristo Cabeza, pero todo el Cuerpo participa en el acto sacrificial. El pan y el vino, por lo tanto, tienen un significado complejo. Son dones de la creación, signos de la ofrenda humana, y pronto, por acción divina, se convertirán en la presencia sacramental de Cristo mismo. Lo que se coloca sobre el altar representa visiblemente lo que debe ocurrir interiormente: la entrega de nuestras vidas a Dios. Por eso, el sacrificio eucarístico nunca es simplemente la acción del sacerdote. Es el acto de Cristo y su Iglesia, Cabeza y miembros inseparablemente unidos.

Aquí, pues, nos detenemos, al final de la Plegaria Eucarística, donde convergen la acción de gracias, la consagración y el misterio. En nuestra próxima reflexión, nos adentraremos más en ese centro sagrado. Hasta entonces, acerquémonos al altar con renovada conciencia, reconociendo que la liturgia no solo invita a la asistencia, sino a la transformación.


