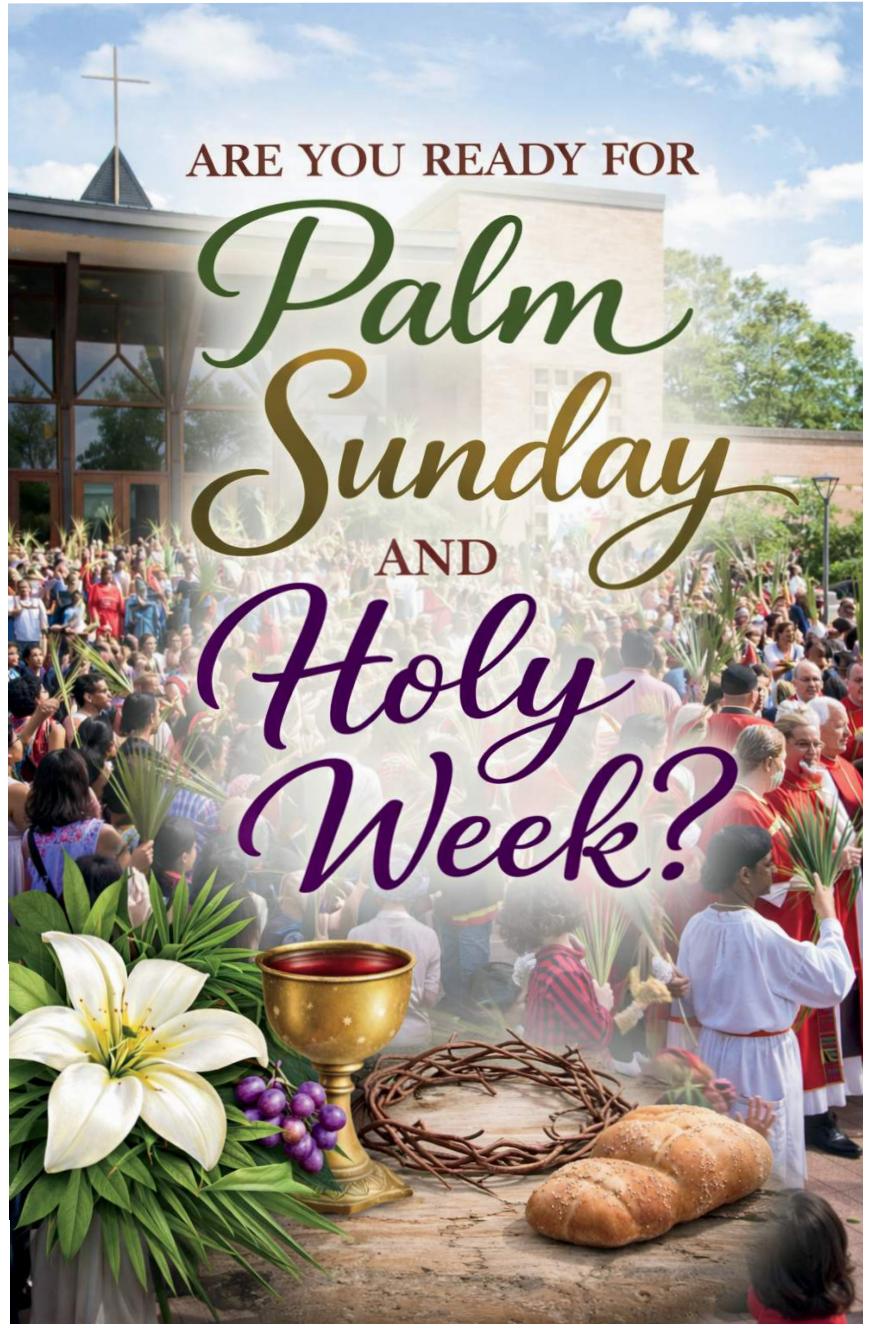

# PASTOR'S COLUMN

## COLUMNA DEL PASTOR

---



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Over the past several weeks in this space, we have been reflecting together on the sacred structure of the Holy Mass. Our most recent letter concluded with the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer, that great prayer of thanksgiving and consecration in which the Church, through the ministry of the priest, offers the sacrifice of Christ to the Father. In that prayer we hear the Preface proclaim the wonders of God's saving work, we join the angels in the *Sanctus*, and through the power of the Holy Spirit the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. The Eucharistic Prayer reaches its summit in the great Amen — the congregation's solemn assent to the mystery we have just celebrated.

From that moment we move naturally into the Communion Rite, the part of the Mass that prepares us to receive the sacred Body and Blood of the Lord whom we have just adored upon the altar. The Communion Rite is not merely logistical preparation for receiving the Eucharist. Rather, it is a spiritual and communal preparation that disposes our hearts for so great a mystery. The Communion Rite begins with the prayer that Christ Himself taught us: the Lord's Prayer. It is fitting that this prayer stands at the threshold of Holy Communion. In the *Our Father*, we acknowledge God as our Father and ourselves as His children, united as one family around the altar. We ask that His kingdom come and His will be done — a prayer fulfilled most perfectly in the sacrifice of Christ made present in the Eucharist. We also ask for our "daily bread." The Fathers of the Church often understood this phrase not only as the bread necessary for earthly life, but also as the Eucharistic Bread that sustains the life of grace. Immediately before approaching the altar we pray for forgiveness — "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." Reconciliation with God and with one another is an essential disposition for receiving Holy Communion worthily. During this Lenten season we have chosen to chant the Lord's Prayer in Latin, the ancient language of the Roman Rite. Doing so reminds us that this prayer unites Catholics across cultures and continents. In every language and every land, the Church prays the words given to us by the Lord Himself.

Following the Lord's Prayer, the priest prays for deliverance from evil and invites the assembly to exchange the Sign of Peace. This gesture expresses our desire to live the reconciliation we have just prayed for. Before approaching the altar to receive Christ, we acknowledge that we must be at peace with one another. The Sign of Peace has deep roots in Christian worship. In the early centuries of the Church, it was known as the "kiss of peace," a sign of communion among believers. Saint Justin Martyr, writing in the second century, describes Christians exchanging this sign before approaching the Eucharistic table. While its form has developed through the centuries, its meaning remains the same: we approach the sacrament of unity only after expressing unity with one another. After the Sign of Peace, the priest breaks the consecrated Host. This action is known as the Fraction Rite. Though simple in appearance, it carries profound symbolic meaning. In the early Church, the breaking of the bread was so central to Christian worship that the Eucharist itself was sometimes called simply "the breaking of the bread". While the priest performs this action, the assembly chants the *Agnus Dei* — "Lamb of God." These words echo the proclamation of John the Baptist, who pointed to Jesus and declared: "*Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.*" As the Host is broken, we ask the Lamb of God for mercy and peace. The chant reminds us that the Eucharist is the sacrificial Lamb offered for the salvation of the world. All of these moments culminate in one of the most powerful proclamations of the Mass. Elevating the consecrated Host and the chalice, the priest declares: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold Him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." These words directly recall John the Baptist's testimony along the banks of the Jordan River. What John once proclaimed in faith, we now behold sacramentally upon the altar. The Lamb who was slain now invites us to His banquet.

Next week we will reflect more deeply on the reception of Holy Communion itself — how we approach the altar, the meaning of receiving the Eucharist, and how this sacred encounter with Christ shapes our lives beyond the walls of the church. Before concluding, I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to the many parishioners who worked so diligently to make our St. Joseph Altar such a beautiful and successful celebration of faith and tradition. Your generosity, creativity, and spirit of service continue to enrich our parish community. A brief reminder as well: please refrain from parking in the red-curbed fire lanes around the church and parish facilities. These areas must remain clear for safety and emergency access. Your cooperation helps ensure the well-being of everyone on our campus.

### Sunday, Mar 22, 2026

#### A rock of faith

Of the two sisters of Bethany, Mary is usually considered the “spiritual” one, and Martha is relegated to the category of “hostess with the mostest.” But after the death of their brother Lazarus, it is Martha who shows her spiritual mettle in her encounter with Jesus on the road. She gives her profession of faith with as much insight and certainty as does Peter when he was once asked by Jesus, “Who do you say that I am?” Peter’s response earns him the role of first leader of the church. Martha’s faith ensures that Lazarus is returned to her family and demonstrates that she, too, is a “rock.”

#### FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

*Ezekiel 37:12-14; Romans 8:8-11; John 11:1-45 (34).* “Yes, Lord. I have come to believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God.”

### Monday, Mar 23, 2026

#### Withhold your judgment

If you read the scripture for today, you’ll find two long and dramatic stories about the dangers of judging others. You’ll see the hazards of denying your conscience, bearing false witness, and having the attitudes of judgmentalism and self-righteousness. Believing in Jesus, on the other hand, and following him, leads to humility, honesty, integrity, and compassion. The next time you’re about to judge someone—talk down a friend, coworker, or member of your family, or get mad at someone in a service job—step back and offer your resentment up to God. “Do not judge, and you will not be judged,” Jesus says in Luke 6:37. “Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven.”

*Daniel 13:1-9, 15-17, 19-30, 33-62; John 8:1-11 (251).* “Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her.”

### Tuesday, Mar 24, 2026

#### The sender in the sent

At the end of every Mass, we hear some version of the words, “Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.” This moment is not the end, it’s the beginning. We celebrate the Eucharist so that we might become for others what Jesus was for us—sustenance and life poured out for the good of all we meet. When we go forth “in his name,” we carry Jesus with us in a very real way, to our families, workplaces, and neighbors, and to strangers alike. Next time as Mass comes to a close, listen to those words commissioning you to bear Christ to the world. Take them to heart.

### Wednesday, Mar 25, 2026

#### Play the favorite

It’s not easy for us to explain why we hold certain people in special esteem above others. We have our favorites, and we don’t usually analyze it much beyond that. But if we did, we would probably find that we enjoy the person’s company because what they do pleases us. For these same reasons Mary found favor with God. She chose ways that were God’s ways. “Mary’s greatness,” says Pope Benedict XVI, “consists in the fact that she wants to

magnify God, not herself.” She is the “mirror of all holiness.” Follow Mary’s example and strive to be a shining example of God’s love.

#### SOLEMNITY OF THE ANNUNCIATION OF THE LORD

*Isaiah 7:10-14; 8:10; Hebrews 10:4-10; Luke 1:26-38 (545).* “The angel said to her, ‘Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God.’”

### Thursday, Mar 26, 2026

#### Naming rights

As Christians we often take on new names at Baptism, Confirmation, Holy Orders, and marriage to mark entrance into a new phase of our faith life and discipleship. When God entered into a covenant with Abram and his descendants, Abram got a new name—Abraham—that signified the renewed relationship between God and God’s people. Simon became the Peter as Jesus called him to be his rock. Each Lent as we review and renew our relationship with God, perhaps we should consider giving our faith life a new name. What will yours be?

#### LENTEN WEEKDAY

*Genesis 17:3-9; John 8:51-59 (254).* “No longer shall you be called Abram; your name shall be Abraham, for I am making you the father of a host of nations.”

### Friday, Mar 27, 2026

#### Prayer stations

Today is the last Friday before Holy Week and the last one before Good Friday. As the day of the week on which Jesus died, Fridays have had a special place in Christian tradition. There was a time when Catholics abstained from meat on every Friday, not only those in Lent, as a reminder of Christ’s sacrifice. Another traditional Catholic practice associated with Friday is the Stations of the Cross. Every church has the series of 10 shrines devoted to the Stations. Going from one to another as you pray retraces Jesus’ footsteps to the place of his Crucifixion and offers a kind of pilgrimage in the same sacred space where we celebrate the Eucharist. From life to death to new and transformed life: This is the mystery we enter into at this time of year—and all year round. Pray the Stations today.

#### LENTEN WEEKDAY; DAY OF ABSTINENCE

*Jeremiah 20:10-13; John 10:31-42 (255).* “The LORD is with me, like a mighty champion: my persecutors will stumble, they will not triumph.”

### Saturday, Mar 28, 2026

#### Renew, repent, repeat

Being human, it is likely we would sin every day. That is why we are encouraged, particularly during Lent, to renew ourselves daily. “This is what we do with houses, says Saint John Chrysostom, “we keep constantly repairing them as they wear old. You should do the same thing to yourself. Have you sinned today? Do not despair, do not despond, but renew your soul by repentance, and tears, and Confession, and by doing good things.” And the great doctor of the church adds, “Never cease doing this.”

**In partnership with Catholic Extension this Lenten season, St. Ignatius of Loyola parish community is supporting seminarian education and priests in the Diocese of Little Rock, Arkansas.**

In a state where the Catholic population is around five percent, the Diocese of Little Rock is making big things happen. In many ways, Little Rock is a model for how Catholic Extension support can help the Catholic Church to flourish in spite of enormous challenges. For more than a century, Catholic Extension Society has stood in partnership with the Diocese of Little Rock to strengthen this missionary Church.

### The Diocese of Little Rock, Arkansas

The Diocese of Little Rock was established by Pope Gregory XVI on November 28, 1843. From its founding, the diocese has covered the entire state of Arkansas – a vast missionary territory spanning 75 counties and more than 52,000 square miles. Today, approximately 170,000 Catholics live in Arkansas, representing less than 5% of the state's total population. By contrast, the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston serves nearly 1.8 million Catholics – more than ten times the Catholic population of Arkansas. The Diocese of Little Rock has 25 seminarians, roughly 7,000 Catholics per seminarian while the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston has approximately 1 seminarian for every 34,000 Catholics. Proportionally, Little Rock is fostering vocations at nearly five times the rate of Galveston-Houston.



### Understanding the Need

Unlike densely Catholic regions of the country, parishes in Arkansas are often separated by long rural distances, and many communities are small, geographically isolated, and financially limited. In some areas, Catholics travel great distances to attend Mass, and certain parishes do not have a resident priest.

When Catholics are spread across thousands of miles and represent a small minority of the population, the local Church has fewer financial resources to sustain its ministries – including the education and formation of future priests. Yet the need for priests is even greater in such a setting. A single priest may serve multiple parishes, travel hours each week to celebrate Mass, and minister to communities that would otherwise go without regular access to the sacraments.

One of the most significant developments in recent decades has been the rapid growth of the Hispanic Catholic population. Hispanic children now make up a large and increasing percentage of those enrolled in religious education programs, and Hispanic youth and young adults are becoming a dynamic and essential part of parish life. This growth is a tremendous blessing – but it also increases the need for well-formed, bilingual, and missionary priests who can shepherd diverse and expanding communities. As congregations grow, so does the demand for sacramental ministry, pastoral leadership, and vocational outreach. Formation today determines whether these communities will have priests tomorrow.

**When we understand the demographics of the Diocese of Little Rock, we see the vision clearly: a small but vibrant Catholic population spread across a vast territory, growing in diversity, and deeply in need of well-prepared shepherds. By supporting the formation and education of seminarians, we are investing in the spiritual future of an entire state. This Lent, your generosity supports the formation and education of priests and helps the communities they serve.**

Queridos hermanos,

Durante las últimas semanas, en este espacio, hemos reflexionado juntos sobre la estructura sagrada de la Santa Misa. Nuestra carta más reciente concluyó con el inicio de la Plegaria Eucarística, esa gran oración de acción de gracias y consagración en la que la Iglesia, mediante el ministerio del sacerdote, ofrece el sacrificio de Cristo al Padre. En esa oración, escuchamos el Prefacio proclamar las maravillas de la obra salvífica de Dios, nos unimos a los ángeles en el *Sanctus*, y por el poder del Espíritu Santo, el pan y el vino se convierten en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. La Plegaria Eucarística alcanza su punto culminante con el gran Amén: el solemne asentimiento de la congregación al misterio que acabamos de celebrar.

Desde ese momento, pasamos naturalmente al Rito de la Comunión, la parte de la Misa que nos prepara para recibir el sagrado Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor, a quien acabamos de adorar en el altar. El Rito de la Comunión no es una mera preparación logística para recibir la Eucaristía. Es más bien una preparación espiritual y comunitaria que dispone nuestros corazones para tan gran misterio. El Rito de la Comunión comienza con la oración que Cristo mismo nos enseñó: el *Padrenuestro*. Es apropiado que esta oración se encuentre en el umbral de la Sagrada Comunión. En el *Padrenuestro*, reconocemos a Dios como nuestro Padre y a nosotros como sus hijos, unidos como una sola familia alrededor del altar. Pedimos que venga su reino y se haga su voluntad, una oración que se cumple con la máxima perfección en el sacrificio de Cristo hecho presente en la Eucaristía. También pedimos nuestro "pan de cada día". Los Padres de la Iglesia a menudo entendían esta frase no solo como el pan necesario para la vida terrenal, sino también como el Pan Eucarístico que sustenta la vida llena de gracia. Justo antes de acercarnos al altar, oramos pidiendo perdón: «Perdona nuestras ofensas, como también nosotros perdonamos a quienes nos ofenden». La reconciliación con Dios y entre nosotros es una disposición esencial para recibir dignamente la Sagrada Comunión. Durante esta Cuaresma, hemos optado por recitar el *Padrenuestro* en latín, la antigua lengua del rito romano. Esto nos recuerda que esta oración une a los católicos de todas las culturas y continentes. En todos los idiomas y en todos los países, la Iglesia reza las palabras que nos dio el Señor mismo.

Tras el *Padrenuestro*, el sacerdote ora por la liberación del mal e invita a la asamblea a intercambiar el Signo de la Paz. Este gesto expresa nuestro deseo de vivir la reconciliación por la que acabamos de orar. Antes de acercarnos al altar para recibir a Cristo, reconocemos que debemos estar en paz unos con otros. El Signo de la Paz tiene profundas raíces en el culto cristiano. En los primeros siglos de la Iglesia, se conocía como el "beso de la paz", un signo de comunión entre los creyentes. San Justino Mártir, escribiendo en el siglo II, describe a los cristianos intercambiando este signo antes de acercarse a la mesa eucarística. Si bien su forma ha evolucionado a lo largo de los siglos, su significado sigue siendo el mismo: nos acercamos al sacramento de la unidad solo después de expresar la unidad entre nosotros. Tras el Signo de la Paz, el sacerdote parte la Hostia consagrada. Esta acción se conoce como el Rito de la Fracción. Aunque simple en apariencia, conlleva un profundo significado simbólico. En la Iglesia primitiva, la fracción del pan era tan central para el culto cristiano que la propia Eucaristía a veces se llamaba simplemente "la fracción del pan". Mientras el sacerdote realiza esta acción, la asamblea canta el *Agnus Dei*: "Cordero de Dios". Estas palabras hacen eco de la proclamación de Juan el Bautista, quien señaló a Jesús y declaró: "He aquí el Cordero de Dios que quita el pecado del mundo". Al partir la Hostia, pedimos al Cordero de Dios misericordia y paz. El canto nos recuerda que la Eucaristía es el Cordero sacrificial ofrecido por la salvación del mundo. Todos estos momentos culminan en una de las proclamaciones más poderosas de la Misa. Elevando la Hostia consagrada y el cáliz, el sacerdote declara: "He aquí el Cordero de Dios, he aquí a Aquel que quita el pecado del mundo. Bienaventurados los llamados a la cena del Cordero". Estas palabras evocan directamente el testimonio de Juan el Bautista a orillas del río Jordán. Lo que Juan una vez proclamó con fe, ahora lo contemplamos sacramentalmente sobre el altar. El Cordero que fue sacrificado ahora nos invita a su banquete.

La próxima semana reflexionaremos más profundamente sobre la recepción de la Sagrada Comunión: cómo nos acercamos al altar, el significado de recibir la Eucaristía y cómo este encuentro sagrado con Cristo moldea nuestras vidas más allá de los muros de la iglesia. Antes de concluir, quisiera expresar mi sincero agradecimiento a los numerosos feligreses que trabajaron con tanta diligencia para hacer de nuestro Altar de San José una celebración de fe y tradición tan hermosa y exitosa. Su generosidad, creatividad y espíritu de servicio siguen enriqueciendo a nuestra comunidad parroquial. Un breve recordatorio: les rogamos que se abstengan de estacionarse en los carriles de incendios con bordillo rojo alrededor de la iglesia y las instalaciones parroquiales. Estas áreas deben permanecer despejadas por seguridad y para el acceso en caso de emergencia. Su cooperación contribuye al bienestar de todos en nuestro campus.

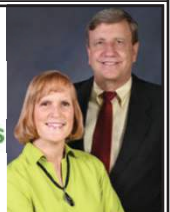
