IRA Charitable Distributions

1. Gifts from an IRA, Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD), are popular forms of end-of-year giving for those 70 1/2 or older. PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the last several weeks we have been reflecting together on the various parts of the Holy Mass, following the guidance of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* and the living tradition of the Church. Within the Eucharistic Prayer we arrive at the most sacred moment of the entire celebration: the consecration. When the priest repeats the words of Jesus spoken at the Last Supper, “This is my Body... This is the chalice of my Blood,” the Holy Spirit acts in a profound and mysterious way. What had been simple bread and wine are changed into the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. This mystery, which the Church calls *transubstantiation*, stands at the very center of our Catholic faith. Because of the profound nature of this moment, the Church invites us to observe a deep reverence and stillness. **During the consecration there should be quiet and full attention throughout the nave.** Our focus is directed entirely toward the altar and the mystery unfolding before us. Movement during this moment distracts not only the person moving but also those around them who are striving to pray. The consecration calls us to stillness, to silence, and to awe before the Lord who becomes sacramentally present among us.

After the Eucharistic Prayer concludes, the liturgy leads us toward the reception of Holy Communion, the moment when the sacrifice we have celebrated becomes the food that nourishes us. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has determined that the normative posture for receiving Holy Communion in the United States is standing. This posture reflects an ancient Christian understanding of ourselves as a pilgrim people—men and women who are on a journey toward the Kingdom of God. The Communion procession itself expresses this reality. As we move forward from our pews and walk toward the altar, we symbolize the pilgrimage of the Church through history. On this journey we are sustained not merely by ordinary food, but by the Bread from Heaven—the Lord Jesus Christ Himself. He is our strength, our nourishment, and our hope along the path of discipleship. Because we approach so great a gift, our actions should reflect proper reverence and decorum. When the minister presents the Sacred Host or the Precious Blood and proclaims, “The Body of Christ” or “The Blood of Christ,” the communicant responds with a clear and confident “Amen.” This response is not simply a polite acknowledgment. It is a profound act of faith. In that single word we affirm that we truly believe that what we receive is the living Christ.

Before receiving, the bishops of the United States ask that the communicant make a simple bow of the head as a gesture of reverence. After this bow, the communicant extends the hands forward, one placed upon the other, forming what the early Church described as a throne upon which the King of Kings may rest. Already in the earliest centuries of the Church we find instruction on how to receive the Eucharist with reverence. St. Cyril of Jerusalem, writing in the fourth century, taught the faithful: “Make your left hand a throne for your right, which will receive the King.” His words remind us that every gesture we make at Communion expresses our faith in the One we receive. Genuflecting at this moment is not the expected gesture; rather the simple bow of the head is the proper sign of reverence for the communicant.

While the normative practice in the United States is to receive Holy Communion standing and in the hand, the Church also preserves other legitimate options. The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, supported by the teaching authority of Pope Benedict XVI, allows communicants to receive Holy Communion on the tongue. If one chooses this method, it is important to extend the tongue outward rather than merely opening the mouth so that the minister may place the Sacred Host reverently. The Church also permits a person to receive Holy Communion while kneeling. Although this is not the norm in our country, it remains a legitimate option. Those who choose to kneel should ensure they are able to stand again without assistance and should be mindful of those behind them in the Communion line.

As we continue our reflection on the Mass, we now look ahead to the sacred days of the Church’s most solemn celebrations. The Sacred Triduum—Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil—forms the high point of the entire liturgical year. These liturgies are not simply commemorations; they are the Church’s participation in the saving mysteries of Christ’s Passion, Death, and Resurrection. To participate in these liturgies is to walk with Christ through the events that accomplished our redemption. On Holy Thursday we gather for the Mass of the Lord’s Supper, remembering the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood. On Good Friday we stand at the foot of the Cross and venerate the instrument of our salvation. At the Easter Vigil we rejoice as darkness gives way to light and the Church proclaims the Resurrection of the Lord and initiates new members into the community. For this reason, I strongly encourage each of you to make every effort to participate in these sacred celebrations. They lead us to the very heart of our faith and prepare us to celebrate Easter not merely as a day, but as the triumph of Christ that transforms our lives. Let us approach these mysteries with reverence, gratitude, and renewed faith in the Lord who continues to feed His pilgrim people with the Bread of Heaven.

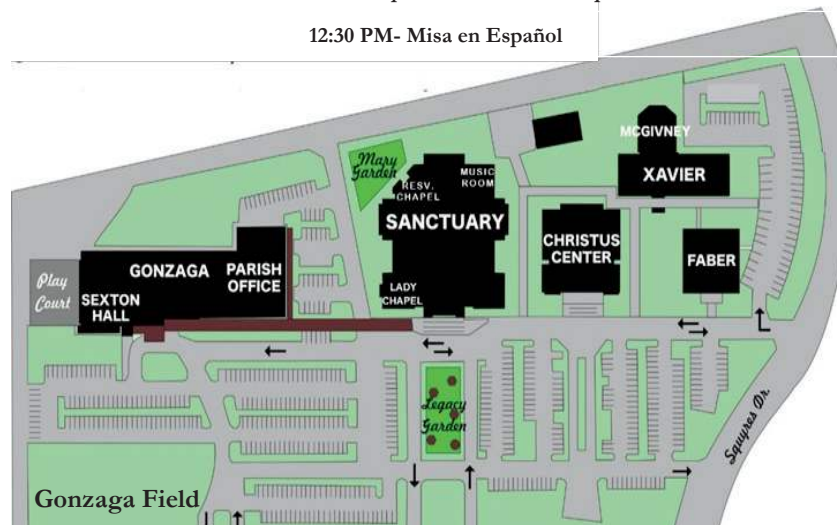

Find solace in the psalms

In an interview after his release from captivity, Servite Father Lawrence Martin Jenco, one of the hostages held in Lebanon for 564 days in the 1980s, said that the prayers and psalms he had learned as a child gave him the greatest solace during a long incarceration filled with cruel and severe deprivations. Jesus found similar comfort during his torture and death. His last words from the cross, according to the Gospels of Mark and Matthew, were: “My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?” a line from Psalm 22, one of the many psalms Jesus would have learned as a boy. Memorize a psalm today that will give you comfort in your hour of need.

Do you have Jesus’ back?

The last time we saw Martha and Mary together, they were weeping at the tomb of their brother, Lazarus. But now all three of them are having a dinner party for Jesus and the disciples at their home in Bethany. They do not know the religious authorities are planning to put Lazarus to death because his second chance at life is leading many to believe in Jesus. Nor do Martha, Mary, and Lazarus suspect that Jesus is about to be betrayed to those same authorities by one sitting at their table. Sharing the cup with Jesus only signifies friendship with him if we back it up once we’ve left the table. Are you ready to stand by Jesus and stand up for radical love?

Put knowledge to good use

What can be said about Judas, the apostle who committed the ultimate betrayal in history, handing over Jesus to his executioners for money? Like the other apostles, Judas knew the Lord—indeed, he knew Him well enough to identify Him to the authorities. But what did Judas do with that knowledge? He chose to exploit it. Ironically, had he used his knowledge of Jesus for the good of others rather than for a few meager silver pieces, he would have been glorified. Instead, he died by his own hand and lives in ignominy. Holy Week invites us to reflect on what we will do with our own knowledge of the Lord: whether we will allow it to transform us, or merely use it for our own ends.

Look for the signs

If you’re reading a suspenseful book or watching a scary movie, you can always tell when evil is about to intrude. In the moments of quiet before the unleashing of the stormy action, you’ll normally find telltale signs—a foreboding phrase or an ominous change in the music. Wednesday of Holy Week is the moment of quiet before the events of Jesus’ suffering, death, and Resurrection begin to rapidly unfold. The sign of what is to come is that Judas

agrees to betray Jesus and begins looking for opportunities to hand him over. What opportunities are you looking for today? Do they support Christ, or betray him?

Your humble servant, Lord

Today begins the Triduum (Latin for “space of three days”), during which we celebrate the central mystery of our faith: Christ’s Passion and Resurrection. Jesus calls his disciples to do as he has done: namely, love and serve one another. But what does Jesus mean by service? For Jesus, service always involves humbling oneself for the sake of another’s salvation. Jesus washes his disciples’ feet so that they may come to understand what true discipleship is. Jesus suffers, dies, and rises so that each of us may know the path to eternal life. Now it is up to us to choose discipleship and follow that path of love and service.

Say a prayer for spiritual courage

Sadder than the betrayal of a false friend is the denial of a true one. We might imagine that Judas had a false bottom in his heart: It’s the place where he kept his money. But Peter’s heart was full of genuine love and admiration for Jesus, so what went wrong in the courtyard of the high priest? Not bribery or a loss of faith, but something far simpler overcame Peter: fear. Many of us modern followers of Jesus might admit in an honest hour that fear is one of the greatest enemies of our own friendship with Jesus. Pray for spiritual courage, so that your witness may remain constant.

Watch and wait

Today the church does two things. It waits and fasts at the tomb of Jesus. Then, when night falls, it celebrates the vigil of his Resurrection. Tonight, we keep vigil around the Easter fire, and as we wait, we tell the stories of how we got here—in particular, how God got us here. Jesus’ empty tomb unveils the deepest mysteries of faith and all we hope for as Christians. If you are able to participate in a vigil liturgy tonight, you’ll be standing on the holiest ground: the place where we follow Christ into glory and welcome new and eternal life (and, in many communities, new members of Christ’s risen Body, the church).

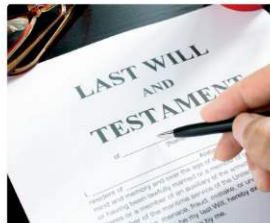



In partnership with Catholic Extension this Lenten season, St. Ignatius of Loyola parish community is supporting seminarian education and priests in the Diocese of Little Rock, Arkansas.

Mission Appeal Representative – Father Jeff Hebert

Fr. Jeff Hebert grew one of 11 children in the suburbs of Houston attending St. Ignatius of Loyola and now serves as the Director of Vocations and Seminarians in the Diocese of Little Rock, AR. Catholic Extension Society was honored to have supported his seminarian education so he could answer God's call to serve his people.

Before Fr. Jeff Hebert's priestly ordination in 2018, he was clear about what kind of priest he wanted to be for God's people – "a priest who has the smell of the sheep."

Fr. Hebert, 38, became the diocesan vocations director in 2021, helping guide discerners and seminarians to hopefully build that strong connection of faith to their own flocks one day. While he had served only as an associate pastor at St. Joseph Church in Conway before Bishop Anthony B. Taylor assigned him to the role of assistant vocations director and prefect of the House of Formation in June 2020, Fr. Hebert said the parish and all the people he ministers to are always in his mind when he works with young men.

"It's really the thing I'm trying to get these young men to understand and to conform their hearts to the heart of Christ that smells like the sheep, because I actually have the sheep in mind," Fr. Hebert said. "And so that's really helped me to kind of guide that and to really reconcile the ministry that I have now as opposed to being in a parish or in parish ministry is that I still have the parish in mind. There's no point in forming these guys to be a theoretical priest."

It's the mentality he believes Msgr. Scott Friend, former Vocations Director, felt throughout his service. Msgr. Friend grew vocations throughout his tenure, with 44 priests ordained, 24 more in formation and the construction of the House of Formation, where seminarians and discerners live and study.

"Really understanding vocations as a sign of God's love for us but also as a reason for the people to continue to believe, and just kind of seeing how that fits into the greater proclamation of the kingdom of God. It's been really cool for me," Fr. Hebert said.

As vocations director, Fr. Hebert visits parishes and schools outside of Central Arkansas to talk more about vocations. He also visits with discernment groups at different parts of the state for young men.

"I think what society needs in priests today, above all, they are men of faith. And I don't mean that in the cliché, just like prayerful men. Men who actually believe the things they're proclaiming from the pulpit," he said. "Men who actually believe that the source and the summit, the highest thing we do is the celebration of the Eucharist, the communal celebration. I think men who believe truly what the Gospel revealed. It's really about handing on the message of Jesus Christ in the way and the tradition he has left us."

Fr. Hebert said his role is not to choose the future priests but to guide them in God's will. Lay Catholics planting seeds in the minds of young men who they think would be good priests can be life-changing. In his own vocation story, a woman he had never met put her hand on his shoulder and said, "You're going to be a priest someday."

Queridos hermanos,

Durante las últimas semanas, hemos estado reflexionando juntos sobre las diversas partes de la Santa Misa, siguiendo las orientaciones de la *Instrucción General del Misal Romano* y la tradición viva de la Iglesia. Dentro de la Plegaria Eucarística, llegamos al momento más sagrado de toda la celebración: la consagración. Cuando el sacerdote repite las palabras de Jesús pronunciadas en la Última Cena —«Esto es mi Cuerpo... Este es el cáliz de mi Sangre»—, el Espíritu Santo actúa de un modo profundo y misterioso. Lo que antes era simple pan y vino se transforma en el Cuerpo, la Sangre, el Alma y la Divinidad de Jesucristo. Este misterio, que la Iglesia denomina *transustanciación*, ocupa el centro mismo de nuestra fe católica. Debido a la naturaleza profunda de este momento, la Iglesia nos invita a guardar una profunda reverencia y quietud. **Durante la consagración, debe reinar el silencio y la plena atención en toda la nave del templo.** Nuestra atención se dirige enteramente hacia el altar y hacia el misterio que se despliega ante nosotros. El movimiento durante este momento distrae no solo a la persona que se mueve, sino también a quienes la rodean y se esfuerzan por orar. La consagración nos convoca a la quietud, al silencio y a la admiración ante el Señor, que se hace sacramentalmente presente entre nosotros.

Una vez concluida la Plegaria Eucarística, la liturgia nos conduce hacia la recepción de la Sagrada Comunión: el momento en que el sacrificio que hemos celebrado se convierte en el alimento que nos nutre. La Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos ha establecido que la postura normativa para recibir la Sagrada Comunión en los Estados Unidos es estar de pie. Esta postura refleja una antigua concepción cristiana de nosotros mismos como un pueblo peregrino: hombres y mujeres que se encuentran en camino hacia el Reino de Dios. La propia procesión de la Comunión expresa esta realidad. Al avanzar desde nuestras bancas y caminar hacia el altar, simbolizamos la peregrinación de la Iglesia a través de la historia. En este trayecto, no somos sostenidos meramente por un alimento ordinario, sino por el Pan del Cielo: el mismo Señor Jesucristo. Él es nuestra fortaleza, nuestro sustento y nuestra esperanza a lo largo del camino del discipulado. Dado que nos acercamos a un don tan excelso, nuestros gestos deben reflejar la debida reverencia y decoro. Cuando el ministro presenta la Sagrada Hostia o la Preciosa Sangre y proclama: «El Cuerpo de Cristo» o «La Sangre de Cristo», el comulgante responde con un «Amén» claro y firme. Esta respuesta no es un simple gesto de cortesía; es un acto de fe profundo. En esa sola palabra, afirmamos que creemos verdaderamente que lo que recibimos es el Cristo vivo.

Antes de recibirla, los obispos de los Estados Unidos solicitan que el comulgante haga una sencilla inclinación de cabeza como gesto de reverencia. Tras esta inclinación, el comulgante extiende las manos hacia adelante, colocando una sobre la otra, formando lo que la Iglesia primitiva describía como un trono sobre el cual el Rey de Reyes puede posarse. Ya en los primeros siglos de la Iglesia encontramos instrucciones sobre cómo recibir la Eucaristía con reverencia. San Cirilo de Jerusalén, escribiendo en el siglo IV, enseñaba a los fieles: «Haz de tu mano izquierda un trono para tu derecha, la cual recibirá al Rey». Sus palabras nos recuerdan que cada gesto que realizamos durante la Comunión expresa nuestra fe en Aquel a quien recibimos. La genuflexión en este momento no es el gesto esperado; más bien, la sencilla inclinación de cabeza constituye el signo de reverencia apropiado para el comulgante.

Si bien la práctica normativa en los Estados Unidos consiste en recibir la Sagrada Comunión de pie y en la mano, la Iglesia también conserva otras opciones legítimas. *La Instrucción General del Misal Romano*, respaldada por la autoridad magisterial del Papa Benedicto XVI, permite a los comulgantes recibir la Sagrada Comunión en la lengua. Si se opta por este método, es importante extender la lengua hacia afuera —en lugar de limitarse a abrir la boca— para que el ministro pueda depositar la Sagrada Hostia con reverencia. La Iglesia también permite que la persona reciba la Sagrada Comunión de rodillas. Aunque esta no sea la norma en nuestro país, sigue siendo una opción legítima. Quienes opten por arrodillarse deben asegurarse de poder volver a ponerse de pie sin ayuda y deben tener consideración hacia las personas que se encuentran detrás de ellos en la fila de la Comunión.

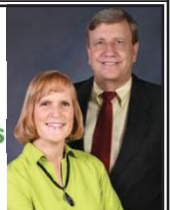
