1. Gifts from an IRA, Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD), are popular forms of end-of-year giving for those 70 1/2 or older. A donor can make a gift directly from their IRA to the parish which can result in a reduction in annual taxes owed. Gifts to the parish alone can be mailed directly to the parish.
2. Gifts of appreciated stock allow donors to make an impact to the mission of the church and avoid capital gains on the appreciated shares that are donated to a qualified charity. A donor must complete a stock letter of intent.

PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

A blessed and joyful Easter to you all! *Resurrexit sicut dixit, Alleluia! He has risen as He said, Alleluia!* With the whole Church throughout the world, we proclaim with confidence and joy that Jesus Christ is risen from the dead. Today, we celebrate not merely an event of the past, but a living reality that continues to transform hearts, renew lives, and shape the destiny of the world. Easter is the central mystery of our faith. As St. Paul reminds us, “If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching; empty, too, your faith” (1 Cor 15:14). The Resurrection of Jesus Christ is not an optional belief or a symbolic gesture; it is the definitive victory of God over sin and death. It is the moment in which darkness is overcome by light, despair is replaced with hope, and death gives way to eternal life.

While Easter is the foundation of Christian belief, its significance reaches far beyond the walls of the Church. The Resurrection has profoundly shaped the course of human history, influencing our understanding of the dignity of the human person, the value of sacrificial love, and the meaning of hope itself. The very rhythms of our calendar, the development of hospitals and universities, the pursuit of justice and charity, all find their roots, in some way, in a worldview transformed by the Resurrection. Without Easter, the Cross would remain a tragic symbol of suffering and defeat. But because of Easter, the Cross becomes the sign of redemption, love, and ultimate triumph. The Resurrection affirms that evil does not have the final word, that suffering is not meaningless, and that every human life is destined for something greater than what we see before us. This truth has inspired countless acts of charity, mercy, and courage throughout the centuries—and continues to do so today.

For us as Catholics, Easter is not confined to a single day of celebration. Every Sunday is, in fact, a “little Easter.” Each time we gather for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we enter into the Paschal Mystery—the passion, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Sunday is the Lord’s Day, the day of Resurrection, and it is the foundation upon which our entire liturgical life is built. When we come to Mass each Sunday, we are not simply fulfilling an obligation; we are participating in the very victory of Christ over sin and death. We are nourished by the Bread of Life so that we may go forth as witnesses to the Resurrection in our daily lives.

This Easter also offers a moment of invitation and welcome. First, we extend a heartfelt welcome to our neophytes who, through the sacred celebrations of the Easter Vigil, have passed through the waters of Baptism, have been anointed with Sacred Chrism, have received the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and have completed their initiation by receiving Holy Communion for the first time. The journey of Christian faith is just beginning, and our hope is that your presence among us will encourage you in your discipleship and inspire all of us to live more fully as a resurrected people.

To those who have been away from the Church for some time: welcome home. The doors of the Church are always open to you. There is a place for you here, at the table of the Word and the table of the Eucharist. If life has been difficult, if faith has grown distant, or if questions remain unanswered, know that Christ continues to seek you with a patient and merciful love. To those who may be exploring the Catholic faith or are simply curious about what we believe: we welcome you as well. Our parish community stands ready to walk with you, to answer your questions, and to accompany you on the journey of faith. The Resurrection we celebrate today is not meant for a select few, it is a gift offered to all.

And to our faithful parishioners who continue to live and grow in the life of the Church: thank you. Your witness of faith, your generosity, and your commitment to living as missionary disciples make the presence of the Risen Christ visible in our community.

As we celebrate this most holy day, may we allow the truth of the Resurrection to penetrate our hearts more deeply. May it renew our hope, strengthen our faith, and inspire us to live with greater charity and purpose. The world around us longs for the light of Christ—may we be the ones who carry that light into every corner of our lives. May God continue to pour out His abundant grace upon each of you and your families. May the joy of Easter remain with you not only today, but throughout the entire year.

Roll away the roadblocks

Today we are blessed to welcome a host of new Catholics who became part of the church at last night's vigil. Whatever obstacles that stood in the way have been rolled away. These new Catholics have entered freely into our community of believers and have committed to be followers of the Way of Jesus. They bring new life and energy to our fellowship. What gets in the way of your believing more completely? The message of Easter is: In every moment, Christ lives.

SOLEMNITY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD (EASTER SUNDAY)

Acts 10:34a, 37-43; Colossians 3:1-4 or 1 Corinthians 5:6b-8; John 20:1-9 (42). "Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning ... and saw the stone removed from the tomb."

Monday, Apr 06, 2026

Mountain climbing not required

After he is raised from the dead, Jesus meets his disciples on a mountain in Galilee. According to scripture scholars this meeting place is significant because mountains are often where God and mortals meet: Moses got the Law on a mountain; Jesus gave his immortal sermon on a mount (at least in the Gospel of Matthew); and after his death, Jesus commissions his apostles on a mountain to: "Go, make disciples, and baptize." Yet, as scripturally significant and awe-inspiring as mountains may be, they are not absolutely essential to religious experience. God can be encountered anywhere. It's not going somewhere that is important; it's opening your eyes to where you are. Where are you?

Happy are new witnesses to Easter

Happy are those who have not seen and have believed, Jesus once observed. He was talking about us. We weren't there in that moment of history 20 centuries ago when miracles occurred and dreams came true. We didn't stand at the open mouth of the tomb where death lost its sting and eternal life had its astonishing victory. But with eyes of faith, we can still declare with Mary Magdalene, "I have seen the Lord!" Amazing grace still operates all around us, within us, through us, and in spite of us. For those who can see resurrection in every spring unfolding and each transformed life, "happy" is the only word to describe it.

Acts 2:36-41; John 20:11-18 (262). "Mary went and announced to the disciples, 'I have seen the Lord.'"

Wednesday, Apr 08, 2026

Food for the journey

Easter week continues, and with it the church's ongoing encounter with the risen Jesus. In the gospel story about the meeting of the two disciples with the risen Lord on the road to Emmaus, Jesus interprets scripture to the two disciples, then reveals himself in the breaking of the bread. It's similar to what happens when we gather at Mass to hear the word proclaimed and brought to bear on our lives. Not only the word is broken open, of course, but also the bread, the Body of Christ. In all of this we encounter the Real Presence of Christ. The next time you're at Mass, think about how

there's probably no better way to know and follow Jesus than to receive him in word and transformed bread and wine, which the church calls the "source and summit of the Christian life." Indeed, the Eucharist should lead us, like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, to "set out at once" to love and serve the Lord.

WEDNESDAY WITHIN THE OCTAVE OF EASTER

Acts 3:1-10; Luke 24:13-35 (263). "He was made known to them in the breaking of the bread."

Thursday, Apr 09, 2026

What constitutes glory?

There are those who preach a "prosperity gospel." That is, they present the message of Jesus as meaning that if we just believe hard enough all our worldly problems will fade. We will be rich. We will be successful in the eyes of the world. We will be safe and secure. Yet, Saint Elizabeth of Hungary, born a princess, asks, "How could I wear a crown of gold when my Lord wears a crown of thorns and he wears it for me?" Indeed, ours is a savior who shows us his wounds. After the Resurrection but before the enlightenment of Pentecost, the apostles were often unsure of who this stranger was in their midst. They recognized him in two ways—in the breaking of the bread and in the showing of his wounds. Today, try to find Jesus in the wounds life brings. Those sorrowful moments are part of the mystery of God's glory.

Acts 3:11-26; Luke 24:35-48 (264). "He showed them his hands and his feet. ... they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed."

Friday, Apr 10, 2026

Catch the Christian Spirit

The poor apostles were lost without Jesus. Trained fishers, they couldn't even catch any fish. In fact, we're all lost without Jesus. He gave us the Good News that we're the children of God and showed us how to live lives that reflect our holy heritage. The Orthodox Christians, who begin their Triduum observance today, also believe that "we are called to be saints and grow in the likeness of God," according to their catechism. Like Roman Catholics, the Orthodox believe that "having been given the Holy Spirit, we actively participate in sanctification." With the help of the Spirit, work toward a net full of holiness today.

The end never comes

How do you finish a story like the gospel? Early writers had lots of ideas about where the story should end. Mark's gospel, the first to be written, recorded three different endings in various ancient manuscripts. Although most early copies of Mark end at chapter 16, verse 8, some include an additional summarizing paragraph. And a few go on for 12 more verses, the so-called "Longer Ending," which includes the story of Mary Magdalene's meeting with Jesus. The bottom line is, no matter how you end the gospel, it's never really finished.

the descent of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the Church.

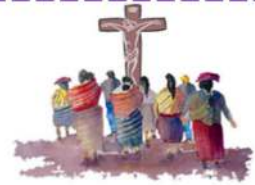

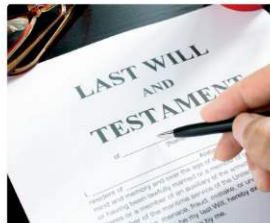

Queridos hermanos,

¡Una Pascua bendecida y llena de alegría para todos ustedes! **Resurrexit sicut dixit, Alleluia!** ¡Ha resucitado, como lo dijo, Aleluya! Junto con toda la Iglesia en el mundo entero, proclamamos con confianza y alegría que Jesucristo ha resucitado de entre los muertos. Hoy no celebramos meramente un acontecimiento del pasado, sino una realidad viva que continúa transformando corazones, renovando vidas y forjando el destino del mundo. La Pascua es el misterio central de nuestra fe. Como nos recuerda San Pablo: «Si Cristo no ha resucitado, en vano es nuestra predicación; vana también vuestra fe» (1 Co 15, 14). La Resurrección de Jesucristo no es una creencia opcional ni un gesto simbólico; es la victoria definitiva de Dios sobre el pecado y la muerte. Es el momento en que las tinieblas son vencidas por la luz, la desesperación es reemplazada por la esperanza y la muerte cede el paso a la vida eterna.

Si bien la Pascua constituye el fundamento de la fe cristiana, su trascendencia se extiende mucho más allá de los muros de la Iglesia. La Resurrección ha moldeado profundamente el curso de la historia humana, influyendo en nuestra comprensión de la dignidad de la persona humana, del valor del amor sacrificial y del significado de la esperanza misma. Los propios ciclos de nuestro calendario, el desarrollo de hospitales y universidades, la búsqueda de la justicia y la caridad: todo ello halla sus raíces, de algún modo, en una visión universal transformada por la Resurrección. Sin la Pascua, la Cruz permanecería como un trágico símbolo de sufrimiento y derrota. Pero, gracias a la Pascua, la Cruz se convierte en el signo de la redención, del amor y del triunfo definitivo. La Resurrección afirma que el mal no tiene la última palabra, que el sufrimiento no carece de sentido y que toda vida humana está destinada a algo más grande que aquello que tenemos ante nuestros ojos. Esta verdad ha inspirado incontables actos de caridad, misericordia y valentía a lo largo de los siglos, y continúa haciéndolo hoy en día.

Para nosotros, como católicos, la Pascua no se limita a un solo día de celebración. De hecho, cada domingo es una «pequeña Pascua». Cada vez que nos reunimos para el Santo Sacrificio de la Misa, entramos en el Misterio Pascual: la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Jesucristo. El domingo es el Día del Señor, el día de la Resurrección, y constituye el fundamento sobre el cual se edifica toda nuestra vida litúrgica. Cuando acudimos a Misa cada domingo, no estamos simplemente cumpliendo con una obligación; estamos participando en la propia victoria de Cristo sobre el pecado y la muerte. Nos nutrimos del Pan de Vida para que podamos salir como testigos de la Resurrección en nuestra vida cotidiana.

Esta Pascua ofrece también un momento de invitación y acogida. En primer lugar, damos una cordial bienvenida a nuestros neófitos, quienes, a través de las sagradas celebraciones de la Vigilia Pascual, han cruzado las aguas del Bautismo, han sido ungidos con el Santo Crisma, han recibido los dones del Espíritu Santo y han completado su iniciación al recibir la Sagrada Comunión por primera vez. El camino de la fe cristiana apenas comienza, y nuestra esperanza es que su presencia entre nosotros los aliente en su discipulado e inspire a todos nosotros a vivir más plenamente como un pueblo resucitado.

A aquellos que han estado alejados de la Iglesia por algún tiempo: bienvenidos a casa. Las puertas de la Iglesia están siempre abiertas para ustedes. Hay un lugar para ustedes aquí, en la mesa de la Palabra y en la mesa de la Eucaristía. Si la vida ha sido difícil, si la fe se ha vuelto distante o si quedan preguntas sin respuesta, sepan que Cristo continúa buscándolos con un amor paciente y misericordioso. A aquellos que tal vez estén explorando la fe católica, o que simplemente sientan curiosidad por lo que creemos: también les damos la bienvenida. Nuestra comunidad parroquial está dispuesta a caminar con ustedes, a responder a sus preguntas y a acompañarlos en el camino de la fe. 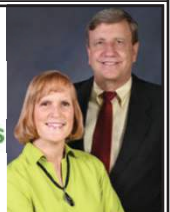
