PASTOR'S COLUMN

COLUMNA DEL PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

“Resurrexit sicut dixit, Alleluia!” The joy of Easter does not belong to a single day; it overflows into time itself. That is why the Church, in her wisdom, gives us not merely a feast, but an octave, eight days celebrated as one continuous solemnity. In the biblical imagination, the eighth day is the day of new creation, the day beyond the cycle of ordinary time. Just as God created the world in seven days, the Resurrection inaugurates something entirely new: a re-creation of humanity in Christ. Thus, the Church lingers in Easter joy, prolonging the celebration so that what happened on that first Easter morning may take deeper root within us. The octave teaches us that the Resurrection cannot be contained; it must be lived, pondered, and allowed to transform us.

Within this octave, we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter, known also as Divine Mercy Sunday. Its origin is relatively recent, yet profoundly rooted in the Gospel itself. Through the revelations entrusted to St. Faustina Kowalska and later promulgated by Pope St. John Paul II, the Church was reminded of what the Resurrection reveals most clearly: the inexhaustible mercy of God. In the Gospel proclaimed today, the Risen Christ appears to His disciples and speaks the words, “Peace be with you,” even after they had abandoned Him. He breathes upon them and grants the power to forgive sins. The wounds of Christ, still visible, are not marks of defeat but signs of mercy poured out for the world. How fitting, then, that Divine Mercy Sunday is placed within the Easter Octave. The Resurrection is not simply a victory over death; it is the triumph of mercy over sin. The empty tomb proclaims that no darkness is beyond the reach of God’s love. On a personal note, this day holds particular significance for me, as the first Mass I celebrated as a newly ordained priest was on Divine Mercy Sunday. From the very beginning of my priesthood, the Church placed before me this central truth: that everything we do flows from and returns to the mercy of God. This same mercy is at work in our parish in a tangible way as we continue to welcome those newly initiated into the Church. At the Easter Vigil, many passed through the waters of Baptism, were anointed with Sacred Chrism, and received the Eucharist for the first time. Today, we celebrate the initiation of our Children of Catechetical Age, and next week we will receive into full communion those already baptized in other Christian traditions. Their journey is a powerful witness to all of us. It reminds us that the Christian life is not static; it is a continual response to grace.

For all of us who are baptized, this season calls us to remember our obligations as Catholic Christians. We are not merely recipients of grace; we are stewards of it. We are called to participate in the life of the Church through the faithful celebration of the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist every Sunday. We are to confess our sins regularly, to live according to the moral teachings of the Church, to be formed in the faith, and to contribute to the mission of the Church through our time, talent, and treasure. Baptism is not a past event; it is a present reality. We have died with Christ and risen with Him, and therefore our lives must reflect that transformation. As missionary disciples, we are sent to be witnesses, men and women who live differently because we belong to Christ.

As we conclude our series on the Holy Mass, it is fitting that we reflect on the final moments of our liturgical celebration. After receiving Holy Communion, the priest prays the Post-Communion Prayer, gathering our silent thanksgiving into one voice. Brief announcements may follow, connecting our worship to the life of the parish. Then comes the Final Blessing, in which God strengthens us for what lies ahead. And finally, the dismissal. The dismissal is not an afterthought; it is essential. The word “Mass” itself comes from the Latin phrase *Ite, missa est*, “Go, you are sent.” The liturgy does not end; it extends into the world. To leave early, to “eat and run,” is to miss the very purpose of what we have just celebrated. We are not simply fed; we are commissioned. Having received the Body and Blood of Christ, we are sent forth to become what we have received. The dismissal is our mandate to bring Christ into our homes, our workplaces, our schools, and our community. In the spirit of St. Ignatius of Loyola, we are called to find God in all things and to be contemplatives in action. The Eucharist strengthens us so that we may go forth as “a people for others,” carrying the light of the Risen Christ into a world that so desperately needs hope. The Mass forms us, nourishes us, and then sends us.

As we continue this Easter Season, may we not keep the Alleluia confined to our lips alone. Rather, let us sing it with our lives, through acts of mercy, words of truth, and lives of holiness. The world must see that Christ is truly risen, and He chooses to make that known through us.

Blessings for the Easter Season. Go forth and proclaim the Gospel with your life, Alleluia, Alleluia!
Resurrexit sicut dixit, Alleluia!

The quality of mercy

The church named the Sunday after Easter Divine Mercy Sunday to celebrate the devotion to the mercy of Jesus as revealed to Blessed Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun who died in 1938 and was declared a saint in 2000. God's bountiful mercy to us calls us to show mercy as well. Saint Faustina prayed, "I want to be completely transformed into your mercy and to be your living reflection, O Lord. May . . . your unfathomable mercy pass through my heart and soul to my neighbor." Why not make today a time to rededicate yourself to showing mercy, love, compassion, and forgiveness to all those you encounter?

Get a new life

Have you ever been asked if you are born again? Just what does that mean? It comes from the verse found in the Gospel of John that earlier versions of the Bible translated as "Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3). In modern translations in both the Catholic New American Bible and the Protestant New Revised Standard Version, the passage is translated as "No one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above." Whether you use the term "born again" or "born from above," Jesus' meaning is clear: Those who accept the Good News of Christ live a life free from fear of sin and death. Our worst moments do not define us when we repent and embrace Christ's love. In Baptism, we receive the gift of eternal life and the forgiveness of sins. Celebrate your new life!

Trust in the unknown

There is a folksy saying, attributed to many different ethnic groups, that goes: "Every baby is born with a loaf of bread under his arm." In so many words, it means that God will provide, even if you're not exactly sure how. It's difficult to let go of worry in the face of uncertainty, whether it's being able to care for a child or to handle any important responsibility. Your willingness to try, despite your fears, without knowing the outcome, shows faith. Trust that God will see you through it.

God is in the saving business, intending to rescue the goodness of the old creation for the new one. As Saint Clement says, "The Lord has turned all our sunsets into sunrise." Take a moment to praise God by enjoying this glorious new day.

Think good thoughts

Now that Lent is over, those who chose to give up social media or gossip may be finding themselves sucked back into the everyday world of bombast, news hype, and juicy tidbits. We are bombarded by mind-numbing, spirit-draining trivialities all day long; it is no wonder many of us slip into casual indifference about what is true, real, and worthy of our attention. Saint Thomas More warned us about this: "Occupy your minds with good thoughts, or the enemy will fill them with bad ones." Counter the tendency toward cynicism or pettiness with doing or saying the kind thing.

Keep your intentions pure

In this post-Easter season we are invited to reflect on the intentions behind our actions. If on the other hand our deeds stem from vanity, arrogance, or a desire for praise, then they will not bear good fruit, no matter how altruistic they may appear to others. Take a moment today to pray that your words and actions come from your inner being, where God resides, that you may bear good fruit and be found worthy to suffer for Christ's sake.

A lived-in faith

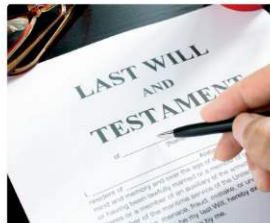

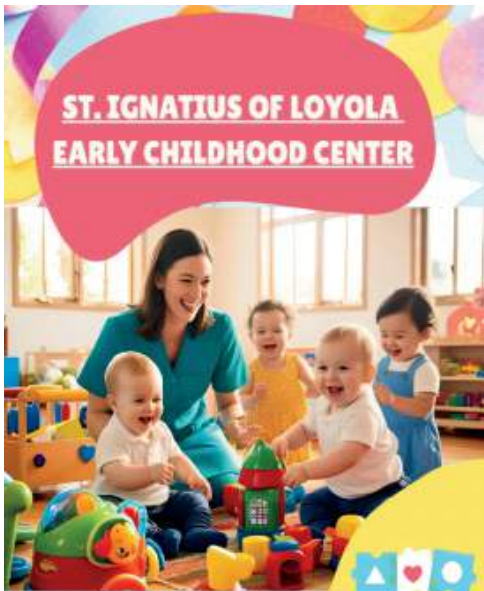

Queridos hermanos,

«*Resurrexit sicut dixit, Alleluia!*» La alegría de la Pascua no pertenece a un solo día; se desborda hacia el tiempo mismo. Por eso la Iglesia, en su sabiduría, nos ofrece no solo una fiesta, sino una octava: ocho días celebrados como una única y continua solemnidad. En la imaginación bíblica, el octavo día es el día de la nueva creación, el día que trasciende el ciclo del tiempo ordinario. Así como Dios creó el mundo en siete días, la Resurrección introduce algo enteramente nuevo: una recreación de la humanidad en Cristo. De este modo, la Iglesia se detiene en la alegría pascual, prolongando la celebración para que aquello que aconteció en aquella primera mañana de Pascua eche raíces más

profundas en nuestro interior. La octava nos enseña que la Resurrección no puede ser contenida; debe ser vivida, meditada y permitir que nos transforme.

Dentro de esta octava, celebramos el Segundo Domingo de Pascua, conocido también como el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Su origen es relativamente reciente, aunque profundamente arraigado en el Evangelio mismo. A través de las revelaciones confiadas a Santa Faustina Kowalska y posteriormente promulgadas por el Papa San Juan Pablo II, se le recordó a la Iglesia aquello que la Resurrección revela con mayor claridad: la inagotable misericordia de Dios. En el Evangelio proclamado hoy, Cristo Resucitado se aparece a sus discípulos y pronuncia las palabras: «La paz esté con ustedes», incluso después de que ellos lo hubieran abandonado. Él sopla sobre ellos y les otorga el poder de perdonar los pecados. Las heridas de Cristo, aún visibles, no son marcas de derrota, sino signos de la misericordia derramada por el mundo. ¡Cuán apropiado resulta, entonces, que el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia este dentro de la Octava de Pascua! La Resurrección no es simplemente una victoria sobre la muerte; es el triunfo de la misericordia sobre el pecado. El sepulcro vacío proclama que ninguna oscuridad está fuera del alcance del amor de Dios. En un plano personal, este día reviste para mí una importancia particular, ya que la primera Misa que celebré como sacerdote recién ordenado tuvo lugar el Domingo de la Divina Misericordia. Desde los mismos inicios de mi sacerdocio, la Iglesia puso ante mí esta verdad central: que todo cuanto hacemos emana de la misericordia de Dios y a ella retorna. Esta misma misericordia se manifiesta de manera tangible en nuestra parroquia, a medida que continuamos acogiendo a aquellos que han sido recién iniciados en la Iglesia. Durante la Vigilia Pascual, muchos atravesaron las aguas del Bautismo, fueron ungidos con el Santo Crisma y recibieron la Eucaristía por primera vez. Hoy celebramos la iniciación de nuestros niños en edad catequética y, la próxima semana, recibiremos en plena comunión a aquellos que ya han sido bautizados en otras tradiciones cristianas. Su camino constituye un poderoso testimonio para todos nosotros; nos recuerda que la vida cristiana no es estática, sino una respuesta continua a la gracia.

Para todos nosotros, los bautizados, este tiempo nos llama a recordar nuestras obligaciones como cristianos católicos. No somos meros receptores de la gracia; somos sus administradores. Estamos llamados a participar en la vida de la Iglesia mediante la celebración fiel de los Sacramentos, especialmente la Eucaristía, cada domingo. Debemos confesar nuestros pecados con regularidad, vivir de acuerdo con las enseñanzas morales de la Iglesia, formarnos en la fe y contribuir a la misión de la Iglesia con nuestro tiempo, nuestros talentos y nuestro tesoro. El Bautismo no es un acontecimiento del pasado; es una realidad presente. Hemos muerto con Cristo y resucitado con Él; por lo tanto, nuestras vidas deben reflejar esa transformación. Como discípulos misioneros, somos enviados a ser testigos: hombres y mujeres que viven de manera diferente porque pertenecemos a Cristo.

Al concluir nuestra serie sobre la Santa Misa, resulta oportuno reflexionar sobre los momentos finales de nuestra celebración litúrgica. Tras recibir la Sagrada Comunión, el sacerdote reza la Oración después de la Comunión, unificando nuestro silencioso agradecimiento en una sola voz. A continuación, pueden seguir breves avisos que vinculan nuestro culto con la vida de la parroquia. Luego viene la Bendición Final, en la cual Dios nos fortalece para lo que nos aguarda. Y, finalmente, la despedida. La despedida no es un mero añadido; es esencial. La palabra misma «Misa» proviene de la expresión latina **Ite, missa est**: «Id, la Misa ha terminado». La liturgia no termina; se extiende hacia el mundo. Marcharse antes de tiempo —«comer y salir corriendo», por así decirlo— equivale a perderse el propósito mismo de lo que acabamos de celebrar. 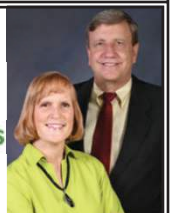
