2.	Finance Council Mission
	The Finance Council's mission is to provide financial guidance to Father Norbert and to ensure that the Parish's financial resources are best used to serve the needs of the St. Ignatius Community.
3.	Finance Council Members
	Members of the Finance Council generally serve three-year terms that are staggered so we continually have stable, yet fresh perspectives each Fiscal Year.
	We have our existing members on the slide and if any of you are here, please stand up.
4.	Parishioner Data  Now for a quick overview of our parish data.
	•

- Registered households are the same year/year & have not recovered from our high in 2022.
- Recordable donors are those donors who contribute via parish envelope, a check, or through an online mechanism other than Faith Direct. As you can see, they decreased this past year...a **most** concerning number.
- The number of Parish Soft (fka Faith Direct) Donors continue to increase, and we thank you. Faith Direct is our Parish's most reliable and consistent way to give.
- On an encouraging note, Weekly Mass attendance has grown by ~250 people/week.

#### 5. Weekly Offerings

Let's review the 2025 fiscal year financial results.

- Weekly collections are the lifeblood of every Catholic Parish. We rely on weekly collections to support the 80 plus ministries within our Parish.
- Our FY2025 collections were slightly lower compared to FY2024.
- It is important to remember that we must ensure regular and growing weekly collections from every registered family. We are very sensitive to the fact that in this present economic climate there are financial strains, but weekly donations are still essential for our Parish's vitality and for sustaining the programs and services that help us bring the word of God to life.
- If you have not signed up for Faith Direct I encourage you to do so. The QR code is in the bulletin.

#### 6. Fiscal Year Actuals

- Our revenue totals reflect all monies collected by the parish including but not limited to weekly collections, special gifts, Fall Festival and various fees such as our Early Childhood program.
- Revenue for FY2025 shows a slight but not a substantive decrease from FY2024. The larger point being...no Y/Y growth in revenue.
- Because our parish staff continues to do a tremendous job managing costs, the slight increase in expenses was kept at a minimum and was actually under budget projections. This, in spite of inflationary pressures.
- We did end the year with a surplus of \$464K, but this
  is largely attributable to unbudgeted Parishioner
  donations as well as the mentioned expenses coming
  in under budget.

#### 7. Surplus Allocation

Regarding the Surplus of \$464K, that was put together with \$408K that was drawn from Savings and the sum was used to pay off our debt in the form a final Principal Payment of \$872k.

8. **Archdiocesan Special Collections** 

In addition to our regular collections, our Parish has been generous in supporting many other Archdiocesan special collections. In FY2025 we experienced a similar level of giving from the previous fiscal year.

It's with your generosity that we continue to fully support programs like our Guatemala Mission, where our donations help cover nine (9) full-time and two (2) part time teachers. We are very grateful for all of your support to this and all Archdiocesan ministries.

#### 9. **Diocesan Services Fund (DSF)**

For calendar year 2025, our yearly assessment for the Diocesan Services Fund (DSF) increased to \$343,000.

Understanding the current economic challenges, we thank you for your generosity in supporting the archdiocese, and if you have not yet pledged to DSF please be sure to do so before the end of this calendar year.

As you can see from the numbers on the screen, we have a substantial way to go to meet our assessment, both in terms of Participants and the pledges/payments made to date. For clarity, any deficit to our Assessment will come out of St Ignatius church funds.

10.	IGNITE Capital Campaign
	<ul> <li>As we have shared previously, the purpose of the Archdiocese's IGNITE Capital Campaign is to provide long-term funding for archdiocese-wide initiatives as well as the needs of our home parish.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Our parish goal is almost \$1.9 million, and the campaign concludes in November of this year. Two thirds of the proceeds go to the archdiocese and one- third remains with the parish. The parish has currently pledged over \$2M with 91% paid already from 365 participants.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>To date, \$564K was remitted back to our parish from the Diocese.</li> </ul>
11.	Archdiocesan Loan Repayment
	<ul> <li>For fiscal year 2025 the parish repaid \$423K in regularly scheduled principal and nearly \$46K in interest on the Gonzaga Center loan.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Because of an accumulation of funds from various sources including prior surpluses and IGNITE Proceeds, an unscheduled principal payment of \$449K was remitted before the end of the fiscal year.</li> </ul>
	This loan is finally paid off.

12.	Our Accomplishments We feel the Gonzaga Center unscheduled final principal payment was the major financial accomplishment for the Parish this year. Not only did it significantly reduce the debt, it will save the Parish thousands in interest.  A sincere and gracious 'thank you' to the St. Ignatius Parish Staff for diligently managing funds during these financially challenging times.
13.	<ol> <li>Our Challenges</li> <li>Put simply, our biggest challenge as a Parish, is increasing our weekly collections. This is the area that we would humbly ask for your prayerful consideration that a) if you are not presently giving on a weekly basisto do so even if only on a small basis. OR b) if you are presently givingdiscerning your ability to increase your weekly donation by a small 5, 10 or 15% or whatever you are able.</li> <li>The Fall Festival is our biggest fund raiser and we would not have made budget this year without its success. We absolutely need a repeat of this success next month! Thank you in advance for your support.</li> <li>Lastly, the need to address the current deficit in the Diocesan Services Fund (DSF).</li> </ol>

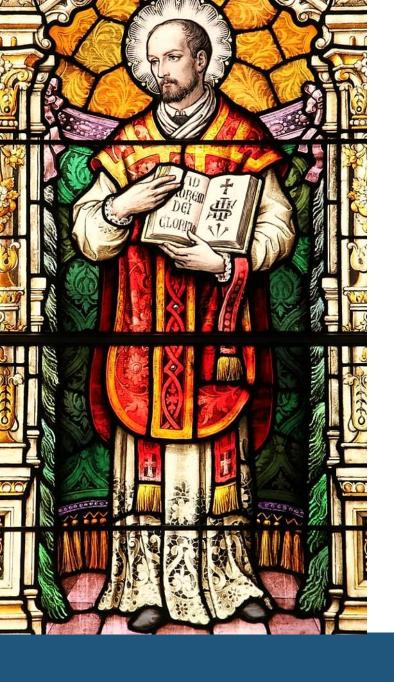
