Two Questions- 4

- Who is God to you? What image or concept of Him do you have?
 - -We should always be pursuing more knowledge of God or theology.
 - -Heb. 5:12-14 What do you consider yourself?
- -Isaiah 40 is full of Declarative questions. (12-14)
 - -These questions are used to reveal in certainty about God.
 - -Both Isaiah & God ask a two questions each.

Isa, 40:18-27

I. Isaiah's Questions (18-24)

- 1. Isaiah declares the greatness & power of God in 10-17 & then He presents two questions.
 - -Declares that God is not comparable.
- 2. Man's attempt to compare God (19-20) -Exo. 20:1-6
 - -We carve idols out in our minds of what we think or want God to be like.
 - -(Draw a picture of God.)

 Can you? Is a picture/image of Christ an idol?
- 3. God is unique, one of a kind. I Tim. 2:5
 - -No pic, statue, or form can replicate God. -Jn. 4:24
- 4. Isaiah compares God to: (22-24)
 - -Man (grasshoppers- small & numerous.)
 - -Space & heavens (Vastness of space as a curtain.)
 - -Princes & judges (With all their authority & power.)
- 5. God raises up & God brings down.
 - -God has control over all creation even kings & rulers.
 - -Nothing happens outside of God's control or will.
 - -The sovereignty of God.

II. God's Questions (2527–14)

- 1. Changes to first person with power & authority.
 - -God asks Himself what/who He is comparable to.
 - -Deut. 4:12-19- (Why God places such an emphasis.)
- 2. God call out attention to creation. Why? (26)
 - -Ps. 19:1-4. Rom. 1:20
 - -Creation is a 24/7 revelation & reminder of God.
 - -Take time and notice/meditate.
 - -We tend to take it for granted.
- 3. Revelation of God's might & power.
 - -Created all we see from nothing.
 - -Ask a scientist to do that for you.
 - -Calls all of creation by name -Animals, people, & stars.
 - -Ps. 147:4-5
- 4. God sees and judges all. (27)
 - -He knows the thoughts & intents of our hearts.
 - -Ps. 139:1-18
 - -No one escapes God or His judgment.

Conclusion

- -Who is God like?
 - -This great & all-powerful creator God comes down from heaven to you & I.
 - -He desires fellowship, worship, & devotion.
 - -Comes as a Father to a son or daughter.
- -Take time to describe who God is to you.
 - -How has He revealed Himself to you?
