Each class will begin and end with prayer. Depending on grade level, students will learn the different forms of prayer: praise, petition, thanksgiving and contrition. These prayers can be found in the Catholic Prayers section of your children's textbook. We encourage parents to say these prayers with their children every day.

Program Routines

Class Times

In Person Pre-K through 7th Grade: In Person Sessions are offered 2x a month on Sunday mornings from 9:00-10:00am at St. Mary's Of The Lake.

Family-Based Program: Gathers monthly church gatherings for prayer, discussion, and sharing experiences, with a potluck meal from 5:30-7:00 PM.

Confirmation 1 (8th grade) & Confirmation 2 (9th grade): Immediate preparation will take place on the 1st Sunday evening of the month from 6:00-7:30 pm (including a potluck meal).

Drop off and Pick up Parking

When you arrive, please use the Austin Street parking lot only, unless you are attending the 10:15am Mass. Please do not block or park your car at the covered entrance.

Dismissal

All Grades will be dismissed to the Parish Center escorted by their teacher. Please meet your child in this area, even if you are attending Mass at 10:15 am. Please let the office know if you would prefer for your older child to pick up younger child for dismissal.

Arrival & Sign In

When you arrive, please bring your child into the building at the covered entrance and sign-in. There are sign-in sheets for each grade. After signing in you may accompany your child to their classroom if you wish.

Walkers / Carpooling

If your child will walk or carpool to faith formation with non-family members, a parent/guardian must complete and sign the Walk and Carpool Permission form. This form must be signed annually and is available on our website. Please use the Carpooling form for any changes in who may pick up your child and note on sign in sheet when dropping child off.

If your child has any special needs including physical, sensory, cognitive, or social / emotional disabilities please let us know so we can better serve your child. We will make every effort to accommodate a child with special needs.

Volunteers

Volunteers are always welcome! Parents may volunteer in a number of ways including as a teacher or teacher's aide, hall monitors, substitute teacher or aid, administrative help, and/or setting up for special occasions. All volunteers must attend a VIRTUS training session held by the Diocese of Syracuse. It is a requirement of the Diocese of Syracuse that no adult can be in the classroom without being VIRTUS trained. The VIRTUS training schedule is published on the Diocese of Syracuse's website or you can email us for info.

All classroom doors will be locked during class time.

5 Ways to Nurture Your Child's Faith

Here are five gifts you can give to nurture the spiritual life of your child.

Explain to your child why you gave him or her the name you did: In the Bible, names carry a lot of meaning. Jesus changed Simon's name to Peter (Greek for "rock"), which indicated Peter's vocation as the leader of Christian community. By telling your child how you chose his or her name, you can highlight the spiritual hopes you have for your child and emphasize his or her connection to the larger community.

Tell stories about your ancestors: Explain, for example, how their grandparents or great-great grandparents came to this country if they are of immigrant heritage. Such stories—of the strength, perseverance, and faith of their forebears—will help them know that they are part of a larger, grander story than just their own.

Share with your child who your favorite saint is and why: Describe how you receive inspiration from the example or teaching of this saint (or saintly person, whether canonized or not). Explain to your child the reason you are devoted to this saint and talk about other people whom you admire.

Offer a story about how your faith helped you in a difficult time in your life: Think back to a time when you made an important decision and, if you are comfortable, share how your faith shaped the decision. Set aside time to also talk about how your faith helps you on a daily basis.

Give your child your time and attention; listen to their hopes and dreams: The care and concern you express for your child provides a foundation upon which your child can accept God's love and the love of others. Every day you help to shape the attitude your child brings to prayer and worship. The loving attention you share with your child prepares him or her to encounter Jesus in the heart, in the Eucharist, and in other people.
