Matters Arising - Minutes 15th December 1978.

Page 2. Exclusion of 15 year old.

R. Wynn expressed his concern that the club was closed to boys of this age. He was advised that the previous committee had considered this matter very carefully and had decided that as 15 year olds could ride with the Adult Club, the club should save any membership vacancies for younger riders. However, the situation would be reviewed after 12 months.

Page 3. 17 year olds.

D. Thompson felt that club should encourage these riders to assist in the organisation of trials, practices, etc., with a view to permitting them to ride. It was confirmed that the club welcomes these riders to assist in setting out courses, giving tuition at practices, or back markers but under the current A.C.U. regulations 17 year old riders are not allowed to compete in any way in youth events.

Page 4. Crowthorne Club Challenge.

The K.Y.T.C. had been invited to ride with this club on 7th April 1979. The event is open to all class 'C' and 'B' riders and in addition the K.Y.T.C. to forward a team of 6 class 'C' and 6 class 'B' riders to compete for a Challenge Trophy. R. Cooper to revert with suggestions regarding the format of the challenge. ✓

It was agreed to invite the Crowthorne Club (in total) to participate in our trial on 22nd July 1979. If this date was not convenient, then R. Cooper to revert with alternatives. ✓

Page 5. Experts Trial.

G. Lemmon suggested that a small trial should be organised purely for the Club's Experts, possibly with an Adult

Expert setting out the course. To be discussed further at the next meeting.

G. Cressey agreed to organise this with authority to purchase and scrounge prizes.

Car Parking.

Club Finance.

In the absence of M. Banks this item was deferred until the next meeting.

Chairman's Report.

The next A.C.U. Youth Division Committee meeting would take place on 4th February 1979 and it was suggested the A.C.U. Committee should be asked to send out a copy of the Youth Regulations with the new licences.

T. Dobbs would be donating the awards for the January trial and had asked for shields to be purchased. The club would pay for the engraving on these awards. Letter of thanks to be sent by D. Brown.

At the next meeting the Committee should appoint a sub-committee consisting of about 6 - 8 people, to organise the National Championship Trial in August 1979, but not necessarily existing Committee Members.

Competition Secretary.

The trial at Tibbs Court on 17th December 1978 was a very good event, possibly the best of the year, but unfortunately two riders had been excluded and an official protest received from Mr. Legge in respect of his son, J. Legge (45).

J. Legge had been penalised 10 marks on section 2 of the last lap. Mr. Legge advised the Committee that he had personally accompanied his son for the duration of the trial and that all sections were attempted. The observer had been telephoned and it was confirmed that a mistake could have been made. Therefore, the protest was upheld and the mark reduced to 5.

D. Burroughs was disqualified for riding without gloves and S. Wynn for riding about after the event. In addition to this, D. Burroughs had approached the Committee to draw their attention to the fact that the scrutineer had allowed two riders to compete without chainguards (against Club Rules).

Considerable discussion took place whether the disqualified riders should be re-instated and no action taken against the riders without chainguards. It was pointed out that G. Lemmon had taken these steps as the club's rules had been broken and therefore should be supported.

It was proposed that all four riders, D. Burroughs, S. Wynn, J. Smith and K. Williams, should be disqualified.

It was agreed that the boys should be personally advised of the Committee's decision and then to confirm this in writing (D. Lemmon).

The problem of the chainguards highlighted the need for a scrutineer to be appointed for the whole year, ideally a Committee Member.

The trial at Fax Farm proved to be hard due to changing weather conditions. A rider had complained that one section was dangerous. It was agreed that at all future events there must be a compound

Page 3. Gravesend Eagles have now confirmed that we could use Peter's Pit for the National, but could not allow us the use of the cement factory.

The Sub-committee had met and the Minutes have been circulated.
