A fine job by club members to cut out new sections now making this an excellent venue for Club Trials. Course setters for this trial were Roger Thompson, Les Matton, & Pete Sadler, well done lads. With a number of Experts on National duty we had an entry of 25.

With no caravan signing on was done out of the back of Cathy's car, good job the weather was fine..... Bob now has a sound system to save his voice and so you have no excuse not to hear. Lets hope he doesn't get carried away and burst into a Karioke version of "My Way" !!!

All sections were manned mainly by committee members and the regulars for a change. The section sharing idea seems to be catching on though, well done Vic.

### Section One.

Observed by Mr Burd, no cleans recorded here by either the A or B riders though plenty of clean rides in the C&D notably Darryl and Ben in the C and Adam & Nicky in the D's.

### Section Two.

Observed by Vic & Nigel, big drops and climbs in the bowl, Bryn managed a clean on the last lap, Grant had cleans on laps 3 & 4. Nick Bullock had trouble getting up the hill until it was discovered that he had about 40lb in the rear tyre!

### Section Three.

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## Y.M.S.A. TWO DAY TRIAL

The weekend of the 13/14 June saw the coming of the YMSA Two Day Trial set in Derbyshire. This is a trial that Kent Youth have supported for some years now. This year was no exception, those members who made the trek up the M1 (or the M40!...Roy) were treated to two glorious days of trials.

The Kent families involved were The Dunks, Mattons, Craigs, Nutbrowns, Rodemarks, Bridges, Gilberts and Thompsons. Adrian Howard & Ian Hodges turned up "to have a laugh" as Aldo put it.

Day one was in Magical Mick Andrews back garden! Superb ground with mostly rock sections, for the Experts 15 of them 4 times! The temperature in the high 70's they set off at 1.30ish. This Club cater for all classes of riders, A,B,C,D, inters, Experts, Novice, Guests, you name it. Les Matton was riding his BSA Bantam for The British Bike Award (the only bike in the class) and Nigel Craig his Honda for the Twin Shock Award (also the only bike in the class), so we had this tied up.

As I said 15 very hard sections in difficult conditions over rather large boulders, as Bryn said "I've never seen a rock till today never mind ride over one". By the early evening the sections had been mastered, punctures had been mended and water poured over riders to help the dehydration. This was aided later on in and around Matlock Bath by the Kimberly Ale company.

After a well deserved nights sleep the second day was to be at a disused quarry a few miles down the road.

Another fifteen sections faced the lads today. Some resembling Kent type going some not..... This venue (incidentally up for sale anyone with a 100 grand to spend?) had every type of terrain, rocks, trees, a stream and even mud, oh and a Moto Cross Course.

The YMSA have a great way of getting observers, they insist that each rider provides an observer on one or other of the days, maybe an idea we can adopt.

After what seemed by Saturdays standards a much easier day with the marks reducing somewhat, could have been the cooler weather had some part in it, the day ended with Luke Wood of the Aprilla B Team giving a demonstration while the results were worked out.

All finishers of the two days received a trophy or was it an ice scraper as a memento of the event, a nice touch.

Main award winners were Stevie Dunk who came third in the C Class, and Les Matton got to his delight a 2nd Class Award for his efforts.

The North vs South Challenge ended in us getting a hiding, less said the better.

A thoughly enjoyable two days perhaps we may see more members next year.

DIRECTIONSOpen Day - Sturry

Take A 28 from Canterbury to Sturry and take the A291. Gun club is over the level crossing, up the hill on your left.

Trial - Sheppy

Take A249 across Kingsferry bridge. At roundabout turn right. Take left turn into Barton Hill Drive. At 'T' Junction turn right. Turn left into Broadway, follow this road to the sea wall. Turn left into car park at Batons Point. DO NOT RIDE ON THE SEA WALL.

Practice - Matfield

Take B2160 Paddock Wood to Pembury road, turn right after Matfield opposite war memorial, field on left so follow markers.

The Ten Golden Rules

- 1) You must wear, Helmet, Boots, Gloves, Long Sleeves.
- 2) Your bike must be fitted with, Chain Guards, Kill Button, Self Closing Throttle, and be Silenced.
- 3) Your bike must be scrutineered before signing on
- 4) You and your parent must sign on.
- 5) No riding before signing on.
- 6) No riding in the Car Park.
- 7) Do not carry your punch card in your mouth.
- 8) Do not argue with the observer.
- 9) Stick to the marked route between sections.
- 10) Sign off, then no more riding.
