After the first lap Steve Dunk led Steve Craig

to his lead. With only 7 marks lost over the  
next two laps the Canterbury ace cruised home  
losing 1/3rd of the marks of runner up Steve C  
whose riding was ultra consistent as over his  
last 3 laps he lost 15-15-15.

Third was Luke Paine who once again had bike  
trouble with no power after a few laps. This  
time he completed the trial on Steve D's TYZ  
and, low and behold, posted his best lap on the  
bike. (That's bad news isn't it David!!)

Nick Bullock had a lonely ride in 4th spot,  
improving lap by lap to get his score down to  
22 by the final tour.

Novices

Closest finish of the day was between Dan Bullock  
and Greg Kennedy with just one mark between them  
at the end. Dan was riding a brand spanking new  
TYZ Yamaha only for the second time and he  
admitted that he was terrified of dropping the  
gleaming new machine. Greg almost pinched the  
win on the last lap losing one mark to Dan's 8  
but the Yamaha rider really won the trial on the  
first lap when he went 'clean'.

Nicky Dowland took 3rd losing 25 marks in total -  
no thanks to a Fantic 80 that stopped running  
when it felt like it.

Ryan Hoare was next on the Beta with 48 while  
brother Ben seemed to be having dreadful trouble  
with section 5 recording a maximum every lap.

### 'C' Class

Eight riders contested 'C' Class with the under age Daz Richards losing just 2 marks on lap 3 to win from Jimmy Edwards on 5. Having his best ride for a long while and looking more like his old self, Adam Goodsell did well to lose just 9 marks. But for a careless 5 on section one he would have finished further up the list and to make matters worse it was his mum, Debbi, who had to give him the 5!

Also having a good day Chris Stoddart was 4th on 16 with a best lap of just 2 marks lost. Richard Ely was next on 21 but was the only other rider with Daz to get a clean lap - his last. Philip King was 6th on 27, Dean Latter 7th and Rick Marshall 8th.

Ben Ely returned to winning ways with a 13 mark advantage over last months winner James Burroughs, 11 to 24.

Best Beginner award went to Michael Jones who lost 42. Danny Strudwick was next ahead of Andrew Mills. Good to see Andrew finishing after his retirements at Sheppey and Yetnor Farm.

It was also nice to see Simon Bird back at our trials giving a virtuoso performance to lose just 8 over the expert route.

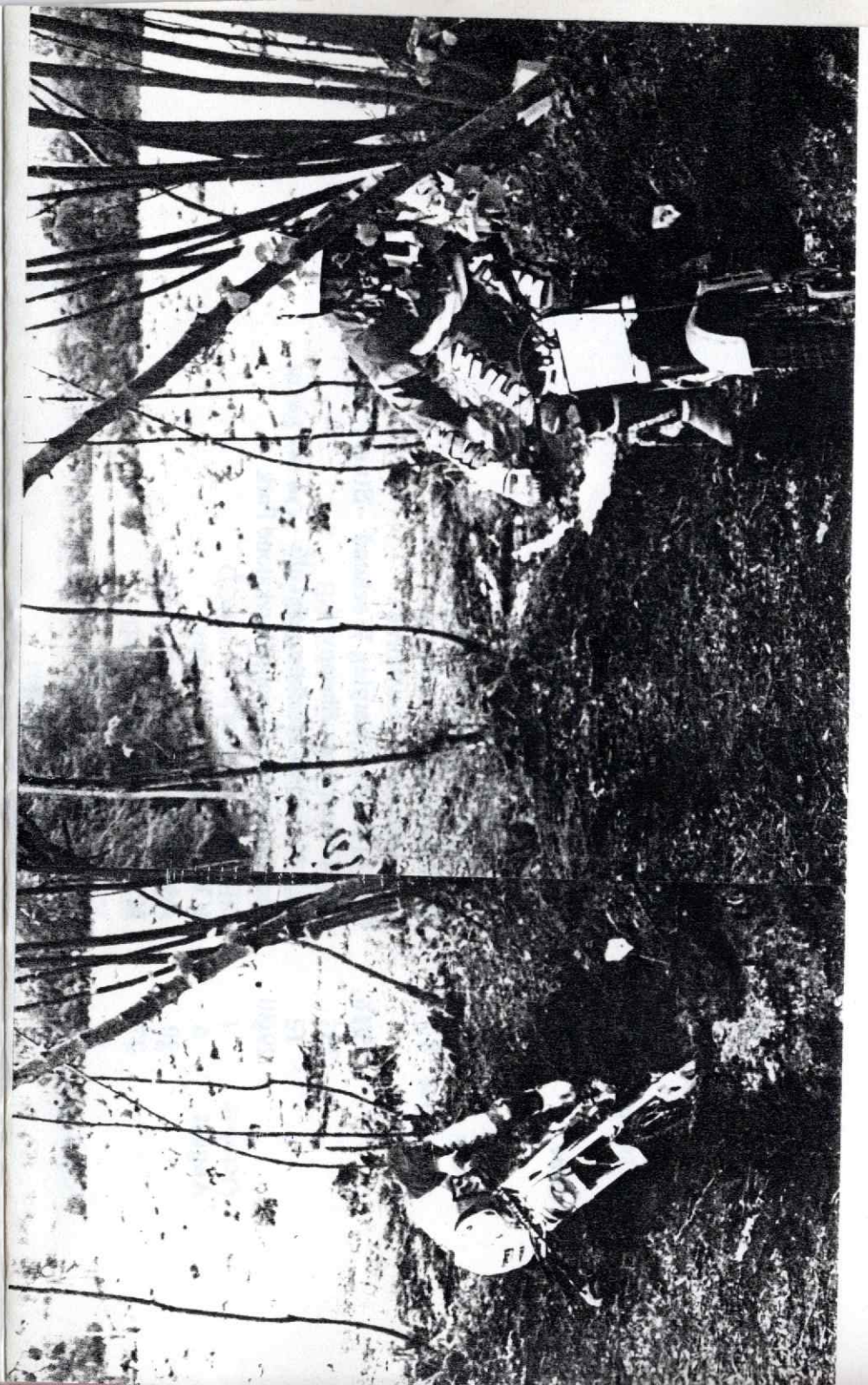

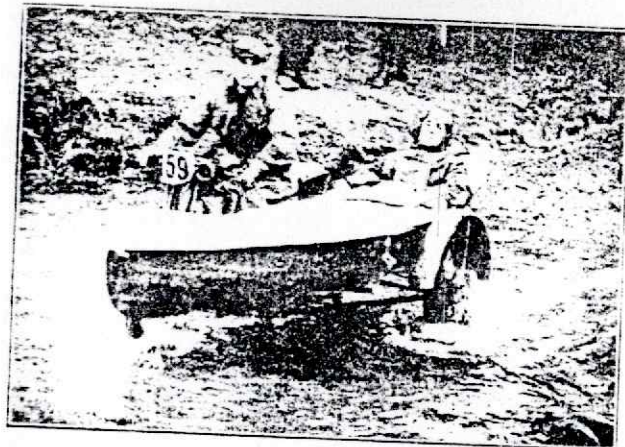

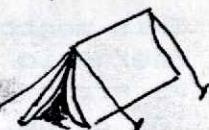

PH. Pamela Anderson and her silicone implant machine.

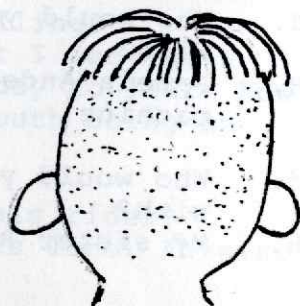
Ed. Who would you least like to be shipwrecked with?

## TRIAL REPORT

### MAY - OWENS FARM

The time...The day before our 4th trial of the year - late Saturday afternoon.  
The place...A totally transformed Owens Farm, devoid of 200 trees.

Ed....."How many sections have we got now?"

Paul....."Er...I'm not sure...nine I think...no ten...on the other hand..."

Ed....."Shall we count them?"

Paul.....No, no it's 10 definately...I think..."

Ed....."O.K...if you're sure....."

Paul....."Why have you put Section 7 Begins at the beginning of this section and Section 8 Ends at the end?"

Ed....."Pass.....it's probably cos me brain is decaying faster than we can set this trial...."

Ed....."Oh Yeah.....what is it then?"

## **The Ten Golden Rules**

- 2) *Your bike must be fitted with, Chain Guards, Kill Button, Self Closing Throttle, and be Silenced.*
- 3) *Your bike must be scrutineered before signing on*
- 4) *You and your parent must sign on.*
- 5) *No riding before signing on.*
- 6) *No riding in the Car Park.*
- 7) *Do not carry your punch card in your mouth.*
- 8) *Do not argue with the observer.*
- 9) *Stick to the marked route between sections.*
- 10) *Sign off, then no more riding.*

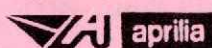
