



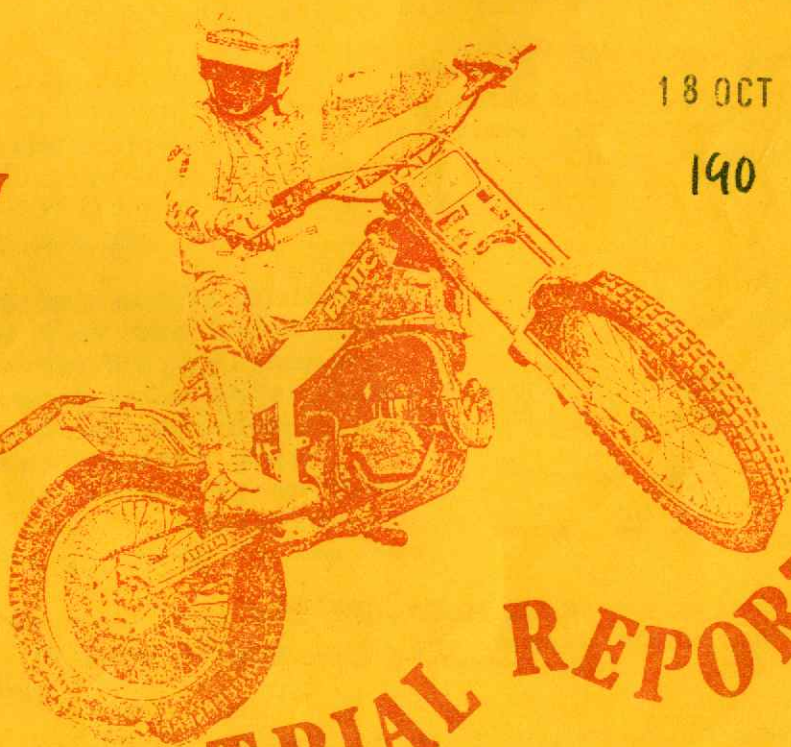

OWENS Farm, Orpington, is a difficult venue to set a trial at the best of times - but, with no forecast, the clerk of the course had his work cut out preparing four routes for the Kent Youth Trial on Sunday. Thankfully, the rain didn't arrive with any force, and riders could enjoy their four laps of nine sections without major problems.

Sole Expert A class rider James Bergersen went round for a first lap of 19 and signed-off with a superb last lap of just five. His overall tally of 46 was the best score of the day. Best of the Expert B class was David Gilbert, who signed-off with a last lap of 14, securing a debut win for his new Gas-Gas Contact 160. His overall tally was 87.

Bryn Manton and Ross Thompson had their usual tussle in the Novice A class, though Bryn just came out the better on each lap. Toby Sparkes put in an improved performance to finish third, just one mark behind Ross.

Stephen Dunk pipped Grant Stone for the honours in the Novice B class. Grant was in front for the first two laps, but Steven closed the gap over the next two. The eventual outcome was decided on the penultimate hazard, with Stephen gaining victory by a single mark.

Ben Smith came walked the C Class in the absence of his arch-rival Darryl Jeffery. There was a good battle for second place, though, between Greg Kennedy and Steve Thompson. Nicky Dowland maintained his unbeaten record in the D Class, winning more easily than ever. Adam Goodsell was, as usual, the bridesmaid. On the east-east of the routes, Ryan Chapman took the Best Beginner award with a loss of 47.

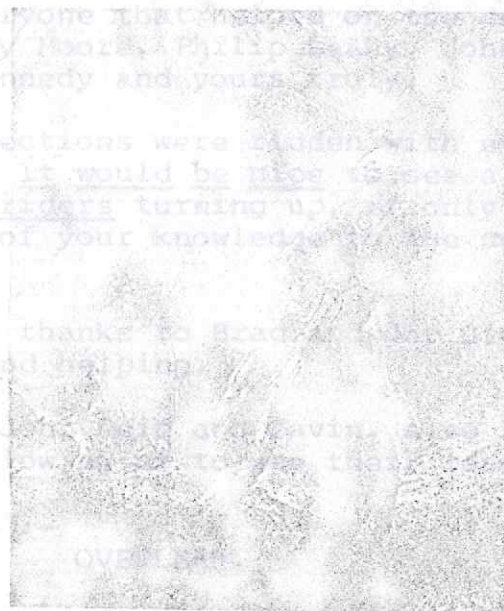

DIRECTIONS.TRIAL at MATFIELD

Take B 2160 Paddock Wood to Pembury Road. Sheppy

Turn Right after Matfield opposite War Memorial.

Follow markers down lane, entrance is on the Left.

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The Ten Golden Rules

- 1) You must wear, Helmet, Boots, Gloves, Long Sleeves.
- 2) Your bike must be fitted with, Chain Guards, Kill Button, Self Closing Throttle, and be Silenced.
- 3) Your bike must be scrutineered before signing on
- 4) You and your parent must sign on.
- 5) No riding before signing on.
- 6) No riding in the Car Park.
- 7) Do not carry your punch card in your mouth.
- 8) Do not argue with the observer.
- 9) Stick to the marked route between sections.
- 10) Sign off, then no more riding.
