

Strong Wellington Boots (Steel Top Caps if possible)



The riders will start at 10.00 a.m from Withdean Stadium, Brighton, and the course is 25 miles. The A E U advise spectators to enquire at the stadium which would be the best sections to visit and to try and obtain routes from the Brighton Club officials at the stadium. If you can get Mum and Dad to take you, they feel you would benefit by watching the experts.

Finding your way

At the next practice Bob Simcock will be not at a particular spot to guide you to the trial. Bob stated at the committee that when you eventually enter other trials, you would have to find your own way there guided by the laid down markers. We hope Mum and Dad will co-operate and leave it up to you to guide them in. What you will be looking for: Notice will be a Large Arrow pointing in the direction you must go. On the notice will be K.Y.T.C. After this you will be looking for markers painted RED for keep Right, BLUE for keep left. WHITE for Straight On.
