This Week's Reflection

Reflexión De Esta Semana

Being Unified

Unity could be called the theme of the readings today. Unity demands effort, but unity brings a sense of peace. In our First Reading, we hear of the first Christian being martyred. As St. Stephen is being stoned, he prays the first prayer addressed to Jesus in scriptures, a prayer to be united with Jesus through his death. The Responsorial Psalm speaks of the unity of all peoples as they praise the Lord God Who is ruler of all the world. In our Second Reading, St. John shares the message of Jesus, the Alpha and the Omega, Who is coming soon to unite all people. In the Gospel, Jesus prays to His Abba-Father and asks that His followers be one, just as Jesus and His Abba are one.

The stoning of St. Stephen is the first in a few ways. It is the first martyrdom of a believer in Jesus. During his stoning, Stephen prays the first prayer addressed to Jesus. Stephen also, like Jesus before him, prays for those who are mistaken in their drive to martyr him, including a certain Saul who will later become St. Paul, the Apostle to the Gentiles. Stephen senses a connection, a union, with Jesus and even with those who are part of his persecutors. His being a witness unites him with all who will be martyrs after him, including Paul.

The psalm today is a hymn of praise of the Lord God Who rules over all. Not only does God rule over all, but all peoples see God's glory and raise a song of joy over what God does.

In the Second Reading, St. John concludes the Book of Revelation with Jesus' promise that, as the Alpha (Beginning) and the Omega (End), He is coming soon to unite all who call upon Him. The only response we can say is the prayer, "Come, Lord Jesus!"

The Gospel is part of Jesus' Last Supper Discourse (John chapters 13-17). Today's pericope is part of Jesus' prayer for His disciples. He speaks of the unity He has with His Abba and asks that the same unity include His union with His disciples, not just at the time of the Last Supper, but all who will follow Him in future, including us.

"Unity" does not necessarily mean "uniformity." Yes, we are asked to put on the mind of Christ Jesus (cf. Philippians 2). The key aspect of "unity" is the focus of looking beyond oneself to God and to other humans and to all creatures. Our God is a union of three persons: Abba-Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. That union is always other-focused. That is that type of unity we must seek to establish with our One God, and with all who are children of our One God, and all of God's creation. We are not to think first of ourselves and what we want or what we can get out of being joined with others. We must endeavor to reach out and assist others, especially those in need.

So, as we come to the last week of this Easter Season, we are called, commissioned, and sent to bring a greater sense of Unity between all humans and our Triune God, and between all humans, and with all of God's creation. We continue the ministry and mission of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity Who has always been One with His Abba-Father in the Unity of the Holy Spirit. Jesus continues to pray for us and promises to be with us, especially as the Holy Spirit leads and guides us. We are to work for uniting of all peoples with the One True God so that we can share in the Unity for all times.

Unidad

La unidad podría ser el tema central de las lecturas de hoy. La unidad exige esfuerzo, pero trae consigo una sensación de paz. En la primera lectura, escuchamos sobre el martirio del primer cristiano. Mientras San Esteban era lapidado, reza la primera oración dirigida a Jesús en las Escrituras: una oración para unirse con Jesús a través de su muerte. El Salmo Responsorial habla de la unidad de todos los pueblos al alabar al Señor Dios, gobernante del mundo entero. En la segunda lectura, San Juan comparte el mensaje de Jesús, el Alfa y la Omega, que viene pronto para unir a todos los pueblos. En el Evangelio, Jesús reza a su Abba-Padre y pide que sus seguidores sean uno, así como Jesús y su Abba son uno.

La lapidación de San Esteban es la primera en varios sentidos. Es el primer martirio de un creyente en Jesús. Durante su lapidación, Esteban reza la primera oración dirigida a Jesús. Esteban también, como Jesús antes que él, reza por aquellos que se equivocan en su afán de martirizarlo, incluyendo a un tal Saulo que más tarde se convertirá en San Pablo, el Apóstol de los Gentiles. Esteban siente una conexión, una unión, con Jesús e incluso con aquellos que forman parte de sus perseguidores. Su ser testigo lo une a todos los que serán mártires después de él, incluyendo a Pablo.

El salmo de hoy es un himno de alabanza al Señor Dios que gobierna sobre todo. Dios no solo gobierna sobre todo, sino que todos los pueblos ven la gloria de Dios y elevan un cántico de alegría por lo que Dios hace.

En la segunda lectura, San Juan concluye el libro del Apocalipsis con la promesa de Jesús de que, como el Alfa (Principio) y la Omega (Fin), Él vendrá pronto para unir a todos los que lo invocan. La única respuesta que podemos decir es la oración: "¡Ven, Señor Jesús!".

El Evangelio es parte del discurso de la Última Cena de Jesús (Juan capítulos 13-17). La perícopa de hoy es parte de la oración de Jesús por sus discípulos. Habla de la unidad que tiene con su Abba y pide que la misma unidad incluya su unión con sus discípulos, no solo en el momento de la Última Cena, sino con todos los que lo seguirán en el futuro, incluyéndonos a nosotros.

"Unidad" no significa necesariamente "uniformidad". Sí, se nos pide que nos pongamos la mente de Cristo Jesús (cf. Filipenses 2). El aspecto clave de la "unidad" es el enfoque de mirar más allá de uno mismo hacia Dios, hacia los demás humanos y hacia todas las criaturas. Nuestro Dios es una unión de tres personas: Abba-Padre, Jesús y el Espíritu Santo. Esa unión siempre está centrada en el otro. Ese es el tipo de unidad que debemos buscar establecer con nuestro Único Dios, y con todos los que son hijos de nuestro Único Dios, y con toda la creación de Dios. No debemos pensar primero en nosotros mismos ni en lo que queremos o lo que podemos obtener al estar unidos con otros. Debemos esforzarnos por acercarnos y ayudar a los demás, especialmente a los necesitados.

Así, al llegar a la última semana de este Tiempo de Pascua, somos llamados, comisionados y enviados a traer un mayor sentido de Unidad entre todos los humanos y nuestro Dios Trino, y entre todos los humanos, y con toda la creación de Dios. Continuamos el ministerio y la misión de la Segunda Persona de la Santísima Trinidad, que siempre ha sido Uno con Su Abba-Padre en la Unidad del Espíritu Santo. Jesús continúa orando por nosotros y promete estar con nosotros, especialmente mientras el Espíritu Santo nos guía. Debemos trabajar por la unión de todos los pueblos con el Único Dios Verdadero para que podamos compartir la Unidad para todos los tiempos.

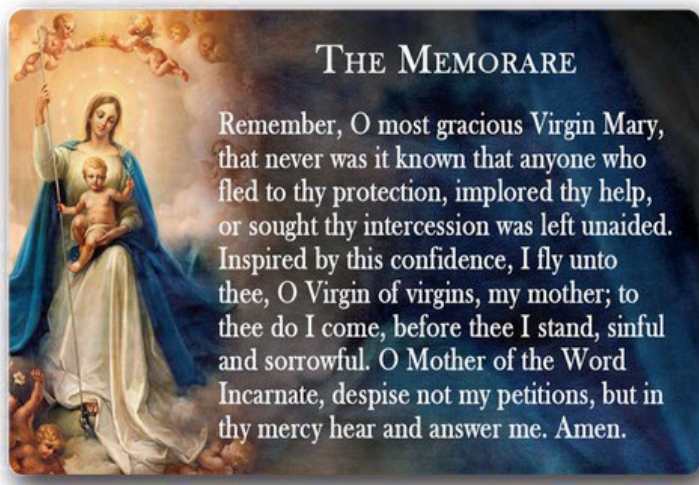

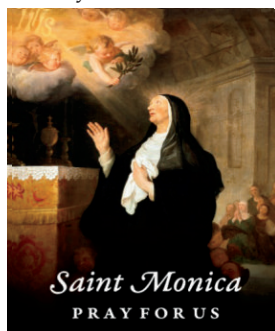
