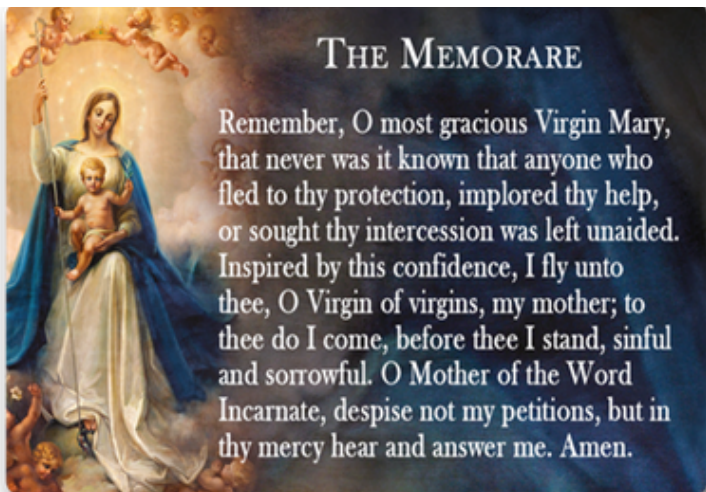

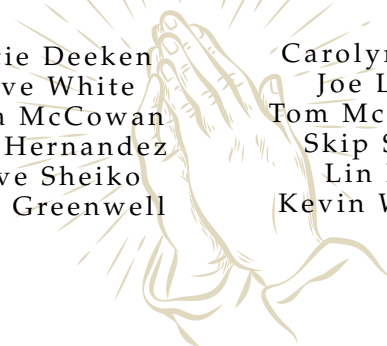

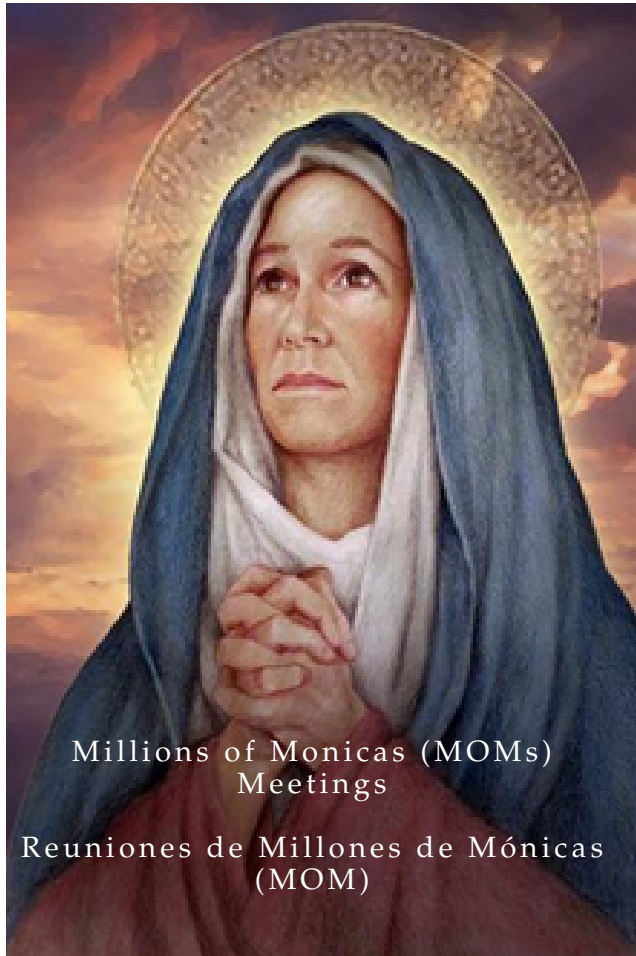

## This Week's Reflection Reflexión De Esta Semana

### **Easter Sunday** *Believing Is Seeing*

You've heard the saying "Seeing is believing." Today's first reading seems to say just the opposite. You might think that when Jesus rose from the dead, everyone would see him. Then his friends would rejoice and those who had put him to death would repent (or run as fast as they could). Yet Peter says that he was only visible to some of the disciples. Jesus did not appear to Herod or Pilate or Caiaphas. The Pharisees and scribes did not see him, either. Even the disciples did not immediately see him. The first thing they saw was the empty tomb, with burial cloths lying on the ground. They may have thought that if his enemies had stolen Jesus' body, they would not have removed the burial cloths; touching a corpse would have made them unclean. So it seems the empty tomb helped them to believe, and believing enabled them to see the Lord. The exception to this may be Thomas, who said he would not believe until he saw and touched Jesus' risen body. Yet when he does see the Lord, Jesus himself declares that believing is primary when he blesses those who have not seen but still believe (John 20:31). Another example could be Mary of Magdala. She saw him, thinking he was the gardener. Then she believed and recognized him. What does this mean for us? Jesus seems to be hidden again. Yet we say that he is present in the sacraments; Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation show that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit live in us. So perhaps we just need to believe in order to see him. Mother Teresa could do it. She said she was amazed at the love she felt when she saw Jesus in the poor and the dying people of Calcutta. St. Francis saw him not only in the poor but in all creation. Maybe we need to grow in faith so that we can see Jesus in the poor, the dying, the people who annoy us, even our enemies.

### **Domingo de Pascua** *Creer es ver*

Han oído el dicho: "Ver para creer". La primera lectura de hoy parece decir justo lo contrario. Podríamos pensar que, cuando Jesús resucitó, todos lo verían. Entonces sus amigos se alegrarían y quienes lo habían matado se arrepentirían (o huirían lo más rápido posible). Sin embargo, Pedro dice que solo fue visible para algunos de los discípulos. Jesús no se apareció a Herodes, ni a Pilato, ni a Caifás. Los fariseos y los escribas tampoco lo vieron. Ni siquiera los discípulos lo vieron de inmediato. Lo primero que vieron fue la tumba vacía, con las telas funerarias en el suelo. Quizás pensaron que si sus enemigos hubieran robado el cuerpo de Jesús, no habrían quitado las telas, porque tocar un cadáver los habría vuelto impuros. Así que parece que la tumba vacía los ayudó a creer, y creer les permitió ver al Señor. La excepción podría ser Tomás, quien dijo que no creería hasta que viera y tocara el cuerpo resucitado de Jesús. Sin embargo, cuando ve al Señor, Jesús mismo declara que la fe es lo primordial al bendecir a quienes no han visto pero creen (Juan 20,31). Otro ejemplo podría ser María Magdalena. Ella lo vio, pensando que era el jardinero. Luego creyó y lo reconoció.

¿Qué significa esto para nosotros? Jesús parece estar oculto de nuevo. Sin embargo, decimos que está presente en los sacramentos; el bautismo, la Eucaristía y la confirmación muestran que el Padre, el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo viven en nosotros. Así que quizás solo tenemos que creer para verlo. La Madre Teresa pudo hacerlo. Dijo que estaba asombrada del amor que sentía al ver a Jesús en los pobres y los moribundos de Calcuta. San Francisco lo vio no sólo en los pobres, sino en toda la creación. Quizás necesitamos crecer en la fe para poder ver a Jesús en los pobres, los moribundos, las personas que nos molestan, incluso en nuestros enemigos. Por eso es tan importante difundir la fe; si no vemos a Jesús en todos, quizás nunca tengamos verdadera paz.

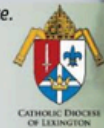

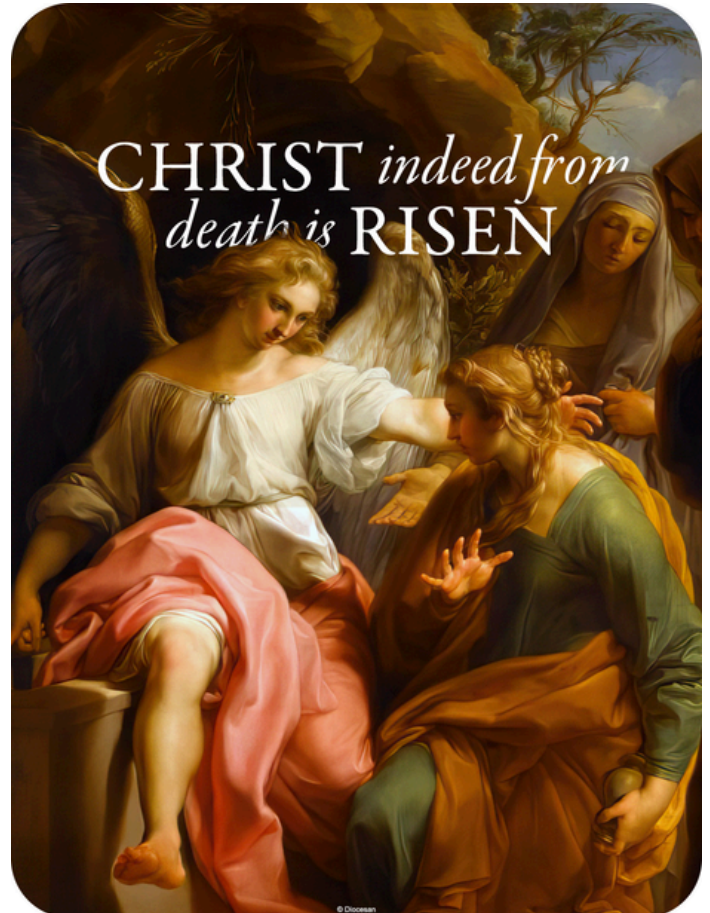

## New Hearing Assistance System

St. Luke's has recently installed a system to help our members who need hearing assistance. This new system has two ways to help with hearing the Mass and announcements.

### Method 1:

We have a limited number of receiver/headphone units that the ushers can give you to use for the duration of the Mass. Simple to use. Just turn it on, put on the headphones, and adjust the volume to your liking.

### Method 2:

You can scan the QR code to the left with your smart phone. It walks you through how to download an app, connect to our wi-fi, and use the app. Once the app starts to play the Mass, you can redirect the audio to your own Bluetooth headphones or ear buds or even your own hearing aids if they are Bluetooth enabled.
