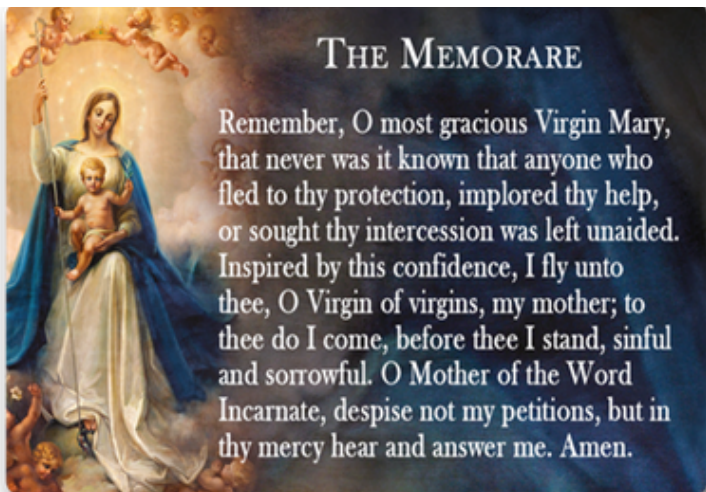

The Women's Group will be preparing a meal for The Homeless Shelter on Saturday, April 18th at 2:00pm, in the church basement. All are welcome.

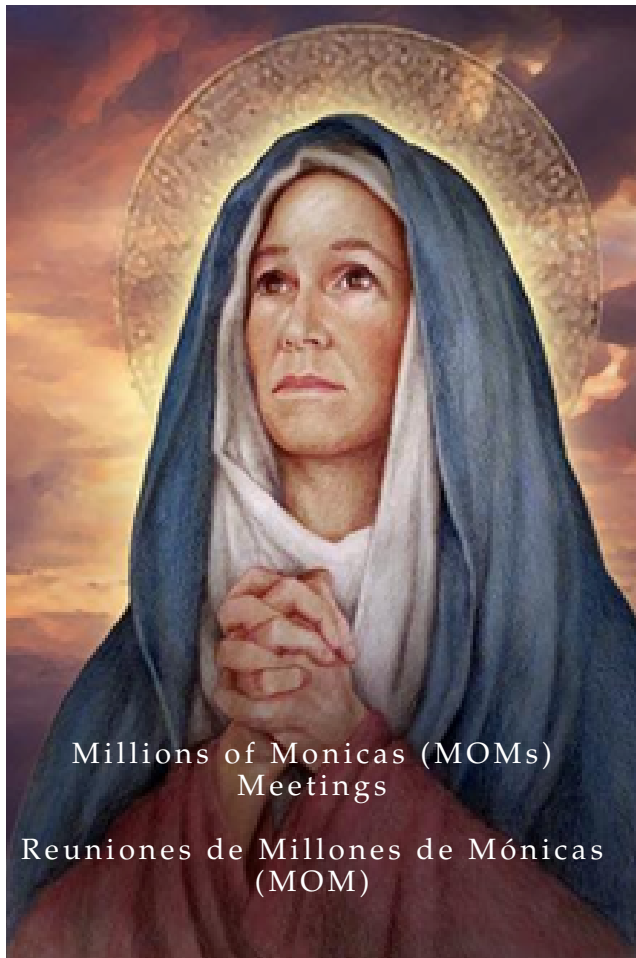

This Week's Reflection Reflexión De Esta Semana

Palm Sunday *My Will Be Done*

One of the most comforting parts of the Passion story for me is the agony in the garden. That might sound odd, considering how the disciples fall asleep while Jesus is in distress. I suppose I could identify with them as they show weakness when Jesus needed strength. But I am really comforted by Jesus' words. If the Son of God had to tell himself and his Father, "not as I will, but as you will" (Matthew 26:39), I should be able to say the same. There are times when I would much rather have things always go my way, but that is not going to happen. So it's comforting to know that Jesus did not take the easy way out, but accepted the Father's will that he should suffer and die.

Whenever we say the Lord's Prayer we pray, "Thy will be done." But how often do we still take the easy way out? Ever hear someone tell a lie or spread gossip that hurts a person's reputation? We can choose to do nothing (the easy way) or gently reproach the other with a simple question, "What would Jesus do?" When I have a chance to help someone in need, do I tell myself it's none of my business, or do I ask if there is anything I can do? When I am hurt by the death of a loved one, or am injured in an accident, do I get angry at God for letting this happen, or do I say with Jesus, "Not my will, but yours be done"?

Luke's Gospel ends the temptation of Jesus in the desert with the phrase, "When the devil had finished every test, he left him until an opportune time" (Luke 4:13). That time came in the garden. and again Jesus had the last word, choosing to do his Father's will. Our temptations continue every day as we face frustrations, desire for things we can't have, unanswered prayers, or our own weaknesses. Even though we know God always does what is best for us when we would rather have what we think is best, at least remember to say, "Not my will, but yours be done."

Domingo de Ramos *Hágase mi voluntad*

Una de las partes más reconfortantes de la Pasión para mí es la agonía en el huerto. Puede sonar extraño, considerando que los discípulos se duermen mientras Jesús sufre. Supongo que podría identificarme con ellos, pues muestran debilidad cuando Jesús necesitaba fortaleza. Pero me consuelan profundamente las palabras de Jesús. Si el Hijo de Dios tuvo que decirse a sí mismo y a su Padre: "que no se haga mi voluntad, sino la tuya" (Mateo 26,39), yo también debería poder decir lo mismo. Hay momentos en que preferiría que las cosas siempre salieran como yo quiero, pero eso no va a suceder. Por eso, es reconfortante saber que Jesús no tomó el camino fácil, sino que aceptó la voluntad del Padre de sufrir y morir.

Cuando rezamos el Padrenuestro, oramos: "hágase tu voluntad". Pero, ¿con qué frecuencia seguimos tomando el camino fácil? ¿Alguna vez has oído a alguien mentir o difundir chismes que dañan la reputación de otra persona? Podemos optar por no hacer nada (el camino fácil) o reprender amablemente al otro con una simple pregunta: "¿Qué haría Jesús?" Cuando tengo la oportunidad de ayudar a alguien necesitado, ¿me digo a mí mismo que no es asunto mío o pregunto si hay algo que pueda hacer? Cuando me duele la muerte de un ser querido o sufro un accidente, ¿me enojo con Dios por permitir que esto suceda o digo con Jesús: "que no se haga mi voluntad, sino la tuya"? El Evangelio de Lucas concluye la tentación de Jesús en el desierto con la frase: "Cuando el diablo hubo acabado todas las pruebas, lo dejó hasta el momento oportuno" (Lucas 4,13). Ese momento llegó en el huerto, y nuevamente Jesús tuvo la última palabra, eligiendo hacer la voluntad de su Padre. Nuestras tentaciones continúan cada día al enfrentar frustraciones, deseos de cosas que no podemos tener, oraciones sin respuesta o nuestras propias debilidades. Aunque sabemos que Dios siempre hace lo que es mejor para nosotros cuando preferiríamos lo que creemos que es mejor, al menos recordemos decirle: "que no se haga mi voluntad, sino la tuya".

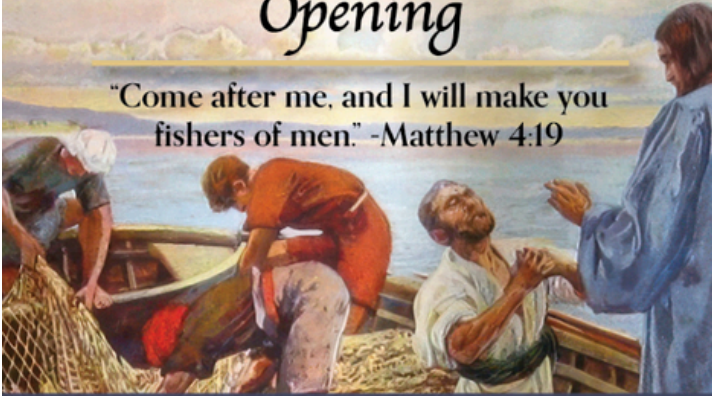

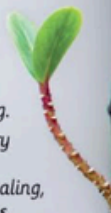

New Hearing Assistance System

St. Luke's has recently installed a system to help our members who need hearing assistance. This new system has two ways to help with hearing the Mass and announcements.

Method 1:

We have a limited number of receiver/headphone units that the ushers can give you to use for the duration of the Mass. Simple to use. Just turn it on, put on the headphones, and adjust the volume to your liking.

Method 2:

You can scan the QR code to the left with your smart phone. It walks you through how to download an app, connect to our wi-fi, and use the app. Once the app starts to play the Mass, you can redirect the audio to your own Bluetooth headphones or ear buds or even your own hearing aids if they are Bluetooth enabled.

Reconciliation

Confessions are heard for 30 minutes before each weekend Mass time and may be heard upon request. Please call Fr. Aldrin to make an appointment.

Baptism

Parents must be registered parishioners and must also attend instruction prior to Baptism. Call the parish office to make arrangements.
