This Week's Reflection

Reflexión De Esta Semana

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

Loving Obedience

One theme common to all three readings today is obedience. Sirach commends the son who obeys his father. St. Paul tells children to obey their parents "in everything." And the Gospel shows Joseph obedient to the warnings of the angel. Yet all three put obedience in terms of a larger relationship.

Sirach says that obedience is part of what makes a happy family. Children trust that their parents have good reason for telling them to do something. Children also learn both discipline and how to contribute to family life.

St. Paul shows how love of Christ transforms a family. When he talks about wives being subordinate and husbands loving them, he means that husbands and wives should defer to each other and love each other.

Parents might look at the gospel for support in encouraging obedience. Families can learn that stressing obedience can protect the child as well as teach. Parents can also remind children that God asks for obedience for our good, not on a whim. When we obey God's law, we learn to trust God more deeply and to appreciate that God's law enables us to live more freely.

Obediencia Amorosa

Un tema común en las tres lecturas de hoy es la obediencia. La lectura de Eclesiástico elogia al hijo que obedece a su padre. Luego San Pablo les dice a los hijos que obedezcan a sus padres "en todo". Y el Evangelio muestra a José obediente a las advertencias del ángel. Sin embargo, los tres consideran a la obediencia en términos de una relación más amplia.

Eclesiástico afirma que la obediencia forma parte de la felicidad familiar. Los hijos confían en que sus padres tienen buenas razones para decirles que hagan algo. Los hijos también aprenden disciplina y a contribuir a la vida familiar.

San Pablo muestra cómo el amor de Cristo transforma una familia. Cuando habla de que las esposas deben ser subordinadas y los esposos deben amarlas, quiere decir que ambos deben respetarse y amarse mutuamente.

Los padres pueden buscar apoyo en el Evangelio para fomentar la obediencia. Las familias pueden aprender que enfatizar la obediencia puede proteger al niño, además de enseñarle. Los padres también pueden recordarles a sus hijos que Dios pide obediencia para nuestro bien, no por capricho. Cuando obedecemos la ley de Dios, aprendemos a confiar más profundamente en Dios y a valorar que la ley de Dios nos permite vivir más libremente.

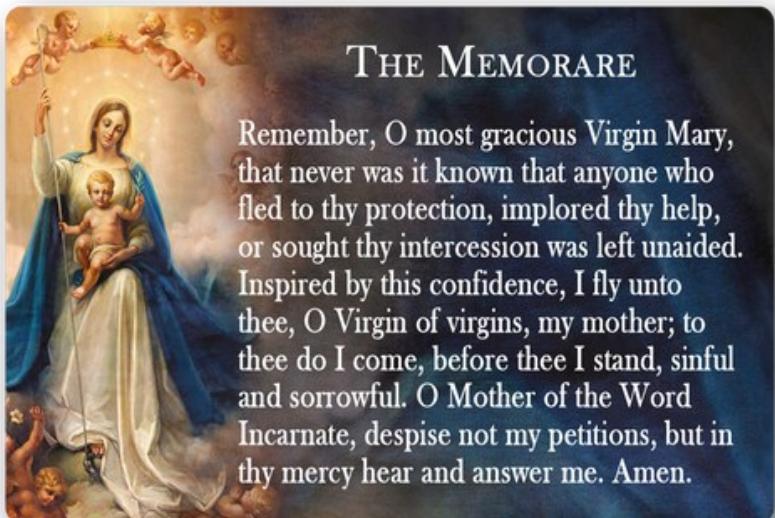





Dear parishioners,

For more than ten years, Saint Luke Church has prayerfully sought to purchase the empty lot adjacent to the church for future parking needs and possible expansion of our church spaces. Despite our efforts, the owner of that property has chosen not to sell.

Several years ago, one of our generous parishioners donated \$60,000 specifically for the purchase of property adjoining the church. These funds were designated solely for that purpose and could not have been used toward the capital campaign or anything else.

About a month ago, the owner of the property located behind Saint Luke Church, at 103 Brown Street, approached us with an offer to sell their land and home—which extends half the length of our church property—before listing it publicly. After careful discernment, I convened the Finance Council, our Parish Council president, and the Property Committee chairperson to review this opportunity. Together, we agreed that pursuing this purchase would be in the best interest of our parish.

Through God's providence and the generosity of our community:

- The parishioner who donated \$60,000 agreed that these funds should be used for this purchase.
- The property owners graciously reduced the sale price by \$30,000, effectively donating that amount to our church.
- Another parishioner has pledged \$40,000 exclusively for the property purchase.

With these blessings, the total cost to Saint Luke Church was **\$70,000**, which was drawn from our general fund. Please note we did NOT use capital campaign funds for the purchase and those funds remain dedicated solely to the projects reflected in the renderings displayed on the monitor at the back of the church.

Looking ahead, this property will serve our parish well. In the future, it will provide space for additional parking and storage. In the meantime, we will rent the house to a parishioner, generating income.

This is a moment of thanksgiving for our parish family. We are grateful to God for opening this door, and to our parishioners whose generosity and faithfulness make such opportunities possible.

Let us continue to pray that this new property will serve Saint Luke Church for generations to come.


