





# Baby Bottle CAMPAIGN



The St. Luke Right to Life Ministry is again sponsoring the “Baby Bottle Blessings” program beginning on Sunday January 18. Baby bottles will be available in the vestibule for you to take home and fill with currency or coin (or you can write a check) to benefit Assurance for Life, a non-profit health clinic in Lexington, Kentucky, offering free, confidential support for unplanned pregnancies, including pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, STI testing, and counseling on parenting, adoption, and abortion. The bottles need to be returned by Sunday February 15. The Knights of Columbus and the Women’s Group both have supported Assurance in the past and encourage you to take a baby bottle home and offer your support and prayers for the unborn.

**This Week's Reflection***Reflexión De Esta Semana***Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time***Boast in the Lord*

What are you most proud of? What do you like to boast about? Were you top of your class in college? Do you work harder than anyone in your office? Everyone likes to have something they are the best at, or at least very good. But it really is kind of silly to base your own worth on what you accomplish. What truly makes us important is that we are loved by God. Our second reading tells how God uses the foolish, weak, or poorest people to shame those who are wise, strong, and wealthy. Why? Because God loves the poor, the weak, the disabled, the homeless just as much as God loves the important people.

And it's not just the external qualities that are important. Some wealthy people have great love for the poor. Some of the best teachers only work with disabled children. Our Gospel on the Beatitudes today makes that clear if you listen carefully. Blessed are not just the poor, but the poor in spirit; not only the hungry, but those who hunger for righteousness. That's what Saint Paul means when he says, "Whoever boasts, should boast in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 1:31).

So how do we get to be "important" to God? Instead of asking God to make my projects a success, I can ask what God wants me to do. And for all the good that you do, remember to thank the Lord.
