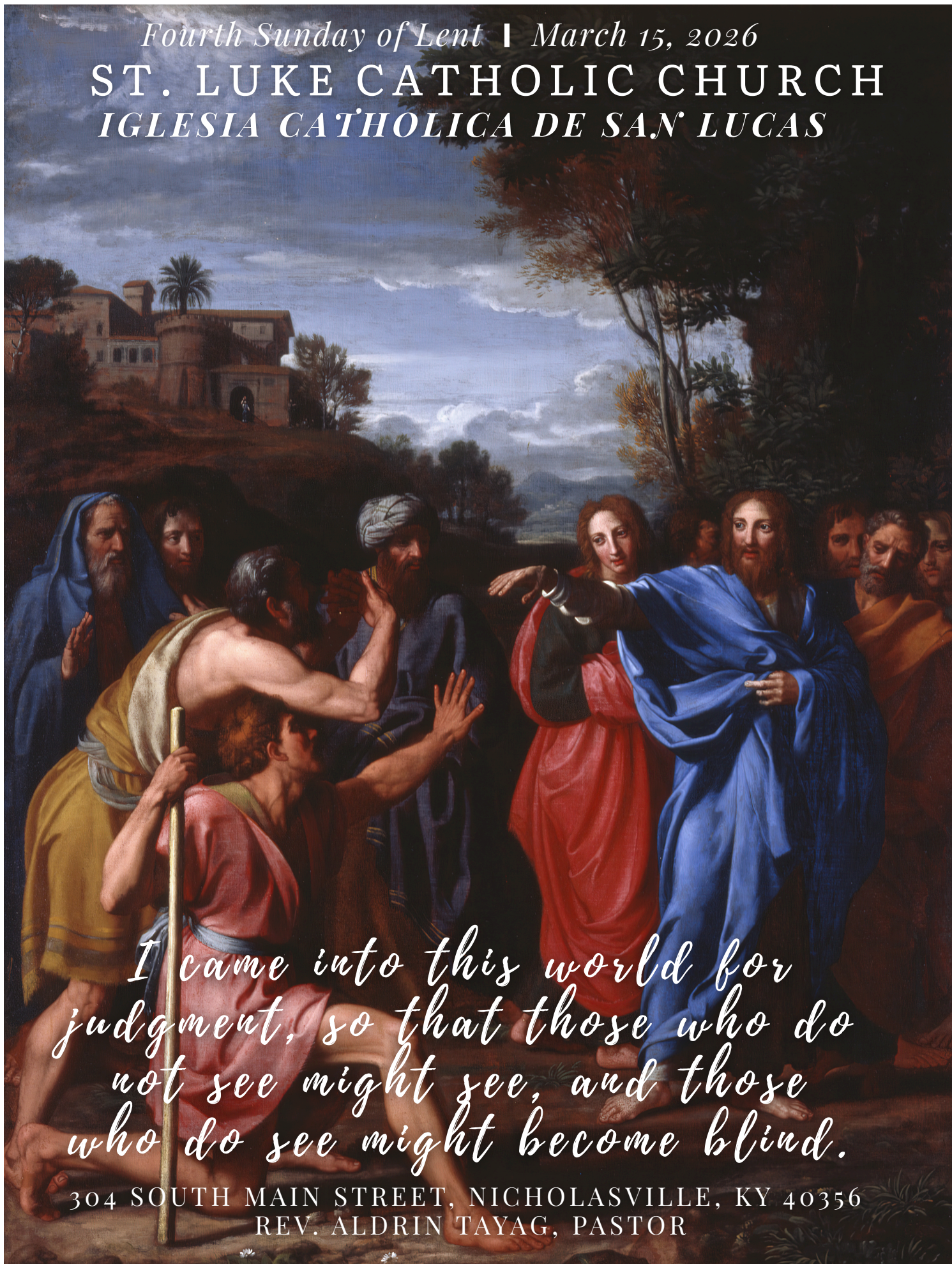

The Women's Group will be preparing a meal for The Homeless Shelter on Saturday, April 18th at 2:00pm, in the church basement. All are welcome.

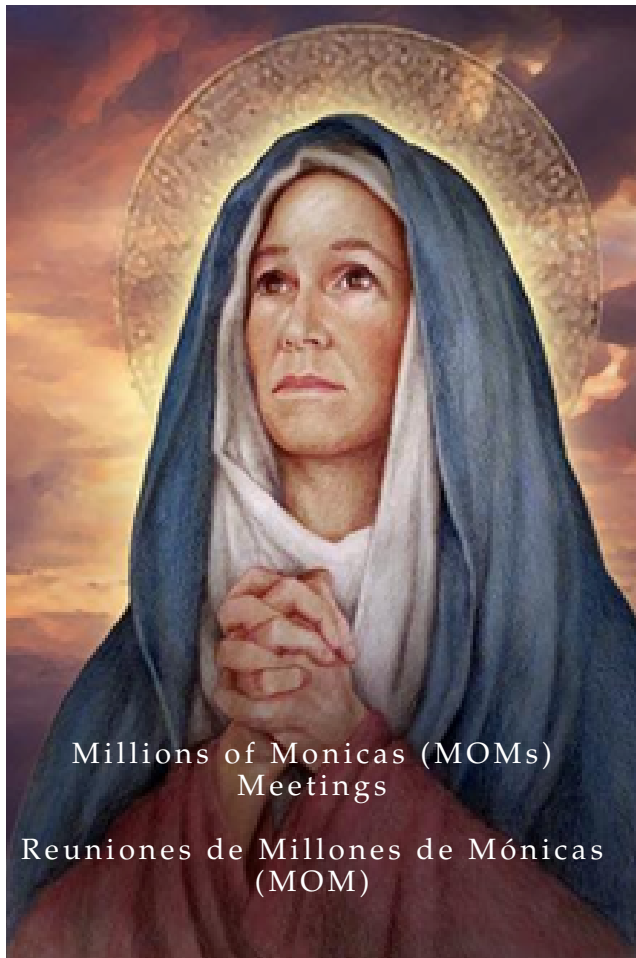

This Week's Reflection Reflexión De Esta Semana

Fourth Sunday of Lent *Beware of the Dark Side*

Do you remember the Star Wars movies, in which the Dark Side was a symbol of evil? In our second reading Paul tells the Christians in Ephesus that they were once in darkness. Paul uses darkness as a symbol of shame. Shame is not just sorrow for sins; it is the fear of being caught in sin, or of telling our weaknesses to another because we think the other will look down on us. Or you might fear the punishment you think you deserve. Paul was a sinner himself and was blinded when Jesus appeared to him, asking, "Why do you persecute me?" So he knew that the only way to be free of shame is not to hide sins, but to expose them.

Does that mean we have to broadcast our sins on the evening news, or post them all on our social media pages? No; we just need to confess them to God and receive God's forgiveness. We can do this through the sacrament of reconciliation. The priest shows that God loves sinners, no matter what they have done. When you injure your arm, you explain how you hurt it, so the doctor knows how to treat it. If you wreck your car, you take it to the repair shop and tell the mechanics what is broken so they can repair it. In reconciliation we bring our sins to the priest so that we can experience forgiveness. You could leave your car at the shop overnight, with enough cash to make the repairs, but until you come back and claim your car, you will never know if it was fixed. Sometimes other people try to shame us. In today's Gospel, Jesus' disciples asked whose sin caused the man to be born blind. The Pharisees told the man that he was born in sin. Jesus, however, told his disciples that the man had not sinned, and furthermore, the Pharisees themselves were the sinners because they had judged the blind man. So when we know that God forgives us and still loves us, we don't have to fear what others might think. Let us instead hold our sins up to the light of forgiveness and be free of our shame.

Cuarto Domingo de Cuaresma *Cuidado con el Lado Oscuro*

¿Recuerdan las películas de Star Wars, donde el Lado Oscuro era un símbolo del mal? En la segunda lectura, Pablo les dice a los cristianos de Éfeso que antes andaban en la oscuridad. Pablo usa la oscuridad como símbolo de vergüenza. La vergüenza no es solo el dolor por los pecados; es el miedo a ser descubiertos en el pecado, o a confesar nuestras debilidades a otros por temor a ser juzgados. O quizás temas el castigo que crees merecer. El mismo Pablo era pecador y estaba cegado cuando Jesús se le apareció, preguntándole: "¿Por qué me persigues?" Por eso sabía que la única manera de liberarse de la vergüenza no es ocultar los pecados, sino exponerlos.

¿Significa esto que debemos divulgar nuestros pecados en las noticias o publicarlos en nuestras redes sociales? No. Solo debemos confesarlos a Dios y recibir su perdón. Podemos hacerlo mediante el sacramento de la reconciliación. El sacerdote demuestra que Dios ama a los pecadores, sin importar lo que hayan hecho. Cuando te lastimas el brazo, explicas cómo te lastimaste para que el médico sepa cómo tratarlo. Si chocas el carro, lo llevas al taller y le dices a los mecánicos qué está roto para que lo reparen. En la reconciliación, llevamos nuestros pecados al sacerdote para experimentar el perdón. Podrías dejar tu carro en el taller toda la noche, con suficiente dinero para las reparaciones, pero hasta que regreses a recogerlo, nunca sabrás si está arreglado.

A veces, otras personas intentan avergonzarnos. En el Evangelio de hoy, los discípulos de Jesús preguntaron de quién era el pecado que había causado que el hombre naciera ciego. Los fariseos le dijeron que había nacido en pecado. Sin embargo, Jesús les dijo a sus discípulos que el hombre no había pecado y, además, que los fariseos mismos eran los pecadores porque habían juzgado al ciego. Así que, cuando sabemos que Dios nos perdona y nos sigue amando, no tenemos que temer lo que otros puedan pensar. Expongamos nuestros pecados a la luz del perdón y liberémonos de la vergüenza.
