

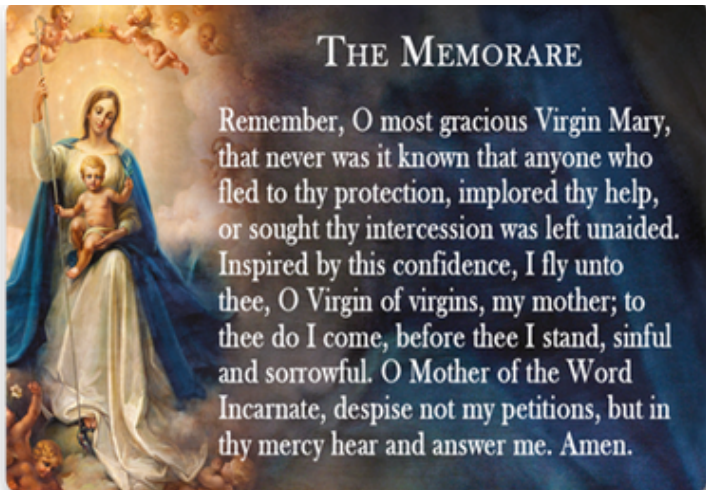

The Women's Group will be preparing a meal for The Homeless Shelter on Saturday, April 18th at 2:00pm, in the church basement. All are welcome.

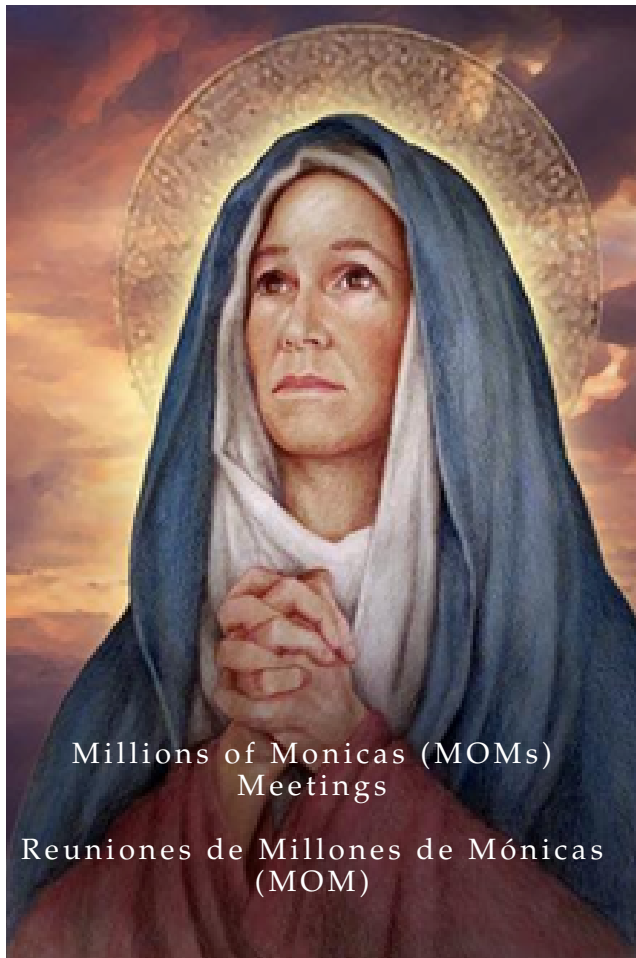

This Week's Reflection Reflexión De Esta Semana

Fifth Sunday of Lent *Greater Than You Expect*

Sometimes a prophet says more than he intended. Ezekiel in the first reading is talking about restoring Israel after the Babylonian exile. The Jews saw the Exile as punishment for their sins, especially the sin of relying on false gods or political leaders for their safety. God demonstrates forgiveness by bringing them back to Israel; God also shows them divine power and glory so that they return to the Lord for their protection.

Ezekiel uses the image of the dead rising from their graves (37:12). Jesus came to show us God in a new way and to fulfill the promises of all previous prophecies. Notice how the first reading repeats two phrases: "open your graves" and "know that I am the Lord." Jesus demonstrates that God's promise is much greater than anything Ezekiel expected.

First, the Gospel. When Jesus went to the tomb of Lazarus, he apparently waited till his friend had died. He knew that he was going to raise Lazarus from death to help his disciples believe. So why was he "perturbed and deeply troubled"? It could be that he was disappointed that his friends did not seem to believe that he could raise Lazarus. Notice Jesus became perturbed again when some of the crowd question Jesus' ability to do so (John 11:37-38). Like Ezekiel, the people of Jesus' time did not expect him literally to raise the dead. But God used the prophet's message to prepare for Jesus' message that not only would he rise from the dead, but we will also. And like the friends and relatives of Lazarus, we too may find it hard to believe, or at least question how it could be possible. Fortunately, Jesus helps with that, too.

Look at the second reading to the Romans. Because we have God's Spirit living in us, we who are sinners can be raised to new life by that Spirit. When our sins are forgiven, we begin to live a new life by loving the people we hurt by our sins, forgiving people who have hurt us, being more concerned for the poor than for our own comfort. We are freed from worrying about the future, from holding onto grudges, and perhaps even from the fear of death itself—all because we have experienced the new life of God's Spirit and, as Ezekiel says, know that God is the Lord.

Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma *Más Grande de lo que Esperas*

A veces, un profeta dice más de lo que pretendía. Ezequiel, en la primera lectura, habla de la restauración de Israel tras el exilio babilónico. Los judíos veían el exilio como un castigo por sus pecados, especialmente por confiar en dioses falsos o líderes políticos para su seguridad. Dios demuestra su perdón al traerlos de vuelta a Israel; también les muestra su poder y gloria divinos para que regresen al Señor en busca de protección.

Ezequiel utiliza la imagen de los muertos resucitando de sus tumbas (37,12). Jesús vino a mostrarnos a Dios de una manera nueva y a cumplir las promesas de todas las profecías anteriores. Noten cómo la primera lectura repite dos frases: la de abrir los sepulcros y la de saber que Él es el Señor. Jesús demuestra que la promesa de Dios es mucho mayor de lo que Ezequiel esperaba.

Primero, el Evangelio. Cuando Jesús fue a la tumba de Lázaro, aparentemente esperó hasta que su amigo muriera. Sabía que iba a resucitar a Lázaro para ayudar a sus discípulos a creer. Entonces, ¿por qué "se conmovió hasta lo más hondo"? Podría ser que le decepcionara que sus amigos no parecieran creer que pudiera resucitar a Lázaro. Notemos que Jesús se perturbó de nuevo cuando algunos de la multitud cuestionaron su capacidad para hacerlo (Juan 11,37-38). Al igual que Ezequiel, la gente de la época de Jesús no esperaba que resucitara literalmente a los muertos. Pero Dios usó el mensaje del profeta para preparar el mensaje de Jesús: que no solo él resucitaría, sino que nosotros también lo haríamos. Y al igual que los amigos y familiares de Lázaro, a nosotros también nos puede resultar difícil creerlo, o al menos cuestionaríamos cómo podría ser posible. Afortunadamente, Jesús también nos ayuda con eso.

Veamos la segunda lectura de la carta a los Romanos. Gracias a que el Espíritu de Dios mora en nosotros, como pecadores todavía podemos ser resucitados a una nueva vida por medio de ese Espíritu. Cuando nuestros pecados son perdonados, comenzamos a vivir una nueva vida amando a quienes hemos herido con nuestros pecados, perdonando a quienes nos han herido y preocupándonos más por los pobres que por nuestra propia comodidad. Quedamos liberados de la preocupación por el futuro, del rencor y quizás incluso del miedo a la muerte misma, todo porque hemos experimentado la nueva vida del Espíritu de Dios y, como dice Ezequiel, sabemos que Dios es el Señor.
