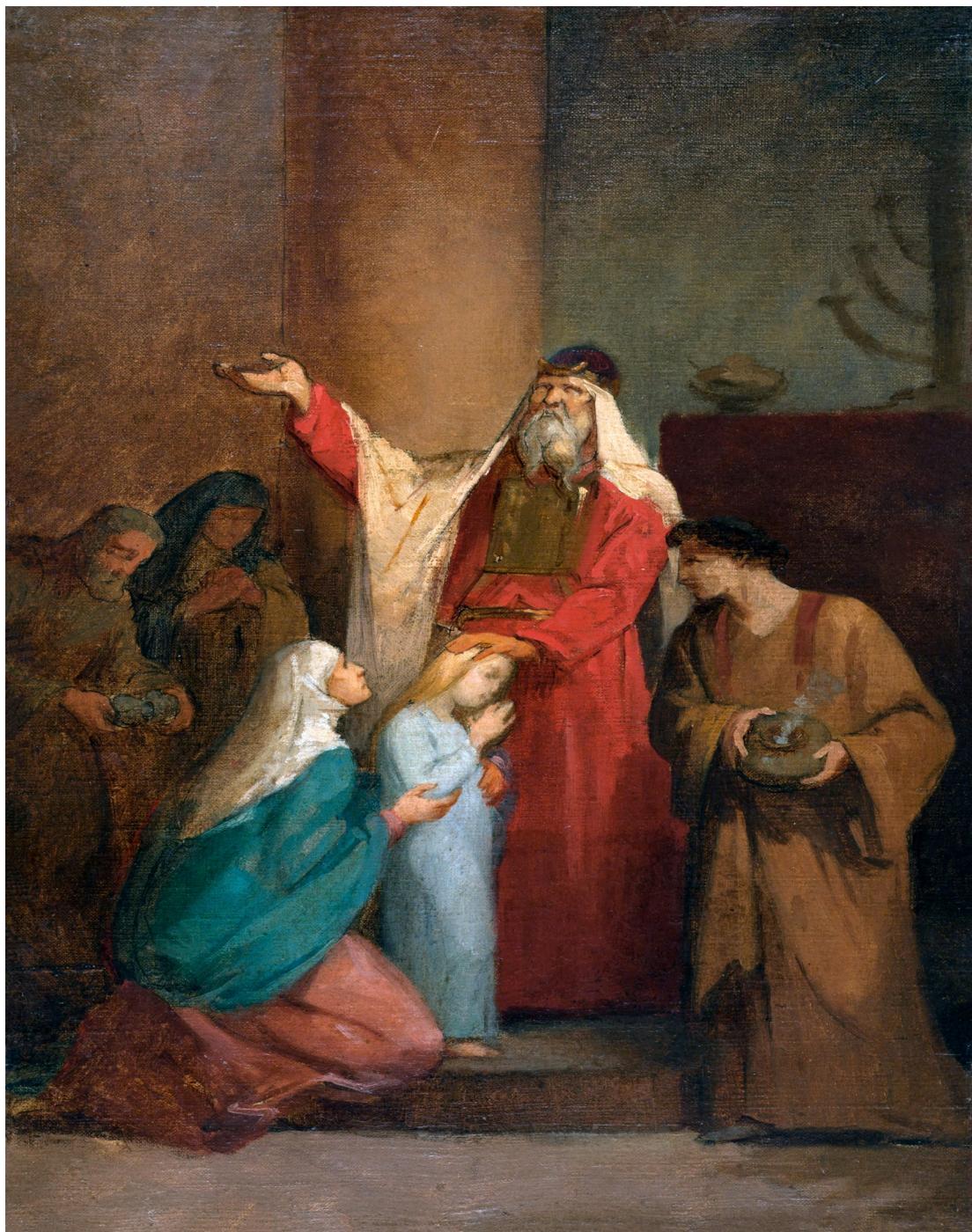

## This Week's Reflection

### Reflexión De Esta Semana

#### No Good Deed Goes Unpunished

When Jesus rose from the dead, he showed his disciples that even death will be overcome by God. In today's Gospel, he expands that to include most of the bad things that can happen to both non-believers and disciples alike.

Starting with the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem, Jesus mentions most of the scary things that people thought would bring the end of the world. He gives two pieces of advice. First, don't be fooled by anyone who says this is the end or who claims to be Jesus. When Jesus comes again, there will be no doubt about who it is. You won't have to learn about it on the evening news. Then, don't be terrified by natural disasters or wars. Wars, epidemics, earthquakes, and the rest happen throughout history and will happen again.

As disciples, we hope we would respond to disasters not with fear, but with love. Believers can voluntarily help those affected, comfort the survivors, or help rebuild their homes or schools. You may choose to give at a blood drive or donate to one of the charities that help disaster victims. People have welcomed strangers into their homes after a flood or hurricane has destroyed a neighborhood.

There is a saying that "no good deed goes unpunished." Jesus never says that his disciples would be given awards for their acts of charity. In the second half of the Gospel, he says that his disciples would be persecuted, hated, and even betrayed by their own families. Jesus has advice for that situation, too. He presents it as an opportunity to give testimony, or witness, to our faith. His advice sounds strange at first. Unlike a modern lawyer, who practices with a witness before they go into the courtroom, Jesus tells us "not to prepare your defense," but to let him give us the words. I suspect that he means not to worry about what you might say, lest you become scared speechless. If you let him, Jesus will "prepare" you with the scripture readings, your pastor's homilies, and your own prayer life. All of these can help open us to the gifts of the Spirit, who helps us proclaim our faith without fear.

#### Ninguna buena obra queda sin castigo

Cuando Jesús resucitó, mostró a sus discípulos que incluso la muerte será vencida por Dios. En el Evangelio de hoy, amplía esta idea para incluir la mayoría de las cosas malas que pueden suceder tanto a los no creyentes como a los discípulos.

Comenzando con la destrucción del templo en Jerusalén, Jesús menciona la mayoría de las cosas aterradoras que la gente creía que traerían el fin del mundo. Da dos consejos. Primero, no se dejen engañar por nadie que diga que este es el fin o que dice que es Jesús. Cuando Jesús regrese, no habrá duda de quién es. No tendrán que enterarse por las noticias de la noche. Luego, no se dejen aterrorizar por los desastres naturales ni las guerras. Guerras, epidemias, terremotos y demás ocurren a lo largo de la historia y volverán a ocurrir.

Como discípulos, esperamos responder a los desastres no con miedo, sino con amor. Los creyentes pueden ayudar voluntariamente a los afectados, consolar a los sobrevivientes o ayudar a reconstruir sus hogares o escuelas. Pueden optar por donar sangre o dar a una de las organizaciones benéficas que ayudan a las víctimas de desastres. Hay personas que han recibido a desconocidos en sus hogares después de que una inundación o un huracán destruye un vecindario.

Hay un dicho que dice que "ninguna buena obra queda sin castigo". Jesús nunca dice que sus discípulos serían recompensados por sus actos de caridad. En la segunda mitad del Evangelio, dice que sus discípulos serían perseguidos, odiados e incluso traicionados por sus propias familias. Jesús también tiene un consejo para esa situación. La presenta como una oportunidad para dar testimonio de nuestra fe. Su consejo suena extraño al principio. A diferencia de un abogado moderno, que practica con un testigo antes de entrar en la sala del tribunal, Jesús nos dice "no tienen que preparar de antemano su defensa," sino dejemos que él nos dé las palabras. Creo que se refiere a no preocuparse de lo que vamos a decir, para no quedarnos sin palabras por el miedo. Si se lo permites, Jesús te "preparará" con las lecturas de las Sagradas Escrituras, las homilías de tu párroco y tu propia vida de oración. Todo esto puede abrirnos a los dones del Espíritu, quien nos ayuda a proclamar la fe sin miedo. Tom Schmidt

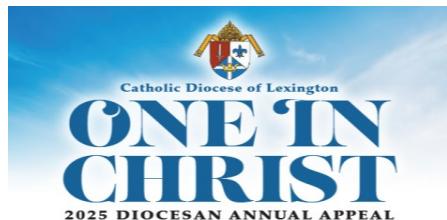



### Frequently Asked Questions about St. Luke's Giving Tree

**1. Where do we get the names that appear on the tags?**

**2. Who decides what is asked for?**

Each group determines who is included.

**3. Why is it so important to keep the original gift tag?**

The picture/shape determines what agency it represents.

Tree—Rose Terrace Lodge - place gifts in gift bags except community items  
Angel—Veterans Center - place gifts in gift bags except community items

Mitten—Church Referrals – Please contact the church office – Wrap  
Jesus & Santa—Social Services of Jessamine Co. - Wrap



ALL COMMUNITY ITEMS should be placed in a plastic/garbage bag with the tag attached. Do not wrap. Please DO NOT attach bows to any gifts. Most get ripped off as the gifts are stacked and unstacked causing the paper to be ripped.

**4. Can I buy more than what is on the tag?**

You are more than welcome to purchase additional items if you'd like. Please be certain to indicate on the additional gift package the tag picture/shape and the number or secure the packages with the one gift tag attached.

**5. Can I select more than one tag? There is no limit to the number of tags you can select.**

**6. Do I have to buy all the items listed on the tag? No. These are just suggestions.**

**7. How are the packages delivered?**

Packages are delivered to each group. The early due date allows each group enough time to deliver all the packages to each individual before Christmas.

**8. How can I participate?**

Select a tag(s) from the tree. Return the bagged/wrapped present, with the original gift tag attached, to the vestibule any time but final drop off is the weekend of December 6th & 7th.

**9. I'd like to help but I'd rather not do the shopping. Can I donate money instead?**

Yes. Each year we have a need for extra funds to make last-minute purchases. You can help by placing cash or a check (Made payable to St. Luke Church) in an envelope and marking it "Giving Tree" and placing it in the collection basket.




