This Week's Reflection

Reflexión De Esta Semana

First Sunday of Advent
Do What You Can

The reading from the prophet Isaiah this Sunday contains a remarkable prediction—the end of war between nations (Isaiah 2:4). While most of the good predictions of the prophets were fulfilled in Jesus, we still await the end of all wars. So why hasn't that one been fulfilled? We can look to the second reading and the Gospel for some hints.

Both readings talk about being awake and ready for our salvation (Romans 13:12) or the coming of the Son of Man (Matthew 24:39). Being awake doesn't mean consuming lots of coffee or turning the music volume all the way up. Paul calls it "putting on the Lord Jesus Christ" as a soldier would put on armor before a battle. He even mentions rivalry and jealousy as attitudes to avoid. Both of those vices have been the cause of many wars in our history. What if we not only avoided them, but also taught our children to avoid them? What if everyone eventually learned not to be jealous and hateful?

We are a long way from ending all wars. There are still people who teach hate to the poor instead of helping to feed them. There are still people who get rich selling the weapons of war. This brings us back to the first reading, in which Isaiah speaks of beating swords into plowshares. Do we have enough faith in God's love to stop building weapons and use those resources to feed the hungry or cure diseases in underprivileged countries? Until we convert everyone to following Jesus, that's not likely. The Gospel calls us to be ready. Maybe we need to be ready to share our faith. Maybe we have to be awake to any opportunity to show God's love to those around us. Are we afraid to offer to pray for someone in need? Maybe we need to put on the "armor of light," as St. Paul calls it. Instead of trying to stop all wars, could we at least show forgiveness to someone who has hurt us?

Jesus never said to do the impossible. If we can be ready to see Jesus in those around us, to show his love to those who need it, or just be patient with other people's faults and weaknesses, we may not stop all wars, but we will be prepared for the coming of the Prince of Peace.

Primer Domingo de Adviento
Haz lo que puedas

La primera lectura del profeta Isaías contiene una predicción notable: el fin de las guerras entre las naciones (Isaías 2,4). Si bien la mayoría de las buenas predicciones de los profetas se cumplieron en Jesús, aún esperamos el fin de todas las guerras. Entonces, ¿por qué esa no se ha cumplido? Podemos consultar la segunda lectura y el Evangelio para obtener algunas pistas.

Ambas lecturas hablan de estar despiertos y preparados para nuestra salvación (Romanos 13,12) o para la venida del Hijo del Hombre (Mateo 24,39). Estar despierto no significa tomar mucho café ni subir el volumen de la música al máximo. Pablo dice: "Revístanse más bien, de nuestro Señor Jesucristo" como un soldado se pondría la armadura antes de una batalla. Incluso menciona la rivalidad y los celos como actitudes que debemos evitar. Ambos vicios han sido la causa de muchas guerras en nuestra historia. ¿Qué pasaría si no solo los evitáramos, sino que también enseñáramos a nuestros hijos a evitarlos? ¿Qué pasaría si todos aprendiéramos a no ser celosos ni odiosos?

Estamos muy lejos de acabar con todas las guerras. Todavía hay quienes inculcan el odio a los pobres en lugar de alimentarlos. Todavía hay quienes se enriquecen vendiendo armas de guerra. Esto nos lleva de vuelta a la primera lectura, donde Isaías habla de convertir las espadas en arados. ¿Tenemos suficiente fe en el amor de Dios para dejar de fabricar armas y usar esos recursos para alimentar a los hambrientos o curar enfermedades en países desfavorecidos? Hasta que no convirtamos a todos a seguir a Jesús, eso no es probable. El Evangelio nos llama a estar preparados. Tal vez debamos estar dispuestos a compartir nuestra fe. Tal vez debamos estar atentos a cualquier oportunidad para mostrar el amor de Dios a quienes nos rodean. ¿Nos da miedo ofrecernos a orar por alguien necesitado? Tal vez debamos ponernos las "armas de la luz", como la llama San Pablo. En lugar de intentar detener todas las guerras, ¿podríamos al menos perdonar a quien nos ha hecho daño?

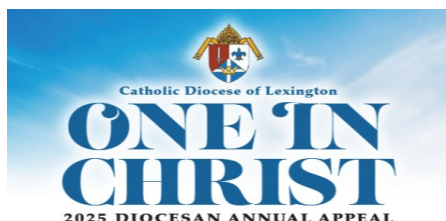

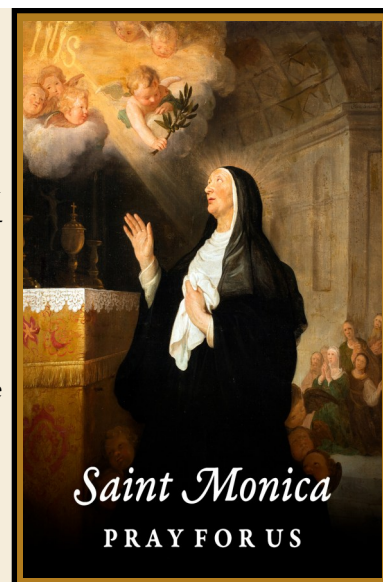

1. Where do we get the names that appear on the tags?

3. Why is it so important to keep the original gift tag?

The picture/shape determines what agency it represents.

Angel—Veterans Center - place gifts in gift bags except community items

Mitten—Church Referrals - Please contact the church office - Wrap

Jesus & Santa—Social Services of Jessamine Co. - Wrap



ALL COMMUNITY ITEMS should be placed in a plastic/garbage bag with the tag attached. Do not wrap. Please **DO NOT** attach bows to any gifts. Most get ripped off as the gifts are stacked and unstacked causing the paper to be ripped.

4. Can I buy more than what is on the tag?

You are more than welcome to purchase additional items if you'd like. Please be certain to indicate on the additional gift package the tag picture/shape and the number or secure the packages with the one gift tag attached.

5. Can I select more than one tag? There is no limit to the number of tags you can select.

6. Do I have to buy all the items listed on the tag? No. These are just suggestions.

7. How are the packages delivered?

Packages are delivered to each group. The early due date allows each group enough time to deliver all the packages to each individual before Christmas.

8. How can I participate?

Select a tag(s) from the tree. Return the bagged/wrapped present, with the original gift tag attached, to the vestibule any time but final drop off is the weekend of December 6th & 7th.

9. I'd like to help but I'd rather not do the shopping. Can I donate money instead?

Yes. Each year we have a need for extra funds to make last-minute purchases. You can help by placing cash or a check (Make payable to St. Luke Church) in an envelope and marking it "Giving Tree" and placing it in the collection basket.

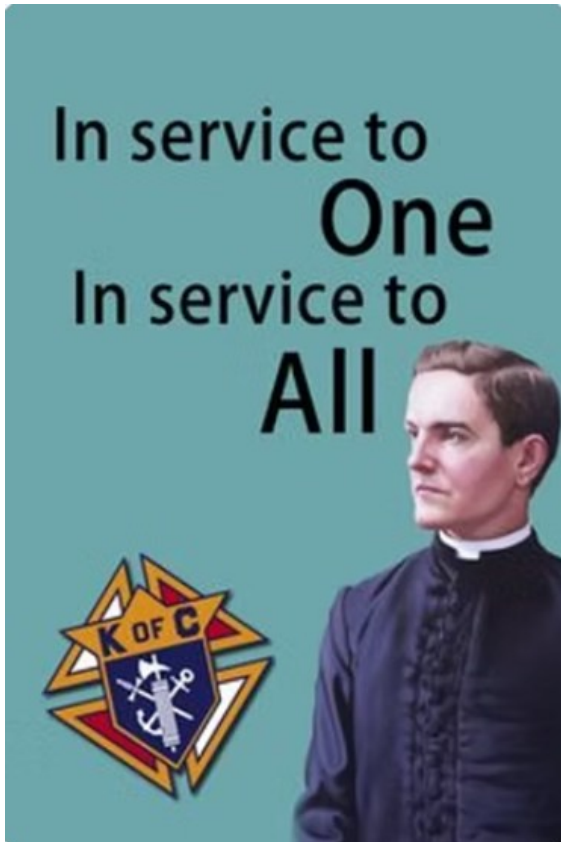

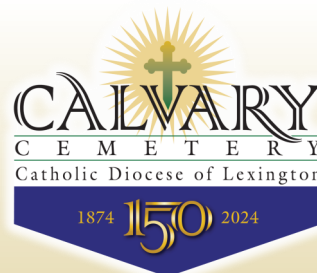

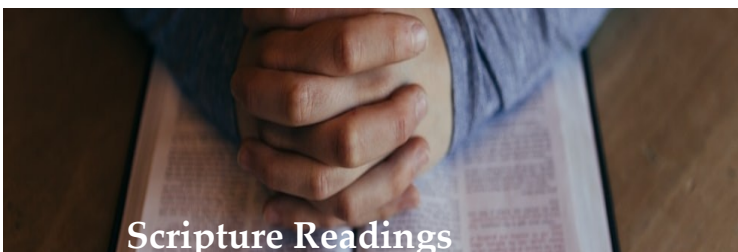
