Did you know 1 in 4 Idahoans is a family caregiver?

Caregiving is a fact of life for people of all ages and backgrounds. In Idaho alone, 25% of our population provides 171 million hours of unpaid support annually to those in need. This means that caregiving is affecting families across the state; numbers that will continue to grow as our population ages. However, keep in mind that caregiving is not limited to taking care of the elderly.

What's your definition of a caregiver?

Many people wonder what qualifies as a caregiver and the truth is - caregiving is a spectrum that depends on the care recipient's age, ability, capacity, and other support systems that are in use. According to Cambridge Dictionary a definition of caregiver is someone who takes care of a person who is young, old, sick, or disabled (=having an illness, injury, or condition that makes it difficult for them to do some things that other people do), either as a family member or friend, as a job or as a IVC transportation volunteer.

Some examples of caregivers include but are not limited to:

	The young adult child who looks after their siblings because of a parent's mental illness
	The adult child who manages their parent's medical needs
	The parent who supports their adult child with a mental health condition
?	The spouse who supports their partner with chronic health conditions
?	Handling your parent's finances
?	Providing company and emotional support
?	Taking your neighbor, friend, or client to medical appointments
	Someone who regularly assists an elderly individual or couple in your community

Interesting Census Data

According to the US Census Bureau, in 2023 Twin Falls Idaho has a population of 56,121 in the city and 93,792 in the county, per the census growth rate of 1.38%, in the past year. 38,135 (62%) are adults and 7,819 (21%) are 60 years of age or older. This indicates a significant increase in number of individuals who may require IVC's services. Without more volunteers, IVC's impact for the needs of the Magic Valley's growing population will be limited.

Robert Isabelle, Buhl: Veteran Robert Isabelle served in the U.S. Navy from 1955 to 1959 aboard the USS Los Angeles and the USS Hamul. He was nominated by the Buhl VFW Post 3604. After his military service, Isabelle studied French and worked part-time for a lab delivering reports and picking up specimens. He has been a life member of the VFW since 1995. Isabelle was the Post Quarter Master from 1999 – 2023. Isabelle has driven for Interlink Caregiver/Volunteers since 2018. Isabelle says he is a devout follower of Jesus Christ.

Important IVC updates

The insurmountable increase in mileage over the past two years is unprecedented (Jan. – Dec 2023 – 124,408 miles total miles compared to Jan. – Dec. 2022 – 102,246). Beginning with January 2024 mileage reimbursements payable in **February 2024** will increase to .67 cents per mile. **Hooray!!!**

We provide 4,271 scheduled client interactions (transports & home modifications), with 124,408 reimbursable volunteer miles and 7,357 volunteer hours (valued @ \$192,098) for 2023. **NOTE: Over 247 different individuals used IVC in 2023 including 121 new clients.**
