Interim tax bills for 2024 are due in two installments, the first half is due on March 22nd, the second half is due on April 26th. A fee of \$47 will be charged for any cheque returned from a financial institution. We accept E-transfer payments. Please send E-transfers to info@armourtownship.ca and remember to include your name and roll # or address. Credit card payments are accepted through Plastiq and can be accessed ONLY through our website, additional fees apply. Arrears of taxes accrue interest at a rate of 1.25% per month.

Landfill - 141 Chetwynd:

Based on the annual volumetric comparison, the TRI communal landfill received 1,251.4 cubic metres of waste in 2023, leaving 13,924.3 cubic metres of air space for landfilling. With an estimated annual fill rate of 1,500 cubic meters, closure of the landfill will occur in 9 ¼ years. Be sure to do your part with blue box recycling and the many diversion programs available at the site. Hold onto your landfill card, it was reloaded in January with 30 bags. Lost or stolen cards can be deactivated and the remaining value can be reloaded to a replacement card. A fee of \$11+ HST applies for a replacement card. Blue boxes are available at the landfill site for \$11. Fire Department:

Everyone has the responsibility to keep their families and homes safe from fire and carbon monoxide.

The best ways to do this are to:

- Prevent fires from starting.
- Install and maintain working smoke alarms on every story of your home and outside all sleeping areas.
- Have as much time to safely escape as possible, if a fire does occur.
- Not only do smoke alarms save lives, they are required by law.
- Plan and practice a home fire escape plan so everyone in the home knows exactly what to do should the smoke alarms sound in an emergency.
- Have fuel-burning appliances serviced annually by certified service technicians.

Keep an eye on the municipal website and fire rating signs throughout the municipality for updated fire conditions.
