General Information:

Final tax bills for 2022 are due in two installments, the first half is due on September 23, the second half is due on October 28. A fee of \$46 will be charged for any cheque returned from a financial institution. We offer a preauthorized payment plan with several options. We now accept E-Mail money transfers! If you would like to pay with this option, please contact the township office. Credit card payments are accepted through Plastiq and can be accessed ONLY through our website, fees apply. Arrears of taxes accrue interest at a rate of 1.25% per month.

Preauthorized Payments:

We offer payment plan options that allow you the benefit of settling your tax bill by making monthly payments or paying installments on the due dates indicated on the tax bills. Join today! See our website for additional details.

Municipal Elections:

Monday, October 24 is municipal Election Day in Ontario. If you'd like to throw your hat in the ring for a position on council, you may do so by 2:00 p.m. on August 19. Nomination forms are available at the municipal office. The nomination fee is \$100 for Councillor and \$200 for Mayor. The 2022 Election will be conducted via vote by mail. For ongoing updates, please refer to our website or contact the municipal office. If you are unsure if you are on the voters list, visit www.voterlookup.ca. Voter kits will be mailed to you starting September 26. You may return your completed ballot by mail as soon as you receive it or bring it to the municipal office. In both cases, follow the instructions and use the envelope provided. You must mail your ballot by October 14 to ensure timely delivery. If you or someone you know requires assistance to place their vote, please contact the municipal office.

Building Department:



CLEAR BAGS ONLY

Just taking a few extra minutes to sort and prepare your recyclables properly can make a big difference. Think of it as an investment in the health of our environment and the benefits will last generations – because some of the products we use will sit for hundreds of years in a landfill. Please keep your Landfill Cards as they will be automatically topped up at the end of the year with an amount predetermined by Council. Lost or stolen cards can be deactivated and the remaining value can be reloaded to a replacement card. A fee of \$10+ HST applies to a replacement card.
