School safety audit

I am proud to announce that there was recently a safety audit of Acacia Hill School, and we scored 95%, which is "Leading Safety Maturity" level. This audit includes things like safety inductions for workers, having a hazardous chemicals register, having a visitor sign in and out register, hazard inspection checklists, annual electrical testing and tagging, First Aid kits and treatment register, school excursion risk assessments, emergency plan exercises (fire drills, lockdown drills). Some of these things everyone will be aware of, and others are quietly organised by the admin team (such as hazardous chemicals registers, hazard inspection checklists). I am very thankful to Julia and Steve in particular, for ensuring that Acacia is up to date with all relevant safety procedures and requirements.

Student attendance

While students are happy to come to school, there are a number of students who come only rarely. A positive is that our current overall attendance, according to eDash, is 69.4%, and this time last year it was 68.7%, so there is some improvement! Cheryle, our Aboriginal Education Officer (AEO), Stephanie, our Home Liaison Officer (HLO), and I continue to work with an officer from the Attendance and Inclu-

School concert and end of Term 3


