Attendance prizes

I'm proud to announce we had two students who were at school every day last term and were not late even once: Theo Bell and Lennox Dickson. Review of Secondary Education

Resulting from the recent review of secondary education, NT DET is moving away from the Middle Years structure and back to comprehensive 7-12 high schools. The proposal for Alice Springs is that CMS will become a 7-12 high school and CSC will become an industry, trade and flexible education hub. There definitely won't be two 7-12 government high schools. There is time right now to give feedback on this proposal, at Reforming secondary education–Alice Springs. We are encouraging the parents and carers of our Year 6 students to do this survey, as it will potentially affect their young people.

Indica attended the official presentation last Friday evening at the Araluen Arts Centre, where



FAST FOOD FOR BUSY PARENTS

Sometimes it can be difficult finding the time and energy to cook a healthy meal for the whole family and it might seem easier and cheaper ordering fast food or takeaway.

Preparing healthy, affordable, convenient meals can be made simple using these tips:

- 1. always have staples ingredients in the pantry (e.g. rice/ pasta/ quinoa/ canned chicken & tuna/ canned chickpeas, lentils & beans/ pesto/ tomato passata sauce)
- 2. have frozen ingredients/ leftover meals in the freezer (e.g. frozen vegetable bags, fruit, meats & bread loaves)
- 3. don't let scrap ingredients go to waste.... turn them into a pizza, fried rice, tacos, pasta, noodle, toastie, frittata or soup meals

Let's compare the time, money and health cost of buying fast food versus making a quick healthy meal at home for dinner

'Fast food' family meal (hamburger, nuggets/fried chicken, soft drink & fries)

Drive there (5-10 minutes)

and wait in the queue (10 minutes)

Drive home (5-10 minutes)

Settle the kids and start eating at the dinner table

= 25-35 minutes

= \$46.70

= 3703 calories
