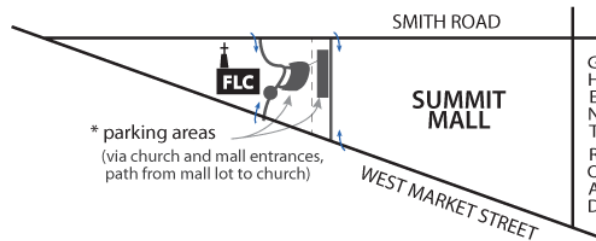
History
