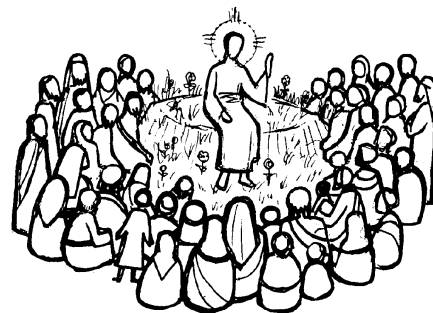

Fr Ben writes...

June unfolds a sequence of solemnities and feasts that invite us deeper into the mystery of Christ's presence and the mission of His Church. From the tender encounter of the Visitation to the triumphant witness of Peter and Paul, these celebrations weave together themes of divine visitation, Eucharistic adoration, prophetic preparation, and apostolic foundation.

Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary (1st June Transferred)

Commemorating Mary's journey to her cousin Elizabeth after the Annunciation. Bearing the incarnate Word in her womb, the young Virgin becomes the first tabernacle and the first evangelist. At Mary's greeting, the infant John leaps for joy in Elizabeth's womb, while Elizabeth proclaims her cousin "blessed among women." Mary responds with the Magnificat, her hymn of praise that echoes through the Church's liturgy daily. The Visitation reminds us that authentic encounter with Christ always leads to charity and joy. Mary teaches us to "bring Christ" to others through humble service and bold proclamation.

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - "Corpus Christi". (7th June transferred)

This feast, is a profound celebration of the Real Presence of Christ in the Sacrament. Instituted in the 13th century amid growing devotion to the Eucharist, Corpus Christi calls the faithful to process publicly with the Blessed Sacrament, proclaiming that Jesus remains with us "always, until the end of the age." The solemnity counters any spiritual dryness by renewing wonder at the miracle of transubstantiation: the same Body born of Mary, offered on Calvary, and risen in glory is given to us as food. Eucharistic processions, adoration, and hymns remind us that the Church draws her life from this inexhaustible source.

St. Barnabas (June 11th)

"Son of encouragement" This early disciple, a Levite from Cyprus, sold his property to support the Jerusalem community and vouched for the newly converted Saul (Paul) when others feared him. He accompanied Paul on the first missionary journey and later ministered in Antioch and Cyprus. Though not among the original Twelve, Barnabas is numbered among the Apostles in the broader sense for his foundational role in spreading the Gospel. His feast encourages us to be bridge-builders and encouragers in our parishes and families.

Nativity of St. John the Baptist (June 24th)

One of only three birthdays celebrated in the liturgical calendar (with Jesus and Mary). Born six months before the Lord, John fulfils the role of forerunner: "He must increase; I must decrease". His birth symbolizes how the light of Christ will soon outshine even the greatest prophet. The feast calls us to repentance, humility, and courageous witness—qualities the Church desperately needs today.

Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul (June 28th Transferred)

These pillars of the Church - the fisherman given the keys and the zealous Pharisee turned apostle to the Gentiles - represent the unity of the Church's Jewish roots and universal mission. Martyred in Rome under Nero, their combined feast underscores that the Church is built on apostolic foundation, sustained by the Eucharist, and animated by the same Spirit that moved Mary and John.

Together, these June observances form a cohesive catechesis. Mary brings Christ to Elizabeth and John; the Eucharist nourishes us with that same Christ; John prepares the way; and Peter and Paul extend the invitation to the ends of the earth.

In a world hungry for authentic encounter, let us imitate Mary's haste in charity, adore Christ in the Sacrament, embrace prophetic humility, and live the apostolic zeal these feasts place before us.
