On August 15th the Church celebrates the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This great feast invites us to reflect deeply on Mary's unique role in our Salvation history and her glorious entry into heaven, body and soul, as a sign of hope for all believers. The Assumption, proclaims that Mary, at the end of her earthly life, was taken up into heaven to be with her Son, Jesus Christ. This belief rooted in centuries of tradition and theological reflection, emphasises Mary's unique grace as the Mother of God, preserved from original sin and filled with divine favour.

This feast is not merely a historical or theological event; it is a celebration of God's promise to humanity. Mary's Assumption points to the destiny that awaits all who follow Christ: the resurrection of the body and eternal life with God. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Blessing the Boats

On Sunday 13 July, about one-hundred people – not including passersby who stopped and stared – attended our annual Blessing the Boats service on Lancing's Beach Green. Father Ben Scott, Assistant Curate, led the service, with Father Jake Pass as guest preacher. Among other things, Fr Jake is Chaplain of the Royal Navy Reserve as well as Team Vicar of Christ Church, Waltham Cross in the Diocese of St Albans.

The Blessing the Boats service at Lancing, organised by St Michael and All Angels Church for over 30 years, celebrates the historic fishing community while embracing modern seabased leisure. Held annually at Beach Green, the service includes hymns, prayers, and holy water blessings for boats and equipment, ensuring safety. It traces back to biblical times, honouring Jesus' fishermen disciples.

The hymns were accompanied by Lancing Brass conducted by 'Mr Music' himself, Aedan Kerney. Ian Tout reported in SussexWorld that items blessed included "boats from 3rd/5th Lancing Sea Scouts, a kayak from Matthew Ayling, fishing rods from Andrew Parkinson and Steve Gates, and two children's body boards...The boat permanently moored on Lancing's seafront and used as a flower display was also blessed."

The event did not pass without incident. As one of the boats was disassembled at the end, the mast fell, just missing Fr Jake who jumped out of the way in the nick of time. No wonder he later told me that the service was "memorable". But he greatly enjoyed the event.

Afterwards some of us walked up to St Michael's Hall for cream teas.

Putting mission on the MAP

At the beginning of May, members of the Parochial Church Council met at Church House Hove to review our current Mission Action Plan (MAP) and discuss what could be included in a new one. The day was led by The Reverend Dr Jack Dunn who is both Canon Chancellor at the Cathedral and Parish Development Officer for the diocese.

The three sections of our MAP are Church Growth, Reimagining Ministry and Contributing to the Common Good.

Each section was made up of three group and every member of the PCC was on at least one group (some of us were on several!).

With the knowledge of our impending Vacancy and because we're a busy parish, Fr Jack suggested we needed to do less because there would extra work to take on with Fr Felix's departure and also because a new priest would want to start new things and there needed to be space for this to happen.

Our new MAP has the same three sections but now only two groups in each. This has enabled the groups to be slightly larger to share the workload more. So under Church Growth we have Children, Young People and Families (this includes Alive Messy Church Rise Schools' ministry Uniformed organisations) and <u>Welcome and Social</u> (this includes all adult church groups and pastoral care). Under Reimagining Ministry we have Buildings / Fabric (covering the maintenance needs and missional opportunities of our buildings), and Resourcing: Vocation and Finance (looking at our resourcing needs and covering teaching, training and spiritual growth), and under Contributing to the Common Good we have Mission (encompassing Local, International, Eco Church, Foodbank and Fairtrade), and Communication (both internal and external, covering the website, the Net etc). Communications is also something for each group to consider how we communicate our work to the wider parish and how we pick up what is happening that we could be part of, plus discerning what further communications needs there are.

Each group has a designated group leader who will facilitate their meetings and the groups may decide to coopt non-PCC members if additional skills are needed (look out!). Each group will meet at least three times each year and report back to the PCC which meets six times.

Please pray regularly for the members of the PCC and that we will be led by the Holy Spirit in discerning what we need to do (and sometimes to stop doing) in our parish to further the mission and ministry of the Church.

Not Christmas already?!

In February this year, according to our work planner I had to mention to Bishop Martin that we needed to start the planning for this year's Christmas card. It was clear from his reaction, despite having approved the work planner, that he thought February too early to be planning for Christmas.

Now we're in August and in the parish my thoughts are, perhaps belatedly, turning to our third Christmas Tree Festival which will be held at St Michael's from Friday 5 - Sunday 7 December with the grand 'switching on' on Thursday evening.

Each year we've staged the festival it has grown in popularity and in the number of trees, and what it raises for the mission and ministry of St Michael's. One successful element in 2023 was that trees were sponsored so that groups who might not necessarily have the money to sponsor a tree could take part and show their creativity. This enabled several of our schools to take part at a time when education budgets are severely stretched.

Please can you ask yourself "what can I do to help the Christmas Tree Festival?". Are you part of a group who could sponsor and decorate a tree? Would you like to personally sponsor a tree for £30 and donate it to be decorated by a local school or other organisation? What else could you do to ensure people know about the Festival and attend it? Please also pray for growth in all forms mentioned above and what could happen as a result of it.
